CAMPAIGN NEWS

INDIANS, STCU, INNOVIA DEBUT *OPERATION FLY TOGETHER*



On May 27, 2021, the Spokane Indians Baseball Team announced the launch of a new community campaign called Operation Fly Together, centered on honoring and supporting local military veterans.

The Operation Fly Together campaign stems from an historic agreement between Team Fairchild and the baseball team, designed to celebrate the KC-135 tanker, build pride for the base's critical functions, and help better the lives of Veterans from all services that have settled in the Spokane region.

The campaign, supported by STCU, Innovia Foundation, KHQ Television, and The Spokesman-Review, will build financial support and awareness for the newly created Operation Fly Together Veterans Fund, administered by Innovia. In addition, the campaign has been endorsed locally by Spokane County & Eastern Washington Veterans Services.

A press conference at Avista Stadium included the presentation of the first checks from the Operation Fly Together Veterans Fund to three local veteran causes: Newby-ginnings of North Idaho for general operating expenses, restoration of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Riverfront Park, and to the Spokane Tribe of Indians for a new handicap ramp for VFW Post 10711.

"The team's partnership with Team Fairchild was formed two years ago and put on hold during the pandemic. While it's not uncommon for teams to have veteran appreciation nights and similar events, the Spokane agreement is unique nationwide," said Otto Klein, Sr. Vice President of Spokane Indians Baseball Team.

"If there's anything more American than baseball, it's showing support for our veterans," said Klein. "Spokane is particularly indebted to Fairchild for producing leaders who have served our country and now are serving our region. As the community's baseball team we want to celebrate and acknowledge our veterans in a fun way."

As part of the campaign launch, the team unveiled a new merchandise line that is now available online and in the Team Store. Operation Fly Together merchandise, including t-shirts, patches, hats and more, are all available for purchase. In addition, is a new alternate team uniform modeled after the current U.S. Air Force Service Dress Uniform which the team will wear at every Friday night game starting on June 4th.

Q&A WITH JESSE STENDER

MANAGER OF MINOR LEAGUE OPERATIONS FOR THE COLORADO ROCKIES

Jesse Stender, Colorado Rockies Manager of Minor League Operation, recently made his first visit to Spokane for one of his many trips to Rockies' affiliates. Stender has had quite the professional journey in baseball, going from a ticket sales representative for the Rockies to now one of the top decision makers for their farm system.

Like many, he knew being a professional baseball player wasn't in the cards for him but has found his own path in the game through player development. The CU-Boulder alum took the time for a Q&A with the Spokane Indians.

Spokane Indians (SI): Your title is Manager of Minor League Operations for the Colorado Rockies. How would you explain what you do?

Jesse Stender (JS): I'm in the front office in Denver. Myself along with our Farm Director Zach Wilson, and then Assistant Farm Director Chris Forbes, we basically oversee anything and everything that is minor league baseball for the Colorado Rockies. Obviously with that is signing players, talent evaluation, moving players up and down and out, staffing, all of our affiliates in various roles coaching, physical performance, clubhouse, so on and so forth. So really overseeing all of that is the basics of it. But behind that is a lot of administrative work: the payroll, the insurance, all the gritty details, and basically bringing it all together at the end of the day.

We're tasked with building a culture of winning and player development, and at the same time developing relationships and trust that will help



us play that out. Ultimately the front office has to make the call on a lot of very, very difficult decisions. The people who are in place, the people in Spokane and our other affiliates, they're the boots on the ground, and are working every single day. It has to go hand in hand with what we're doing in the front office to make the whole thing work. So we are a resource for all staff and all players in every aspect on and off the field.

SI: What's your favorite part of the job and what's your least favorite part?

JS: I have to pinch myself every day because it's a special position to be with the people I work with, the players that we have, and a staff that we have all over the country. It's just a good group of people, and everybody's really going after the same thing. We want to win the World Series up top, and the way we're going to do that is to develop

major league caliber players who are going to be successful at the major league level. Everything that goes into it, from the draft, from the relationships, to what goes on on the field, the scouting element, it all just kind of rolls into one.

And for me, there isn't a part of my job that I dislike. I get to go work at a ballpark every single day. When you look at the calendar you have spring training, you have the regular season, you have postseason, you have the offseason, which comes with camps and signing new players. It's a nice cycle, and you're doing something different, seemingly every week, so it's a nice balance.

SI: With all the changes to Minor League Baseball, what was the process like on your side of determining what affiliates the Rockies would be working with going forward?

JS: There was a lot of discussion about changing Minor League Baseball in ways that were ultimately going to create a better experience and a better environment for players. I think we're achieving that. Obviously not knowing exactly where we were going to land, who we were going to be partnered up with, there was a lot of uncertainty there. We've been with affiliates for multiple decades that we're no longer with. We have some very close relationships with those affiliates and it's a bummer when you really get to know a city, really get to know the staff, and having those ties taken away from you.

However, it also creates a lot of excitement for new opportunities. With our new affiliates, obviously here in Spokane and Fresno, we feel very blessed to have the opportunity to partner up with a new city, a new team, a new front office, and so far, so good. We're very happy with the way things shook out.

SI: What are your initial impressions of the Spokane Indians?

JS: Very positive. You get off the plane, you get your first take on a new city, and it's a positive vibe. It's a cool town. Probably haven't been able to explore as much as I would like, but it is a beautiful country. Overall impressions it's a very good ballpark that is also unique. It's a little smaller outfield but it's not necessarily an offensive park. It's not necessarily a pitcher's park, either. It plays very neutral, which is good. It helps both sides. The park is good, the playing surface is great.

Across the board, the people in the Indians front office have been very welcoming. Yeah, so far in Spokane it's been a solid start to the relationship.

SI: What is your assessment of our 2021 roster, and what can fans expect from watching the team play this season?

JS: Obviously, the win-loss record right now is something we expect to get better as we go. There's a lot of randomness to it, and you get hot and you get cold. I know this: it's gonna turn around in the wins and the losses.

The guys work hard. It's a group of just quality human beings. They care about each other, they care about the team, they care about their careers and their futures, and I mean they're here every day. You know as soon as they can they are in the cages, they're out on the field, or in the weight room. It's just a group of guys that collectively want to work and want to get better. And you have a nice mix of some younger guys and some veteran guys.

Obviously, we saw David Hill throw last night. He's a great story with his injury history, and then you mix in some of the younger arms. You

really can say the same thing on the position player side. We have some younger guys and some veteran guys and we're just trying to find our footing right now. Obviously, you take over a year off away from the game and things don't come back as smooth. Baseball was a tough game before the COVID shut down. It is in some ways even tougher now. So just getting back into the swing of things, seeing live arms, building up your arms, and the ways you need to bounce back outing after outing, there is a lot that goes into it.

We obviously have a bigger roster this year than we have ever had at our full seasons. Balancing everybody who needs to play, making sure that they are all getting in there, and they're all getting the development opportunities that that they need is something new as well.

Top to bottom, I mean it's a very talented roster and we expect that to show throughout the summer.

SI: Time for some rapid-fire questions to end on. What is your go-to ballpark meal?

JS: When I'm at the ballpark, I'm usually in the clubhouse and minor league baseball is known for their PB&J. So when I'm at the minor league ballpark I make my own peanut butter and jelly. I like to control the amount of peanut butter on there.

SI: What was your sport growing up?

JS: I played baseball and basketball, but I enjoyed playing baseball with a really good group of friends that I grew up with. I was a shortstop. I could pick it, a little light on the hitting side, but just loved every second of playing baseball. After baseball was taken away from me and I started working in baseball, I was still playing in men's leagues. I just love it.



But basketball is a different type of sport, you get the cardio and get the juices flowing. So yeah, basketball and baseball were my two go-tos.

SI: What would be your walkout song?

JS: "Explosive" by Dr. Dre. You really can't let it get too far into the song before you had to cut it. But the start is just very relaxing and put me in the right mental state. It really loosened me up as I was heading towards the plate.

SI: Who is your favorite professional baseball player, whether growing up as a kid or now?

JS: When I was young, I played short, so Alex Rodriguez was kind of my guy. I know there are a lot of different feelings about him at this point. He was just a special, special ballplayer.

At this point of working with the players, I'm trying to remove myself from the fan part of the game. I don't have a player. I tell everybody it's now every Rockies player. So yeah, right now, nobody. Growing up, it was definitely Alex Rodriguez.

SPOKANE INDIANS BY DECADE

2010

Record: 43-33
(1st in Eastern Division)

MLB Affiliate: Texas Rangers

Notable Alumni: Jurickson Profar

Notes: The 2010 Spokane Indians are one of the greatest “what-if” teams in recent memory. The league’s youngest squad featured three first-round picks (Kellin Deglan, Mike Olt and Jake Skole) and a talented international class that featured future number one overall prospect Jurickson Profar.

The offense, which was led by NWL MVP Jared Hoying, finished atop the league in batting (.273) and runs (410) while the pitching staff, buoyed by strong performances from Ben Rowen, Miguel De Los Santos and Tim Stanford, ended the season in the middle of the pack in most statistical categories.

Spokane finished with a solid 43-33 regular season record before sweeping the Yakima Bears in the first round of the playoffs. The Indians then took Game 1 of the NWL Championship series against Everett before dropping the next two against the AquaSox bring a sudden end to a promising season.

Profar has put together the best MLB career from the 2010 squad, although thus far it has fallen short of the immense expectations that followed him through the minors. Olt reached the majors with Texas before being traded to the Chicago Cubs, but a concussion and vision problems ultimately derailed his career. Skole never got above Double-A before retiring from baseball and returning

to the University of Georgia to play football, while Deglan finally reached Triple-A last season with the New York Yankees. Hoying and lefthander Chad Bell reunited last season with the Hanwha Eagles of the Korean Baseball Organization and are set to team up again in 2020.

2000

Record: 38-38
(3rd in Eastern Division)

MLB Affiliate: Kansas City Royals

Notable Alumni: N/A

Notes: The tail end of Spokane’s affiliation with the Royals - aka the Tom Poquette years - produced some truly forgettable seasons, starting with a pedestrian 2000 squad (things only got worse in 2001 when the Indians posted an abysmal 22-54 ledger).

It certainly wasn’t all Poquette’s fault though, as the 2000-01 teams would only combine to produce five big league players with Kansas City struggling to identify talent in the draft.


The 2000 Indians were a bit unlucky, finishing second in the league in batting and fourth in ERA, but still ending the season at .500 despite scoring 42 more runs than they allowed.

Chad Santos, who would get all of seven big league at-bats with the Giants in 2006, was the team’s offensive star with an .820 OPS, 14 home runs, and 47 RBI. Justin Cowan (.312) led the squad in average while speedster Marco Cunningham stole 31 bases - a number no Indians

player has eclipsed in the last two decades. Ian Ferguson (5-6 3.28 ERA, 71.1 IP) and Brad Stiles (8-3, 3.78 ERA, 78.2 IP) were the pitching staff's workhorses with Mike Natale (1.32 ERA, 43 K's in 41 IP) and Mark Newell (2.25 ERA, 1.10 WHIP in 40 IP) anchoring the bullpen.

1990

Record: 49-27
(1st in North Division, Defeated Boise 2-1 for NWL Championship)

MLB Affiliate: San Diego Padres

Notable Alumni: Gene Glynn
(Manager)

Notes: The 1990 squad captured the last of four consecutive NWL Championships during a fruitful affiliation between the San Diego Padres and Spokane Indians. Although devoid of noteworthy future MLB talent (only five players from the

squad would reach the majors, with Matt Mieske the most notable) the Indians won nearly two-thirds of their regular season games before topping the Boise Hawks, who featured MLB All-Stars Garret Anderson and Troy Percival, for the NWL title. Mieske led the Indians with a .964 OPS, 12 HR, 63 RBI and 26 stolen bases, while Jay Gainer topped the team in average (.356) and doubles (21).

Future big leaguer Lance Painter was nearly unhittable for Spokane, finishing the season with 104 strikeouts in 71.2 IP with a 1.51 ERA and 0.837 WHIP. Clarkston High School graduate Bruce Bensching was nearly as dominant as Painter, posting an 8-1 record and 1.54 ERA with 10 saves and 78 K's in 58.1 IP (Bensching returned to Clarkston following his playing career and is now the high school's head baseball coach).



Notes: The Indians struggled during their three-year affiliation with the Mariners, posting a combined 184-243 record during that span, though the 1980 squad was probably the best of the bunch at least in terms of future big league talent.

It was a long summer in 1980 though, as the team posted a whopping 4.54 team ERA and scored the second-fewest runs in the league, finishing a woeful 19.5 games behind first place Vancouver.

Outfielder Steve Stroughter paced the offense with a .307 average and 75 RBIs while speedy infielder Kim Allen stole an incredible 84 bases—the most in the PCL in the last 60 years. Dave Henderson, who would go on to post 27.6 WAR over 14 MLB seasons, held his own as one of the team's youngest hitters with a .279 average and 34 extra base hits in 109 games. Right-hander Randy Stein (12-8, 3.90 ERA) was the team's most consistent starter with Manny Sarmiento (8-7, 3.00 ERA, 13 saves) serving as the de facto closer. Reliever Joe Coleman (1-0, 1.64 ERA, 22 IP) won 142 games in the majors but all of them came prior



to his time with the Indians. Skipper Rene Lachemann and catcher Jerry Narron would both spend time as big league managers, although neither would post a winning record across 13 combined MLB seasons.

Notes: Guess you'd like to see the big tamale, huh? The 1970 Spokane Indians are considered one of the greatest minor league teams of all time (Baseball America tabbed

them as the top squad of the second half of the 20th century) and for good reason. That year's team would go on to produce a Hall of Fame manager (Lasorda), an NL MVP (Garvey), a batting title (Buckner), five Gold Gloves, and a combined 21 All-Star selections.

It certainly wasn't hard to forecast future success for the members of this team after they ran roughshod over the Northwest League, finishing with a 94-52 record before sweeping the Hawaii Islanders (who actually finished with a better regular season record at 98-48) for the PCL title. Spokane hit an amazing .299 as a team that year and also led the PCL in stolen bases while striking out at the lowest rate in the league.

Bobby Valentine was named MVP after stuffing the stat sheet with a .340 average, 39 doubles, 16 triples,

14 home runs, 80 RBIs, and 29 stolen bases. Injuries would ultimately keep Valentine from enjoying similar success at the big league level, though he would go on to win over 1,100 games as an MLB manager with the Rangers, Mets, and Red Sox.

Other offensive standouts that season included Tom Paciorek (.326, 17 HR, 101 RBIs), Garvey (.319, 15 HR, 87 RBI), and Bill Buckner (.335, 33 2B, 74 RBIs) The pitching staff is often overshadowed by the squad's legendary offensive stars but they finished second in the league in ERA (3.31) and strikeouts (881) led by strong performances from Charlie Hough (12-8, 1.95 ERA), Jerry Stephenson (18-5, 2.82 ERA), and Bob O'Brien (13-3, 3.40).

Spokane hurlers Hough, Doyle Alexander, and Geoff Zahn would go on to combine for a total of 93.8 WAR and over 500 big league wins. Amazingly, it's been half a century since this team took the field, and their legend seems destined to grow with every passing year.
