Giveaways: Syracuse committed another error last night that led to an unearned run. The Mets lead the International League with 60 errors this season. Indianapolis is second with 56. The Mets have allowed the second-most unearned runs in the League with 45 of 283 total runs allowed being unearned. Indianapolis leads the lead with 46 unearned runs allowed but has only allowed 235 runs total.

Lee Isn't Playing Little: Since returning to the Syracuse Mets last week, **Khalil Lee** has found a groove at the plate. In ten games, the 23-year-old has gone 13-for-39 (.333 batting average) with five doubles, three home runs, seven runs scored, and nine RBIs. Lee has hit two home runs over the 22-foot-high Worcester Wall in right-field this week.

Prior to his return to Syracuse, Lee had gone just 11-for-74 at the plate in 22 games in Triple-A. The former Triple-A All-Star played eight games with St. Lucie in Low-A last month before his call back up to Triple-A. Last season, Lee hit .274 in 102 games with Syracuse, adding 20 doubles, 14 home runs and 37 RBIs with 8 stolen bases.

Streiking: **Travis Blankenhorn** has reached base in 12 of his last 15 games, including hits in 11 of 15. During his last 15 games, Blankenhorn is hitting .288 (15-for-52) with two RBIs, four doubles, five walks, 15 strikeouts, and a .351 on-base percentage. From the beginning of the season to May 11th, Blankenhorn hit .167 with 12 RBI, 4 homers, three doubles, four walks, 28 strikeouts, and a .216 on-base percentage.

Prospects Promotion: Outfielder **Jake Mangum** had four hits again yesterday. It is the second time in two weeks and the third time in his pro career that Mangum has had four hits in a game. The 26-year-old is 15-for-41 (.366) with five RBIs, five doubles, a walk, and two stolen bases in nine games with Syracuse after a promotion from Double-A Binghamton last Monday.

Mangum hit .283 with nine extra-base hits in 31 games in Double-A but was particularly hot in May, hitting .367 with three doubles, two triples, and a .433 on-base percentage in 16 games played this month. Mangum entered the 2022 season ranked as the 22nd-best prospect in the New York Mets organization by MLB Pipeline.

Do the Palka: Since reaching a season-low batting average of .205 on May 28th, Daniel Palka has hits in five consecutive games. During this stretch, the 30-year-old is hitting .429 (9-for-21) with five RBIs, a double, two runs scored, two walks, and four strikeouts.

From the beginning of the season to April 29th, Palka hit .288 (15-for-52) with 20 RBIs, six home runs, five doubles, 13 runs scored, 11 walks, 12 strikeouts, and a .413 on-base percentage.

From April 30th to May 28th, Palka hit .150 (12-for-80) with seven RBIs, four home runs, ten runs scored, nine walks, 27 strikeouts, and a .236 on-base percentage.

Power Surge: Since May 2nd, **Mark Vientos** is hitting .329 (24 for-73), with 14 RBIs, six home runs, three doubles, seven walks and a .395 on-base percentage in 19 games.

From the beginning of the season to May 1st, Vientos was hitting .164 (9-for-55) with seven RBIs, a home run, four doubles, a triple, nine walks, 22 strikeouts, and a .288 on-base percentage in 18 games.

Additionally, Vientos walked just four times in 15 games from the beginning of the season to April 24th, but in his last 24 games, Vientos has walked 12 times.

Timely Hitting: The Syracuse Mets have risen from last in the league hitting with runners in scoring position to 16th out of 20 teams with a .233 batting average with runners in scoring position. This week, the Mets are 24-for-55 (.436) with runners in scoring position. Last week, Syracuse went 10-for-41 (.244) with runners at second and/or third base.

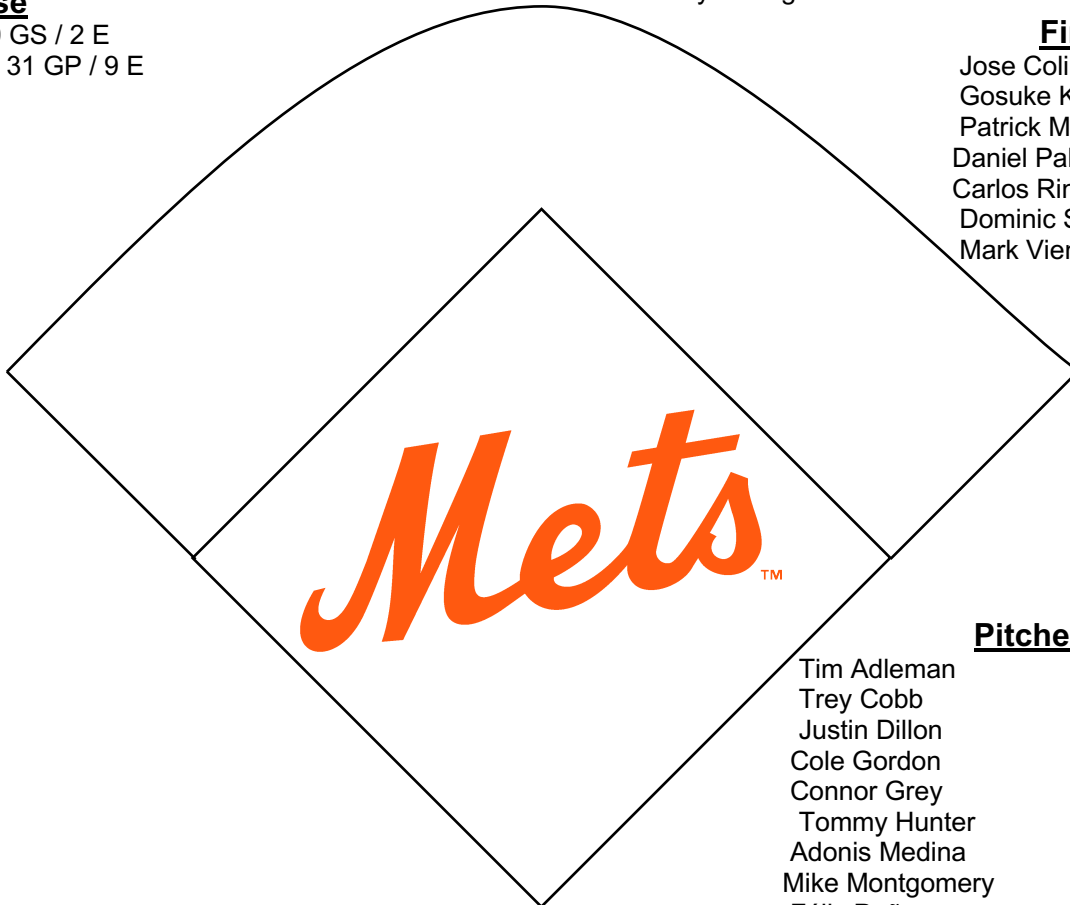
