CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

CAREER TRANSACTIONS: Drafted by the Philadelphia Phillies in the 14th round (433rd overall) of the 2023 draft out of Houston. Signed with the Phillies on July 18, 2023.

2024: Began season with High-A Jersey Shore. On Development List from July 16-23. Promoted to Double-A Reading on August 13. Made Double-A debut on August 16 with double and run scored. Had a trio of three-hit games, with most recent on July 24 against Aberdeen. Owned 13 multi-hit games with BlueClaws. Homered on Apr. 14 at Hickory and May 12 vs Wilmington. Had three RBI game on July 4 at Wilmington, along with three hits. Had nine multi-RBI games with Jersey Shore. Scored multiple runs on six different occasions, scoring two runs each time. Hit .288 at home, compared to .223 on the road. Slashed .361/.431/.410 (.841 OPS) in July, with 11 runs driven in. Slashed .307/.385/.360 (.745) with RISP, adding one home run and 33 RBI. Hit .304 in second half of season with Jersey Shore after hitting just .214 in the first half of the season.

2023: Began pro career with FCL-Phillies (ROK). Made pro debut July 27 vs FCL-Tigers. First professional hit July 29 vs FCL-Blue Jays. Promoted to Single-A Clearwater August 4. Made full-season debut Aug. 5 vs Lakeland, and had first hit, run and RBI same game, while also walking three times. First professional home run Aug. 15 vs Dunedin. Also homered Sept. 8 at Palm Beach. Career-high four hits Sept. 9 at Palm Beach, along with two runs, double and career-best four RBI. Had five multi-hit games, two multi-run games and three multi-RBI contests. Had three RBI, and triple, Aug. 3 vs FCL-Tigers. Played in six postseason games. Two hits and one RBI Sept. 17 at Jupiter in game one of FSL Championship Series. Slashed .304/.403/.411 (.814 OPS) in August, with 12 runs and seven RBI, along with home run. Hit .315 vs RHP, compared to .200 vs LHP. Slashed .538/.571/.846 (1.417 OPS) with two triples and six RBI in first inning of games. Slashed .333/.447/.533 (.980 OPS) with RISP, along with four extra-base hits and 14 RBI.

COLLEGE: Spent 2020-21 with LSU and 2022-23 with Houston. In 2023 received the following accolades: Pre-season All-AAC, All-Silver Glove Series Team, All-AAC First Team, Gold Glove Finalist (also was one in 2022), American All-Academic Team. Named 2021 NCAA Eugene Regional All-Tournament Team. Team Captain in 2023 at Houston. Had 32-game on-base streak. Finished 2023 season ranked ninth all-time in career home runs at Houston with 23. Led Houston in home runs (13) and runs (55) in 2023. 55 runs scored was most by Cougar since Connor Wong (61) in 2017. Had three home runs and seven RBI vs UT-Arlington on 3/26/23, which tied the program's single-game home run record. Hit .283 over 56 games in 2022 with Houston. Was lone third baseman in AAC with one or no errors in 160-plus chances. Hit .277 with 26 RBI over 49 games with LSU in 2021, while adding seven home runs and 25 runs scored for Tigers. Hit .412 (7-17) at NCAA Eugene Regional. Appeared in two games for LSU during COVID-shortened 2020 season.

Hit .406 as high school senior. 2019 California All-State Infielder for medium-sized schools. Two-time all-league shortstop (2018-19). Full name is Zachary John Arnold. Parents are John and Denise.
