Today's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Yorman Gomez** to the mound today, looking for their 40th victory in Huntington Park this year (39-26, .600, 3rd in the IL). The Cubs will counter with LHP **Justin Steele**. Columbus is 17-22 (.436) versus left handers this year. Steele has pitched against the Clippers twice in his career, both in Huntington Park, going 0-1 with a 3.18ERA (5.2IP, 6H, 5R, 2ER, 3BB, 6K).

vs. the Cubs

Since a 5G win streak against Iowa from 5/12-6/14/24, the Clippers are 23-20 opposing the I-Cubs (38-27 in the last 65G). Individually, **Milan Tolentino** has hit the Cubs at a .336 clip (38x113) with 11HR and 28RBI in his career (32G). **Kahlil Watson** has hit .304 (21x69) with 5HR and 16RBI in 18G, while **Kody Huff** has hit .303 (27x89) with 2HR and 17RBI in 23G (**Cooper Ingle** has 4HR, 12RBI in 14G).

Start with a Bang

Over the last 33G, the Clippers have plated 239 runs (most in the IL, 7.2 per), with 153 (64%) tallied in the first four innings of the game, including 53 in the 1st. Opponents have only 73 in the first four innings of the last 33G, but are outscoring the Clippers 112-86 thereafter. Taking a lead into the 8th inning, Columbus has won 63 straight (last loss: 8/22/25) and 77 straight when leading into the 9th (8/7/25).

Back to the Launch Pad

Columbus leads all of pro baseball in homers hit since 7/28 (72, accounting for 49% of runs: 117 of 239) and have allowed the 9th most (54, 2nd in IL; accounts for 44%: 82 of 185). Huntington Park has been breached 84 times in the last 21G, but only 10 times in 5G this week. Last night the Clippers reached triple digits for the third season in Huntington Park history (102; hit 108 in 2024 and 100 in 2011).

Always On

Cooper Ingle has lost 30 points on his batting average over his last 22G (.197, 15x76) and 72 points from his slugging, with only 3XBH (HR last night snapped streak of 66AB without), but his OBP has dipped only four points in that time, as he has 29BB in 105PA. He ranks 2nd in the IL in walks (81; **Christian Cairo** is 1st with 85BB), having accumulated them in only 419PA (19%, Cairo has 491PA).

Big Time Production

Kyle Manzardo has hit safely in each of 18G since 8/15 (.338, 24x71, 3HR), while collecting 21RBI (RBI in 13G of streak). In his career with Columbus, Manzardo has played only 129G (567PA), but he has still managed 69XBH (.557SLG), including 31HR, against just 58 singles. Additionally, he has scored 100 times with 91RBI, while keeping his strikeout rate under 20% (110K, 19%; 86BB, 15%).

King Ralph

Dating to 7/28, **Ralph Velazquez** leads the IL in HR (17, +5), RBI (41, +7) and SLG (.780, +44) and, aside from going 0x21 in 6G at St. Paul (7/21-7/26), is hitting .330/.415/.655 since 6/18 (20HR, 55RBI). Though Velazquez has not homered in the last 7G (21AB), he has 9BB in 31PA (9BB in prior 28G, 122PA) and has 11RBI in his last 12G (1HR in 42AB, had 16HR and 30RBI in previous 20G, 76AB).

Another High

A day after his 20G on base streak was snapped (tied career long, .382OBP from 8/2-9/1), **Kody Huff** has gotten back to work with hits in each of his last 2G. Huff is hitting .395 (15x38) over his last 10G, including a 4x4 performance on 8/23 vs. St. Paul, after a 19G slump from 7/26-8/22 (.134, 9x67). He has yet to go deep on the current hotness (5HR during slump), though he does have 6XBH (.579SLG).

Power and Speed

Milan Tolentino popped his 20th homer last night (3HR in last 6G) and picked up his 18th steal on Friday, as he attempts to secure the second 20-20 season in franchise history. He scored the first such season last year and, since the start of 2025, he is tied for 1st in the IL with 41HR (25th with 38SB). **Kahlil Watson** is sitting at 18HR (career high, had 11HR through 5/29) and 22SB (three off career best).

Busting Out

Dayan Frias was 1x25 (.040) with an RBI triple from 8/20-8/28, but has gone 7x23 with 4HR and 7RBI since (.348SLG coming into today is season high). He tied a career high with his 20th steal last night (had 20SB between Akron and Columbus last year). **Tyresse Turner** drew 3BB and stole a base last night, giving him 90SB in his minor league career (only 11CS; 60 for 66 in last three seasons)

This Date in Clipper History

9/6/2015

Toru Murata secured his 15th win of the season (led the IL by three; one shy of the franchise record) with 7.0IP of shutout baseball vs. Toledo. Murata went 10-0 with a 2.90ERA over his final 12GS in 2015, leading the Clippers to a division title over Indianapolis. He then beat the Indians at Huntington Park in front of 11,894 rabid fans in game two of the Governors' Cup Finals, staking Columbus to a 2-0 lead (won, 3-2).

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,495 to 1,448).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 187-147 (.560) in pitch reviews, with batters going 94-87 (.519) and pitchers/catchers going 93-60 (.608). They have run out of challenges in 48G and have not challenged in 8G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 850, would rank as 4th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 164 through 134G (on pace for 180SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 47CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (52; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 188 runs while crafting a .892OPS (over 60 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 124 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +64 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 306-198 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 81 grand slams and 2,003RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.39 through 134G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up 202HR (would be 2nd most in franchise history; 214HR allowed in 2023).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 8th in the IL this year (.980), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 73G this season (43-30, .583), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 8th most last at bat wins this year (15, three off the lead) while playing in the 13th most games decided in the last at bat (28, Norfolk has 39). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 102G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 49-53 (.480, 16th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's seventh year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 459-467 (.496), 429-421 with Columbus (.505).

500K

Gomez surpassed 500K in his career on 8/20 vs. St. Paul (509K, 491.1IP). He has seen his strikeout rate tick up this season (23.8%, 66K to 277BF between Rookie League and Triple-A; 24.7% in career prior), but his walk rate has increased with it (12.6%, 35BB; was at 9.1% prior). A month ago, on 8/1 vs. Toledo, **Trenton Denholm** picked up his 500th career strikeout (542.1IP; **Logan Allen** collected his 500th minor league strikeout two days prior, 7/30 vs. Toledo, 399.0IP).

Injury Delay:

Gomez was slated to make his Triple-A debut during the season-opening series at Iowa, but injured his shoulder in his last preseason bullpen to wind up on the shelf (missed 72G; Clippers went 40-32). He was sent to Arizona at the end of May to rehab, appearing in 4G for the Guardians.

Bad Bookends:

On 7/19 vs. Indianapolis, Gomez gave up a career worst 7ER to add over two runs to his season ERA (5.06 to 7.08). He then locked in at St. Paul on 7/25 (5.1IP, 0ER) and 7/31 vs. Toledo (5.1IP, 1ER) to shave over two runs off his ERA (7.08 to 4.94), before allowing a new career worst of 9ER at Syracuse on 8/8 (ERA jumped back to 6.82). Gomez surrendered 4HR to the Mets on 8/8 (20BF) and gave up 2HR in each of 3GS from 7/2-7/19 (59BF; had 0HR to 40BF from 7/25-7/31).

House of Horror:

Through his first six weeks in the IL, Gomez pitched at Omaha, Lehigh Valley and St. Paul, accumulating a 1.93ERA (14.0IP, 3ER) and holding hitters to a .146 average (7x48) with a .333SLG (2HR). He was then greeted rudely in a loss at Syracuse on 8/8 (3.1IP, 9ER, 4HR). Gomez has also struggled in Huntington Park, registering a 7.34ERA (30.2IP, 25ER), while opponents have hit .286 (24x119) with a .563SLG (8HR).

Right Stuff:

While in the Rookie League, Gomez mowed down opposing right-handers, racking up 10K against 21BF (48%; 4K to 23BF on the left side, 17%). When they did put the bat on the ball (5x20, .250), righties notched 3XBH (all doubles; .400SLG), compared to 0XBH from lefties (5x17, .295). His strikeout rate in Triple-A is fairly even (29K against 122BF from the left and 23K vs. 111BF from the right), but right handers are still teeing off when they do connect (26x95, 8HR, .632SLG).
