## WHAT IS COPA DE LA DIVERSION?

"Copa de la Diversion,"or "Fun Cup," is a Minor League Baseball Marketing Initiative that is a season-long event series specifically designed to embrace the culture and values that resonate most with the local U.S. Hispanic/ Latino communities. Based on the successful launch of its national "It's Fun to Be a Fan" (and corresponding Spanish-language "Es Divertido Ser Un Fan®") marketing campaign in 2017, the Modesto Nuts were chosen to participate in the 2019 "Copa de la Diversion"


Los Alebrijes de Modesto
In Mexican culture an "Alebrije" is a mythical creature that guides spirits safely from this life to the next. Alebrijes can take on the form of one or multiple creatures. Los Alebrijes de Modesto have taken on three forms that embody our community.
The coyote, which is common throughout the Central Valley, is a smart, adaptable canine. The moose, not common in the Central Valley, but instead a representation from the Pacific Northwest part of the United States. The Moose antlers represent the home of our parent club, the Seattle Mariners. The Mariners have taken great pride in immersing themselves into our community through countless player appearances and annual charity functions. Lastly, the Mighty Eagle, which was derived directly from La Bandera Mexicana, the heritage of nearly $50 \%$ of our population. The Mexican Flag features an Eagle's wings and talon. The Eagle is a symbol of great pride and respect in Mexican culture.
