Inland Empire 66ers (10-23)

RANCHO CUCAMONGA QUAKES (20-12)





LHP Francis Texido (1-2, 3.60 ERA) vs. RHP Jose Rodriguez (4-1, 5.47 ERA)

TODAY'S GAME: Welcome to LoanMart Field, as your first-place Quakes continue a 12-game home stand, with game two of a six-game set against the Inland Empire 66ers (LAA). Today is another IEHP Education Day, with a special start time of 11am! Tickets are available at rcquakes.com.

VS THE 66ERS: Today's game is the eighth of 24 head-to-head meetings between the two clubs and the second of 12 at home. The Quakes are currently 6-1 against the 66ers in 2024, with the first six games taking place at San Manuel so far. Last year, the Quakes went 8-4 here at San Manuel Stadium, 14-13 overall against the 66ers.

LAST GAME: Patrick Copen pitched a career-best seven innings, as the Quakes rolled to their fourth straight win overall, shutting out the Inland Empire 66ers by a final of 6-0 on Tuesday night at LoanMart Field. Copen (3-2) scattered just three hits while walking one over seven scoreless innings, finishing with four strikeouts. Robinson Ortiz finished it off with two scoreless innings, helping the Quakes net their fourth shutout overall and their third in the last nine games. Kendall George had three hits, a run scored and an RBI, while Jeral Perez finished with two hits, including the game's only home run, his fifth. Inland Empire starter Barrett Kent (1-5) took the loss, allowing four runs in 4.1

RECAPPING THE ROAD TRIP: While it started off poorly, it finished strong, as the Quakes won four of six over Visalia, including the final three at Valley Strong Ballpark, as they finished the road trip at 5-7 overall. Rancho has won every single six-game series this year, with the exception of the Modesto series to open this past road trip, when they went 1-5. Even with the sub-.500 road trip, the Quakes only lost a half-game in the standings, as they currently lead second-place Lake Elsinore by a season-high five games and third-place Visalia by 6.5 games.

LACK OF LONG-BALLS: The Quakes slugged just four home runs through the 12 games of this past road trip, with the first three being clubbed by infielder Jordan Thompson and the final one by Samuel Munoz. Thompson, who had a multi-homer game in last Tuesday's loss at Visalia, now leads the club with five, one more than Jeral Perez. Jeral Perez got the Quakes going last night, slugging his first home run in almost four weeks. Despite the home run drought for Rancho, the Quakes are still second in the league in home runs with 22, six fewer than league-leading Modesto (28) **ROSTER MOVES:** The Quakes made a number of roster moves on the 12-game road trip. The final move came on Sunday, when they added RHP Waylin Santana to the active roster. He took the roster spot of RHP Carlos Duran, who went on the Development List earlier in the week.

JOSE RODRIGUEZ: The Quakes will give the ball to right-hander Jose Rodriguez today, as he makes his second start, but his seventh overall appearance, his third appearance and first start against Inland Empire. In his previous two outings against the 66ers, he combined to allow one run on five hits over 9.2 innings, while striking out 19 batters, going 2-0 in relief. He suffered the defeat in his last overall outing, when he allowed seven runs on eight hits over just 3.2 innings in a loss at Visalia on May 9. Rodriguez signed with the Dodgers in 2019 out of Oaxaca, Mexico.

FRANCIS TEXIDO: Left-hander Francis Texido makes his seventh appearance and sixth start for Inland Empire this year, his third appearance and second start against the Quakes. In his two appearances against Rancho, he's 0-1, allowing four earned runs on six hits over 8.1 innings. In his last start overall, he allowed three runs on three hits over just two innings in a loss at Lake Elsinore on May 9. Last year, he went 6-1 with a 2.31 ERA over 12 starts and 50.2 innings. Texido signed with the Angels in 2023 out of Havana, Cuba.
