YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels beat the Yard Goats, 2-1. Hartford took a 1-0 lead in the second on an RBI single by Braylen Wimmer. **Bo Davidson** hit a solo homer in the third, his eighth at Double-A and 18th this season overall. In the fourth, **Victor Bericoto** hit a triple and scored on a single by **Carter Howell** for a 2-1 lead. **Trystan Vrieling** threw five innings and allowed one unearned run while setting a professional career high with eight strikeouts. **RJ Dabovich** worked a scoreless sixth inning. **Evan Gates** threw the seventh and eighth. **Tyler Vogel** closed out his sixth save with a 1-2-3 ninth inning.

DIAMOND'S AREN'T FOREVER: This week, the Flying Squirrels play the final series at The Diamond before moving to neighboring CarMax Park for the 2026 season. The Diamond has been home to professional baseball in Richmond for 40 years. From 1985-2008, it served as the home ballpark for the Richmond Braves, Atlanta's Triple-A club. Since 2010, it has been the Flying Squirrels' home. Since the first game at The Diamond on April 17, 1985, the ballpark has hosted 16,637,484 fans.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the third of a six-game, season-ending series against the Hartford Yard Goats, Double-A affiliate of the Colorado Rockies. This is the first series between these two teams since the Yard Goats came to The Diamond last August for a six-game series split. The Flying Squirrels are 6-1 in their last seven home games.

PACKING THE HOUSE: This season the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,608 fans per home game, which leads Double-A and ranks eighth among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their current average is the highest since 2013 and fourth-highest in franchise history. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history. Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS were eliminated from postseason contention with Sunday's loss in Altoona. After winning the final five games of their last home series against Akron, Richmond dropped five-of-six in last week's road series at Altoona. Of Richmond's 78 losses this season, 43 of them have been by two runs or less (25 by one, 18 by two). Their 25 one-run losses are second-most in the EL, two less than Reading.

THE YARD GOATS are in third place in the Northeast Division second-half standings. They are 3.5 games behind second-place Somerset for a spot in the postseason. They split last week's series at home against Reading, dropping the final two games on Saturday and Sunday. Hartford's roster features six players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Rockies prospects list, including OF/3B Charlie Condon (No. 2), OF Jared Thomas (No. 3), OF Cole Carrigg (No. 4), LHP Welinton Herrera (No. 12), 2B Roc Riggio (No. 16) and LHP Sean Sullivan (No. 18). MLB.com's top-30 Rockies prospects list features nine Hartford players, including Condon (No. 2), Carrigg (No. 3), Thomas (No. 8), Riggio (No. 11), Sullivan (No. 13), Herrera (No. 20), LHP Konner Eaton (No. 22), LHP Michael Prosecky (No. 23) and LHP Ben Shields (No. 30).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Jack Choate** makes his 24th start of the season and third outing of his career against the Yard Goats. He last pitched on Friday at Altoona and allowed five runs over 3.1 innings. For the year, he ranks fifth in the Eastern League in strikeouts. Among pitchers who have pitched at least 100 innings this year in the EL, he ranks second in K/9 (10.89), second in strikeout percentage (28.1%) and fifth in ERA (3.60). In his last 13 outings since July 1, including seven starts, Choate has gone 3-1 with a 2.72 ERA (13 ER/43.0 IP). Last year, Choate spent most of the season with High-A Eugene, going 1-3 with a 2.90 ERA in 19 outings (18 starts). He was promoted to Double-A Richmond in August and made eight starts for the Flying Squirrels, posting a 1-4 record with a 5.82 ERA to close the season. Choate finished 2024 ranked first among qualified, full-season Giants minor-league pitchers in BAA (.231) and WHIP (1.21) while ranking second in ERA (3.79). Choate was selected by the Giants in the ninth round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Assumption University. He entered 2025 ranked by Baseball America as the No. 28 Giants prospect and No. 27 by MLB.com. **For more on Choate, see page two.**

FOR HARTFORD: Left-hander Michael Prosecky makes his ninth Double-A start and the first of his career against the Flying Squirrels. He last pitched last Thursday against Reading and worked five scoreless innings, allowing four hits with six strikeouts. He began the year with High-A Spokane and went 7-5 with a 3.86 ERA in 18 starts. Prosecky was selected by the Rockies in the sixth round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of the University of Louisville. In 2023, he was a California League Post-Season All-Star with Fresno.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey**, **Zach Morgan**, **Onil Perez** and **Drew Cavanaugh** have combined to catch 69 stolen base attempts this season, which first among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 48 runners caught stealing. Sugastey has set a franchise record for the most caught stealing in a season in Flying Squirrels history, passing **Jackson Williams'** mark of 35 set in 2015 with his 36th on July 26 against Portland. For his career with Richmond, Sugastey's 60 runners caught stealing for his career is the most in franchise history, passing Williams' (2010-11, '15) previous mark of 60.

BERI BOMBS: **Victor Bericoto** has 12 homers this season, which leads all Richmond players for the year. On Saturday night, he hit the 34th homer of his Flying Squirrels career, moving him ahead **Jacob Heyward** (2019, '21-22) for second on the franchise's all-time homer list. He is three behind **Ricky Oropesa's** (2013-16) franchise record of 37. Bericoto now has 139 career RBIs with Richmond, trailing only Oropesa's record of 165. In his last 35 games since August 1, Bericoto is batting .352 (44-for-125) with four homers, five doubles, a triple, 17 walks and 22 RBIs.

IT'S BO TIME!: **Bo Davidson** is batting .288 (19-for-66) with five homers, two doubles and nine RBIs in his last 14 games dating back to August 23. He also posted a nine-game hit streak from August 23-September 2. On August 29 against the Rubber-Ducks, he had his second two-homer game at Double-A and drove in three runs. Davidson has reached base in 21 consecutive games dating back to August 15, which is the longest streak by a Flying Squirrels player since 2023.

SECOND-HALF SABIN: In his last 19 games since August 9, **Sabin Ceballos** is batting .382 (26-for-68) with three homers, seven doubles and 18 RBIs. For the season, he is second on the team with 47 RBIs. He had four consecutive multi-hit and multi-RBI games to close the last home series against Akron. In his last 42 games since July 3, Ceballos is batting .311 (46-for-148) with six homers, 11 doubles and 29 RBIs.

TAKE A WALK: **Diego Velasquez** has worked 69 walks this year, which is the second-most in a season in Flying Squirrels franchise history, passing Hayden Cantrelle's 2023 mark (66). Jacob Heyward set a new record with 80 walks in 2019 Velasquez is second in the Eastern League in walks this season, trailing only Reading's Aidan Miller (73), who has been promoted to Triple-A.

THE FURMANATOR: Since joining the Richmond roster on September 2, **Nate Furman** is batting .375 (6-for-16) with three walks and two RBIs. In his last week with High-A Eugene before being bumped up to Double-A, Furman was named the Northwest League Player of the Week after batting .458 (11-for-24) with five homers, a double, seven walks and 11 RBIs in a six-game series at Everett from August 26-31, posting a 1.719 OPS for the week. Furman was traded to the Giants from the Guardians on August 26, 2024.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Diego Velasquez** is second in walks (69), tied fifth in hits (115) and seventh in OBP (.358). **Turner Hill** is tied for ninth in triples (5). **John Michael Bertrand** is first in ERA (2.87), third in innings pitched (131.2), sixth in BAA (.249) and sixth in WHIP (1.31). **Jack Choate** is fifth in strikeouts (121). **Joe Whitman** is sixth in strikeouts (119) and eighth in innings pitched (110.1). **Tyler Myrick** is tied for first in saves (10).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 267 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features four players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 3), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 10), **Joe Whitman** (No. 11) and **Jack Choate** (No. 30). **John Michael Bertrand** is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. **Adrian Sugastey** is ranked as the top defensive catcher. **Aeverson Arteaga** is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 5), Whitman (No. 14) and Velasquez (No. 21).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1978: The Richmond Braves beat the Pawtucket Red Sox, 7-3, in Game 1 of the Governors' Cup finals. The R-Braves took a 4-0 lead in the first inning with a run scoring on an error, a two-run double by Mike Reynolds and an RBI single by Jerry Maddox. Kevin Stephenson added a run with a sacrifice fly in the third. In the fourth, Mike Macha hit a two-run homer. Roger Alexander threw a complete game and struck out seven. **1983:** The Richmond Braves lost to the Tidewater Tides, 6-1, in Game 4 of the Governors' Cup finals at Parker Field. Dwight Gooden, 18 years old, threw a complete game and allowed one run with eight strikeouts. Tidewater scored four in the second inning, including a two-run single by Wally Backman and an RBI single by Terry Blocker. Blocker added solo homers in the fifth and seventh. Larry Owen tripled in Richmond's only run in the sixth to bring in Chico Ruiz. **1994:** The Richmond Braves beat the Syracuse Chiefs, 11-7, at MarArthur Stadium to take a 2-0 lead in the Governors' Cup finals. The R-Braves scored five runs in the first inning with two outs. Luis Lopez brought in the first run with a double. Ed Giovannola hit a two-run double and scored on a single by Eddie Perez, who later came in on a single by Tyler Houston for a 5-0 lead. After two Syracuse runs in the bottom of the first, Brad Kowitz hit a solo homer in the top of the second for a 6-2 lead. Richmond errors led to two Syracuse runs in the bottom of the second before a three-run third for Richmond, including a run-scoring groundout by Mike Mordecai and a two-run homer by Kowitz, his second of the game. Mike Kelly hit a two-run homer in the fifth for an 11-6 lead. **2007:** The Richmond Braves beat the Durham Bulls, 4-2, at Durham Bulls Athletic Park in Game 1 of the Governors Cup Championship Series. Mike Rozema hit a two-run double in the seventh to break a scoreless tie. Rozema hit a solo homer in the ninth. Jeff Bennett threw six scoreless innings and allowed three hits. After allowing a run in the bottom of the ninth, Joey Devine struck out Justin Ruggiano with two runners on base to close his fourth save of the postseason. **2011:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Harrisburg Senators, 2-1, at The Diamond to cap a three-game sweep in the Western Division Series. Chris Dominguez hit a two-run homer in the bottom of the sixth. Justin Fitzgerald held the Senators scoreless until the top of the eighth inning.
