YESTERDAY: The Skeeters lost their first game of the season 6-4 in Albuquerque on Sunday afternoon. Taylor Jones drove in all four runs for the Skeeters, with a two-run double and two-run home run.

HEY SIRI: Jose Siri has logged multi-hit games through the first four contests of the season. He's logged multiple RBIs in three of the first four games. His nine RBIs lead Triple A West. Siri hit the first-ever home run in Skeeters Triple A history with a three-run shot on Friday night.

ROSTER MOVES: Following Friday night's game, the Astros announced the signing of infielder Yadiel Rivera and assigned him to Sugar Land. Infielder Colton Shaver was assigned to Corpus Christi (AA). Rivera has appeared at the MLB level each season from 2015-20 and has logged 192 MLB appearances. He last appeared in four games with Texas in '20. Rivera played in a career-high 111 games in '18.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: The Skeeters hit four doubles on Sunday and their 17 doubles as a team lead Triple A West, with the next closest team at 14 doubles (Reno).

HIT PARADE: The Skeeters are hitting .363 (58x160) as a team through four games. It's the highest team batting average of any Triple A team, with Round Rock the next-closest (.321). Skeeters pitching has held Albuquerque to a .189 average (25x163).

PUTTING OUT THE FIRE: Skeeters relievers had tossed 10 straight scoreless innings prior to Taylor Motter's eighth-inning homer on Sunday and own a 1.17 ERA this season (2 ER/15.1 IP).

MOVING ON UP: The Skeeters are in their first season in affiliated minor league baseball as the Triple A affiliate of the Houston Astros. The Skeeters are one of three independent teams rising to affiliated minor league ranks this offseason, along with the St. Paul Saints (AAA, MIN) and Somerset Patriots (AA, NYY).

A LITTLE ABOUT US: Through their first nine seasons of existence, the Skeeters played in the independent Atlantic League of Professional Baseball. They won the Atlantic League Championship in 2016 and '18 and appeared in the postseason in five of nine seasons.

The Skeeters still hold the Atlantic League single-season record for wins (95) and winning percentage (.679) from their 2013 season.

CLOSE TO HOME: Based on approximate mileage, the Skeeters are located second-closest to the stadium of their parent club out The St. Paul Saints are located approximately 11 miles from Minnesota's Target Field.

NOW HERE'S A STOREY: Mickey Storey is entering his third year as the manager of the Astros Triple A affiliate. He led Round Rock to the best record in Triple A in 2019 (84-56) and to the Pacific Coast League Finals. Storey got his first managerial job in the Astros system in 2018 with Class A Quad Cities, winning the Western Division of the Midwest League. Storey appeared at the MLB level with the Astros in 2012 and the Blue Jays in 2013 as a right-handed pitcher. He still holds numerous career pitching records for Florida Atlantic University.

MAJOR TALENT: The Skeeters roster features eight players with Major League service time: OF Ronnie Dawson, IF Alex De Goti, IF Taylor Jones, RHP Nivaldo Rodriguez, RHP Peter Solomon, C Garrett Stubbs, IF Abraham Toro, RHP Hector Velazquez. All but Velazquez have appeared at the Majors with the Astros.

PROSPECT POWER: The Skeeters have nine players ranked as Astros top-30 prospects (per MLB Pipeline): RHP Tyler Ivey (No. 9), RHP Shawn Dubin (No. 11), RHP Peter Solomon (No. 14), RHP Jojanse Torres (No. 20), IF Taylor Jones (No. 21), RHP Brett Conine (No. 23), RHP Austin Hansen (No. 24), RHP Nivaldo Rodriguez (No. 25), OF Ronnie Dawson (No. 29)

PUT IT ON THE MANTEL: Ronnie Dawson, Alex De Goti and Peter Solomon each made their Major League debuts with the Astros this season. Dawson went 1x5 with a run through 3 G, De Goti went 2x6 with a run and RBI through 6 G and Solomon tossed a scoreless 2 IP in relief, allowing just one hit and striking out two.

WELCOME TO ABQ: The Skeeters are making their first trip to Albuquerque in franchise history. The Skeeters and Isotopes are scheduled to play each other 30 times this season and are both in the East Division of Triple-A West. The Isotopes visit Constellation Field in Sugar Land for the first time from May 27-June 1.

SHOW BEFORE THE SHOW: Rodriguez is set to make his Triple A debut with Monday's start. He bypassed the Double A and Triple A levels to make his Major League debut in '20. He's also made one relief appearance at the MLB level in '21 (4/13 vs. DET), allowing one run and striking out three over three innings.

PROSPECT CREDENTIALS: Rodriguez is rated as the Astros No. 25 prospect by MLB Pipeline.

BIG LEAGUE DEBUT: Rodriguez made his MLB debut on 7/28/20 vs. Los Angeles (NL) and threw two scoreless innings in relief ... He picked up his first strikeout against 2019 NL MVP Cody Bellinger in his debut ... Set his MLB career highs in innings pitched (4) and strikeouts (5) in his final outing of the season on 9/27/20 at Texas

THIS IS 40: Rodriguez is one of two Skeeters pitchers on the Astros 40-man roster. Rodriguez was added to the Astros 40-man roster in November 2019

CAREER YEAR: Spent the bulk of his '19 season with Fayetteville (A+) and went a combined 6-6 with a 2.83 ERA (28 ER/105.0 IP), also appearing with Quad Cities (A) ... Posted professional career highs in WHIP (0.990), H/9 (5.9) and innings pitched ... Tied for the Carolina League lead in wins (11), was third in WHIP (1.41) and was third in ERA (4.64) ... Recorded the second-lowest ERA of Astros minor leaguers with at least 100 innings pitched

PLAYOFF HERO: Rodriguez went 1-1 with a 2.31 ERA (3 ER/11.2 IP) in the 2019 Carolina League postseason, helping lead Fayetteville to the Carolina League Finals
