Opening Day starter **Seth Shuman** makes his 11th start of the year, taking on Fort Wayne southpaw **Danny Denz** in his fourth start. The two pitchers are scheduled to rematch on Sunday.

Sunday Night: West Michigan Whitecaps 3, Lansing Lugnuts 0. In the loss, four Lugnuts pitchers struck out 15 Whitecaps batters.

What's New in 2021: Entering this season, the Lugnuts' stadium name changed from Cooley Law School Stadium to Jackson® Field™, Lansing moved up to the High-A Central and the ballclub accepted an invitation to affiliate with the A's, the Nuts' fourth MLB partner, following the Royals (1996-98), Cubs (1999-2004) and Blue Jays (2005-2020).

LUG•NOTES: HEADLINES AND POINTS OF INTEREST

Transaction: Before today's game, the Athletics promoted lefty **Dalton Sawyer** to Double-A Midland, with right-hander **Garrett Acton**, an undrafted free agent in 2020 from Illinois, where he had served as the Illini closer, moving up from Low-A Stockton to take Sawyer's spot in the Lugnuts' bullpen. Lansing also received infielder **Yerdel Vargas** from Double-A Midland.

Roster Index: The newest Nuts, **Garrett Acton** and **Yerdel Vargas**, are the 846th and 847th Lugnuts all-time as well as the 42nd and 43rd players used this year. The 2021 Lugnuts have surpassed the total number of players used in the 1996 (40), 1999 (38), 2001 (40) and 2009 (38) seasons. The franchise record for most players used in a single year is 54, set in 2017. Currently, 18.5% of all Lugnuts have reached the Major Leagues (157 of 845). If that percentage continues to hold true, at least eight of the 43 Lugnuts players this year will eventually reach the Majors.

Major League Transaction: Late last night, the A's traded Triple-A slugger **Greg Deichmann** and Low-A starter **Daniel Palencia** to the Cubs for reliever **Andrew Chafin**. A former Kent State Golden Flash, Chafin did not pitch against the Lugnuts on his way up the Arizona Diamondbacks' ladder, jumping from the college ranks/rookie ball in 2011 to High-A Visalia in 2012.

Awaiting His Moment: On Saturday, the Baltimore Orioles promoted 2015 Lugnuts pitcher **Conner Greene** to the Majors. When he debuts, Greene will become the 158th Nut all-time to reach MLB and the fourth this year. 16 members of the 2015 Nuts have already reached the Major Leagues, not including the rehabbing **Marcus Stroman**, who dropped by for a September start against Great Lakes on his way back to the Blue Jays. The 2009 Midwest League champion Fort Wayne TinCaps set the standard with 19 future Major Leaguers on their roster.

Alumni Report: Vladimir Guerrero, Jr., who played for the 2017 Lugnuts, is fourth in the Majors in batting average (.328), second in home runs (32), second in RBIs (80), first in on-base percentage (.426), second in slugging (.661), first in total bases (230), first in OPS (1.087) and tied for first in runs scored with fellow 2017 Lugnut **Bo Bichette** (77). 2019 Lugs outfielder **Griffin Conine** leads the Minors with 24 home runs.

No Place Like Close to Home: The Lugnuts are in the midst of a period of easy travel. Between June 28 and August 1, the Nuts don't leave the state of Michigan, with their only road trips to Midland (Great Lakes) and Comstock Park (West Michigan).

Hoya Saxa: Right-hander **Jack Cushing**, a product of Georgetown, has been brilliant since joining the Lugnuts from Low-A Stockton. Cushing's appearances: six innings, one run vs. Dayton; a seven-inning complete game, one run at Great Lakes; five shutout innings of relief vs. Lake County; and Thursday night's six innings, two runs at West Michigan. All told, Cushing has 25 strikeouts and five walks in 24 innings with a 1.50 ERA, allowing an OBA of .157.

Streak Snapped: Catcher **Drew Millas** went 0-for-4 on Sunday, ending his hitting streak at eight games, tied for second longest on the Lugs this season.

TODAY IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

2014: In 15 innings on a Sunday matinee, the Lugnuts defeated Burlington, 3-2, on a Dawel Lugo RBI single. The game lasted four hours and 38 minutes, and came a day after the Nuts lost in 14 innings in four hours and three minutes to Burlington, meaning that the Lugnuts and Bees played 29 innings lasting eight hours, 41 minutes in a 24-hour span in the first two games of their three-game series at Community Field. It was exhausting.

Root, Root, Root for the Home Team: July 4th's Lugnuts/Dragons series finale drew a season-high attendance of 10,109. That's higher than the average attendance in MLB for the Baltimore Orioles, Pittsburgh Pirates, Tampa Bay Rays, Oakland Athletics, Miami Marlins and Toronto/Buffalo/Dunedin Blue Jays. Only eight of the 119 other Minor League teams have drawn a larger crowd to a game this season: Albuquerque, Nashville, Charlotte, Fresno, Indianapolis, Round Rock, Durham and Las Vegas.

Pitching is an Art... and So is Sculpting: Blake McFarland, who pitched for the 2012 Lansing Lugnuts, is now a professional sculptor who competed on NBC's reality show "Making It," hosted by Nick Offerman and Amy Poehler, but was eliminated in the fifth episode.

Major League Lugnuts: Three former Nuts have made their Major League debuts this season, bringing the total to 157 all-time - pitcher **Ty Tice** '18, outfielder **Josh Palacios** '16-'17, and pitcher **Taylor Saucedo** '16-'17. Tice and Palacios made their first MLB appearance in the same game for the Toronto Blue Jays on April 9th. It was the seventh time in team history that two Lugnuts made their MLB debut in the same game, with the first occurring on September 14, 1998: **Carlos Febles** and **Carlos Beltrán** for the Kansas City Royals. Saucedo most recently debuted, tossing a scoreless inning for the Blue Jays on June 17.

Star of Stars: The 2021 MLB All-Star Game MVP Award was won by 2017 Lugnut **Vladimir Guerrero, Jr.**, who went 1-for-3 with two RBIs, including a 468-foot home run, in the American League's 5-2 victory. Fellow 2017 Lugnut **Bo Bichette** came off the bench for the A.L. as reserve shortstop.

Record-Setting, Single Game, Stolen Bases: On June 15, **Max Schuemann** broke **Samad Taylor's** franchise single-game record of four steals in a game (set July 1, 2018) with five stolen bases against the Great Lakes Loons.

Record-Setting, Single Game, Home Runs Allowed: On June 20, **Stevie Emanuels** broke the franchise single game record, tied many times before, of three homers served up in a game, giving up four HRs to the Loons - two apiece by Deacon Liput and Andy Pages.

Record-Setting, Single Game, HBPs: On July 14, Lansing Lugnuts pitchers hit seven Lake County Captains, breaking the franchise single game record, and the second-highest single game HBP total for a team plunked by one pitching staff behind the 1993 Gulf Coast League Braves, who were hit eight times on June 18, 1993.

Representing His Country: 1B/3B **Jordan Diaz** played for Colombia in Olympic Baseball Qualifying play, blasting a game-tying home run in the 9th against Venezuela, but Colombia lost all three games in opening pool play and was eliminated. Team USA won the tournament, punching a ticket to Japan.

Front Office Connections: Lugnuts pitching coach **Don Schulze** was drafted 11th overall by the Chicago Cubs in 1980, 12 picks before Oakland Executive Vice President of Baseball Operations **Billy Beane** was drafted by the New York Mets. Lugnuts first baseman **Patrick McColl** set a new Harvard baseball single season record with 70 hits in 2019, breaking the previous record held by Athletics General Manager David Foster.

Clubhouse of Higher Learning: The Ivy League is well represented on the Lansing roster. First baseman **Patrick McColl** played for Harvard University, reliever **Michael Danielak** was drafted from Dartmouth College and catcher **William Simoneit** spent four years at Cornell University before grad-transferring to Wake Forest. Speaking of outstanding academic institutions, starter **Jack Cushing** spent four years at Georgetown University.

International Appeal: Seven nations are represented on the Lugnuts' roster: USA, Colombia, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Japan, South Africa (**Anthony Phillips**) and Venezuela (**Javier Godard**).

Finally: Pitchers **Jeff Criswell**, **Stevie Emanuels** and **Shohei Tomioka**, catchers **Jared McDonald**, **Drew Millas** and **William Simoneit**, first baseman **Patrick McColl**, and outfielder **Michael Goldberg** have all made their pro debut this season with the Lugnuts.

So Many Starters: The Lugnuts have used 14 different starting pitchers this season, namely **Brady Basso**, **Raid Birlingmair**, **Jeff Criswell**, **Jack Cushing**, **David Leal**, **Stevie Emanuels**, **Richard Guasch**, **Rafael Kelly**, **Bryce Nightengale**, **Colin Peluse**, **Leudeny Pineda**, **Seth Shuman**, **Shohei Tomioka** and **Brock Whittlesey**.

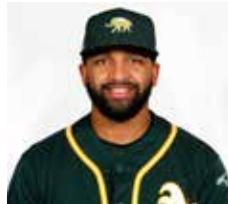

- May 4 vs. Lake County: started on Opening Day... 50 pitches (37 strikes)... both hits allowed were Bryan Lavastida singles.
- May 15 at Dayton: started... two perfect innings, 29 pitches (21 strikes).
- May 20 at Fort Wayne: relieved... whiffed five in two innings, allowing solo HR to Dwanya Williams-Sutton... Lugs pitchers K'ed 18.
- May 27 vs. Great Lakes: started... allowed one run in 2 2/3 IP... Loons broke the game open with nine unearned runs in the sixth inning against Richard Guasch and Charles Hall, handing Lugnuts a 10-1 defeat.
- June 2 vs. South Bend: started... charged with loss... allowed one unearned run due to a Drew Millas throwing error.
- June 9 at West Michigan: scratched from start in favor of reliever Brock Whittlesey because of the threat of rain in forecast... when rain never arrived, relieved Whittlesey (1.2 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 1 BB, 2 K) with two outs in the 2nd inning... received the victory as the Lugnuts cruised past the Whitecaps... only 'Caps run came when Rey Rivera led off the 5th with a single, moved to second and third on back-to-back Shuman wild pitches, and scored on a Trei Cruz groundout.
- June 16 vs. Great Lakes, charged with the loss after allowing four runs (three earned) in five innings, striking out eight and walking none... gave up a James Outman triple and an Andy Pages two-run homer in the 3rd... allowed a Ryan January RBI double in the 4th... gave up an unearned run (due to Cobie Vance error) in the 5th... Lugnuts fell, 6-4.
- June 23, Game 2 of the doubleheader at Cedar Rapids... tossed five shutout innings, allowing two hits, striking out six, and received no-decision... relievers Dalton Sawyer and Charles Hall allowed an unearned run in the 6th and the Lugnuts lost, 1-0.
- June 30 vs. Dayton... Dragons' only run came in the fourth inning on a Victor Ruiz sacrifice fly... Lugnuts won, 8-3, with a five-run sixth inning blowing open a 1-1 game.
- July 8 at Great Lakes: dominated Loons in six scoreless innings, but the Lugnuts gave up leads of 1-0, 2-1 and 3-2 before finally scoring five runs in the 12th inning to win, 8-3.
- July 13 vs. Lake County... started on short rest due to David Leal being pushed back in the rotation... gave up leadoff HR to Will Brennan in three-run 1st inning... gave up two-run homer to Bryan Lavastida in 5th... game called due to inclement conditions in 6th.

Professional Career Entering 2021: Drafted 194th overall in the 6th round from Georgia Southern in 2019, signed for \$235,000 (one round in front of Lugnuts teammate Millas)... one of 10 2019 draftees on the Lugnuts roster... made pro debut with Short-Season A NYPL Vermont Lake Monsters on June 29, 2019... of 14 runs allowed in 11 games in 2019, nine came in two poor outings; dominated otherwise, finishing with back-to-back five-inning scoreless performances.

Family Ties: Seth's father, Bart, was the starting shortstop on the 1979 NCAA Division-II National Champion Valdosta State Blazers, hitting .277 and striking out just eight times in 61 games... sister, Sloan, was a two-time national champion cheerleader at Valdosta State... brother, Scott, nine years older (first name: Rutherford), was drafted in the 19th round in 2009 by Tampa Bay from Auburn University and pitched in the Midwest League with the 2010 Bowling Green Hot Rods (3.01, 14 saves, 46 G, 71 2/3 IP, 38 BB, 111 K), rose as high as Double-A, and spent the 2019 season as a relief ace for independent Lancaster.

Glory Days on the Diamond: Coached by his father, Bart, at Valdosta High School... named Region 1-6A Pitcher of the Year as a senior after posting 1.53 ERA, with 80 strikeouts and 15 walks in 59 innings... tossed a no-hitter vs. Tift HS... 1st-team All-Region infielder, hitting .313 with 20 BB / 13 K.

Glory Days on the Gridiron: Starting quarterback at Valdosta H.S., named 2nd-Team All-State by the Georgia Sports Writers Association and Honorable Mention All-State by the Atlanta Journal-Constitution in 2015, breaking the school's single-season passing record with 3,194 yards... 25 touchdowns, 3 interceptions... Valdosta High School football is one of the nation's most storied programs, owning the most wins in USA history (929) in addition to six national championships and 24 state championships.

Saying No to the O's: Shuman was drafted in the 39th round from Valdosta HS in 2016 by the Baltimore Orioles, 11 picks ahead of the Toronto Blue Jays' selection of 2018 Lugnuts outfielder Chavez Young... Orioles drafted his high school teammate, DL Hall, 21st overall in 2017, signing him for \$3 million... Baltimore drafted a third Valdosta HS baseball player, outfielder Colby Thomas, in the 37th round in 2019, but Thomas turned down the Orioles to attend college (in his case, Mercer University).

Speaking of Valdosta: The only Valdosta Wildcat to make the Major Leagues to date is Buck Coats, who played for the Chicago Cubs (2006), Cincinnati Reds (2007) and Toronto Blue Jays (2008). Coats, coincidentally, played two full seasons with the Lugnuts, 2002 and 2003, totaling 265 games and 989 at-bats.

Transitioning from Football to Baseball in Statesboro: Wore No. 10 and played in four games as a freshman QB on Georgia Southern football team, taking 114 snaps, in 2016-2017, passing for 357 yards and a touchdown and rushing for 39 yards... considered a walk-on with Georgia Southern baseball due to football scholarship, and split his time between baseball and spring football... quickly impressed as an impact pitcher as a freshman, going 8-0, 3.34, 46 2/3 IP, 49 K, and received the honor of the start in Sun Belt Tournament Championship game vs. South Alabama (received no-decision)... left football team after freshman year to gain full baseball scholarship... named Preseason All-Sun Belt Conference in both 2018 and 2019 as sophomore and junior... named First-Team All-Sun Belt Conference in 2019 (3.83, 16 GS, 91 2/3 IP, 27 BB, 114 K)... earned nickname "The Franchise" at Georgia Southern because of his importance to the program during his three years.

Fly Eagles Fly: Georgia Southern University baseball has produced 17 Major Leaguers, led by Joey Hamilton, John Tudor, Scott Fletcher, Todd Greene, Sam Howard, longtime MiLB manager Marty Pevey, and longtime MiLB manager John Tamargo Sr., father of the former Lugnuts hitting coach and manager John Tamargo, Jr.

A Fun Georgia Southern Note: The Eagles' most notable game in team history might have been on March 15, 2008, when they hit 14 home runs in a 26-8 victory over Columbia. In the eighth inning alone, the Eagle crushed five homers, including three consecutive shots by pinch-hitters. "I thought we took some good swings, and certainly conditions with the wind were right for it today, as well," coach Rodney Hennon said afterward.
