## TODAY'S HEADLINES

**LAST TIME OUT:** The Saints piled on seven runs in the first inning and rode that lead to a 14-6 win over Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on Friday night. The Saints tied their season-highs for runs and hits in an inning with seven runs on seven hits in the first. Every Saints batter recorded a hit and a run and seven of the nine drove in a run. Michael Helman and Jair Camargo each finished with three-hit nights and Helman tied a career-high with four runs scored. Randy Dobnak picked up his 10<sup>th</sup> win of the season, becoming the first Saints' Triple-A pitcher to accomplish the feat. The bullpen hung on with 4.0 innings of shutout relief from Ryan Jensen and Nick Wittgren to close out the game.

**DOBNAK DOES DOUBLE-DIGIT DUBS:** Randy Dobnak scored his 10<sup>th</sup> win of the season on Friday, becoming the first Saints pitcher to accomplish the feat since joining the International League in 2021. He's only the second IL pitcher to do so this season, joining Nashville's Chad Patrick, who has a league-best 11 wins. The previous record of nine wins was held by Chandler Shepherd in 2021, in addition to Caleb Boushley, who has nine wins this season. Dobnak is the first Twins' Triple-A pitcher to record 10 wins in a season since Aaron Slegers (15 wins) and David Hurlbut (10 wins) each reached the mark for the 2017 Rochester Red Wings.

**A LEAGUE OF HIS OWN:** DaShawn Keirse Jr. has put together an impressive 2024 campaign, recording 108 hits, 14 home runs and 31 stolen bases. He is the only Triple-A player this season to record at least 100 hits, 10 home runs and 30 steals. He is one of six minor leaguers to amass those totals this season. The Saints are one of three IL teams since 2021 to have multiple players record 100-10-30 seasons, as Andrew Stevenson (132-16-44) did so last year. The Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders (Estevan Florial and Oswald Peraza, 2022) and the Omaha Storm Chasers (Brewer Hicklen and Dairon Blanco, 2022) are the others. Keirse Jr. is fifth on the single-season hit totals at 108, trailing Jermaine Palacios (111, 2022), Jose Miranda (117, 2021), Tomás Telis (125, 2021) and the franchise record set by Andrew Stevenson at 132 hits last season.

**THE RACE TO 75:** DaShawn Keirse Jr. and Yunior Severino have found themselves in a race to break the franchise single-season RBI record, sitting at 70 and 69, respectively. The record was set by Chris Williams in 2023, who knocked in 75 runs. Keirse Jr. and Severino have also climbed into the league leaders for RBI, with Keirse Jr. ranking tied for fifth and Severino sixth. The Saints are one of two teams to have multiple players among the league's top 10 in RBI, with Rochester being the other (Travis Blankenhorn and Jose Tena).

**REHAB ROUNDTABLE:** Brooks Lee joins Alex Kirilloff on Major League Rehab tonight. Kirilloff was placed on the Twins' 10-Day Injured List on June 13 with a back issue and transferred to the 60-Day on July 30. Lee was placed on the 10-Day Injured List on August 9 (retro August 8) with right bicep tendinitis.

Lee has played 54 career games with the Saints since 2021, hitting .362/.452/.667 with a 1.119 OPS. He has clubbed 17 homers in those 54 games, totaling .071 HR/PA with St. Paul, the second-base rate in franchise history (min. 50 PA), trailing Brent Rooker's .075 HR/PA.

Lee played 20 games with the Saints this year before he was called up for his Major League debut on July 3. In 20 games Lee hit .329/.394/.635 with seven home runs.

**ELECTRIC EELES:** Since joining the Saints on July 4, he has constantly found ways to get on base, sporting a .425 on-base percentage in Triple-A. He's reached base in 32 of the 37 games he's played in, drawing 18 walks and been hit by a pitch seven times. He is fifth among full-season minor league players in on-base percentage at .442 across three levels. Of the four players ahead of him, only two have played in Triple-A.

**SUMMERTIME SEVERINO:** In Yunior Severino's 65 games since May 21, he has hit .320 (79-for-247), with 13 home runs, drawing 41 walks, owning a .940 OPS. In that time, Severino is tied for the league lead in OPS, ranks third in batting average and RBI (48), sixth in on-base percentage (.410) and with 79 hits and eighth in slugging percentage at .530.

**TWINS UPDATE:** The Minnesota Twins dropped their series opener to the St. Louis Cardinals 6-1. David Festa took the loss, allowing three runs on three hits over 3.2 innings. Ryan Jeffers accounted for two of the Twins' five hits.

**LAST START:** 8/18 @ IND...made second AAA start, throwing 3.0 innings, allowing three runs on two hits, walking four (tying his career high) and struck out three...all three runs allowed were scored in the second inning, walking two, allowing two hits and hitting a batter in the inning...faced four batters in the first and third inning...started twice in one series for the first time in his career...did not factor into the decision on a 7-6 Saints loss.

**APPEARANCE PRIOR:** 8/13 @ IND...made AAA debut, throwing a quality start of 6.0 innings, allowing one run on two hits, one home run, walking one and striking out two...worked around a triple in the first inning...gave up a solo home run to Billy McKinney in the second inning...retired 14 of final 15 batters faced, walking Henry Davis in the fourth inning...primarily threw his slider, using it 46% of the time (37 pitches)...did not factor into the decision in a 5-4 Saints loss.

**ON THE FAST TRACK:** Morris will be pitching at his third different level of minor league baseball with the Saints in 2024, but it won't be the first time he's accelerated at a faster pace that his peers. He graduated high school at only 16 years old, starting his freshman season of college at just 17. He was born on the cutoff date of September 1 for starting school and his mother chose to start him in kindergarten a year ahead. Not only that, he also skipped second grade as he was being homeschooled in Alaska.

**BUILDING UP TRAVEL POINTS:** Although he was born in Manhattan, Morris claims Boulder, Colorado as his hometown. He moved from New York as a child to Oregon, then to Alaska and then to Colorado, where he attended Monarch High School in Boulder. He tells people Boulder is where he's from as that is where he lived the longest.
