TODAY'S GAME: The Isotopes evened the series last night with an 8-4 triumph over Sugar Land, their second-straight win ... Albuquerque looks to win three-straight games in Sugar Land for just the third time ever (also: Aug. 13-16, 2021 and June 2-4, 2022) ... Anthony Molina and AJ Blubaugh are expected to start for the Isotopes and Space Cowboys, respectively.

RUNS ALLOWED: Albuquerque's pitching staff has allowed 67 runs, their lowest total through the first 13 games of a season since 2017 (54 runs). The Isotopes relented 110 tallies over their first 13 games last year.

HOMER STREAK: Albuquerque has homered in nine-straight games, longest stretch since Aug. 30-Sept. 8, 2024 (nine games).

MULTIPLE DINGERS: Albuquerque has also connected on multiple clouts in six-straight, the longest such streak since April 19-27, 2019 (eight games, 25 total homers).

COMEBACK: Last night marked the first time the Isotopes won a game at Sugar Land in which they trailed at any point since Sept. 1, 2022. In that contest, Zach Neal allowed seven runs in the first inning before Albuquerque rallied for a 9-7 triumph.

BY WAY OF THE K: The Isotopes pitching staff registered 14 strikeouts last night (tied season-high), the fourth-straight contest with double-digit punchouts. The last time Albuquerque struck out double-digit batters in at least four-straight games was June 25-29, 2024, a string of five-straight.

KEEP IT CLEAN: Albuquerque was not charged with an error last night, the tenth contest this year without an error. The Isotopes' six miscues on the year are the fewest in the Pacific Coast League and fourth-fewest in Triple-A.

DINGERS: Albuquerque has homered in 11 of their first 13 games to begin the season ... The club has 23 homers on the year, the most in Triple-A.

JUST WIN: Last night was the second time in 2025 Albuquerque won despite being out-hit by four (also: March 30 at Sacramento).

HOMERS ALLOWED: Jacob Melton homered twice for the Space Cowboys last night, the first opposing player to accomplish the feat since Reno's Tim Tawa on Aug. 30, 2024 at Isotopes Park.

ASSIST: Sam Hilliard recorded Albuquerque's fourth outfield assist of the campaign when he threw out Cesar Salazar at third base in the second inning last night. Fernández has the other three assists, all coming during the first weekend in Sacramento.

FULFORD: Braxton Fulford registered three hits last night for his fifth multi-hit game of the year and fifth-straight. Over his last five contests, he is slashing .579/.619/1.316 with 11 hits, two doubles, four homers and nine RBI ... Has reached base in ninestraight games ... It was his first three-hit game since August 14, 2024 vs. Somerset.

YF: Yanquiel Fernández went 0-for-4 last night, ending his nine game on-base streak. He was 10-for-35 with two doubles, three homers, five RBI and three walks during the stretch.

WARMIN' UP: Warming Bernabel singled twice Thursday for his third multi-hit contest of the year and second in his last four games. Also swiped his first Triple-A bag in the fifth frame.

SAM I AM: Sam Hilliard has 78 home runs in an Isotopes uniform across five seasons (2019, 21, 22, 24 and 25). He is one blast away from tying Mike Busch (1993-96) for most among all Albuquerque Triple-A players.

ISOTOPES RBI RECORD: Hilliard has 219 RBI with Albuquerque, which ranks third among career leaders in team history. Jordan Patterson (2016-18) is second with 229 RBI.

REAL SLIM SCHUNKY: Aaron Schunk singled Thursday and has a hit in four-straight and five of his last six games ... Over his last six, he is slashing .348/.400/.565 with one triple, one homer and seven RBI.

SUGAR LAND TIES: Veteran right-hander Miguel Castro pitched in a total of 27 games with Albuquerque during the 2015 and 2016 seasons ... Space Cowboys outfielder Quincy Hamilton 2016 seasons ... lived in Alamogordo for a decade and played one season of baseball at Alamogordo High School.

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 21st year as a minor league manager and third guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his fourth season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his third season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his second year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... The former outfielder played in 33 games for the Isotopes and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the third-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 22) will host the second half winner (beginning June 24) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 27.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Challenge System, in it's third full year in the PCL, will be used exclusively for every game this season. Under this system, the home plate umpire will call balls or strikes while each team has the opportunity to challenge the umpire's call with two challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
