LAST NIGHT: The Skeeters were dealt a 3-2 walk-off loss following a walk-off home run from Yohel Pozo off right-hander Ronel Blanco. Pozo also hit a walk-off home run against the Skeeters on May 17. Bryan De La Cruz delivered both Skeeters RBIs, with a sacfly in the first and solo homer in the sixth.

ROSTER MOVES: Prior to their game Friday in Cleveland, the Astros recalled IF Taylor Jones from the Skeeters to replace Yordan Alvarez (Paternity List). It's Jones' fourth stint with the Astros this season. He's hit .347 with two home runs and 14 RBIs in 13 games with the Skeeters this year.

SHOW TIME: The Astros selected the contract of LHP Ryan Hartman prior to their game Wednesday vs. Baltimore and he made his Major League debut on Wednesday. Hartman allowed a run on three hits through 2 1/3 innings. He's the second player to be called up from the Skeeters and make their MLB debut since their Opening Day on May 6. RHP Ralph Garza Jr. is the other player. IF Alex De Goti, OF Ronnie Dawson and RHP Peter Solomon also made their MLB debuts prior to the Skeeters' Opening Day. Solomon was recalled prior to the Astros' game Thursday in Cleveland. Solomon tossed a scoreless inning in the Astros' 7-2 win.

PLAYER OF THE MONTH: The Skeeters announced Friday that OF Jake Meyers was named the team's June Player of the Month. Meyers hit .337 (33x98) with 9 home runs, 17 RBIs and a 1.072 OPS in 24 games in June. He had a breakout series from June 17-22 in El Paso, hitting seven home runs with 11 RBIs over a five-day stretch.

JAKE RAKES: Over his last 13 games, Jake Meyers has hit .500 (28x56) with eight home runs and 17 RBIs. He leads the Skeeters with three multi-homer games this season. His 14 home runs lead the Skeeters and are fourth-most in Triple A West. He set his career high in home runs, surpassing his previous mark of nine homers from '19 with Fayetteville (A+) and Corpus Christi (AA). Meyers is also third in Triple A West with a 1.032 OPS, fifth with a .341 average and first with 62 hits.

TEXAS TWO-STEP: The Skeeters and Express are set to meet for the 15th time this se ason on Saturday. The two teams are set to meet a total of 30 times this year. Prior to Thursday's series opener, they last met on 6/15 when the Skeeters won a 4-2 rain-shortened contest at Constellation Field. Bryan De La Cruz has hit .308 (13x52) with four home runs and 10 RBIs in 13 games vs. Round Rock.

SURVIVAL KIT: Over his last two outings, LHP Kit Scheetz has tossed three scoreless innings, striking out six batters and allowing just one hit.

RISPY BUSINESS: CJ Hinojosa has hit .371 (13x35) with 18 RBIs while hitting with runners in scoring position this season. He leads all Skeeters player in the category with at least 20 at-bats with runners in scoring position.

REHAB STINTS: Bryan Abreu and Enoli Paredes continued their MLB Rehab Assignments with the Skeeters on Friday. Each threw a scoreless inning of relief, setting Round Rock down in order in both innings. Abreu logged 15 pitches, and Paredes 13 pitches. It was Abreu's third appearance with the Skeeters in his rehab stint. Abreu has been on the 10-Day IL since May 29 with a right calf strain. Prior to their game Saturday, the Astros activated Paredes from the 10-Day IL and optioned him to the Skeeters. Paredes had been on the IL since June 11 with a right shoulder strain.

HINO'HERO': CJ Hinojosa has hit .342 (25x73) with a home run and nine RBIs over his last 18 games. Hinojosa is tied for sixth in Triple A West with 14 doubles.

SUPER 'SIRI'OUS: Jose Siri has hit .366 (15x41) with eight RBIs over his last 11 games. Siri is fifth in Triple A West with 40 RBIs. He's collected four-or-more RBIs in five games this season to lead the Skeeters (no other player has recorded more than one of such games). Siri is also tied for first in Triple A West with 13 stolen bases.

GEAUX PAPPY: Michael Papierski ranks fourth in Triple A West with a .427 on-base percentage. The LSU alum has reached safely in 14 straight games. He's also hit .368 (14x38) with a home run and nine RBIs over that stretch.

K-MART: Seth Martinez is second of Triple A West relievers with 40 strikeouts and is third with 27.1 IP

OH SO SWEET: The Skeeters are third in all of non-complex Minor League Baseball teams with a .284 average.

FANTASTIC FOURS: A Skeeters player has recorded a four-hit game in four of their last 11 games. The Skeeters had not had a four-hit game prior to their 24-15 win on 6/20 in El Paso. Jake Meyers went 4-for-5 on Saturday and Bryan De La Cruz went 4-for-5 with two doubles and two RBIs on Tuesday. Michael Papierski (4x6) and JJ Matijevic (4x5) collected their four-hit games in Monday's win. CJ Hinojosa (4x6) and Meyers (4x5) recorded the first two four-hit games for the Skeeters this season in Sunday's win.

TRIPLE A WEST, EAST LEADERS: The Skeeters are in first place in Triple A West, ahead of Oklahoma City by a half-game. The Skeeters have remained in first place since their win on 6/18 at El Paso

- 7 home runs were a single-game record ... Surpassed previous high of six home runs from July 2, 2019 vs. the Long Island Ducks ... Tied for the most from a Triple A team this season and tied for second-most in all of Mil B
- 23 hits were a single-game record ... Surpassed the previous record of 22 hits on September 9, 2016, vs. the Southern Maryland Blue Crabs ... Second-most from a Triple A team this season
- Jake Meyers became the first player in Skeeters history to hit three home runs in a game
- 12 extra-base hits matched Skeeters single-game record set on September 9, 2016, and are the most from a Triple A team this season and tied for second-most of all MiLB teams
- 50 total bases is a franchise record ... Surpassed previous high of 37 from July 2, 2019 ... Most from a MiLB team this season

MiLB HONORS: RHP Brett Conine was named the Triple A West Pitcher of the Month for May by Minor League Baseball. Conine went 4-0 with a 0.95 ERA (2 ER/19 IP) through four games (three starts) in May. He recorded the lowest ERA in Triple A West and led the league in wins, opponent batting average (.167) and WHIP (0.95) at the end of the month.

CLOSE TO HOME: Based on approximate mileage, the Skeeters are located second-closest to the stadium of their parent club out of Triple A teams. The St. Paul Saints are located approximately 11 miles from Minnesota's Target Field.

PUT IT ON THE MANTEL: Ronnie Dawson, **Alex De Goti** and **Peter Solomon** each made their Major League debuts with the Astros this season. Dawson went 1x5 with a run through 3 G, De Goti went 2x6 with a run and RBI through 6 G and Solomon tossed a scoreless 2 IP in relief, allowing just one hit and striking out two. **Ralph Garza Jr.** recieved his first promotion to the Major Leagues on May 26. He made his Major League debut on May 29 vs. San Diego and threw an inning of relief. **Ryan Hartman** was promoted on June 30 and made his MLB debut that night vs. Baltimore at Minute Maid Park.

FRANCHISE RECORD: Jose Siri drove in seven runs on May 13 at Round Rock, setting the Skeeters franchise record, including their n--ine seasons as an independent franchise. Siri accomplished the feat with a grand slam and three-run double. Five players in Skeeters history had recorded six RBIs in a single game. The seven RBIs are tied for the second-most in a game this season of Triple A players.

NOW HERE'S A STOREY: Mickey Storey is entering his third year as the manager of the Astros Triple A affiliate. He led Round Rock to the best record in Triple A in 2019 (84-56) and to the Pacific Coast League Finals. Storey got his first managerial job in the Astros system in 2018 with Class A Quad Cities, winning the Western Division of the Midwest League. Storey appeared at the MLB level with the Astros in 2012 and the Blue Jays in 2013 as a right-handed pitcher. He still holds numerous career pitching records for Florida Atlantic University. He finished his career second all-time in strikeouts, tied for second in wins and finished top 10 in strikeouts per nine innings, games started, fewest walks per nine innings and innings pitched. Storey

REST OF THE CREW: Joining Mickey Storey on his staff are pitching cocach Erick Abreu, hitting coach Ben Rosenthal and development coach Sean Connole. John Gregorich and A.J. Smith are the Skeeters' athletic trainers and Hazael Wessin is the team's strength and conditioning coach. Abreu is in his eighth season with the Astros organization and his first as the organization's Triple A pitching coach. Rosenthal is in his fifth season with the Astros and third as the htiting coach for their Triple A affiliate. Connole is is in his second season with the Astros and his first as the development coach for the team's Triple A affiliate.

A LITTLE ABOUT US: Through their first nine seasons, the Skeeters played in the independent Atlantic League of Professional Baseball. They won the Atlantic League Championship in '16 and '18 and appeared in the post-season in five of nine seasons. The Skeeters still hold the Atlantic League single-season record for wins (95) and winning percentage (.679) from their '13 season. The Skeeters have been managed by former Major Leaguers Gary Gaetti (2012-17) and Pete Incaviglia (2018-20). As an independent team, the Skeeters went 601-502. Notable people to appear for the Skeeters include: LHP Scott Kazmir, RHP Roger Clemens, IF Rafael Palmeiro, Tracy McGrady, IF James Loney, C Derek Norris, OF Willy Taveras and RHP Felipe Paulino
