LAST NIGHT: Despite three-RBI efforts from CJ Hinojosa and Jake Meyers, the Skeeters lost 10-7 Saturday night to the Albuquerque Isotopes. Hinojosa led off the game with a home run and Meyers added a two-run shot in the fourth inning. The Isotopes chased a 7-4 deficit with two runs in the fourth, one in the fifth and three in the sixth. Skeeters starter Brett Conine allowed a season-high seven runs while right-hander Austin Hansen allowed three runs through three innings of relief, and was issued the losing decision. Jose Briceno, Alan Trejo and Greg Bird each homered for Albuquerque.

CRUZ CONTROL: Bryan De La Cruz has homered in six of his last 14 games. Over his last 14, De La Cruz has hit .364 (20x55) with six home runs and 16 RBIs. De La Cruz is seventh in Triple A West in average (.325), fifth in RBIs (47), tied for first in hits (78) and tied for seventh in runs (43). De La Cruz's 12 homers in '21 give him a career-high, surpassing his eight home runs in '19 with Double A Corpus Christi and High-A Fayetteville.

JAKE RAKES: Jake Meyers had his 10-game hitting streak snapped in Friday's win. Meyers hit .351 (13x37) with a home run and eight RBIs throughout the streak. The 10-game hitting streak was the second-longest active streak in Triple A West. Meyers has gone on hitting streaks of 13 and 14 games this season as well. Bryan De La Cruz owns the longest Skeeters hitting streak of the season at 15 games. Meyers ranks fourth in Triple A West in average (.330), tied for fourth in home runs (16), seventh in OPS (1.006) and tied for second in runs (47). He's tied for first of all Astros minor leaguers with his 16 home runs.

10x10: Jose Siri hit his 11th homer of the season on 7/11 vs. Tacoma. He became the first player in Triple A West with at least 10 home runs and 10 stolen bases following his home run on 7/5 at Round Rock. Over his last five games, Siri has hit .389 (7x18) with a home run and two RBIs. Siri ranks eighth in Triple A West in average (.324), tied for seventh in RBIs (45), fifth in hits (69), ninth in doubles (16) and tied for second with 16 stolen bases.

TRIPLE A WEST, EAST LEADERS: The Skeeters are in first place in the East Division of Triple A West, ahead of Oklahoma City by 1.5 games. The Skeeters have remained in first place since their win on 6/18 at El Paso

HARTS ON FIRE: Sunday starter Ryan Hartman enters the night ifth in Triple A West in ERA (4.44), fourth in strikeouts (57), second in opponent's batting average (.242) and third in WHIP (1.26).

HINO'HERO': CJ Hinojosa has homered in back-to-back games, including a leadoff home run in Saturday's loss. It was the second leadoff home run for the Skeeters this season. Bryan De La Cruz led off the Skeeters' game on May 18 in Round Rock with a home run as well. In two starts out of the leadoff spot this season, Hinojosa has hit .556 (5x9) with two homers and four RBIs. He also leads the Skeeters and is tied for third in Triple A West with 19 doubles. The 19 doubles are tied for the most of Astros minor leaguers as well.

KEEPING UP WITH JONES: Since being optioned to the Skeeters on July 15, Taylor Jones has gone 5-for-9 with a double through two games.

SUNDAY FUNDAY: The Skeeters are hitting .313 in Sunday games, which is their highest batting average of any day of the week this season.

BACK TO ABQ: The Skeeters are set to begin their third series against Albuquerque this season. They've gone 11-3 (.786) vs. the Isotopes thus far, which is their winning percentage against any opponent this year. The Skeeters have hit .298 with 18 home runs in 13 games this year. Skeeters pitching has recorded a 3.20 ERA (47 ER/132.0 IP) with 149 strikeouts against Albuquerque.

LOCKDOWN: The Skeeters lead Triple A West with a 4.26 team ERA. They are seventh of all Triple A teams with a 3.92 ERA in July.

OH SO SWEET: The Skeeters are fourth of all full-season Minor League Baseball teams with a .278 average.

RISPY BUSINESS: CJ Hinojosa has hit .412 (21x51) with 29 RBIs while hitting with runners in scoring position this season. He leads all Skeeters players with at least 20 at-bats with runners in scoring position.

SURVIVAL KIT: Over his last six outings, LHP Kit Scheetz has tossed seven scoreless innings, striking out nine batters and allowing just two hits.

K-MART: Seth Martinez is second of Triple A West relievers with 47 strikeouts and is first with 32.2 IP.

HOMESTAND: The Skeeters went 3-3 in their most-recent homestand vs. the Tacoma Rainiers. It was the first-ever time the Skeeters faced the Rainiers and was the first time in franchise history the Skeeters played a team from the Pacific Time Zone.

BLANCO FUEGO: Ronel Blanco notched his 10th save of the season on Friday, adding to his career high. He ranks third in Triple A West in saves and leads all Astros minor leaguers.

ROSTER MOVES: Prior to Thursday's game, the Astros released RHP Hector Velazquez from the Skeeters. Velazquez has gone 1-1 with a 1.46 ERA (4 ER/24.2 IP) in 14 games (2 GS) with the Skeeters this season. He was acquired by the Astros from the Orioles on July 29, 2020, for a player to be named later. He pitched in parts of seasons from 2017-19 at the Major League level with Boston.

PLAYER OF THE MONTH: The Skeeters announced Friday that OF Jake Meyers was named the team's June Player of the Month. Meyers hit .337 (33x98) with 9 home runs, 17 RBIs and a 1.072 OPS in 24 games in June. He had a breakout series from June 17-22 in El Paso, hitting seven home runs with 11 RBIs over a five-day stretch.

RECORD NIGHT: The Skeeters set the following franchise records in Sunday's win, including their time from 2012-19 as an independent team in the Atlantic League of Professional Baseball:

- 24 runs scored was a single-game record ... Surpassed previous record of 18 runs (accomplished twice and last done on September 9, 2016 vs. the Southern Maryland Blue Crabs ... Most from a Triple A team this season and tied for second-most from any MiLB team
- 7 home runs were a single-game record ... Surpassed previous high of six home runs from July 2, 2019
 vs. the Long Island Ducks ... Tied for the most from a Triple A team this season and tied for second-most in all of MiLB
- 23 hits were a single-game record ... Surpassed the previous record of 22 hits on September 9, 2016, vs. the Southern Maryland Blue Crabs ... Second-most from a Triple A team this season
- Jake Meyers became the first player in Skeeters history to hit three home runs in a game
- 12 extra-base hits matched Skeeters single-game record set on September 9, 2016, and are the most from a Triple A team this season and tied for second-most of all MiLB teams
- 50 total bases is a franchise record ... Surpassed previous high of 37 from July 2, 2019 ... Most from a MiLB team this season

MiLB HONORS: RHP Brett Conine was named the Triple A West Pitcher of the Month for May by Minor League Baseball. Conine went 4-0 with a 0.95 ERA (2 ER/19 IP) through four games (three starts) in May. He recorded the lowest ERA in Triple A West and led the league in wins, opponent batting average (.167) and WHIP (0.95) at the end of the month.

CLOSE TO HOME: Based on approximate mileage, the Skeeters are located second-closest to the stadium of their parent club out of Triple A teams. The St. Paul Saints are located approximately 11 miles from Minnesota's Target Field.

PUT IT ON THE MANTEL: Ronnie Dawson, Alex De Goti and Peter Solomon each made their Major League debuts with the Astros this season. Dawson went 1x5 with a run through 3 G, De Goti went 2x6 with a run and RBI through 6 G and Solomon tossed a scoreless 2 IP in relief, allowing just one hit and striking out two. Since the Skeeters opened their season on May 6, three players have made their Major League debut with the Astros. Tyler Ivey recieved his first MLB promotion on May 21 and made his first Major League start that day, allowing four runs on sixt hits, while striking out three, over 4 2/3 innings to take a no-decision at Texas. Ralph Garza Jr. received his first promotion to the Major Leagues on May 26. He made his Major League debut on May 29 vs. San Diego and threw an inning of relief. Ryan Hartman was promoted on June 30 and made his MLB debut that night vs. Baltimore at Minute Maid Park. He allowed a run on three hits and struck out two through 2 1/3 innings of relief.

NOW HERE'S A STOREY: Mickey Storey is entering his third year as the manager of the Astros Triple A affiliate. He led Round Rock to the best record in Triple A in 2019 (84-56) and to the Pacific Coast League Finals. Storey got his first managerial job in the Astros system in 2018 with Class A Quad Cities, winning the Western Division of the Midwest League. Storey appeared at the MLB level with the Astros in 2012 and the Blue Jays in 2013 as a right-handed pitcher. He still holds numerous career pitching records for Florida Atlantic University. He finished his career second all-time in strikeouts, tied for second in wins and finished top 10 in strikeouts per nine innings, games started, fewest walks per nine innings and innings pitched. Storey

REST OF THE CREW: Joining Mickey Storey on his staff are pitching coach **Erick Abreu**, hitting coach **Ben Rosenthal** and development coach **Sean Connole**. **John Gregorich** and **A.J. Smith** are the Skeeters' athletic trainers and **Hazael Wessin** is the team's strength and conditioning coach. Abreu is in his eighth season with the Astros organization and his first as the organization's Triple A pitching coach. Rosenthal is in his fifth season with the Astros and third as the hitting coach for their Triple A affiliate. Connole is in his second season with the Astros and his first as the development coach for the team's Triple A affiliate.

A LITTLE ABOUT US: Through their first nine seasons, the Skeeters played in the independent Atlantic League of Professional Baseball. They won the Atlantic League Championship in '16 and '18 and appeared in the post-season in five of nine seasons. The Skeeters still hold the Atlantic League single-season record for wins (95) and winning percentage (.679) from their '13 season. The Skeeters have been managed by former Major Leaguers Gary Gaetti (2012-17) and Pete Incaviglia (2018-20). As an independent team, the Skeeters went 601-502. Notable people to appear for the Skeeters include: LHP Scott Kazmir, RHP Roger Clemens, IF Rafael Palmeiro, Tracy McGrady, IF James Loney, C Derek Norris, OF Willy Taveras and RHP Felipe Paulino
