The Fightin Phils stay on the road and continue their penultimate road trip of the season at the Altoona Curve, Double-A affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates. It is the second-of-six match ups with the Curve this season, with all six at People's Natural Gas Field in Altoona. After not playing at all in 2024, this week is Reading's first match up with the Curve since playing a series in Altoona from July 18-23, of the 2023 season. Altoona leads the season series 1-0.

#### Game 113 Recap

The Fightin Phils dropped their sixth-straight game on Tuesday night, falling 6-5 to Altoona. Some misfortune from Griff McGarry in the bottom of the first ultimately led to Termarr Johnson scoring the first run of the night on a wild pitch from McGarry. Down by one in the third, the Fightin Phils delivered four runs in the frame to jump ahead 4-1. Jose Rodriguez delivered a two-run single and then Felix Reyes doubled to score Rodriguez. Dylan Campbell then singled home Reyes to cap off the strong inning. Altoona thought clawed back with a run each in the fourth and fifth innings. Mitch Jebb hit a RBI single in the fourth and then Omar Alfonzo doubled home Esmerlyn Valdez to trim Altoona's deficit to one. Reading responded with a run in the top of the sixth inning was Erick Brito doubled home Campbell to extend the advantage to 5-3. From there, it was all Altoona. An error by Reyes and sac fly from newcomer Konnor Grffin plated two runs in the sixth to tie the game up at five. Tommy McCollum entered in the bottom of the eighth and allowed a single to Duce Gourson and then stole second and third. Tres Gonzalez then lifted a sac fly to put the Curve up 6-5, a lead they would hold onto to capture the opening game of the series.

#### **Buzzed Hair Miller**

After going hitless on July 26 against Binghamton, Aidan Miller told The Athletic's Matt Gelb that teammate Dylan Campbell buzzed Miller's hair because Miller said pre-game that if he went hitless he would shave his head. Since sporting the new haircut on July 27 (18 games), Miller is slashing .320/.416/.520 (.936 OPS); with 19 runs, nine doubles, two homers, nine RBI and is 10-12 in stolen bases. Miller has hits in 15-of-18 games and posted 2+ hits in eight of the games. Included in that stretch was an Eastern League Player of the Week honor last Monday. Miller enters play today with an Eastern League best, and Phillies organizational best, 47 stolen bases on the season. He is the first Fightin Phil to swipe 40+ bags in a season since Quintin Berry in 2009. If Miller is to reach 50 over the next 23 games, he would be the first Reading player to steal 50-or-more in a season since Jose Leiva swiped 50 in 1987. Miller's other Eastern League ranks are: T-4th BB (58 and 3rd runs (59).

#### King Felix

Over six games last week, Felix Reyes slashed .385/.448/.692 (1.140 OPS); with seven runs, five doubles, one home run and seven RBI. Since the start of June, Reyes holds the following Eastern League ranks: 1st AVG (.332), 5th RBI (33), 6th OBP (.374), 1st SLG (.577), 1st OPS (.951), T-1st hits (65), 1st doubles (18), 1st XBH (29), 1st total bases (113) and 3rd in runs scored (39).

#### **Ricketts Rolling**

Caleb Ricketts matched a career-best with four base hits last Tuesday night. It was the fourth time in Ricketts' career he had four hits in a game, with the last coming on June 8 of this season, when he was rehabbing with Clearwater (A). He then homered for the second-straight night last Wednesday. Ricketts has been red-hot in August; over 12 games, Ricketts is slashing .358/.382/.547 (.929 OPS), with 10 runs, four doubles, two home runs and 10 RBI. In August, Ricketts is fourth in the Eastern League in hitting (.358), 8th in slugging (.547), 9th in OPS (.929) and 6th in hits (19).

#### McIntosh Back on Track

Since going 3-35 (.086) over nine games on Reading's two-week road trip from July 29-August 10, Paul McIntosh has turned things around in a big way. Over five games since the end of the last road trip, McIntosh is slashing .364/.391/.682 (1.073 OPS), with two runs, a double, two home runs and five RBI. He has three multi-hit games in his last five contests, including two hits on Tuesday to begin the series at Altoona.

Since July 29, the Fightin Phils lead the Eastern League with 46 stolen bases, 10 ahead of second place over that stretch. On the season, Reading now ranks fourth in the league with 147 stolen bags, which comes after stealing 152 all of last season.

Altoona has a 57-57 record and is first in the Southwest Division in the second half with a 27-19 record. The Curve took four-of-six games from Richmond last week heads to Harrisburg next week. Altoona's roster includes xx of Pittsburgh's top-30 prospects: Konnor Griffin (1), Termarr Johnson (6), Esmerlyn Valdez (15), Mitch Jebb (18), Omar Alfonzo (19), Jack Brannigan (21), Anthony Solometo (25) and Wilber Dotel (28).

#### Altoona Arm

Righty, and Pirates' No. 28 prospect, Wilber Dotel makes his 23rd start of the season for Altoona. He is 5-7, with a 4.41 ERA (50 ER, 102.0 IP). Dotel earned the win last Thursday at Richmond, allowing one run over six innings. This season, Dotel is 10th in the Eastern League in ERA (441), 3rd in strikeouts (109), T-1st in starts (22), 9th in IP (102.0), 6th in BAA (.248), 6th in WHIP (1.26) and 8th in WPCT (.417). Dotel spent all of 2024 with Greensboro (A+), going 9-5, with a 5.33 ERA over 25 starts. The 22-year old signed with the Pirates in 2020 as an International Free Agent out of the Dominican Republic
