CHIHUAHUAS WIN AGAIN

Round Rock fell 14-8 on Saturday. The Express grabbed a 1-0 lead in the second on a SS Jonathan Ornelas RBI single. El Paso answered with a run in the home half when 2B Forrest Wall hit a sacrifice fly to center field and 3B Nate Mondou tied the game. The Chihuahuas broke it open with seven runs on six hits in the bottom of the third to take an 8-1 lead. In the fifth, El Paso added three more. Durán doubled to score two. Dungan tripled and Durán scored to make it 11-1. Round Rock 1B Jake Burger belted his first Express homer in the top of the sixth. 3B Cody Freeman got on with a single then C Chad Wallach sent him around on a single. LF Alex De Goti reached on a throwing error by Mondou and Ornelas came home on the play, cutting the E-Train deficit to 11-4. El Paso matched Round Rock with three runs of their own in the bottom of the sixth to make it 14-4. The Express plated a run on three hits in the seventh. In the eighth, Round Rock put two on and Burger tallied his second RBI of the night with a single. The Express scratched a pair of runs across in the ninth but that was all as they fell by a final score of 14-6 to the Chihuahuas.

TURNING TO CORY

Round Rock RHP Cory Abbott is scheduled to make his Express debut on Sunday. Abbott signed a minor league deal with Texas earlier this week. He opened 2025 with the Tecolotes de los Dos Laredos of the Mexican League and made three starts. He has appeared in the Major Leagues with the Cubs (2021) and Nationals (2022-2023) and has made 45 appearances with 10 starts in the big leagues while posting a 6.02 ERA (70 ER/104.2 IP).

SALVAGING THE SERIES

The Express are now 2-3-2 in their seven series this season. It's their first series loss since April 8-13 against Oklahoma City. Round Rock is two games below .500 for the first time since April 15 and they are 4-10 in their last 14 games.

OFFENSE KEEPS ROLLING

Six of Round Rock's nine batters recorded a multi-hit night on Saturday while their 15 hits tied a season-high. In the last eight games, the Express are averaging 6.1 runs and 10.3 hits per game with a slash line of .299/.371/.496/.867. For the entire season, they have a slash line of .256/.316/.408/.746.

CODY COOL AS A CUCUMBER

INF Cody Freeman owns a nine-game on-base streak after going 3-for-5 with a double, an RBI and a run scored. During the streak, Freeman is slashing .417/.462/.583/1.045 with six doubles, six RBI, six runs scored, three walks and two strikeouts. His .328 batting average (38-116) is seventh in the PCL.

SLOW STARTS

Round Rock starting pitchers are 3-10 with a 5.81 ERA (93 ER/144.0 IP). They have the fewest wins of any starting rotation in the PCL and the third-worst ERA. They are averaging 3.2 innings per start in the first 38 games this year.

BIG LEAGUE EXPERIENCE

In total, 22 of the 31 players on the Opening Day roster have logged Major League service time in their careers, including 14 of the 18 pitchers on the staff, Barlow (Rangers), RHP Caleb Boushley (Brewers, Twins), RHP David Buchanan (Phillies, Reds), RHP JT Chargois (Twins, Dodgers, Mariners, Rays, Marlins), Dunning (White Sox, Rangers), RHP Codi Heuer (Cubs, White Sox), RHP Adrian Houser (Brewers, Mets), Latz (Rangers), Pennington (Rangers, Royals), LHP Michael Plassmeyer (Phillies), Robert (Rangers), RHP Hunter Strickland (Giants, Mariners, Nationals, Mets, Rays, Angels, Brewers, Reds, Angels) and Winn (Rangers). 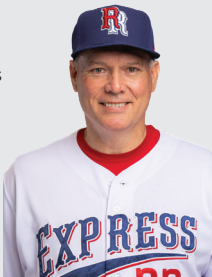

EXPRESS MANAGER DOUG DAVIS

The 2025 season marks Round Rock Express Manager Doug Davis's third season with the E-Train. In 2024, Davis secured his 800th win as a manager on July 12 at Reno. In his first season with the Express in 2023, he guided the E-Train to a PCL Second Half title and the club's first playoff appearance since 2019. The team's 89 total wins were the most regular-season wins in franchise history and just the seventh 80-win campaign in club history. Davis oversaw the longest winning streak in franchise history when the Express won 14 consecutive games from August 8-23.

Prior to Round Rock, Davis spent two seasons as the manager for the Scranton Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, the New York Yankees Triple-A affiliate. Davis brings over 25 years of coaching experience to the Express dugout. Since he began coaching in 1995, he has led a minor league team for 10 total seasons and has accumulated a career 744-665 record. He spent the 2003-2004 seasons as the bench coach for the Florida Marlins, where he won the 2003 World Series.



In two seasons as the manager for Scranton Wilkes-Barre, Davis led the RailRiders to a combined record of 158-119. Last season, he helped oversee a pitching staff that led all Triple-A teams with a 3.89 ERA. Prior to his time as skipper, Davis spent three years in three different roles with Scranton Wilkes-Barre from 2017-2019. In 2017, he was the defensive coach before moving over to bullpen coach in 2018. In 2019, Davis was named the bench coach.

Before joining the New York Yankees organization, Davis spent 11 years in the Toronto Blue Jays system in a variety of roles. Before he was named manager of the RailRiders in 2021, Davis hadn't held a manager title since 2008. He has also been a minor league field coordinator for the Montreal Expos (2001) and Florida Marlins (2002, 2005). His coaching career began in the Yankees system in 1995.

A catcher and infielder in his playing days, Davis was a ninth-round selection by the California Angels in the 1984 MLB Draft. He played professionally for 11 seasons between the Angels, Rangers and Kansas City Royals organizations. He appeared in seven games in the big leagues and tallied six games in 1988 with the Angels, while appearing in one game for the Rangers in 1992. He is a native of Bloomsburg, Pennsylvania.
