The Fightin Phils hit the road for the final road trip of the season, and penultimate series of 2025, at the Hartford Yard Goats. It is the 15th-of-18 games between the teams this season and ninth-of-12 at Dunkin' Park in Hartford. The Yard Goats have a 9-5 edge in the season-series.

Game 126 Recap
The Fightin Phils rolled to a 16-4 win over Hartford on Wednesday night for their first win of the week. Chuck King earned the win, allowing two runs over five innings, with six strikeouts. Alex McFarlane, John McMillon, Jayden Estanista and Andrew Walling each tossed an inning of relief and did not allow an earned run. Reading got a pair of three-run home runs, one from Dylan Campbell in the fourth inning and another from Felix Reyes, his 14th of the season, in the sixth inning. Reyes led the way with three hits, two runs and five RBI on the night. Reyes, Campbell and Leandro Pineda all added doubles as well. Aidan Miller scored three runs and stole his 51st base of the season. Carson DeMartini had two hits, two runs and three RBI. Jose Rodriguez had three hits, a run and RBI. Alex Binelas added two hits, a run and three RBI. 8/9 player in Reading's starting lineup had a hit and everyone reached base at last once. All nine players in the Fightin Phils lineup scored at least one run as well. Reading's 16 runs matched a season-high (Aug. 9 at New Hampshire) and the Fightin Phils 15 hits marked the fourth time they've had 15-or-more hits in a game this season.

The 50 Club for Miller

Aidan Miller stole his 51st base of the season on Wednesdsay night, making him the first Fightin Phil to steal at least 51 since Jeff Stone stole 90 bases in 1983 Miller is the eighth player in franchise history to steal 50-or-more bags in a season and sits at 7th all-time in single-season stolen bases. He was the first R-Phil since Jose Leiva in 1987 to steal 50+ bases in a season. Miller currently leads the Eastern League and Phillies organization in stolen bases. He also ranks second in Double-A in stolen bases. The last time an R-Phil led the Eastern League in stolen bases was Anderson Machado (49) in 2003. Since 1967, four Reading players have finished the year leading the league in stolen bases.

Since August 1 (24 games), Aidan Miller is slashing .340/.449/.629 (1.078 OPS), with 26 runs, 13 doubles, five home runs, 17 RBI and is 14-17 in stolen bases. The Phillies No. 2 prospect has 10 multi-hit games over that stretch, including four three-hit contests. On the season, Miller's Eastern League ranks are: 5th OBP (.369), 10th OPS (.790), 8th 2B (24), 1st BB (66), T-8th XBH (39 and 3rd runs (69).

Ring Feix Reyes had three hits, two runs and was a triple shy of the cycle on Wednesday night. He also drove in five runs, which was one shy of a career-high. Since August 1 (30 games), Reyes is slashing .384/.407/.600 (1.007 OPS), with 25 runs, 15 doubles, four home runs and 29 RBI. Over that stretch, he's had multiple hits in 14-of-30 games he's played in the month, with seven of those games having three-or-more hits. Reyes now qualifies to be ranked amongst the Eastern League leaders and holds the following ranks on the season: 1st AVG (.337), 6th OBP (.369), 1st SLG (.572), 1st OPS (.941), T-4th hits (112), 1st 2B (30), 2nd XBH (47) and 1st total bases (190). On Wednesday, Reyes became the 23rd Fightin Phil all time to have 30-or-more doubles in a season and he leads the league in two baggers. The last R-Phil to lead the league in doubles was Darick Hall (38) in 2019. It's happened five times sine 1967.

Batting Title on the Horizon

Felix Reyes currently would qualify for the Eastern Legaue batting title, as his .337 average leads second place in the Eastern League by 31 points. He also leads all of Double-A and all of Minor League Baseball in batting average for the season. To qualify, MiLB rules state a player needs 2.7 plate appearances per team games played, so if Reading is to play out its remaining games to 136 total, Reyes would need to finish the season with 368 plate appearances and he is currently at 358 with 10 games left in the season. Reyes' .334 average would be tied for the third highest single-season batting average in R-Phils history. The last R-Phil to win an Eastern League batting title was Tagg Bozied in 2010. A R-Phil has won a batting title four times, dating back to

The game ends with Otto Kemp at the plate and the bases loaded. After Kemp fouls off a pitch, home plate umpire Nelson Fraley calls catchers' interference. Kemp is awarded first base and Aidan Miller scores the winning run. It is the second walk-off catchers' interference in Reading history, with the last coming on June 20, 2007.

Hartford enters play today with a 65-62 overall record and 29-29 mark in the second half, which is in third place but just 1.5 games out of a playoff spot. The Yard Goats dropped four-of-six at home against Portland last week and they head to Richmond next week for the final week of the season. Hartford's roster has nine of the Rockies' top-30 prospects: Charlie Condon (2), Cole Carrigg (3), Jared Thomas (8), Roc Riggio (11), Sean Sullivan (13), Wellinton Herrera (20), Konnor Eaton (22), Michael Prosecky (23) and Ben Shields (30).

Lefty, and Rockies' No. 23 prospect, Micahel Prosecky makes the start tonight for the Yard Goats. Over seven starts with Hartford this season, Prosecky is 3-2, with a 6.11 ERA (19 ER, 28.0 IP). Last Thursday against Portland, Prosecky lasted just Flattroid this season, Prosecky is 5-2, with a 6.11 ERA (19 ER, 28.0 IP). Last flutriscal against Portland, Prosecky lasted just 1.1 innings, allowing six runs on five hits. Against Reading on Aug. 3, he earned the win, allowing one run on four hits over six innings, with four strikeouts. Prosecky began the season with Spokane (A+), going 7-5, with a 3.86 ERA over 18 starts. He split last season between the ACL-Rockies (ROK), Fresno (A) and Spokane, going 3-3, with a 4.44 ERA over 14 games. The 24-year old was a sixth round pick by Colorado in 2022 out of Louisville, where he pitched from 2020-22.

2025 Season:

- Prior to the 2025 season, Cabrera was added to the Phillies 40-man roster (on 11/19/24) to protect him from the Rule-5 Draft; optioned to Reading (AA) on March 8
- Appeared in relief for the Phillies in the Spring Breakout Game (3/14 vs PIT) and tossed two innings following Moises Chace, who started the game
- Currently ranks as Phillies No. 11 Prospect (MLB Pipeline)
- Tabbed as Reading's Opening Day starter Apr. 4 vs Portland (ND, 4.2 IP, 2 H, ER, 4 BB, 3 SO)
- First win of season Apr. 16 vs Binghamton (5.0 IP, 4 H, 1 ER, 2 BB, 7 SO)
- May 8 at BNG: 6.0 IP, 4 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 8 SO; eight strikeouts was season-high at the time
- Walked season (and career-high) five batters twice: May 1 vs HBG and May 20 at POR
- Matched season-high (at the time) with eight strikeouts June 18 vs Hartford, also allowed season-high seven hits and ultimately suffered loss, but surrendered just three runs
- Picked up second win in another quality start June 24 at Richmond (6.0 IP, 6 H, 2 ER, 1 BB, 3 SO)
- Earned second-straight win June 29 vs Richmond, allowing one run over five innings and did not allow a hit through first four innings
- Tossed quality start July 5 at Somerset, allowing one run on four hits over six innings; ultimately took a no-decision as Reading surrendered the lead in the ninth

- From June 24-July 29, Cabrera was 4-1, with a 2.86 ERA (11 ER, 34.2 IP)
- Cabrera has tossed six or more innings in eight of his 24 starts this season and has six quality starts in total, with five of them coming since the start of June
- Struck out a season-high, and Double-A high, nine batters in a win on July 29 at Hartford Struck out seven over five one-run inning at Altoona on Aug. 22; allowed two hits
