TODAY'S GAME: The Rancho Cucamonga Quakes complete a home-and-home series this afternoon, with game three of a three-game road trip against the Visalia Rawhide at Valley Strong Ballpark. The Quakes return to LoanMart Field on Tuesday, July 8, as they host the Inland Empire 66ers. Tickets are available at rcquakes.com.

VS THE RAWHIDE: Today's game is the 12th of 24 head-to-head meetings and the ninth of 15 here at Valley Strong Ballpark. In May, the Quakes won four of six in Visalia and are coming off two of three earlier this week at home. Last night's win gives them with a 7-4 mark against the Rawhide. Last season, the Quakes went 14-16 against the Rawhide, 7-8 here in Visalia.

LAST GAME: The Quakes saw the Rawhide tie the game with two outs in the ninth, but went on to score eight in the top of the tenth, as they beat Visalia on Saturday night by a final of 13-7 in ten innings. RBI hits from Jose Meza, Victor Rodrigues and Mairo Martinus helped Rancho take a 13-5 lead in extras. Marco Corcho finished it off in the tenth for Rancho, which snapped a four-game road losing streak. Myles Caba (4-1) was credited with the win. Visalia reliever and former Quake Darlin Pinales (0-2) suffered the loss.

ROAD NOT SO FRIENDLY, LATELY: Last night's win ended a four-game losing streak on the road, but the Quakes have had a tough go of it recently, as they've dropped six of their last eight road games overall. The recent San Jose series finished poorly for Rancho, as they dropped decisions of 9-2, 12-4 and 20-2. With Friday night's 15-3 loss at Visalia, they had been outscored in their last four road games by 45 runs (56-11). Last night's win changed all that and moved Rancho's road record to 23-21.

END OF JUNE: The Quakes had a pretty inconsistent June and hope for a more stable month as the calendar turns to July. By record, June was Rancho's worst month at 11-14. The month of June literally started with game one of a season-worst eight-game losing streak, only to be followed by a season-high nine-game winning streak. As a team, they hit just .233 with an ERA of 5.55, easily their worst statistical months this season. Jaron Elkins had the best offensive month, hitting .316 with ten RBIs and 16 stolen bases in 23 games, but he didn't go deep all month. On the pitching side of things, reliever Cody Morse enjoyed a strong month, allowing just two earned runs over 12.1 innings.

ROSTER MOVES: The Quakes made another roster move on Friday, sending outfielder Cameron Decker to Great Lakes of the High-A Midwest League after appearing in just five games since being activated from the Injured List. LHP Felix Cabrera was released on Wednesday, after going 1-5 with a 10.71 ERA over 16 games. In addition, RHP Dailoui Abad was added to the Rancho Cucamonga roster from the 60-Day Injured List.

STERLING PATICK: 20-year-old Sterling Patick makes his 11th start and 15th appearance, his third against the Rawhide. Against the Rawhide this year, he's 0-0, allowing two runs on nine hits over 8.1 innings. Patick's last start was this past Tuesday against Visalia at LoanMart Field, where he allowed two runs on seven hits over 4.1 innings in a no-decision. Patick was a 2023 18th-round selection for the Dodgers out of South Hills High School in West Covina.

ERICK REYNOSO: 22-year-old Erick Reynoso makes his eighth start and 13th appearance, his first start and second appearance against Rancho. In his lone game against the Quakes, he allowed four runs on two hits over 1.2 innings in a no-decision on May 11 at Valley Strong Ballpark. In his last game overall, he allowed just one run on two hits over a season-best six innings, suffering a tough-luck loss at Inland Empire on June 29. Reynoso signed with Arizona in October of 2022 out of the Dominican Republic.
