Today: The Lansing Lugnuts, High-A affiliate of the Oakland Athletics, play the fourth game in a six-game series against the Quad Cities River Bandits, High-A affiliate of the Kansas City Royals. This is also the fourth game in a 12-game, 14-day road trip to the state of lowa running from July 24-August 6 against Quad Cities and Cedar Rapids. The Nuts took four of six games from Quad Cities in April and currently lead the season series, 5-4.

Yesterday: Lugnuts 4, River Bandits 2. Right-hander Mitch Myers fired six innings of one-run ball, striking out six, designated hitter CJ Rodriguez broke a 1-1 tie in the fifth inning with a two-run homer off top Royals pitching prospect Ben Kudrna, and the Nuts seized their first victory of the series by doubling up the Bandits on a hot Thursday night. Lansing finished the game with 11 hits, built on multi-hit showings from Junior Pérez, Daniel Susac, Danny Bautista, Jr. and Euribiel Ángeles.

On the Air: Kyle Kercheval delivers the call on Bally Live and MiLB TV, with Jesse Goldberg-Strassler delivering an audio-only call via StreamGuys.
On Deck: The Lugnuts and River Bandits wrap things up Sunday, and then the Nuts continue this 12-game road trip to Cedar Rapids for a six-game series next week. Lansing returns to Jackson Field on August 8, opening a two-week homestand against the Fort Wayne TinCaps and the Great Lakes Loons.

## Lug•Notes

Jerome Holtzman, Represent: Out of 21 games the Lugnuts have played in July, 18 games have had saves recorded, including in each of the last 11 games and 13 of the last 14. By month: there were 7 saves in 20 games in April ( $35 \%$ ), 9 in 27 games in May ( $33 \%$ ), 15 in 24 games in June ( $63 \%$ ), and now 18 saves in 21 games in July ( $86 \%$ ).

Keeping it Close: The larger story told by the saves is that virtually every game the Lugnuts have played since the final day of the first half has been contested within one or two runs. Dating back to June 22, 21 of the last 28 games ( $75 \%$ ) have been decided within two runs (nine by one run, 12 by two runs)

Quad Cities' Pitt-fall: Pitt Panther product Mitch Myers has sizzled against the River Bandits this year. Myers has three quality starts this year, and two of those QSes have been accomplished against QC: June 27's six-inning, two-run effort and last night's six-inning, one-run gem.

Among the Midwest League Leaders: Mac Lardner is tied for 2nd in wins (6); Daniel Susac is 4th in hits (90), 3rd in batting average (.300) and tied for 5th in triples (5); and Junior Pérez is 4th in stolen bases (28).

Staying Cool in the Heat: The Lugnuts' pitching staff ranks 10th overall in the Midwest League with a 4.38 team ERA, but things have taken an upward turn. Lansing's 3.63 ERA in July is the second best in the MWL behind only Great Lakes' 3.51 .

Thievery: The Nuts stole three more bases yesterday, increasing their league-leading total to 143 steals this year, leading by six over the Great Lakes Loons. The Lugnuts have 38 steals in 21 games in July.

Historic on the 4th: A crowd of 11,521 packed in to Jackson Field on July 4, the largest home attendance in Lansing since July 4, 2013. It was also the largest single game crowd in all of High-A, let alone the Midwest League, and an attendance larger than any crowd drawn by every Minor League Baseball team save for six Triple-A teams (Buffalo, Albuquerque, Salt Lake, Indianapolis, Norfolk and Round Rock) and one Double-A team (Frisco).

The Cycle: On June 21 at Wisconsin, Jack Winkler went 4-for-4 with a single, double, triple, home run and four RBls, becoming the eighth player in team history to hit for the cycle. The other cycles: Corey Patterson (7/5/99 at South Bend); Donnie Hood (4/21/03 vs. Dayton); Chip Cannon (6/2/05 vs. Clinton); Travis Snider ( $7 / 7 / 07$ at Fort Wayne); Brad Glenn ( $7 / 26 / 10$ vs. Clinton); Edward Olivares ( $4 / 24 / 17$ vs. South Bend); and Ryan Gold (4/18/19 vs. Dayton).

They Know Their Trade: Lansing has three players acquired via trade by the Oakland Athletics on its roster: Christian Fernandez (Tampa Bay Rays, 7/9/22, for Christian Bethancourt); Euribiel Angeles (San Diego Padres, 4/3/22, for Sean Manaea); and Junior Pérez (San Diego Padres, 6/30/20, for Jorge Mateo).

All-Star Nuts: The All-Star festivities had a Nuts flavor.

## Today in Lugnuts History

2015: Jesus Tinoco was traded along with Jose Reyes, Jeff Hoffman and 2014 Nut Miguel Castro to the Colorado Rockies for Troy Tulowitzki and LaTroy Hawkins. Tinoco was 2-6, 3.54, $811 / 3$ innings, 68 strikeouts for the Lugnuts. Meanwhile, the Lugnuts won a weird one in Eastlake - they walked 10 Lake County Captains but stranded 16 Caps on base (nine in scoring position!) en route to a 5-3 victory. Future Blue Jays pitcher Thomas Pannone started for Lake County and lasted only $12 / 3$ innings, allowing five runs.

2018: Brandon Grudzielanek dropped down a bunt toward third in a tie game in the eighth and ended up circling the bases thanks to a pair of Dayton Dragons errors, gifting the Lugnuts with a 5-4 victory at Fifth Third Field. Third baseman Leandro Santana barehanded the bunt and threw wildly to first base. Lead base runner Ryan Noda attempted to score but was thrown out at the plate by right fielder Reshard Munroe. Grudzielanek went for third base, and catcher Mark Kolozsvary's throw sailed down the left-field line, bringing Grudz in with the tie-breaking run.

Retrospective: Watters made his Midwest League debut at Four Winds Field on August 31, 2022, pitching against rehabber Wade Miley in Lansing debut... had made just one prior appearance in the minors before joining the Lugnuts: August 23 for the Arizona Complex League Athletics vs. the Ariz. Complex League Cubs.

Entering Draft Day: Rated Keith Law's No. 68 draft prospect for The Athletic, with Law writing, "Watters started the year in the Mountaineers' bullpen, where he hit 99 mph a few times, so the team moved him to the rotation around midseason, where he struggled more with control ( 37 walks in 50.2 innings) but also showed enough that some scouts think he can start in pro ball. Watters sits $94-97 \mathrm{mph}$ with a power slider in the mid80 s that can miss bats $\ldots$. when he locates it. It's not a bad delivery, with a reasonably short arm stroke and strong finish, so that's not the reason he doesn't throw strikes, but it's true across all of his pitches. It's much more likely he ends up a power reliever with two plus pitches. But with enough of a changeup to start and a delivery that looks like it should work, I wouldn't be surprised to see a pro team keep him in the rotation."... Fangraphs' No. 96 draft prospect.

Inked: Selected 124th overall by the A's in the 4th round and signed for $\$ 491,750 \ldots$ highest pitcher taken by the Athletics in 2022 (following first-round catcher Daniel Susac and three straight outfielders in high schooler Henry Bolte in the second round, Michigan Wolverine Clark Elliott in the compensatory round B, and Mercer slugger Colby Thomas in the third round).

WVU to the Pros: First of three Mountaineers selected in the 2022 draft... the 2021 Fort Wayne TinCaps featured two WVU teammates in 2021 draftees Jackson Wolf (4th round) and Ryan Bergert (6th round); pitched against Bergert on May 26 and tossed $52 / 3$ scoreless innings, allowing only one hit... the last WVU player taken in the first round was Alek Manoah by Toronto in 2019, who in 2022 joined John Means as the only Mountaineers to be named MLB All-Stars... the last West Virginia player to suit up for the Lugnuts was Ryan McBroom, who won the 2015 Midwest League Most Valuable Player award.

Glory Days: Starred for the Bland County HS Rockets as an all-state baseball player as well as in basketball (where he regularly posted double-doubles and topped out at 45 points in one game) and football.

Off to College: Did not receive much notice before his high velocity was discovered at a tryout in Morgantown... named to the Academic All-Big 12 Rookie Team as a freshman (5 G, 4.70 ERA, 7 2/3 IP, 4 R, 6 BB, 11 K )... as a sophomore, made 19 appearances: 3.33 ERA, $27 \mathrm{IP}, 15 \mathrm{H}, 11 \mathrm{R}, 32 \mathrm{BB}$, bullpen-leading $53 \mathrm{~K}, .165 \mathrm{avg}$. allowed, tied for team lead with four saves; named Academic All-Big 12 Second Team; NCBWA Stopper of the Year Midseason Watch List... made first college start in the 2021 Big 12 Championship vs. Texas: 3 IP, 0 H, 1 R, 4 BB, 8 K... as a junior in 2022, named preseason All-American; dominated early as team closer and was moved into role as Friday starter; struck out 15 Texas Longhorns in 6 1/3 IP on May 7; overall: 18 G, 11 GS, 3-7, 6.22 ERA, 59 1/3 IP, 64 H, 44 R, 41 BB, 75 K; named All-Big 12 Honorable Mention.

Hometown Hero: Home city of Rocky Gap, Virginia, is in the Ridge-and-Valley Appalachians, located near the West Virginia border... neighboring city: Bluefield, home of the Bluefield Ridge Runners, previously known as the Bluefield Orioles and Bluefield Blue Jays, which fed such stars as Alejandro Kirk and Vladimir Guerrero, Jr. to the Lugnuts when both were part of the Jays' system... cousin is Jason Michaels, who played 11 years (2001-2011) in MLB.

Current Ranking: MLB Pipeline ranks Watters the No. 26 prospect in the A's organization and the No. 12 pitching prospect... his grades: Fastball 60, Curve 60, Changeup 45, Control 45 , Overall $40 \ldots$ his scouting report: "Watters is a strong presence on the mound at 6 -foot- 4 . His fastball was up to 99 mph during his junior year and touched triple digits in his time as a reliever. He also possesses a plus pitch in his power curve, missing plenty of bats as a true 12-to-6 that sits in the mid-80s. There's also a mid-80s changeup in there, though it's less polished compared to his other two offerings. Command will need to improve for Watters to have a chance to start at the next level. While the stuff was high-octane in college, he usually had little idea of how to locate it. Given his track record as a reliever, there's a strong chance he ends up back in the bullpen, where he can rear back and overpower hitters with two plus pitches."
