SUNDAY: The Flying Squirrels beat the Patriots, 4-3, in 10 innings. The Patriots took a 2-0 lead in the first inning with a two-run homer by Garrett Martin. In the second, **Drew Cavanaugh** closed the score to 2-1 with an infield single. **Bo Davidson** tied the score in the third with a sacrifice fly. In the fourth, Jackson Castillo moved Somerset ahead, 3-2, with a solo homer. With two outs in the bottom of the ninth, **Maui Ahuna** scored to tie the game on a wild pitch. **Cesar Perdomo** held the Patriots off the scoreboard in the top of the 10th, capping six scoreless relief innings. In the bottom of the 10th, **Parks Harber** won the game with a walk-off single to left.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the opener of a six-game series against the Altoona Curve, Double-A affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates. It is the second series between the two teams this season and Richmond's first of two series in Altoona. The Flying Squirrels are 6-0 against the Curve this year.

STRONG START: The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 17-3 start is the best in team history through 20 games, passing the 13-7 start in 2023. Richmond has won all four series it has played so far this year.

RELENTLESS: In their 17 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 11 of them. In seven of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. On April 4, they scored two in the ninth for an 11-9 win at Erie. In the April 7 home opener, they never trailed but jumped ahead in the bottom of the eighth for a 3-2 win over the Curve. On April 9, they scored two in the eighth for another 3-2 win against Altoona. On April 11, the Curve scored two in the top of the 10th before the Flying Squirrels walked off with three in the bottom of the 10th. On April 15 in Hartford, the Flying Squirrels scored five runs with two outs in the ninth to win 13-11. Last Friday, **Drew Cavanaugh** hit a walk-off, two-run homer in the ninth for a 7-6 win over the Patriots. On Sunday, Richmond tied the score with two outs in the ninth before **Parks Harber** hit a walk-off single in the 10th.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS have the best record of all 150 teams across Major League Baseball and Minor League Baseball, ahead of a 16-5 record for Double-A Chattanooga (Reds), Double-A Midland (Athletics) and High-A Eugene (Giants). The Richmond offense leads all 30 Double-A teams in batting average (.296), runs (146), hits (204), total bases (331), doubles (50), RBIs (133), OBP (.387), SLG (.480) and OPS (.867) and has the fewest strikeouts (167). In eight road games this year, the Flying Squirrels are batting .323 (100-for-310) and have scored 72 runs (9.0 runs per game). In 12 home games at CarMax Park, the Flying Squirrels are hitting .274 (104-for-379) and have scored 74 runs (6.2 runs per game).

THE CURVE are 5-15 this season, last in the Southwest Division, but won their first series of the season last week, taking three-of-five against second-place Harrisburg. Altoona's roster features four players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Pirates prospects, including C Omar Alfonzo (No. 13), RHP Khristian Curtis (No. 15), 2B Duce Gourson (No. 21) and SS/3B Jack Brannigan (No. 28). Five players are featured on MLB.com's top-30 Pirates prospects list, including Alfonzo (No. 15), Curtis (No. 22), Brannigan (No. 23), Gourson (No. 27) and 1B Callan Moss (No. 29).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Greg Farone** makes his fifth Double-A start and his second against the Curve. In his last start last Wednesday against the Patriots, he allowed three runs over 3.1 innings with five strikeouts. He faced the Curve on April 9 at CarMax Park and surrendered one run over 4.1 innings, striking out five. He was Richmond's Opening Day starter on April 4 in his Double-A debut and allowed one run over 4.2 innings. He had eight strikeouts, tying the franchise record for the most strikeouts on Opening Day. He pitched his first professional season in 2025 and split the year between Low-A San Jose and High-A Eugene. He made 12 starts for San Jose, going 2-1 with a 3.73 ERA. At the time of his promotion in June, he ranked third in the California League in strikeouts (73). Farone closed the year with 11 starts at High-A, going 4-2 with a 4.25 ERA. Farone began his college career at Herkimer College in New York, where he led the team to the program's first NJCAA national title in 2022, going 7-0 with a 1.65 ERA and was named the NJCAA Division III Player of the Year and MVP of the World Series. He transferred to the University of Louisville for the 2023 season and pitched at the University of Alabama in 2024 before being selected by the Giants in the seventh round of that year's MLB Draft. **For more on Farone, see page two.**

FOR ALTOONA: Left-hander Connor Wietgreffe makes his fifth start of the season and his second against the Flying Squirrels. He last pitched last Tuesday and allowed two runs (one earned) over 3.1 innings. He faced the Flying Squirrels at CarMax Park on April 9 and worked his longest outing of the year, allowing one run over six innings with four strikeouts. Wietgreffe spent most of last year with High-A Greensboro and went 6-4 with a 3.17 ERA in 24 starts. He joined Altoona for the final series of the year and made his Double-A debut on September 13 at Erie, allowing one run over five innings. He was a First-Team All-Big Ten pitcher at Minnesota in 2024 before being selected by the Pirates in the seventh round of that summer's MLB Draft.

SABIN SOARING: Sabin Ceballos homered in back-to-back games last Tuesday and Wednesday and now has four home runs for the year. Over his last 11 games since April 14, he is batting .357 (15-for-42) with two doubles, four homers and nine RBIs with eight walks. He homered twice in the April 15 win at Hartford and finished the night 3-for-4 with four RBIs and four runs scored. Prior to this stretch, he opened the season batting .160 (4-for-25) in his first seven games from April 3-12. Last season, Ceballos hit .311 (46-for-148) with five homers, 11 doubles and 27 RBIs over final 43 games from July 3-September 6.

GREAT SCOTT: Scott Bandura has 16 RBIs over his last 12 games since April 12, including 10 in the last road series at Hartford and four last week against Somerset. On April 14 at Hartford, Bandura went 3-for-4 with two doubles and drove in five runs, the most by a Richmond batter this season. The next day, he hit a solo homer before clubbing a go-ahead, three-run double in the ninth. On Friday, Bandura hit a two-run homer.

JUST HOW WE DREW IT UP: **Drew Cavanaugh** has reached base multiple times in 10-of-his-12 games started this season and leads the Eastern League in on-base percentage (.509), which is fourth in MiLB. He has at least one hit and one walk in 10 starts. On Friday, he entered as a pinch-hitter in the ninth and hit the first walk-off home run in CarMax Park history, a two-out, two-run shot for a 7-6 win.

COX ROCKS: **Jonah Cox** has reached base in all 18 games he has played this season to begin his Double-A career. The streak is the second-longest in the Eastern League this year, trailing only a 19-game streak by Harrisburg's Seaver King. He opened the season on a 12-game hit streak and has at least one hit in 17-of-18 games he has played. For the year, he leads the EL and is tied for first in MiLB in batting average (.429). He is tied for second in the EL and tied for seventh in MiLB in OBP (.500). His 12 steals are tied for second in the league after swiping 58 bases each of the last two seasons.

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 277 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PACKING THE HOUSE: In 2025, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in total (446,679) and average (6,768) attendance for the fourth consecutive season. The average attendance was the highest in the franchise's history. April 7's inaugural game at CarMax Park had been sold out for more than a month, marking the 16th consecutive home-opener to sell out for the Flying Squirrels. This season, the Flying Squirrels rank second among the 120 MiLB teams in average attendance (7,348).

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Jonah Cox** is first in batting average (.429), tied for second in OBP (.500), tied for second in stolen bases (12), fourth in SLG (.667), fourth in OPS (.1167), tied for fourth in RBIs (17) and tied for fifth in hits (25). **Drew Cavanaugh** is first in OBP (.509), fifth in OPS (.1137), sixth in SLG (.628) and seventh in batting average (.349). **Scott Bandura** is tied for first in extra-base hits (12), tied for second in hits (26), third in runs (20), tied for third in doubles (8), tied for third in triples (2), tied for fourth in RBIs (17) and tied for fourth in total bases (44). **Turner Hill** is tied for third in triples (2). **Darrien Smith** is first in WHIP (0.75), second in ERA (1.35), tied for third in wins (3) and fourth in BAA (.145). **Cesar Perdomo** is fifth in BAA (.169), sixth in ERA (2.16) and ninth in WHIP (1.02). **Jack Choate** is first in wins (5). **Joe Whitman** is eighth in strikeouts (25). **Tyler Vogel** is first in saves (5) and tied for fourth in games pitched (8). **Mitch White** is tied for third in saves (2).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features three players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 3), **Parks Harber** (No. 16), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 24) and **Joe Whitman** (No. 25). **Adrián Sugastey** is rated by Baseball America as the top defensive catcher in the Giants organization and **Jonah Cox** is rated as the top defensive outfielder. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 7), Harber (No. 14), **Maui Ahuna** (No. 20) and Whitman (No. 26).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1983: The Richmond Braves beat the Atlanta Braves, 6-5, in 10 innings in an exhibition at Parker Field. The crowd of 15,135 was the largest in Parker Field history. Tony Brizzolara started for Richmond and allowed one run over seven innings on three hits. Gerald Perry drove home the winning run with a bases-loaded, walk-off single in the bottom of the 10th inning. Reigning NL MVP Dale Murphy hit a double for Atlanta before exiting the game. **1987:** The Richmond Braves beat the Maine Guides, 4-3, in 10 innings at The Diamond. With no pinch-hit options left on the bench, relief pitcher Steve Ziem won the game with a walk-off single in the bottom of the 10th. After the game, he found out he was being called up to the majors for the first time. **2010:** The Flying Squirrels beat the New Britain Rock Cats, 5-3, on the road. Down, 3-2, entering the top of the ninth, Thomas Neal drove a bases-clearing, three-run double to give Richmond a 5-3 lead. Roger Kieschnick had three singles in the game for the Flying Squirrels. Nick Noonan and Clay Timpane picked up a pair of early RBIs in the second inning.
