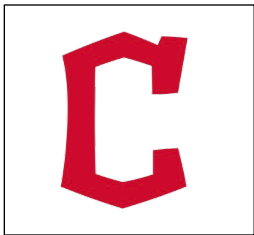

2024 MEDIA GUIDELINES

SEASON CREDENTIALS

Season credentials for the 2024 season will only be issued to legitimate news organizations that cover the Captains on a daily basis. Season credential requests can be submitted online through the [Captains Full Season Media Credential Application](#).

DAILY CREDENTIALS

Daily credentials will be issued to individuals or organizations who do not qualify for season credentials. The Captains Media Relations Department should be notified **24 hours in advance** of the game or event for which daily credentials are being requested. Requests can be made online through the [Captains Single Game Media Credential Application](#). Once approved, credentials will be available for pickup at the will call window.

WEBSITES, BLOGGERS AND FREELANCERS

Bloggers, freelance writers and photographers may request daily credentials, which will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis. Credential requests will be accepted or denied based on spacing, scheduling and the discretion of the Captains Media Relations Department. Requests can be submitted online through the [Captains Single Game Media Credential Application](#).

CREDENTIAL PICKUP

The Captains will notify those qualifying for season credentials on an individual basis prior to the season regarding pickup. Daily credentials will only be available for pickup at the media will call window.

PRESS BOX ACCESS

The Captains will assign press box seats to a number of publications. Only media with an assigned seat will be granted access to the press box. Please note that only **one (1)** media member per publication will be allowed to use their publication's assigned seat each game. Please plan accordingly if multiple members of your organization plan to cover a game.

PRESS BOX SEATING

As mentioned above, press box seating will be assigned. Seats will be socially distanced and marked with the name of the publication. Please remain in your assigned seat in the press box.

ALTERNATE PRESS SEATING

Due to limited press box space, the Captains have designated **five (5)** seating bowl seats for any media that does not have an assigned press box seat.

ARRIVAL

Approved media is permitted to enter Classic Auto Group Park up to **four (4)** hours prior to first pitch.

INTERVIEW REQUESTS

The Captains Media Relations Department is happy to assist members of the media with getting interviews with Captains players and coaching staff. Media members wishing to schedule an interview for a feature story must contact the Captains Media Relations Department at least **48 hours** prior to the requested interview time. Interview requests do not guarantee interview availability.

CLUBHOUSE ACCESS

Clubhouse access will be determined on a case-by-case basis. Contact lpotosky@captainsbaseball.com for more information.

SOCIAL MEDIA/LIVE STREAMING

In accordance with Minor League Baseball rules, unauthorized live streaming of in-game action via social media or other platforms is prohibited.

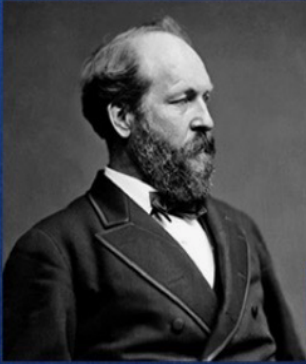
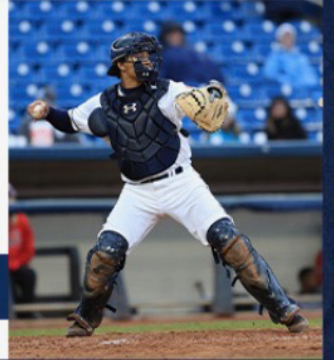

Roberto Hernández was the first Captain to ever reach MLB, and was eventually named an All-Star in 2010. His 19 wins in 2007 were tied for the most on Cleveland's roster, as he helped lead the team to the 2007 ALCS.



Kevin Kouzmanoff became the first player in MLB history to hit a grand slam on the first Major League pitch of his career. On September 2, 2006, [his grand slam in the top of the first inning](#) helped propel Cleveland to a 6-5 win over the Texas Rangers.



Josh Tomlin earned 69 wins and threw 736 strikeouts in his 12-year MLB career. He tallied a career-best 13 wins in 2016, the second-most on Cleveland's roster, which helped lead the team to the 2016 World Series.



Chris Archer was a two-time All-Star with the Tampa Bay Rays during his 10-year MLB career. He earned 63 wins and threw 1,454 career strikeouts, and is now an assistant to the Los Angeles Dodgers' Baseball Operations Department.

José Ramírez has had arguably the best MLB career of any Captain to date. The Cleveland third baseman has been named a five-time All-Star, four-time Silver Slugger Award winner, and five-time Gold Glove Award finalist in his first 11 Major League seasons.



Roberto Pérez is one of just three catchers in Cleveland franchise history to win a Gold Glove Award, winning consecutive Gold Gloves in 2019 and 2020. Offensively, he has recorded 314 hits, 57 doubles, 55 home runs, and 193 RBI in his first 10 Major League seasons.

Francisco Lindor has had a stellar MLB career so far. The New York Mets shortstop has been named a four-time All-Star, three-time Silver Slugger Award winner, and two-time Gold Glove Award winner in his first nine Major League seasons. He is also the only Captain to ever win a Platinum Glove Award, taking home the American League honor with Cleveland in 2016.



Joey Wendle was named an All-Star with the Tampa Bay Rays in 2021. In his first eight Major League seasons, he has hit .263 with 553 hits, 128 doubles, 32 home runs, 219 RBI, and 61 stolen bases across three different MLB teams.

Shane Bieber has had a strong MLB career so far. The Cleveland ace has been named a two-time All-Star and won a 2022 Gold Glove Award in his first six MLB seasons. He is also the only Captain to ever be named a Cy Young Award winner or MLB All-Star Game MVP, taking home the honors in 2020 and 2019, respectively.



Triston McKenzie has become a mainstay in Cleveland's starting rotation. The right-hander has earned 18 wins and thrown 384 strikeouts in his first four MLB seasons. In 2022, he ranked top-10 in the American League in WHIP (0.95, third), opposing batting average (.201, fourth), innings pitched (191.1, sixth), ERA (2.96, ninth), and strikeouts (190, 10th).



Óscar González cemented his legacy as a Cleveland postseason hero in 2022. On October 8, 2022, [his walk-off solo home run in the bottom of the 15th inning](#) led the Guardians to the ALDS. One week later, [his walk-off two-run single](#) gave Cleveland a 2-1 series lead over the New York Yankees in the 2022 ALDS.



Nolan Jones has become one of the premier players for the Colorado Rockies. Last year, in his first full Major League season, he hit .297 with 109 hits, 22 doubles, 20 home runs, 62 RBI, 20 stolen bases, and a .931 OPS, finishing fourth in the 2023 NL Rookie of the Year Award voting.

Bo Naylor has become a mainstay catcher for the Cleveland Guardians. Last season, he hit .237 with 47 hits, 13 doubles, 11 home runs, 32 RBI, five stolen bases, and an .809 OPS in 67 games. His 1.113 OPS from August 19th through the end of the regular season led the American League (minimum 90 plate appearances).



Tanner Bibee quickly burst onto the MLB scene last year. In his rookie campaign, he went 10-4 with a 2.98 ERA, 141 strikeouts, and a 1.18 WHIP in 142.0 innings pitched, finishing as the runner-up for the 2023 AL Rookie of the Year Award. He became the first AL rookie pitcher to record at least 10 wins, 140 strikeouts, and a sub-3.00 ERA in their debut season since 2014.

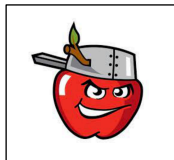

MAKING AN IMPACT ON THE MAINLAND

TRIO OF FORMER CAPTAINS MAKE HISTORY IN FIRST MAJOR LEAGUE SEASONS



HISTORY MADE ON THE MAINLAND

- 2021 Captains **Logan Allen** and **Tanner Bibee** along with 2022 Captain **Gavin Williams** formed a formidable pitching trio in their first Major League seasons with Cleveland.
- In their first big league seasons, Allen, Bibee and Williams combined for a 3.35 ERA, the lowest of any American League rookie trios with 200-plus innings pitched since 2014.
- Struck out a combined 341 batters, tied for the most by an AL rookie trio since 2000 and tied for the second-most since 1974.
- Tossed a combined 349.1 frames, fourth-most by an MLB rookie trio since 2013.
- Combined for 22 quality starts (Six-plus earned runs, three-or-less runs) in 65 total starts.

FIRST YEARS ON THE LAKEFRONT

- Bibee finished as the runner-up for AL Rookie of the Year and was one six Major League pitchers with a sub-3.00 ERA and 140-plus innings pitched.
- Allen went 7-8 with a 3.81 ERA in 24 starts, finishing second on the team in strikeouts (119), tied-second in wins (5), and third in innings pitched (125.1)...Joined Herb Score as the only two Cleveland rookies to begin career with eight strikeouts in consecutive outings.
- Williams made 16 starts, going 3-5 with a 3.25 ERA, the ninth-best ERA in the majors from June 21 to the end of the season with a minimum 75 innings.

SETTING SAIL FOR SHORE

- After posting a 3.10 ERA in five starts at Triple-A Columbus, Allen was the first to make his Major League debut April 23 versus Miami, tossing six innings of one-run ball.
- Three days later on April 23, Bibee was the next to don a Cleveland uniform after just three starts with Triple-A Columbus, getting the win with one run allowed and eight strikeouts in eight innings in his MLB debut versus Colorado.
- Williams, Cleveland's No. 2 prospect by MLB.com before the season, went 5.2 innings allowing four runs and striking out four in his MLB debut June 21 versus Oakland, a 7-6 win.

A SERIES 107 YEARS IN THE MAKING

- In the series against Toronto Aug. 7-10, Bibee, Williams and Allen held the Blue Jays to one run in 19 innings.
- Became the first Cleveland rookie trio to allow just one run in three-straight starts since **Stan Coveleski**, **Jim Bagby** and **Al Gould** did it Aug. 1-3, 1916 against the Washington Senators.

CAREERS IN LAKE COUNTY

- In 2021, Allen made nine starts for the Captains, going 5-0 with a 1.58 ERA, 67 strikeouts and 13 walks in 51.1 innings.
- Allen's 2021 Captains rotation mate Bibee began the season in Lake County, making 12 starts and going 2-1 with a 2.59 ERA, 86 strikeouts and 13 walks in 59 innings.
- In 2022, Williams made nine starts in Lake County, going 2-1 with a 1.40 ERA, 67 strikeouts and 14 walks in 45 innings.

NEW SKIPPER ON THE SHIP

- In manager **Omir Santos'** first year at the helm, Lake County went 65-64, finishing fifth out of six in the Midwest League East Division.
- Went 34-30 in the second half of the season, finishing third out of six in the division during that span.

NEW SEASON, NEW OWNERSHIP

- In addition to a new manager in Santos, 2023 marked the first year under new ownership.
- On January 17, **Alan Miller** and former Seattle Seahawks punter **Jon Ryan** of COLLiDE Sport were announced majority owners of the Lake County Captains.
- Miller and Ryan also operate the West Coast League's Portland Pickles.

20 YEARS OF MAJOR LEAGUE FUN WITH THE CAPTAINS

- 2023 marked the 20th season of Lake County Captains Baseball.
- After the Columbus Red Stixx were purchased in 2003, they were moved to Eastlake and became the Lake County Captains.
- 2023 would be the team's 21st season, but the 2020 Minor League Baseball season was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Entering 2024, Lake County has an all-time regular season record of 1,373-1,361 (.502).

FOUR-STRAIGHT WINNING SEASONS

- Earned its fourth-straight season over .500 in 2023 with a 65-64 record.
- In their last four seasons, the Captains are 280-236 (.543) during that span.

FINISHING STRONG

- Ended the 2023 season on a two-game winning streak with a 5-1 win Sept. 9 and 3-2 win versus Lansing.
- Outscored the Lugnugs 29-9 in the final series, going 5-1 to win the season-ending set.
- Won four of the last five series against Lansing, Beloit, Peoria and South Bend.

WALK-OFF HEROES

- Walked it off nine times at Classic Park in 2023.
- Last walk-off was a game-winning sacrifice fly by INF **Kahlil Watson** Sept. 9 versus Lansing.
- Last walk-off home run was OF **Jorge Burgos'** second blast of the night May 30 versus Quad Cities.

ONE-RUN BALL

- Were 28-16 in games decided by one run, the most one-run wins in the Midwest League.
- The 28 one-run victories were the most by a Midwest League team since South Bend's 29 in 2019 and the most by a Captains team since 28 in 2016 and 29 in 2014.

SONIC YOUTH

- 28 of the 47 Captains who played a game in 2023 were aged 22 or younger.
- 12 Captains were 21 or younger, all position players.
- Those 12 players accounted for 335 of Lake County's 500 RBI (67%).

TOUGH TO HIT

- Allowed the second-fewest hits in the Midwest League in 2023 with 959.
- Held opposing batters to a .234 average, fourth-lowest in the Midwest League.
- The pitching staff struck out 1,182 batters, fifth-most in the Midwest League.

SEE THE BALL, BE THE BALL

- Finished 2023 sixth in the Midwest League with 530 walks.
- Lake County drew its most walks in franchise history as a part of the Midwest League, and its most since it led the South Atlantic League with 609 in 2007.
- INF Will Bartlett led the team with 55, posting an 18.25% walk rate.

HOTTER THAN JULY

- Batted a scorching .285 (233-for-816) in July, the highest in the Midwest League.
- Belted 18 homers, seven triples and 49 doubles for a Midwest League-best .796 OPS in July.

HIGH CLIMBERS

- INF **Juan Brito**, LHP **Jaime Arias** and RHP **Juan Zapata** all reached Triple-A Columbus after appearing in a combined 59 games at Lake County.
- Brito played 35 games at Lake County, 87 at Double-A Akron and five at Triple-A Columbus...Batted .265 with four homers, 14 RBI and 29 runs scored for the Captains.
- Arias made four appearances at Lake County, started four of five games at Double-A Akron, and started one of two games at Triple-A Columbus...Went 1-0 with a 4.70 ERA, eight strikeouts and one walk in four relief appearances for the Captains.

- After being activated off the 60-day injured list July 29, CLE's current No. 1 prospect/MLB's No. 35 prospect OF **Chase DeLauter** began a torrid stretch hitting safely in 36 of 42 games.
- DeLauter's .366 clip led the Midwest League among hitters with at least 88 at-bats.
- From July 29 to Sept. 9, DeLauter slashed .366/.403/.549 with four homers, 18 doubles and 31 RBI.
- Was called up to Double-A Akron and went 8-for-28 with one home run, three doubles and four RBI in nine games.

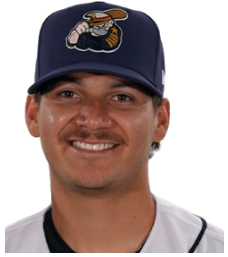
