TODAY'S GAMES: Having secured their first series victory of 2024, the Space Cowboys go for their fourth straight victory in the finale against Las Vegas... Sugar Land went 2-4 at home versus the Aviators in 2023 and 5-7 overall... All-time, the Space Cowboys are 11-7 at Constellation Field against Las Vegas and 18-12 overall.

ABOUT SATURDAY NIGHT: Trey Cabbage, Jesús Bastidas and Joey Loperfido each hit a solo home runs in three consecutive frames in the second, third and fourth to build a 3-0 Sugar Land lead... RHP Rhett Kouba didn't allow a run through his first five inning and departed after facing one batter in the sixth... Las Vegas scored two to move within a run, but Sugar Land got an RBI ground out from Pedro León and an RBI single from Luke Berryhill to push back in front 5-2... LHP Bryan King threw a 1-2-3 eighth and RHP Drew Strotman left the bases loaded to secure his first career save in a 5-3 Sugar Land win.

ROSTER MOVES: 4/7 - RHP Justin Verlander assigned to Sugar Land on Major League rehab... RHP Forrest Whitley activated from the IL... RHP Shawn Dubin sent to Sugar Land on Major League rehab... C CJ Stubbs transferred to Corpus Christi... 4/6 - INF Jacob Amaya acquired in a trade from Miami and optioned to Sugar Land... RHP Mark Washington released... 4/5 - LHP Parker Mushinski optioned to Sugar Land... OF Justin Dirden released...

HOME GROWN TALENT (UPDATE): Sugar Land's active roster has 13 players that were drafted by the Astros, three free agent signings, three players acquired in trades, two international free agents, one MiLB Rule 5 Draft pick and two undrafted free agent.

PROSPECTING: The Space Cowboys roster sports six of the Astros' Top 30 prospects per MLB Pipeline, including: RHP Spencer Arrighetti (#3), OF/INF Joey Loperfido (#6), RHP Rhett Kouba (#14), INF Will Wagner (#15), INF Jacob Amaya (#23) and OF Pedro León (#27).

SERIES-OUSLY SPEAKING: With a victory on Saturday night, the Space Cowboys picked up their first series win on the year in their first six-game series... In 2023, Sugar Land went 6-15-2 in six-game series including 4-8-1 overall at Constellation Field.

FAST STARTERS: Through the first eight games of the year, the Space Cowboys own a +13 run differential in the first inning, having plated 13 runs without giving up a run in the opening stanza... The Space Cowboys have also scored first in seven of eight games.

LOWDOWN ON LOPERFIDO: OF Joey Loperfido has followed up his breakout 2023 season with a hot start to 2024... Loperfido homered in his first at bat on Opening Night at Round Rock, and launched another first inning home run on 3/30, part of a two-homer game... It was the fourth multi-homer game of Loperfido's career, with the last coming on 4/21/23 vs. San Antonio while Loperfido was with Double-A Corpus Christi.

The 24-year-old has brought his power to Constellation Field, homering on Wednesday and Saturday, giving him five home runs in seven games played, tied for the Pacific Coast League lead.

LOOK WHO'S ON THE HILL: RHP Justin Verlander is scheduled to start for the Space Cowboys on Sunday as he returns from right shoulder inflammation... Sunday will be Verlander's first appearance with the Space Cowboys and the three-time Cy Young award winners first rehab assignment as a member of the Astros organization... Verlander made one appearance with Double-A Binghamton on a rehab assignment while he was a member of the Mets organization on April 28, 2023, throwing 4.2 scoreless innings with two hits, a walk and six strikeouts on 69 pitches... In his career, Verlander has made just 23 appearances in the Minor Leagues, and today will be just his fourth appearance in a Minor League game since he was called up by the Tigers in 2005 (Toledo - two in 2015; Binghamton - one in 2023).

NUNES GETS THE CALL: Space Cowboys bullpen catcher Caleb Nunes will be in the bullpen for Sugar Land for the final time on Sunday afternoon... Beginning Monday, Nunes will be in the Houston Astros bullpen as a catcher for the Major League team... Nunes has been the Space Cowboys bullpen catcher since the team became the Astros Triple-A affiliate in 2021.

HITS FROM HAVANA: OF Pedro León has hit safely in all six games he has played in so far in 2024, beginning the season by batting .313 (8-for-24) with three doubles and six RBI... León has also driven in a run in four consecutive games.

VAN-WHY NOT: RHP Logan VanWey has not allowed a run in his first three outings in 2024, throwing more than an inning in two of his first three appearances... The righty has given up just two hits in 4.2 innings and struck out five, including two scoreless frames on Thursday night.

COMEBACK HABIT: The Space Cowboys have won two games in their series with Las Vegas after trailing heading into the sixth inning... In games where they have trailed this year, Sugar Land has come back to tie the game or take the lead in three of five contests.

TWIN KILLINGS: Defensively, the Space Cowboys have turned 10 double plays in their first eight games, getting at least one twin killing in seven of eight games... Sugar Land leads the Pacific Coast League in fielding percentage (.989) and is third in double plays... The Space Cowboys turned 143 double plays in 2023, which ranked seventh in the PCL.

ONE-HIT WONDER: Sugar Land one-hit the Aviators on Friday night, hurling their first shutout of 2024 in just their seventh game of the year... It took Sugar Land until September 5, 2023 to throw their first shutout last season (Game 133)... Last night is the fourth one-hitter thrown in Space Cowboys history, with the last coming on September 28, 2022 at Round Rock.

WHIT-BOMBS RETURN: After winning the Joe Baumann Award in 2023 for leading Minor League Baseball in home runs with 35, INF Shay Whitcomb uncorked his first long ball of the year on 3/31 at Round Rock, a grand slam in the ninth... Whitcomb's grand slam left the bat at 111.4 mph and needed just 4.4 second to sail 430 feet out of the ballpark.

WALK THIS WAY: On Tuesday night, the Space Cowboys drew 13 walks, which ties the franchise record for most walks in a single game... The other time Sugar Land earned 13 free passes was in Game 2 of a doubleheader on August 19, 2022... The Space Cowboys scored 17 runs in the sixth inning of that game and would end up winning 21-4 in seventh innings.

HISTORY FOR BLANCO: Former Space Cowboys reliever and starter RHP Ronel Blanco (2021-23) authored the 17th no-hitter in Astros' franchise history on April 1 at Minute Maid Park, walking just two batters... The no-hitter came in Blanco's 8th career start in the Majors... Blanco becomes the first Space Cowboys hurler to make his debut and then throw a no-hitter in the Major Leagues... LHP Framber Valdez appeared in two games with Sugar Land in 2021 before throwing his no-hitter on August 1, 2023.

RIDE THE BIKE!: On June 24, 2023, OF Pedro León hit for the cycle in reverse order, homering in the 3rd, tripling in the 5th, doubling in the 7th and singling in the 8th... It is the first cycle in Space Cowboys history and the first for León at any level in his career... The La Habana native also reached on a walk and a hit by pitch and scored all six times he reached, setting a new single-game record for runs scored in Space Cowboys history.

SEEING 20-20-20: Both Pedro León (23 2B, 21 HR) and Joey Loperfido (27 2B, 25 HR) posted seasons in 2023 in which they had at least 20 doubles and 20 home runs while stealing at least 20 bases (León - 21; Loperfido - 27)... They were two of just 23 players in Minor League Baseball to have at least 20 doubles, 20 homers and 20 stolen bases, with Corpus Christi OF Kenedy Corona joining them (21 2B, 22 HR, 32 SB)... INF Shay Whitcomb came just one double shy of joining that group, but along with León and Loperfido was one of just 33 players with at least 20 steals and 20 home runs.

UN DULCE IDENTIDAD: As part of MiLB's 'Copa de la Diversión,' the Space Cowboys will once again rebrand on multiple occasions in 2024 as "Los Dulces de Sugar Land." The name is to honor the Latino community's contribution to the foundation and growth of the City of Sugar Land, which are as real as the sugar that gives our hometown its name. The primary logo of 'Los Dulces de Sugar Land,' is vibrant and features a watermelon candy capped in a flame of chamoy and chili powder.

WHERE TO FIND US: All 150 Space Cowboys games can be heard once again be heard on ESPN 92.5 FM (Gow Media). An audio streaming link is also available at slspacecowboys.com. All Space Cowboys games can be seen on MiLB.TV, MLB.TV, the MiLB App and on Bally Live. Garrett Greene returns for his second season as the primary play-by-play broadcaster for Sugar Land and will be on the call for all 150 games. He'll be joined at home and on select road games by Gerald Sanchez, who continues in his fourth season calling games for Sugar Land.

NOW HERE'S A STOREY: Mickey Storey returns for his fifth season as the manager of the Astros' Triple-A affiliate and his fourth with Sugar Land, continuing as the only manager in Sugar Land's history since they became affiliated with the Astros. Storey joined the Astros organization as a coach in 2016 and has managed with Single-A Quad Cities (2018) and Triple-A Round Rock (2019), along with three seasons in Sugar Land. Storey appeared in nine seasons at the professional level as a right-handed pitcher, including stints at the Major League level with the Astros (2012) and Blue Jay (2013). He appeared in four collegiate seasons at Florida Atlantic and was selected by the Oakland Athletics in the 31st round of the 2008 MLB Draft.

REST OF THE CREW: Joining manager Mickey Storey on the Space Cowboys coaching staff are pitching coach Thomas Whitsett, hitting coach Aaron Westlake and development coach Wladimir Sutil. Whitsett enters his first season as the Space Cowboys pitching coach, replacing Erick Abreu, who joined the Atlanta Braves in 2024 as their bullpen coach. Whitsett was the Astros' Assistant Pitching Coordinator in 2023 and served as the Pitching Coach for Double-A Corpus Christi in 2022. He also worked as a pitching coach for Single-A Fayetteville in 2019 before spending a year out of the Astros organization as the director of player development for pitching at the University of Arizona in 2021. Westlake returns for his second season as Sugar Land's hitting coach and previously was the hitting coach in Double-A Corpus Christi in 2022 and a development coach for the Florida Gulf Coast League Astros in 2021. Sutil enters his third season on the Space Cowboys staff after serving as the manager for the Astros' Florida Complex League team in 2021. He's worked as a manager for Astros affiliates at the Short-Season and Gulf Coast League levels, joining the organization as a coach in 2014.

A LITTLE ABOUT US: Through its first nine seasons, Sugar Land played in the independent Atlantic League of Professional Baseball. They won the Atlantic League Championship in '16 and '18 and appeared in the postseason in five of nine seasons. Sugar Land still holds Atlantic League single-season records for wins (95) and winning percentage (.679) from its '13 season. Sugar Land was managed by former Major Leaguers Gary Gaetti (2012-17) and Pete Incaviglia (2018-20). As an independent team, Sugar Land went 601-502. Notable people to appear for Sugar Land include: LHP Scott Kazmir, RHP Roger Clemens, IF Rafael Palmeiro, Tracy McGrady, IF James Loney, C Derek Norris, OF Willy Taveras and RHP Felipe Paulino.

- Signed with the New York Mets as a free agent on December 7, 2022.
- Placed on the 15-day IL on March 28 with a low grade teres major strain.
- Sent on Rehab assignment to Binghamton on April 28... Made one appearances, throwing 4.2 innings, giving up two hits and a walk while striking out six on 69 pitches, 52 strikes.... Activated by the Mets on May 4... Made 16 starts with New York, going 6-5 with a 3.15 ERA in 94.1 innings.

Across 175.0 innings, struck out 185 batters to 29 walks... Led MLB in ERA and WHIP (0.83) while leading the American League in Wins and batting average against (.186).

CAREER NOTES:

- Three Time Cy Young Winner (2011, 2019, 2022)... 2011 AL MVP... 2006 AL Rookie of the Year... 2017 ALCS MVP... Nine Time All-Star (2007, 2009-13, 2018-19, 2022)... One of just six pitchers in Major League history with three no-hitters (Nolan Ryan - 7, Sandy Koufax - 4, Bob Feller - 3, Cy Young - 3, Larry Corcoran - 3)... One of 10 pitchers in MLB history win MVP and Cy Young Award in the same season (2011)... Ranks 12th in MLB history in strikeouts (3,342), one of just 19 pitchers in MLB history to reach 3,000 career strikeouts... One of two players to have won the MVP, ROY & Cy Young (Don Newcombe)... Only pitcher in Major League history to win an MVP, Rookie of the Year and multiple Cy Young Awards.
