#### Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP Kevin Herget to the mound tonight, making his first start since 6/27 (13.2IP, 1ER in 3G of relief since then). lowa will counter with RHP Cory Abbott. The Clippers are 24-30 (.444) against right handers this year. Abbott has pitched against the Clippers once in his career, on 6/13 in Iowa (ND, 6.0IP, 5H, 3R, 3ER, 1BB, 8K).

#### vs. the Cubs

Columbus hammered the Cubs in the first series between the two this year, taking five of six in Des Moines (outscored lowa 40-29) Individually, Connor Marabell has hit .450 (9x20) with 2HR and 9RBI against the Cubs in 6G, while Nolan Jones has hit .435 (10x23) with 2HR and 4RBI in 7G. Trenton Brooks is hitting .333 (8x24) with 3HR and 9RBI in 7G.

### **Pitching Problems**

The Clippers are one of four IL teams to have posted consecutive shutouts this year (Charlotte, Durham, Toledo), blanking Indy from 7/6-7/7, but the 10G since have been a nightmare, with the Clippers allowing 95 runs (worst 10G stretch in IL, no other team has given up more than 77 in 10G; worst 10G in franchise history, previous was 88 from 8/16-8/24/82; worst 11G stretch is 99 from 8/15-8/24/82).

### And the Hits and Homers

Over the last 10G the Clippers have given up 114 hits (worst 10G of any IL team; 10+ hits in 8G) and 25HR (2nd worst of any IL team, Jacksonville allowed 28HR from 6/8-6/19; at least 1HR in each of 10G). Following 18 innings of scoreless ball (7/6 through the 1st inning of 7/8), in which opponents hit 7x61, the Clippers have watched runners cross the plate in 36 of the last 86 (25 multi-run innings).

### **Hammering Gimenez**

Andres Gimenez homered once in six straight (6/13-6/19) and seven of eight from 6/13-6/22 (34AB; 6HR in Huntington Park), but failed to go deep in his next 10G (40AB) until last night (first game played since 7/3 at Toledo). The homer ended a 3G hitless drought (0x12), the second such drought for Gimenez in a Clipper uniform (6/10-6/12, that drought ended with the aforementioned homer streak).

### Luplow Rehab

Jordan Luplow rejoined Columbus last night (1x3, HR) on his rehab from a sprained left ankle (on DL since 5/28, moved to 60-day on 6/17). Luplow appeared for Columbus on 6/11 at Iowa (0x2, BB, K), before getting shutdown. He restarted his rehab on 7/12 in Goodyear, playing twice in the rookie league (1x3, 2BB). With Cleveland, Luplow was hitting .173/.331/.439 with 7HR and 20RBI in 36G

### Back in the Mix

Owen Miller is batting .245 (23x94) since returning from a three week stint in Cleveland, turning in 11 hitless games in 26 chances (four hitless games in first 16). Miller reached the threshold to qualify for the batting title Friday and is now sitting in 8th place in the IL (.310, lowest average of the season). In addition, Miller places 5th in the IL with a .389OBP (1x13 with 8K in last 3G; .341, 14x41, in 11G prior).

### Three Left Turns

Gabriel Arias has scored in four of the last 12G, totaling five runs, following a streak of 22 runs in 15 of 18G (6/12-7/4). Still, beginning with a 3-run game on 6/12 at lowa, Arias has scored 27 runs in his last 30G, leading the IL in that time (hitting .316, 36x114, since 6/12). On the season, Arias is tied for 3rd in the IL in runs (40) and is on pace to score 79 (most since Cord Phelps' 82 in 2012).

### Kept In

Oscar Gonzalez has yet to go deep through 11G with Columbus (43AB since 7/4 HR with Akron), his longest drought of the year (had two homerless streaks of 6G with Akron). After 25XBH in 49G at Double-A, Gonzalez has just one double (7/17 at St.Paul) at Triple-A, resulting in a .300SLG (led EL with .601SLG at time of promotion). His walk last night was the first since his Triple-A debut (.310OBP).

### Party's Back On

Every starter collected a hit last night, for the fourth time in the last six games, including three straight from 7/14-7/16 (one such game through first 59). Despite the hit parade, the Clippers still have not seen an individual 4-hit effort through the first half of the season (had eight 4-hit games in 2019). Almost half of the team's 26 3-hit games have come from Owen Miller (7) and Gabriel Arias (5).

## This Date in Clipper History

The Clippers beat the Buffalo Bisons by a score of 7-3 on the power of 2HR from Ivan Cruz. Cruz hit 13HR for the Clippers during an injury shortened season in 1998, his 3rd with the Clippers. The 1997 co-Clipper of the Year, Cruz finished his Clipper career with 65HR (5th all-time) and 227RBI (8th). In addition, he was selected to play in two Triple-A All-Star Games ('96 & '97).

#### **Huntington (Small) Park**

In each of the first 11 years since the move downtown, Huntington Park has ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game, totaling 2.25 per contest (1,763HR, 783 games). In 2019, HP averaged over three per game for the first time ever (seventh time averaging over a pair), as the Clippers surrendered a record 127HR and just missed out on triple digits themselves (97HR was second highest team total). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (972 to 930).

#### Deadball Era

The franchise record for homers was destroyed in 2019 (213, +31 from '83), as was the record for homers allowed (198, +42 from '98). This season's Clippers are homering at a rate of 1.26 per game, putting them five off the pace of the pre-2019 record (adjusted for 140G). However, on the mound they are allowing 1.51 per game, enough to beat the pre-2019 record by 37, even with the shortened season.

### Ain't Over 'Til It's Over

From 2014-19, no team had more come from behind victories than the 210 posted by Columbus and no team produced a better winning percentage when trailing than the .353 of the Clippers (Scranton/WB was 2nd in percentage, .338, and wins, 192). This year has seen the Clippers go 12-37 (.245) in games in which they trail, ranking 11th.

### **Not Close**

The Clippers have suffered the most losses by at least a grand slam in the IL (22; six in 10G from 7/8-7/19) and rank dead last in wins by at least that many (9). That poor ratio has led to a -83 run differential, a figure that places them 14th in the IL (had a -50 differential over 10G from 7/8-7/19).

#### Get What You Pay For

Columbus was the last team in the IL to play free baseball this season, playing 85 straight games, including the postseason, between extra-inning rumbles on 7/31/19 vs. Louisville (11-8 loss in 11) and 6/26/21 vs. St. Paul (6-4 loss in 10; current 3G losing streak in extra-innings following nine straight wins, 8/21/18-7/3/19). The regulation-inning streak was the longest for Columbus dating to the 1984 season (as far back as the day by day records go) and 45 straight to start the season was also a record.

### **Trending Downward**

The current staff ERA of 5.61 is on pace to be the worst in franchise history (5.08, 1983) and anything over 4.71 will mark the fifth straight season in which the ERA has gotten worse. From 2011-16, the Clipper staff turned in a sub-4.00ERA five times in six seasons (zero such seasons from 1993-2010), including the best two ERAs of the past 32 years (3.33 in 2015 and 3.65 in 2016). The 5.87ERA at Huntington Park is the worst ever (5.29 in 2019, only time ERA has ever been over 5.00 at HP).

#### Free Swingers

After three straight seasons leading the IL in strikeouts, the Clipper lineup is threatening for a fourth, as they currently rank 6th (614K, 64 off the pace, Nashville). The 2019 squad obliterated the franchise record, as they struck out 95 more times than the previous high (1,392; each of last three seasons rank among franchise's three worst, totalling 3,979K in 422G). While the record appears safe due to the truncated schedule, this year's version is averaging 9.45K per game.

### Night and Day

When playing errorless baseball, the Clippers have a winning percentage that is over 150 points higher (.516, 16-15) than when they make a mistake in the field (.353, 12-22). After an exceptional defensive run from 2015-2019, in which the fielding percentage was never below .983 and the team never committed more than 88E, the 2021 team is on pace to botch 101 plays (adjusted for 140G season, have not had triple digits in errors since six straight seasons from 2009-14) with a fielding percentage of .979.

### One On, No Out Success

When the leadoff batter of an inning reached base in 2019, the Clippers plated him nearly 60% of the time (over 51% only once in the last six seasons, 55% in 2016). Getting more than one base was a specialty of Clipper hitters, as they led the IL with 136XBH to lead off the inning, including 54HR (led the IL, had 28 leadoff homers in 2018). So far in 2021, the Clippers are scoring the leadoff batter 51% of the time he reaches, with the leadoff batter scoring himself 17 times (on pace for 33HR).

## Good Baseball

**Oscar Mercado** advanced a runner with a sac bunt on 6/26 vs. St. Paul and the runner came around to score in the loss (3-1 when advanced runner scores). During 2019, the Clippers struggled in the bunt department, but when the advanced runners scored, they were 7-1. During 2018, Columbus was 23-2 in games in which a run was scored after a good bunt attempt.

### International Accolades

**Bobby Bradley** was named International League Player of the Month for May 2019, reaching base in 24 of 25 games during the month while hitting .302/.374/.740 with 12HR (led IL) and 28RBI. **Brandon Barnes, Eric Haase, Josh Smith** and **Asher Wojciechowski** were named to the 2019 IL All-Star Team and Bradley, Barnes and Haase were selected to the postseason squad.

### Manager Profile

Andy Tracy makes his Clippers debut in 2021, following Tony Mansolino's championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; Gene Michael-'79, Joe Altobelli-'80, Frank Verdi-'81, Bucky Dent-'87 and Mike Sarbaugh-'10). This season marks Tracy's second year as a manager (first with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 58-83 (.411), 28-37 with Columbus (.431).

#### Long Relief:

Herget has pitched in relief four times this season, each time on starter's rest. Following Triston McKenzie on 6/6 at Indianapolis, he turned in a brief scoreless outing (1.2IP), but in his two games following Zack Godley and one after Logan Allen, Herget has provided length (4.2IP at Toledo on 7/3, 5.0IP vs. Indianapolis on 7/9, 4.0IP at St. Paul on 7/16). Out of the bullpen, Herget has a 0.59ERA (15.1IP, 10H, 1R, 1ER, 3BB, 22K), as opposed to a 7.20ERA when he starts (30.0IP, 37H, 30R, 24ER, 11BB, 32K).

#### **Huntington Park Effect:**

Herget has pitched five games in Huntington Park this season, getting blistered to the tune of a 7.13ERA (24.0IP, 19ER). He has allowed 8HR to 109BF in Columbus, compared to 2HR to 88BF elsewhere in the IL (13 of 23 runs allowed at home have come via the long ball). In two starts at home from 6/16-6/22, he allowed three leadoff homers, with all of them coming immediately after the Clippers put up runs.

Though 5/26 marked Herget's International League debut, he had pitched in Huntington Park once before, as a member of the Memphis Redbirds against the Durham Bulls in the 2018 Triple-A National Championship (W, 14-5). Herget started and picked up the win for Memphis (5.1IP, 5H, 2R, 2ER, 0BB, 4K), outdueling future Clipper Chih-Wei Hu (2019).

### That Was Fast:

Starting the season with Fargo-Moorhead in the American Association, Herget made only one start, on 5/19 vs. Cleburne (W, 7.0IP, 3H, 1R, 1ER, 1BB, 10K), before Cleveland signed him to a minor league deal on 5/25. While Herget became the first RedHawk to play for Columbus, six former Clippers have suited up for Fargo-Moorhead: Jalal Leach, Mike Figga, Randall Simon, Donzell McDonald, Yurendell de Caster and Yhoxian Medina.
