ENMANUEL **DE JESUS** IS STAYING **CENTERED**

Sports are one of many things in life that bring people together. Through passion, fandom and pride, lovers of the game cheer for some of the best athletes in the world playing on their favorite team. Whether local, national, or international, sports seem to create some of the strongest, most inspiring and heartwarming stories that only fans can piece together.

Jumbo Shrimp pitcher Enmanuel De Jesus grew up in Valencia, Venezuela, the capital of the state of Carabobo. The state is in northwestern Venezuela and is located on the Río Cabriales River in the central highlands about 1,600 feet above sea level near the western shore of Lake Valencia. Today, it is considered one of Venezuela's two major industrial centers.

In De Jesus's native country, people live and die by baseball. It all started thanks to the "Heroes of '41," the team that helped the sport establish its roots as the country's pastime. In 1941, the national team pulled an upset that went down in history for the South American country, defeating Cuba and winning the Amateur World Series championship played in Havana. The heavy favorites going down set Venezuela in a craze and sparked the development of their professional league, Liga Venezolana de Béisbol Pro-

fesional (LVBP), which had its inaugural season just five years later.

"I will say, in Venezuela, the number one sport is baseball," De Jesus said. "They love the game, and they have a pretty good winnable league there."

With such a heavy presence, De Jesus had his favorite players he looked up to and still even admires today. Players like him, just from baseball-crazed Venezuela.

"I grew up watching Johan Santana," said De Jesus.
"I was always a big fan of him, especially since he was
a left-handed pitcher like me."

The two-time AL Cy Young winner is one of many stars born in De Jesus' native country. The now-26-year-old knew he wanted to follow the same path one day as his idol.

"Well, I was playing pool with my dad at home, and I get the call from the manager (Omar López)," De Jesus said. "He said he wanted me, and I was (in) 100 percent. I told him right away. Yeah, whatever you need, any role you need, I'm going to be 100 percent available for you."

That call would be for the opportunity to represent his country on one of the biggest stages, the World Baseball Classic.

"That was an unbelievable experience for me. I never thought I was going to be representing with my team at the WBC, De Jesus said. "When I got the call, I was so excited, it was a great opportunity and a great feeling being around all those guys. Growing up watching Miggy (Miguel Cabrera) and a lot of those guys, it was a great experience being a part of that team."

Being around those Hall of Fame-caliber players speaks volume, but part of the experience is forming those relationships on and off the diamond. One relationship that stuck with De Jesus was Pablo López, a former Jacksonville hurler who grew into a Miami Marlin and now a 2023 All-Star pitcher for the Minnesota Twins.

"We were playing catch up there," said De Jesus.
"I liked the way he managed himself, (the way he) practices and I am trying to pick stuff like that up."

Going into the WBC, he had talked to the coaching staff and was originally under the impression that he would be on the 50-man roster. However, once he got the call regarding the active roster, it was a dream come true. He knew that with an opportunity like this, he needed to prepare and take full advantage of his resources.

"I was trying to learn a lot from the veteran guys, like, especially, patience-wise," said De Jesus. "The way they managed themselves, and on the field, the way they take care of themselves, the way they put work in. And I learned a lot of things that I think can help me."

While the World Baseball Classic may be a peak in De Jesus' climb to the big leagues, his journey naturally commenced long before that.

"Well, I started playing ball when I was four years old," De Jesus said. "My mom put me playing ball because I had a lot of energy when I was a kid."


That little boy grew, taking steps just like Johan Santana and Pablo López did. And when De Jesus was 16, he signed with the Boston Red Sox. From there, he learned quickly that he had to attack every day with a goal.


"I got to move away from my family when I was 16 years old," said De Jesus. "But I cannot get used to this; I see these days as my job. So, it's like every year, I know I have to come to the States for a couple of months to do my job, do the best I can trying to get to the big leagues and wait for that call."

He stays goal-oriented with an approach to attack every day when he arrives at the ballpark.

"I'm trying to give the 100 percent that I can," De Jesus said. "Trying to get at least one percent better every day."

Playing now in Triple-A with a WBC appearance under his belt has gotten him steadily closer to his ultimate goal. Those are peaks. And while De Jesus

has played professionally for 10 years now, there have been times with bumps in the road and sacrifice. One percent isn't always easy to achieve.

For example, coming off the lights and glamor of the WBC, De Jesus missed nearly 40 games with an elbow injury, costing him the beginning of the 2023 season. He reiterated his approach of giving his all, his 100 percent, but he also had a plan on attacking the strike zone more.

"Coming back from my elbow injury wasn't that easy," said De Jesus. "But (I'm) trying to tie up the hitters, staying with my plan, and hopefully that is going to succeed."

With adversity comes stress, especially being extremely far from your home and loved ones. Leaning on family and friends is what keeps you going during those trials and tribulations. However, De Jesus refers to one thing his dad always told him when he was growing up.

"My dad always told me I got to be different than everybody," De Jesus said. "He told me you cannot be like all the other people; you should be a little bit different in a good way."

He has always taken his dad's advice to heart and implies his role model's message by trying to talk to everyone, make an impact, and learn along the way.

"I like to talk with everybody, I'm trying to learn ev-

erything, something every day, either a new language or something."

Coming from Venezuela he was forced to learn a different language and used his dad's moto to understand and be proficient in English.

"I have been playing here for 10 years, I have to learn," said De Jesus. "I put a lot of work my first couple years here and I put a goal: I got to learn a new language because this one I do to do for a living. I got to learn so I can communicate with the coaches and everybody on the team."

He did so by talking a lot, and not being afraid to conversate. He also was never afraid to make a mistake because that is a part of the process, just like in his pitching journey.

"I just got the friends talking, I was not afraid to talk," De Jesus said. "I am never afraid to talk with the guys even though I made some mistakes. I still make mistakes, but I'm not afraid to talk."

From Valencia, Venezuela to De Jesus' current location of Jacksonville, he continues to represent his country and family with pride. The "Heroes of '41" changed Venezuela, and De Jesus is a product of that change. His work ethic and goal-oriented approach have taken him to Triple-A and the World Baseball Classic. Exploiting that one percent difference every day, are the major leagues next?

Bragan Field at 121 Financial Ballpark, which opened in 2003, is one of the premier Minor League ballparks in North America.

The ballpark was the first completed project of the Better Jacksonville Plan. Featuring an old-fashioned design, brick facade and a grass seating berm, 121 Financial Ballpark reminds fans of the days of yesteryear and preserves all of the wonderful tradition baseball has to offer. The vivid sight lines capture the action up-close while providing fans with comfortable seating and easy access to concessions and restrooms.

121 Financial Ballpark features 12 luxury skyboxes, four skydecks, HD videoboards in left field and along the outfield walls, and a one-of-a-kind Tiki Terrace at the left field corner.

The ballpark has hosted three Major League Baseball exhibitions (2006, 2010, 2015), four ACC Baseball Tournaments (2006-09) and two Southern League All-Star games (2003, 2013). The 2013 Southern League All-Star game boasted a league-record 9,373 fans in attendance.

In 2016, owner Ken Babby invested \$1.8 million into the ballpark to add a new groups area directly behind the home

bullpen, a Tiki Terrace near the left-field foul pole, renovations to all 12 private suites and expansion of the suite-level, third-floor lounge to give all fans a climate-controlled space to overlook the playing field.

Since 2007, 121 Financial Ballpark has hosted a game in the annual college baseball series between in-state rivals, Florida State and Florida. The annual installment brings capacity crowds to 121 Financial Ballpark for their storied rivalry.

The ballpark features nearly 6,000 stadium-style chairs and can accommodate more than 11,000 fans with berm and bleacher seating. Has 12 luxury skyboxes and four sky decks, each of which having private seating. Ballpark is also completely wheelchair accessible, including the dugouts, camera wells and playing field.

The total estimated cost is \$34 million, paid for by Jack-sonville residents as part of a tax approved in 2000 to fund the "Better Jacksonville Plan," an initiative to improve the city's infrastructure. The adjacent Jacksonville Veterans Memorial Arena was also funded through the plan and was completed in November 2003.

HOW TO KEEP SCORE



BASEBALL BASICS: HOW TO KEEP SCORE

DIFFERENT FANS have different methods of keeping a scorecard, and many use their own notations. But here's a simple method:


If the hitter grounds out to shortstop, for example, write in "6-3," which shows the shortstop threw him out at first base. If the hitter flies out to left field, write a "7."

If the batter gets a hit, write in the hit according to which base he reached. Each corner of the box represents a base, with the lower-right corner being first.

If he singles, put a "-" in the lower right. If he doubles, write a "=" in the upper right, and so on. For a walk, use "BB" in the lower right. As the runner advances, mark the appropriate symbol in the appropriate corner.

If a runner scores, put a circle at the bottom of the box, and inside the circle put the symbol of the play and/or the player that drove him in. For example, if the No. 5 hitter drives in two runs with a single, mark his single in the bottom right of his box and mark a circle with the number "5" in it in the boxes of the runners who score. (Some people like to use uniform numbers here, so you can tell who did what, even after lineup changes.)

At the end of each inning, total the hits and runs for that inning only. At the end of the game you'll be able to add the innings total to get the game score





STARKVILLE PRIDE: HOME MEANS EVERYTHING TO JAKE MANGUM **By: Laura Burton**

While Jumbo Shrimp outfielder Jake Mangum may be playing professional baseball around the nation during the season, his roots in his home state of Mississippi have always run deep.

After developing a remarkably notable resume in high school, receiving offers from multiple Division I universities, and even committing to Alabama early on in his career, Mangum remained true to Mississippi by ultimately committing to play baseball in Starkville at Mississippi State.

"I committed to Alabama my freshman year of high school because my dad played football there, I grew up an Alabama football fan," Mangum said. "But at the end of the day, I wanted to stay in my home state of Mississippi and play baseball there because it means a lot to the state of Mississippi, we don't have a professional team, so we are very diehard with our colleges and with the love and support that those programs get, it was really hard not to go there.

"Being able to stay home and play for people you care about, you know, when your best friends growing up, your family friends, everyone you know is a Mississippi State fan, Ole Miss fan, Southern Miss fan, when you get to go play for them and have that bond, it's really really cool."

One person in particular who played a crucial role throughout Mangum's life, including his collegiate career,

and now professional baseball experience, is his father.

"My dad has always been my guy when it comes to basically anything in life," Mangum said. "I wouldn't have made it to college baseball if it wasn't for my dad."

The culture of gamedays in Mississippi, Mangum says, "is unbelievable. It's like an event. It's a party surrounded by a baseball game." He added, "I tell everyone that's a baseball fan, you gotta go check out a big Saturday night game in Starkville, definitely a bucket list thing for any big baseball fans."

Mississippi State has set the current NCAA record for the largest single-game on-campus baseball attendance at 15,586 and averages over 10,000 fans at any given game. The Bulldog fans' commitment to their school, and its athletic teams, are Mangum's favorite aspect of his collegiate experience.

"You aren't going to experience that anywhere," said Mangum. "The love and support that the school and program gets, that was the best part. Without guestion."

Mangum was selected by the New York Mets during the 2019 MLB Draft after finishing up his senior year at Mississippi State. He was traded to the Miami Marlins' organization in December of 2022


Mangum was a contributor during the Bulldogs 2019 National Championship run in Omaha.

After reflecting on his professional baseball experience thus far, Mangum stated, "Being my third full season of professional baseball in Triple-A, I can't ask for much more, and I'm happy where I'm at. I wouldn't change the experience I got from my senior year. I'm happy I experienced it, it was a great time and now I'm getting a shot at pro ball."

One of the main components that aided Mangum during his transition to professional baseball was the skill level of athletes and teams around Mississippi State and within the Southeastern Conference.

"We saw great pitching every day," said Mangum. "The pitching I saw in college really got me ready to hit professional pitching, so I'm thankful for that."

Another factor that aided Mangum during his transition was his teammates. Known affectionally to the Mississippi State fanbase as "The Mayor," he is truly a man of the people.



"Being around so many great teammates that really are going to have long baseball careers helped a lot, just being around people that are all striving for the same goal," Mangum said. "Since I got into pro ball, I've learned a lot that I had never learned in college, and vice-versa. Every day is an experience and the people around you can mold you into who you are."

The city of Starkville is over 550 miles away from Jacksonville, but there have been numerous fans who have made the trip to watch Mangum at 121 Financial Ballpark.

"It's awesome," said Mangum. "Anytime you see a place that you care so deeply about, the fans of that place come and support you afterwards, it's a reminder that those four years that I got, I couldn't have experienced that anywhere else. It's just so unique to have a fan base that follows you throughout your career as well as Mississippi State fans do."

During the offseason each year, Mangum returns to his home in Mississippi surrounded by family and friends.

"Home is everything," he said. "Mississippi is very proud of being from Mississippi. They love calling it home, and everyone is just so nice and hospitable. You can be a complete stranger and walk around at a Mississippi State baseball game and you will not pay for a drink or food. They'll feed you, they'll take care of you, show you a great time, make sure you're taken care of,

"I'm very thankful for the opportunity at Mississippi State, it was an amazing four years."



DAREN BROWN I MANAGER I SECOND SEASON

After eclipsing 1,300 career managerial wins during the 2022 season, Daren Brown returns as Jacksonville's manager for the second consecutive campaign.

In Brown's first year with Jacksonville in 2022, the Jumbo Shrimp finished with an 80-69 (.537) record,

placing third in the International League East Division. After stellar performances throughout the season, the Jumbo Shrimp saw 12 players from their roster make their major league debuts. Brown also juggled a franchise-record 79 players, including Jacksonville highs for both pitchers (39) and starting pitchers (25).

A native of Holdenville, Okla., Brown holds a 1,340-1,325 (.503) record as a minor league manager. The 55-year-old is currently in his third stint as a Triple-A skipper. He piloted Triple-A Tacoma in the Seattle Mariners' organization from 2007-13 and again in 2019, tallying 494 victories, which marks the most wins for any manager in Rainiers franchise history. Brown led Tacoma to consecutive division titles in 2009 and 2010, and during that latter season, helped the Rainiers win the franchise's first outright Pacific Coast League Championship since 1969. Over this time period, Brown also earned a pair of call ups to the Mariners' coaching staff, including a stint as the club's interim manager for the final 50 games of the 2010 season.

After working as Seattle's baserunning coordinator in 2014 and bunting and baserunning coordinator in 2015, Brown steered Double-A Jackson to a 84-55 (.604) record and Southern League Championship in 2016. He skippered Double-A Arkansas during the 2017-18 seasons before returning to Tacoma for the 2019 campaign. In 2021, Brown managed the Kinsport Axmen, a summer collegiate baseball team in the Appalachian League.

The son of former major leaguer Paul Brown, who pitched for parts of four seasons with the Philadelphia Phillies from 1961-63 and 1968, Daren was selected in the 29th round of the 1989 draft out of Southeastern Oklahoma State University. He pitched for five seasons in Toronto's organization from 1989-93, reaching as high as Double-A Knoxville. From 1994-99, Daren served as a player-coach (1994-97) and player-manager (1998-99) for Amarillo of the independent Texas-Louisiana League. He retired as a player following the 1999 season, which saw Brown win the circuit's Manager of the Year and Amarillo take the league championship, and managed the Dillas for one more season.

A: Grilled Chicken, fruit and rice.




