Columbus came back from a 7-1 deficit, scoring in the 8th, 9th and 10th on the way to victory.

Milan Tolentino was 3x5 with a double, HR and 3RBI to lead the offense, while **Hunter Stanley** retired all 6BF (3K).

Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send LHP **Logan Allen** to the mound tonight, looking to open the series with a win for the first time since 6/9 at Indianapolis. Louisville will counter with RHP **Julian Aguiar**. Columbus is 36-20 (.643) versus right handers this year. Aguiar has pitched against Columbus once in his career, on 7/20/24 in Louisville (W, 6.0IP, 7H, 4R, 4ER, 4BB, 4K).

vs. the Bats

Columbus was 7-11 against Louisville last year, going 4-10 in the last 14G to lose the season series for the third straight year (4-0 from 2018-22). The Clippers took the series 3-2 in the first half of the season, with each team scoring 18 runs. **George Valera** has collected 6HR and 14RBI in 28G opposing Louisville, while **Kody Huff** owns 2HR and 12RBI in 16G.

On the Low

Despite assaulting the scoreboard with 13 runs on Sunday (4HR, had 1HR in prior 5G), the Clippers still finished the Omaha series with their lowest run total in a 6G set this year (27, scored 28 vs. Toledo from 4/28-5/3). The comeback win was their IL-best 29th (had 28 all last season) and marked the second time this season overcoming a 6+ run lead (11 losses; rest of IL is 8-223, .035, in such games).

Magic Time

Each of the last two wins have featured the Clippers taking a lead in the 8th inning, as they have tied (6) or taken the lead (10) in the 8th 16 times this year. When ending the 8th with a lead, Columbus is an IL-best 34-0 (Charlotte is also 34-0; Gwinnett and Louisville are 33-0). Overall, the Clippers lead the IL when allowing the opposition to score first (22-22) and when trailing at any point (29-36, .446).

Brito Slump

Juan Brito is hitting .176/.322/.230 in his last 20G, with nearly a third of his hits coming on 6/13 at Indy (4x5). Thursday's homer was his first since homering in back to back at bats on 5/8 at Iowa (140AB between) and he has 4RBI in the last 20G (27RBI in first 38G). He has not scored more than once in a game since 6/2 vs. Omaha (21G) and his last multi-RBI game was 5/29 at Toledo (24G).

Fourth and Two

Ralph Velazquez will be making his 31st start at the cleanup spot tonight (all 36 starts with Akron were #2). His bomb on Sunday was just the second homer from the #4 Clipper in the last 49G (last team in MiLB to hit multiple homers since 5/2). While the .378SLG produced in that time ranks 18th in the IL, Columbus cleanup hitters have still managed the 5th best exit velocity (91.0mph).

Naying It

Bo Naylor appeared in his 150th game as a Clipper last time out (6/27), going 0x3 to watch his career OBP fall to .380 and his slugging dip under .500 (.497; only five players in Clipper history have at least 150G, .380OBP and .500SLG, including **Luis Valbuena** and **Johnathan Rodriguez** in the Cleveland era). Naylor has struggled in Huntington Park this year (4x28, .143) but does have 3HR.

Not Walking or Running

George Valera's team-best 21G on base streak (.418OBP) was snapped with a pinch-hit strikeout on 6/11, and though he has reached in six of seven since (.286OBP), he has drawn just 1BB (14BB in last 50PA of streak). He has just one run scored this month (12G), following 10 runs in his last 14G of May. **Ralph Velazquez** can tie for the team-long on base tonight (would set career high).

Another Personal Best

Kody Huff tied his career high in steals (7) on Sunday, a game after establishing new career highs in RBI (48) and runs (now at 48). He is currently riding a career best 19G on base streak (.378OBP) after having twice set career highs in hit streak this year (10G from 4/1-4/12, 12G from 5/1-5/16). Also, he has already hit top marks in triples (3) and HR (10) this season (4BB from prsrnal best: 44 in '24).

Solid Trip

Milan Tolentino was 8x19 (.421) in 5G at Omaha, collecting hits on 67% of balls put in play (7K in 21PA). Dating to the nightcap vs. Scranton/WB on 6/19, he is 10x25 (.400) in his last 7G, collecting 5XBH (.720SLG) and 7RBI. Sunday's HR (30th off RHP in IL career, 0HR off LHP) put him halfway to his second 20-20 season (only Clipper ever to achieve the feat; currently at 9SB, none since 5/30).

This Date in Clipper History

6/30/2003

The Clippers beat the Syracuse SkyChiefs 6-3 in Columbus, powered by **Fernando Seguignol**. The IL MVP was 2x4 with a HR and 3RBI on the day, kicking off a stretch of five consecutive games with a HR (6HR, 14RBI). From that point on, he would hit .353 (84x238) with 20HR and 62RBI over his final 60 games of the season, finishing 1st in the IL in batting (.341) and HR (28) while finishing 2nd in RBI (87).

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,447 to 1,396).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 113-99 (.533) in pitch reviews, with batters going 58-65 (.472) and pitchers/catchers going 55-34 (.618). They have run out of challenges in 36G and have not challenged in 3G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-3 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-36 when playing past regulation (.604, best in the IL; no other team above .571), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 91G to require extra play, 72 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 823, would rank as 4th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 100 through the first 80G (on pace for 186SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 25CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the 4th most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (47; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 127 runs while crafting a .931OPS (over 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 63 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +64 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 192-125 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 78 grand slams and 1,948RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.37 through the first 80G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). However, the staff is pacing to give up only 175HR (average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 9th in the IL this year (.980), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 43G this season (27-16, .628), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

Milan Tolentino bunted the winning run into scoring position in an extra-inning win at Indianapolis on 6/14. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 88-23 (.793) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 5-2 mark this season (.714, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 2nd most last at bat wins this year (13, Syracuse at 14) while playing in the 2nd most games decided in the last at bat (22; Omaha has played 23). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 96G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 47-49 (.490, 14th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 430-442 (.493), 400-396 with Columbus (.503).

Workhorse

Allen is the only Clipper averaging over 80 pitches a start this season, at 87.5 (along with **Ryan Webb**, only pitchers to throw more than 90 in a game multiple times). Averaging almost 93 pitches per outing in the Majors last season, Allen hit triple digits six times (Columbus has not had a pitcher reach 100 since **Peyton Battenfield** on 9/2/22, 544G ago)

On Guard(ians):

In two stints in the Majors this season (27th man in a DH on 4/5 and a two day excursion from 5/24-5/25), Allen has appeared once for Cleveland, closing out the game on 5/25 vs. Washington (4.0IP, 5H, 0R, 0ER, 1BB, 7K). The game was his second in relief at the Major League level (once last season) and he has just 4G out of the bullpen in the minors (all on starter's rest, three piggybacking rehabbing Major Leaguers).

Stellar Support:

Through 13GS, the bullpen has graced Allen with a 2.28ERA in relief (47.1IP, 12ER), stranding three of six runners inherited. The defense has committed only 10E in Allen's starts, while the offense has put forward 5.4 runs per game. That all adds up to an 11-2 record for Columbus when he takes the hill.

Tough Split:

In his first 5GS (103BF), Allen recorded 32K (31%) against only 10BB (10%), while painting the zone with strikes on 63% of his offerings. Once the calendar flipped to May, however, he made 4GS (87BF), watching his strikeout rate dip to 16% (14K) and his walk rate inflate (14%, 12BB; strikes on 57% of pitches). He has found his groove in June, starting with a 10K outing (fifth of career) on 6/6 vs. Omaha (31K to 93BF this month, 33%; 4BB, 4%, 67% of pitches have been strikes).

Cleaning Up:

Opposing cleanup hitters have just one hit off Allen in 30AB this season (1BB, 10K), though the hit went over the wall (**Charles McAdoo**, 4/26 at Buffalo). Looking at the lineup as a whole, the top five in the order have slashed .208/.291/.370 with 5HR in 154AB against Allen, while batters 6-9 have hit .379/.445/.632 with 5HR in 95AB.
