Lansing Lugnuts (4-3) at Dayton Dragons (5-2)

LH Brady Basso (0-1, 2.25) vs. RH Noah Davis (0-1, 1.80)

Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) meet the Lansing Lugnuts (affiliate of the Oakland Athletics) in the second game of a six-game series.

2021 Season Series: Lansing 1, Dayton 0. The two clubs will meet 24 times in 2021.

Last Game: Tuesday: Lansing 9, Dayton 4 (10 innings). The Lugnuts broke a 4-4 tie with five runs in the top of the 10th inning to spoil the Dragons 2021 home opener. Dayton trailed 4-2 before Miguel Hernandez and Brian Rey connected on solo home runs in the sixth inning to tie the game. The Dragons had a chance to win it in the bottom of the ninth when they loaded the bases with two outs, but Jose Tello was a strikeout victim to end the threat. Quin Cotton was 3 for 5, becoming the second Dayton player this season to enjoy a three-hit game.

Player Notes

- Brian Rey leads the High-A Central League in home runs (5), RBI (13), slugging percentage (1.000), extra base hits (7), and total bases (26). Only four other teams have hit more than Rey's five home runs. Rey has played in six of the Dragons seven games.
- Rey's two-homer game on Saturday was the first by a Dayton player since Rey did it in Fort Wayne on July 27, 2019. Also on Saturday, Rey became the first Dayton player to open a game with a homer since Michael Siani on June 26, 2019 at West Michigan.
- Rey has hit safely in all six games he has played in this season, batting .346...Miguel Bautista has hit safely in all four games he has played in, batting .364...Miguel Hernandez has hit safely in four straight games, batting .353 over that stretch, after starting the year by going 0 for 9.
- Eric Yang is tied for eighth in the league in batting average at .350. His .550 slugging percentage ranks 13th and his 1.008 OPS is 11th.
- Reliever Braxton Roxby has not allowed a run in 4.1 innings, surrendering just one hit and two walks. He has struck out 9 of 16 batters faced.

Team Notes

- The Dragons have won at least five of their first seven games for the fourth time in franchise history. The best Dragons starts through seven games were 7-0 in 2007 and 5-2 in both 2010 and 2017. The best starts through eight games were 8-0 in 2007 and 6-2 in 2017. The best starts through 10 games were 9-1 in 2007 and 7-3 in 2014, 2017, and 2018.
- The Dragons are tied for the league lead in stolen bases with 18 in seven games, putting them on a pace for 308 in a 120 game season. They stole 120 bases in 140 games in their last season (2019). The club record for steals in a season is 228 in 2011, when Billy Hamilton stole 103.
- The Dragons lead the league in home runs (8), batting average (.263), slugging percentage (.449), and hits (62). They are second in doubles (14).
- Dragons pitchers have allowed only 34 base hits in 60 innings this season, allowing an opponent batting average of .167.
- Dragons opponents went 5 for 43 (.116) with runners in scoring position in the series at Great Lakes, but Lansing went 5 for 11 last night.
- The Dragons committed only three errors in the six games at Great Lakes, but they had three last night vs. Lansing including two on one play.
- The Dragons roster is headlined by Reds top-10 prospect Michael Siani, a center fielder who spent the entire 2019 season with the Dragons when the club was classified as Low-A. Siani moves up a level on the Reds developmental ladder in 2021 (the 2020 season was canceled) and with the Dragons move up to the High-A classification, Siani returns to Dayton. Siani is listed by Baseball America as the "Best Athlete" and "Best Defensive Outfielder" in the Reds organization. He is ranked as the Reds 10th best prospect overall.
- The Dragons roster includes three of the top 15 players in *Baseball America's* ranking of top Reds prospects. Along with Siani at #10, the roster includes right-handed starting pitcher Lyon Richardson, the #13 prospect, and right-handed starter Noah Davis, ranked #15.
- Other Dragons players listed by Baseball America in their rankings are RHP Graham Ashcraft (#28) and OF Jacob Hurtubise (#41).
- The Dayton roster features 11 players who have previous experience with the Dragons (including Juan Martinez on the injured list).
- The Dragons roster features two players who were signed out of Federal Service academies. Outfield prospect Jacob Hurtubise was signed out of West Point, where he was an All-American with Army in 2019, and pitcher Jake Gilbert, who played four seasons at the U.S. Air Force Academy.

Notable Changes for 2021: Major League Baseball completed a restructuring of the Minor Leagues prior to the 2021 season. Those changes included the contraction of 42 affiliated teams since the last completed season in 2019, cutting the Cincinnati Reds player development system from seven stateside teams to five (Billings and Greeneville were contracted). Here are some of the most significant changes:

- The league is now known as the High-A Central League after previously being referred to as the Midwest League.
- The league has been reclassified to the High-A level of Minor League Baseball after being a "Low-A" league since the Dragons inception in 2000.
- The league has been reduced from 16 teams to 12 (Burlington, Clinton, and Kane County were contracted; Bowling Green moved to new league).
- Each team in the High-A Central League is scheduled to play 120-games (60 home games). This is down from 140 games in previous years.
- League Opening Day in 2021 is May 4 for all teams, much later than the typical start date in recent years of April 3-9. The final date on the schedule this season is set for September 19 after teams closed the year on Labor Day (first Monday in September) in recent years.
- All series in 2021 are scheduled for six games, Tuesday through Sunday. All teams will have Mondays off throughout the season.
- Roster limits in 2021 have been set at 30 players after teams played for 25-player limits in recent years.
- One significant rule change has been made in 2021 in the High-A Central League. Pitchers must now step back off the rubber before throwing to a base, a change that will have its greatest impact on left-handed pitchers. Both the snap throw to first and the "lift and hang" throw by a left-hander will now result in a balk call.

Notes: Noah Davis is ranked as the #15 prospect in the Reds organization by Baseball America. The Reds drafted Davis in the 11th round in 2018, knowing that he would miss all of that season and part of 2019 after undergoing Tommy John elbow surgery. Davis was a college teammate at UC Santa Barbara of Dragons catcher Eric Yang, who caught Davis at Billings in 2019 after Davis returned to the mound following his rehab assignment. Davis made 30 starts at UCSB, serving as a full-time starting pitcher as a freshman and sophomore before being limited to eight innings as a junior due to the injury. He posted a career record of 15-9 with a 4.58 ERA. Davis was on the mound for some big games in college and high school. As a freshman at UC Santa Barbara in 2016, he was the team's #2 starting pitcher behind ace Shane Bieber, the 2020 American League Cy Young Award winner. Davis helped UCSB to its first-ever trip to the College World Series as the team finished the year as the #7 team in the nation. Davis was the starting pitcher for their second game of the 2016 College World Series as his team beat powerful Miami. Davis allowed just one run on two hits over six innings in that game. Davis returned to UCSB in 2017 and was his team's top starter, going 7-4 with a 4.63 ERA. At Huntington Beach High School, Davis was a California All-State selection and pitched his team to a state championship. After being drafted by the Reds in 2018, Davis battled back from reconstructive elbow surgery to return to the mound by June of 2019. He made five short rehab starts with the AZL Reds and then joined the Billings roster on July 28. He was limited to a maximum of 75 pitches at Billings but made eight starts, posting a fine ERA of 2.10.

Notes: Drafted/signed after his junior year at Grand Canyon University of the Western Athletic Conference (WAC)...GCU has been an NCAA Division I program since 2014 and has produced some strong players, though Cotton is the first to be drafted by the Reds since the school moved up to D1. Cotton had back-to-back big seasons at Grand Canyon in 2018-19. In his sophomore year of 2018, he batted a conference-leading .390 and won the WAC Player of the Year award. In 2019, he hit .331 and was 2nd Team All-Conference. His 21 doubles ranked second in the WAC. He combined to hit nine home runs over the 2018-19 seasons in 116 games at GCU...After being drafted by the Reds, Cotton was assigned to Billings and became their lead-off hitter...Selected as a 2019 Pioneer League all-star.

Notes: Signed with the Reds as an undrafted free agent following the 2019 draft after a successful three-year career at the University of the Pacific. Had been projected by *Baseball America* as a player who would be taken in the first 10 rounds...Had a huge freshman season at Pacific in 2017 when he posted an OPS of over 1.000 while leading the conference in both home runs (14) and RBI (54) and batting .343 in 52 games. Those numbers earned him NCAA Freshman All-American honors. He fell off as a sophomore in 2018 to .283 with seven home runs but bounced back in 2019. As a junior in 2019, hit .335 with eight home runs in 49 games with a .541 slugging percentage...After signing with the Reds, Free was assigned to Billings. As late as August 17, 2019, Free was batting .312 and had compiled a .624 slugging percentage. He had seven home runs in 93 at-bats. But over his final 16 games, he went 9 for 62 (.145) to finish at .245. His final slugging percentage of .452 was the best on the team among players with at least 100 plate appearances. Blasted a home run in Billings' three-game playoff series. Free started all three playoff games and hit third in the Billings lineup, playing first base or designated hitter...Native of Walnut, California, about 25 miles east of downtown Los Angeles. He played at Damien High School and was a teammate for all four seasons with Nick Lodolo, the 2019 Dragons pitcher who was the Reds #1 draft pick last summer. Former Cardinals slugger Mark McGwire and the late former Reds pitcher Frank Pastore are also products of Damien High School. Free was a high school star and in 2015, he was selected to play in the WWBA World Championships in Jupiter, Florida, earning All-Tournament Team honors. Among his teammates was 2019 Dragons starting pitcher Lyon Richardson, who was also a high school star at the time from Florida.

Three days after Stockton had played in the league's all-star game as a starting pitcher, the Reds signed him to a Minor League contract. Stockton's 2019 season was an amazing one, as he climbed from the USPBL, making his last start on June 27 against a team called the Westside Woolly Mammoths, all the way to becoming the Cincinnati Reds Minor League Pitcher of the Month in August...Played four years of college baseball at Jacksonville University in the Atlantic Sun Conference, posting strong numbers every year. In 2018, he helped his team earn a bid in the NCAA tournament and was Jacksonville's starting pitcher against the University of Florida, the Regional's #1 seed. He finished the 2018 season with an 8-6 record and a 3.59 ERA, but he was not drafted...After being acquired by the Reds, was initially sent to the AZL Reds in Goodyear, Arizona and made six appearances there including four as a starter, going 3-1 with a 2.14 ERA. He was promoted to Greeneville in early August and made four appearances with the G-Reds, going 2-1 with a 1.96 ERA. Overall in August, Stockton made six appearances in the Reds system, posting an ERA of 1.50 as he allowed just six runs in 36 innings. Those numbers earned him the Reds Minor League Pitcher of the Month honor for August.

Dragons Manager/Coaches:

Jose Moreno is in his first season as Dragons manager and his second year in the Reds organization. The 2021 season is Moreno's 22nd year as a coach, instructor, or coordinator in professional baseball. As a manager, he has won three league championships with affiliated clubs, guiding his teams to titles in 2002, 2007, and 2010. Moreno also led his teams to back-to-back championships in the Venezuelan Winter League in 2019-20 and 2020-21. Moreno was a catcher in Cleveland Indians and Baltimore Orioles farm systems.

Wapakoneta, Ohio native **Brian Garman** joins the Dragons in 2021 as pitching coach. Garman was slated to serve as the Dayton pitching coach in 2020 before the season was canceled. He served as a pitching coach in the Los Angeles Angels system for the previous two seasons, working at Rookie-level Orem (Pioneer League) in 2019 and Advanced-A Inland Empire (California League) in 2018. Garman pitched at Wapakoneta High School and the University of Cincinnati before being drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 17th round in 2010. He spent four years as a pitcher in the Brewers system, reaching the Double-A level.

Hitting coach **Daryle Ward** returns to the Dragons in 2021 after serving in the same position in Dayton in 2017-18. He is in his sixth year in coaching in the Cincinnati Reds organization. He served as the hitting coach with the Goodyear Reds in the Arizona League in 2016 and with the Chattanooga Lookouts in 2019. He was slated to return to Chattanooga in 2020 before the season was canceled. Ward played professionally for 22 seasons from 1994-2015. He spent seven full seasons and parts of four others in the Major Leagues, primarily as a left fielder and first baseman. His father, Gary Ward, was a Major League All-Star selection with both the Twins and Rangers as part of a 12-year Major League playing career.

Darren Bragg returns to the Dragons in his 15th year as a coach or instructor in the Reds organization. He will serve in a newly named position within the Reds organization, carrying the title of development coach. Bragg was the Dragons hitting coach for two seasons in 2007-08, helping the club to the playoffs in both years as he worked with future Reds Todd Frazier, Zack Cozart, Chris Heisey, Drew Stubbs, Juan Francisco, and others in Dayton. Bragg served as the Reds minor league outfield coordinator from 2009-18 before returning to a coaching assignment with an individual team. He was the bench coach at Double-A Chattanooga in 2019 and was slated to fill the same role with Daytona in 2020 before the minor league season was canceled. Bragg spent 11 years as a player in Major League Baseball from 1994-2004, appearing in 916 big league games with nine teams.
