## THE SILVER LEGACY



Local music store owner and real estate developer Morrie Silver came to the rescue of professional baseball in Rochester in the winter of 1956-57, when the St. Louis Cardinals decided to sell their fledgling Triple-A franchise. Silver, whose true passion was serving his community, organized a stock drive to buy the Red Wings and keep them in the Flower City.

There were 8,222 shareholders who purchased the club, a number that has been retired on the left-centerfield fence at Frontier Field, and Silver became the largest shareholder of them all. The 1957 season was the first community-owned season for the Red Wings, who remained a Cardinals affiliate through the 1960 season.

Silver became the first president of Rochester Community Baseball, Inc., running the day-to-day operation of the club. The Brighton native stayed at his post until "retiring" after the 1968 season and moving his family to Miami Beach, Florida. He was actually still at the helm over all aspects of the club while in Florida until he passed away in 1974. Red Wing Stadium, meanwhile, the home of the Red Wings since 1929, was renamed Silver Stadium on August 19, 1968.

Morrie's wife, Anna "Bert" and his daughter Naomi, returned to Rochester in January 1975 to carry on Morrie's legacy. Anna B. became the Chairman of the Board in 1982 and young Naomi started as an intern in 1988. Naomi's primary task in her first year was handling stock transfers (i.e. when a deceased grandparent passes on his stock to a son or grandson). Then in 1989, Naomi took over the operation of the team souvenir store.

Naomi would later work in the accounting department and in concessions, eventually forming a separate concessions entity in 1994, Rochester Community Baseball Enterprises. She also became the Red Wings' voting member for the International League in 1993, the same year she began a lobbying effort for a new ballpark that would replace Silver Stadium. Frontier Field would later open in 1997, and the street along the west side of the ballpark was re-named Morrie Silver Way. Over the years, she continued to oversee accounting, the team store, office personnel, and the relationship with the Red Wings' parent club, the Baltimore Orioles.

Naomi further continued her father's legacy by serving as Vice President of the Board of Directors from 1989-99 and then as Chairman of the Board from 2000-10. She became the Red Wings' President/Chief Executive Officer/Chief Operating Officer in 2010, a position she still holds to this day, overseeing all aspects of the club.

A statue featuring Morrie and a young baseball player stands in the courtyard that leads to the main entrance of Frontier Field, providing a permanent memorial of the civic leader and a meeting place for fans. The bronze figures, commissioned by sculptor Dejan Pejovic, was dedicated on July 25, 2007 in a ceremony that included Hall of Fame Manager Earl Weaver, Rochester's Mr. Baseball Joe Altobelli, International League President Randy Mobley, and several political dignitaries from the city, county, and state.

Morrie's legacy also is remembered on an annual basis with the Morrie Silver Family Scholarship. The scholarships are awarded by the Silver Family to employees of the Red Wings who are pursuing a full-time course study at an accredited 2- or 4 -year college, university, or vocational school. Each applicant is considered on the basis of academic achievement, financial need, extracurricular activities, job performance and recommendations from supervisors. The selected recipients each receive $\$ 5,000$. Those employees who are selected for the scholarship show exemplary work ethic, solid academic achievement and a desire to continue their education to accomplish their goals.

Morrie was a charter inductee to the Red Wings Hall of Fame in 1989, 15 years after his passing. Anna Bert was inducted in 1998 and Naomi in 2007.

## NAOMI SILVCR

## President/Chief Executive Officer/Chief Operating Officer

Naomi Silver has served the ballclub as President, CEO and COO since 2010 after having previously served in various other board capacities. She oversees the day-to-day operation of the ballclub, strategic planning, government relations and various other areas of the business. She is the daughter of late Morrie E. and Anna B. Silver.

Naomi's first involvement with the Wings in the late 1980s led to her assuming her current role. Under her leadership, the Red Wings have grown to be one of the most respected Minor League organizations around.

She has been recognized nationally in the world of baseball having been named Baseball America's Minor League Executive of the Year in 2008 and the Rawlings Woman of the Year in 1994. Locally, Naomi has been recognized with the 2019 Rochester Business Journals Icon Award, the Young Women's College Prep Leadership Award in 2017, Nazareth College's Woerner Kollmorgen Award in 2016, the Public Relations Society of America's CEO of the Year in 2012, and St. John Fisher's Sports Manager of the Year in 2008. She serves on the MLB/MiLB Governance Committee, and the boards of the United Way, Monroe Community College Foundation, Boys and Girls Club of Rochester, University of Rochester Medical Center, Rochester Downtown Development Corportation, Rochester Broadway Theater Leauge, and KeyBank Advisory board. Naomi is also a member of the Frontier Field Walk of Fame and Red Wings Hall of Fame.

Naomi is the mother of two, Morrie, 24, and Desirée, 20.

## DAN MASON

## General Manager

Dan Mason has served as General Manager of the Rochester Red Wings since 1995 while he has worked in various capacities, including Director of Group Sales, Promotions and Assistant GM, since 1990.

Under his direction, the Red Wings have been honored nationally by several outlets, including the 2008 Ongoing Excellence Award, given to organizations that consistently perform at a high level and have no need for a turnaround, by Ballpark Digest, the Baseball America Triple-A Bob Freitas Award, presented to the organization which demonstrates longstanding excellence of operations in the ballpark and front office, and the Larry MacPhail Award, in recognition of outstanding performance in the area of promotions, both in 1997. The team has also been honored with the Prism Award, exemplifying excellence in sport franchise management, by the University of Massachusetts in 2006 and the John H. Johnson President's Award, presented annually to the National Association club best exemplifying the standards of the complete baseball franchise, in 2004. Mason has been honored three times as International League Executive of the Year: 1996, 1997 and 2012.

Dan is the past president of the Rochester Press Radio Club and a former board member of McQuaid Jesuit High School, Hillside Family of Agencies and Compeer. He currently serves on the board for the Monroe County Sports Commission and Zweigles.

Dan is a 1985 graduate of McQuaid Jesuit High School in Rochester and a 1989 graduate from the University of Notre Dame. Dan and his wife Sheila have two children, Cameron, 23, and Anna, 21.

## GARY LARDER <br> Chairman of the Board

Gary Larder is the longest serving Director in Rochester Community Baseball's history and has held every Officer position, including that of President/CEO from 2000-09. He was inducted into the Red Wings Hall of Fame in 2007 and currently serves as Corporate Chariman. A charterinductee in the Rochester chapter of the National Beta Gamma Sigma Honorary Finance Society, Gary is a retired financial executive from Xerox Corporation. He currently serves on the Executive Committee on the Board of Trustees at Houghton College. Gary was the recipient of the 2017 Bowie Kuhn Award presented to an individual, team or organization who demonstrates support of the Baseball Chapel program in professional baseball.



COACHING CAREER: LeCroy is in his 14th season in the coaching ranks, all in the Nationals organization, and 11 th as a minor league manager...this year will be his second at the helm of Rochester, leading the Red Wings to a 49-77 record and a sixth-place finish in Triple-A East Northeast last season...previously managed Double-A Harrisburg (2016-19, 2012-13), Single-A Potomac (2011), and Single-A Hagerstown (2009-10)...has a combined minor league record as a manager of 663-718 (.480)...led three of his teams to the playoffs, including a spot in the Eastern League Championship series in 2013, and appearances in 2011 and 2019...was slated to be Washington's Minor League Quality Control Coordinator in 2020 prior to the cancellation of the MiLB season...spent two seasons as Washington's Bullpen Coach from 2014-15.
PLAYING CAREER: LeCroy played 11 professional seasons, including parts of eight years with Minnesota (2000-05, 07) and Washington (2006)...batted .260/.326/.440 with 68 doubles, one triple, 60 home runs, 218 RBI, and 146 runs scored in 476 MLB games...hit a pinch-hit grand slam with one out in the 9th inning off Terry Adams on May 19 at Toronto to turn a 5-2 deficit into a 6-5 victory...made his MLB debut on April 3, 2000 and doubled off Steve Trachsel in his first plate appearance in the 3rd inning...hit first MLB home run as the final blast of back-to-back-to-back homers with Ron Coomer (two-run) and Jacque Jones off Brad Rigby in the 6th inning on April 9, 2000 as Kansas City...won a Bronze Medal with Team USA at the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta...won the Silver Medal with Team USA at the 1999 Pan American Games in Winnipeg...originally drafted in the first round (50th overall) by the Twins out of Clemson University in 1997...was also selected in the second round by the Mets in 1994 but did not sign.
PERSONAL: Matthew Hanks LeCroy...wife, Holley...daughters, Isabella, Maggie, and Mabree; sons, Noah and Max... 1994 graduate of Belton-Honea Path High School (Belton, SC)...attended Clemson from 1995-97...ranks tied for fifth in Tigers program history with 24 home runs, tied for ninth with 79 RBI, and 10th with a .722 slugging percentage in 1997 ...hit safely in 22 straight games from May 25, 1996-March 8, 1997, tied for the 10th-longest hitting streak in Clemson history...led the Tigers in home runs all three seasons and is fifth in program history with 53 career home runs and ninth with 208 career RBI...named ACC Freshman of the Year in 1995, the first Clemson player to earn the honor... named an All-American by five publications in 1997 (First-Team Baseball America and National Collegiate Baseball Writers Assocation, and Second-Team American Baseball Coaches Association, Collegiate Baseball, and Sporting News) and twice in 1996 (Second-Team ABCA and NCBWA)... elected into the Clemson Hall of Fame in 2013...won a state title with the tennis team in high school.

COACHING CAREER: Chaves is in his 25th season as a professional coach or coordinator and first as pitching coach for Rochester...spent the previous three seasons as the Director of Pitching Development for Philadelphia.... was the Phillies pitching coordinator from 2015-18...spent the prior six years with Los Angeles-NL as apecial assistant, player personnel (2014) and pitching coordinator (2009-13)...New York-AL's Triple-A pitching coach for Scranton/Wilkes-Barre in 2008, leading the RailRiders to a league-best 3.67 ERA and the Governors' Cup...began his coaching career in Seattle's organization as a pitching coach at every level including with the big league club from 2006-07, Triple-A Tacoma (2004-05), Double-A San Antonio (2002-03), Single-A San Bernardino (2001), Single-A Wisconsin (2000), Rookie Everett (1999), and Rookie AZL Mariners (1998).
PLAYING CAREER: Chaves played 12 minor league seasons with San Diego, Baltimore, Florida, and Pittsburgh, reaching as high as Double-A...originally signed by the Padres as an undrafted free agent in 1986...led the California League with 34 saves for Single-A High Desert in 1992, double the players in second...second in the Carolina League with 22 saves for Single-A Lynchburg in 1995...tied for second in the Eastern League with 20 saves for Double-A Bowie in 1993...second in the California League with 19 saves for Single-A Riverside in 1988. PERSONAL: Rafael Chaves...wife, Ivelisse Abreu...daughter, Nicole...grandson Diego.



COACHING CAREER: Daubach is in his 12th season as a coach or manager in Washington's system, second as hitting coach for the Red Wings, and seventh as hitting coach for the Nationals Triple-A team....was set to Fresno's hitting coach in 2020 prior to the cancellation of the minor league season...served same role for the Grizzlies (2019) and Syracuse (2015-18)...managed Double-A Harrisburg (2013-14), Single-A Potomac (2013), and Single-A Hagerstown (2011-12)... the 2013 P-Nats had the best overall record (84-55) in the Carolina League, winning both the first and second-half North titles, before falling to Salem in the Mills Cup Championship and his 2012 Suns team had the best overall record in the South Atlantic League at $82-55$ and won the second-half division title before falling to Greensboro in the first round of the playoffs...managed the American Defenders of Independent Can-Am League in 2009 and served as hitting coach for the Nashua Pride of the same league in 2008.
PROFFESIONAL CAREER: Daubach played 17 professional seasons, including parts of eight with Florida (1998), Boston (1999-2002, 04), Chicago-AL (2003), and New York-NL (2005)...won the 2004 World Series with the Red Sox...International League All-Star in 1998 with Charlotte, leading the league with 35 home runs, 45 doubles, and 124 RBI , and tied for fifth with 157 hits...second in the IL with a . 325 average in 2005 with Norfolk...second in the IL with 40 doubles and fifth with 93 RBI in 1997 with Charlotte...originally selected in the 17 th round of the 1990 Draft out of West High School (Belleville, IL).

## Rochesters (1877-1878)

Professional baseball began in Rochester in 1877, when Rochester joined the International Association. The team at the time was simply called the "Rochesters".

## Hop Bitters (1879-1880)

Rochester's first official team nickname was an early example of marketing and product placement. The team was named after then-owner Asa Soule's Hop Bitters - a purported cure-all medicinal aid which claimed to treat everything from indigestion to sleeplessness. When the International Association folded after only 12 games in 1880, Soule took the Hop Bitters team on the road in a barnstorming tour, and eventually ended up generating national brand recognition for the Hop Bitters name and brand. There was no professional baseball in Rochester in 1881-1884.

## Rochesters (1885-1892)

In 1885 Rochester was granted a franchise in the New York State League. In 1890 the team was admitted into the American Association, its only season as a Major League team. In 1891 Rochester was back to the minors, playing in the Eastern Association, and in 1892 in the Eastern League. All of these seasons were played as the "Rochesters." The team was also referred to as the "Rochester Base Ball Club." There was no professional team in Rochester in 1893-1894.

## Brownies (1895-1897)

In 1895 Rochester was granted a franchise in the Eastern League once again, and under new ownership, played in a new ball grounds on St. Paul Blvd. across the street from the present site of the Seneca Park Zoo. Decked in brown-trimmed uniforms, the team was given the nickname "The Brownies," which was retained through the 1897 season. Some have suggested that the Brownies nickname may have been a reference to the Kodak Brownie camera, but the Brownie camera was not introduced until 1900

## Patriots (1898)

In 1898, under new ownership, a new Rochester team joined the Eastern League. Contemporary newspaper accounts referred to the team as the "Patriots." William McCarthy's "Rochester Diamond Echoes" (1949), referred to the Rochester players wearing "eagle screaming hosiery" (most likely referring to red, white and blue striped socks), and "A sash of red, white, and blue" (sash referring to the players' belts). These patriotic-colored accessories most likely earned the team the "Patriots" nickname.

## Bronchos (1899-1908)

In 1899 the team was nicknamed "Buck's Bronchos" (commonly shortened to "Bronchos") after then-manager Al Buckenberger. "Broncho" was a common spelling at the time for what we now refer to as a "Bronco", or an untamed/unbroken horse. The nickname "Bronchos" may have been bestowed upon the team as a commentary on players' unruly behavior. The name stuck, and was used by the team through the 1908 season.

## Beau Brummels (1903-1904)

"Beau Brummel" is a (now outdated) phrase meaning "an extremely or excessively welldressed man." Although the Beau Brummels nickname was used consistently in newspaper articles during the 1903 and 1904 season, the "Bronchos" nickname was commonly used throughout those seasons as well.

## Hustlers (1909-1918)

The "Hustlers" nickname was chosen in 1909 by a committee appointed to identify a new name for the baseball club. Reactions to the announcement of the new name were mixed. One opponent stated: "To call a ball club in one of the most important leagues in the country by the name Hustlers is a disgrace. Hustlers! Why don't you call them the Busy Little Workers... No name suggesting a condition of the club should be picked."

## Colts (1918-1920)

The nickname "Colts" began to be used as early as the beginning of the 1918 season as a nickname for Manager Arthur Irwin's young team of players. During the 1918 season the nicknames "Hustlers" and "Colts" were used interchangeably in newspaper articles. By 1919 Colts was considered the "official" team nickname.

## Tribe (1921-1927)

In the first half of the twentieth century, the term "tribe" was often used as a general term meaning "team." By 1921, references to other team names (such as "Colts") were few and far between. In 1926 and 1927 the team wore a silhouette of a Native American Chief on the left breast of their uniform.

## Red Wings (1928-Present)

In 1928, under the new ownership of the St. Louis Cardinals, a "name the team" contest was announced. Team President Warren Giles announced that "Red Wings" had been selected from over 1,700 entries as the new official team name. In Giles' announcement, the reasoning for the selection was explained; the name was unique (no professional team was using it at the time), the name represented a "unit or wing of the Cardinal organization", and the name represented the rich Native American history of the area.

## Early Baseball in Rochester

Prior to the formation of a professional team, baseball (or "Base Ball" as it was known at the time) was played by amateurs. There were no official playing fields or stadiums, but rather the games were generally played in public squares. In 1877, corresponding with the formation of Rochester's first professional team, the "Rochesters," the first permanent ballpark was erected on North Union Street not far from the current site of the Rochester Public Market.

## Union Street Base Ball Grounds (1877-85)

The Union Street Base Ball Grounds, known also as "Hop Bitters" grounds, was located between Union and Scio streets on the east and west, and between Ontario and Weld streets on the north and south. It had entrances from both Union Street and Scio Street. The ballpark was "L"-shaped, and featured a primary grandstand as well as an adjacent bleacher. Its construction was of wood, and it featured a high fence around the perimeter.

When first opened in 1877, the ballpark was generally referred to as the "Union Street Base Ball Grounds", but it was later renamed "Hop Bitters Base Ball Grounds" after the team nickname from the time. It remained Rochester's primary professional baseball stadium through the 1885 season.

## Culver Park Grounds (1886-92)

The Culver Park Grounds, located on University Avenue at the current location of the Gleason Works, opened in 1886. Although it remained in use through the 1893 season, it was supplemented by the Windsor Beach Base Ball Grounds for Sunday games from 1888-1892. The ball park was rectangular in shape and the playing field was situated in the north/south manner. There was a main grandstand, situated at the southern end of the park, along Culver Park (now University Avenue) and two bleachers, one along each base line. A grove of trees in the southeast corner of the park (behind the first base bleachers) made for a serene atmosphere. Professional baseball was played at the Culver Park Grounds through the 1892 season. Amateur teams played there in 1893. A fire destroyed the primary grandstand in October 1893, spelling the end for the Culver Park Grounds.

## Windsor Beach Ball Grounds (1888-92)

At the time the Culver Park Grounds were in use as Rochester's primary baseball facility, the city of Rochester and surrounding towns had blue laws on the books prohibiting the playing of baseball games in public areas on Sundays. One way to circumvent these laws was to play Sunday games on private property. General Henry Brinker, president of ballclub, also owned the Rome Watertown and Ogdensburg railroad. The RW\&O Railroad Company, in conjunction with the ballclub, announced that a series of Sunday baseball games would be played at the railroad company's new ball grounds at Windsor Beach, near Summerville. The ballpark featured a main grandstand which was supplemented by bleachers. The total capacity of the grandstand was about 3,000 , but the grounds were touted as being able to accommodate as many as 20,000 spectators within the fenced area.

## ROCHESTER BALLPARKS

## Riverside Park (1895-97)

Rochester had no professional team in 1893 or 1894. In 1895 a new ownership group purchased the team. Rather than rebuilding the Culver Park Grounds' grandstand that burned in 1893, property was purchased on North St. Paul Boulevard opposite present Seneca Park and plans were drawn up for a brand new ball park which would be called Riverside Park. The ballpark included a bicycle track around the baseball field. The circular quarter-mile track was 20 feet wide and constructed of solid concrete. Three grandstands were situated on the east end of the park, behind which were horse stables and a large bicycle enclosure. The owners, frustrated with the city's enforcement of Sunday blue laws, uprooted the team mid-season in July 1897, and moved the team to Montreal, signaling the end for this ballpark after only two-and-a-half seasons.

## Culver Field (1898-1907)

Rochester fielded a new club for the 1898 season and a new baseball field at the former location of the Culver Park Grounds, now called Culver Field, was ready for the 1898 season. It hosted Rochester's professional baseball team from 1898 through the 1907 season. Like Riverside Park, Culver Field also had a bicycle track, this one slightly larger at $1 / 3$ mile. Unlike the concrete track at Riverside Park, the new bicycle track was built of wooden decking, and was pitched and elevated. There was a primary grandstand directly behind home plate, a bicycle grand stand on the third base side of the baseball field, and bleachers on the first base side. Sadly, tragedy struck again - while it was a fire that led to the ultimate demise of the first Culver Park Grounds, Culver Field suffered a collapse of the first base side bleachers during a game in May of 1906, resulting in over three hundred injuries and a number of lawsuits.

## Baseball Park at Bay Street (1908-1928)

Opened for the 1908 season, Baseball Park at Bay Street was host to Rochester's professional team through the 1928 season. Baseball Park at Bay Street was located on the south side of Bay Street between Webster Avenue Park and McKinster Street. Of wooden construction, the park had a large main center grandstand with a roof, and bleacher sections on the first and third base sides. The entire grounds were fenced, and colorful billboards adorned the outfield walls. The park's dimensions were monstrous by today's standards - it was a rare occurrence for a ball to be hit over the fence.


#### Abstract

Although the seating capacity of the ballpark was approximately 8,000 , overflow crowds often significantly exceeded that, especially on opening day - packing as many as 17,000 fans into the fenced area surrounding the field. Fans (and even automobiles) packed the farthest reaches of the outfield grass on these overflow occasions. Over the 21 seasons played at the park, various changes and improvements were made. Within the first few years of the ballpark a press box was added on the grandstand roof and the first base-side bleachers were significantly expanded. In 1910 set-in benches replaced the simple benches along the edge of the grandstand. In 1922, the set-in benches were replaced with dugouts.


## Red Wing (Silver) Stadium (1929-1996)

Built at a cost of \$415,000 and opened for the 1929 season, Red Wing Stadium at 500 Norton Street was considered by many to be the "Taj Mahal of the minor leagues". Constructed of concrete and steel, and rivaling many major league ballparks of the time, Red Wing Stadium had an original capacity of approximately 16,000 . In 1933 lights were added, making it one of the first ballparks in the country to feature them. In the 1930s and 1940s the left field wall was brought in twice. In 1968 the stadium was renamed Silver Stadium in honor of Morrie Silver, President of Rochester Community Baseball and considered by many to be the savior of baseball in Rochester.

By the 1980s the aging stadium was lacking many of the amenities enjoyed by other teams; the clubhouses were sub-par, there were no luxury boxes, and the infrastructure of the stadium itself was in disrepair. Calls for a new stadium began. As a stopgap, a major refurbishing took place in the 1986-87 offseason which gutted the stadium down to the bare steel girders. The crumbling concrete was replaced, as well as the seats, clubhouses, and restrooms and a significant percentage of the original structure. Ultimately the extensive refurbishing only proved to be a temporary stopgap as the pressures to build a new stadium eventually won out. Frontier Field, originally planned to open for the 1996 season, opened for the 1997 season.

## Governors' Cup Quick Facts

- The Wings have played in 309 Governors' Cup playoff games with a record of 151-158.
- Since the Shaughnessy Playoff system was introduced in the IL in 1933, the Wings have made 44 Governors' Cup Playoff appearances and have played in 63 all-time Governors' Cup Playoff series winning 29 series and losing 34. The 44 appearances are the most in Governors' Cup history -- 15 more than 2nd place Columbus (29).
- The Wings have been eliminated in the lst round of the Governors' Cup 23 times and have advanced on 19 occasions. (From 1988-91 only 2 division winners qualified)
- Rochester has won an IL record 10 Governors' Cup championships while losing in the finals 11 times (1933, '34, ‘50, ‘53, '60, ‘61, '82, '86, ‘93, ' $96 \& 2006$ ).

Frontier Field is located in downtown Rochester, accessible from I-490. From the west, take Exit \#12 (Brown/Broad Street). From the east, take Exit \#14 (Plymouth Avenue). From the airport (ROC), take I-390 North to I-490 East. Parking
Parking for working members of the media is in the VIP Lot along the first-base line of Frontier Field. The entrance to the VIP Lot is at the corner of Morrie Silver Way and Oak Street.

## History

Frontier Field opened for baseball on April 11,1991, when the Red Wings played host to the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre Red Barons (Phillies) before a crowd of 13,227. The downtown ballpark replaced Silver Stadium, which was home to Rochester's International League franchise for 68 years beginning in 1929. Frontier Field is the 7th ballpark to serve as the home of pro baseball in the Flower City.

Frontier Field was designed by the Kansas City-based architectural firm Ellerbe Becket. A groundbreaking ceremony was held on November 16, 1994, but actual construction didn't begin until July 1995 due to cuts in the state budget. Funds were eventually restored, and after a 5 -month delay, it took one year to build at a price of $\$ 33$ million. There were 169,000 bricks used in the ballpark structure. Frontier, the primary telephone company in Rochester, bought the naming rights for $\$ 3.5$ million over 20 years.

The first event at Frontier Field was a Beach Boys concert on July 12, 1996, when 12,982 music lovers poured into the brand-new ballpark. The first sporting event at Frontier took place the next night, when 14,717 soccer fans came to see the Rochester Raging Rhinos defeat the Montreal Impact 3-2. The first baseball game wouldn't be until the home opener of the 1997 season. The Red Wings lost $8-5$ to Scranton/Wilkes-Barre in the inaugural game despite leading 5-0 through 6 innings.

Since its opening, Frontier Field has hosted two Governors' Cup Championship Series in 1997 and 2006. The Red Wings defeated the Columbus Clippers (Yankees) 3 games to 2 in the 1997 series, clinching at home for their 10th International League Governors' Cup title. The Wings fell to the Toledo Mud Hens (Tigers) 3 games to 2 in the 2006 series.

## FRONTIER FIELD

Frontier Field hosted the 2000 Triple-A All-Star Game, an 8-2 win by the Pacific Coast League All-Stars over the International League All-Stars on July 12 before 12,810 fans and a nation-wide television audience on ESPN2. The Red Wings had three representatives at the hometown game: Javier De La Hoya, Karim Garcia, and Josh Towers.

Frontier Field served as the home ballpark for the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre Yankees in 2012 while PNC Field in Moosic, Pennsylvania underwent a season-long renovation. The Yankees played 38 regular-season home games at Frontier, as well as two post-season contests. The Yankees were originally scheduled to play 37 home games at Frontier Field, but added a game on May 6 when it was decided that New York Yankees left-handed pitcher Andy Pettitte would be making a rehab start. The game switched locations from Dwyer Stadium in nearby Batavia to Frontier Field. The game established a Frontier Field record for a regular-season baseball game with 13,584 in attendance.

## Non-Red Wings Events

Frontier Field plays host to over 30 non-Red Wings events each year, including several 5k runs, charity events, rehearsal dinners, live music and non-Red Wings baseball games. In total, over 80,000 people attended non-Red Wings events in 2019.

The stadium has been home to several marquee events the past several seasons including the J.P. Morgan Corporate Challenge from 2017-19, Nitro Circus in 2017 and 2021, the LeSean McCoy Celebrity Softball Game in 2015 and 2017, the 2nd Annual Pepsi Max Field of Dreams Game in May, 2013 as well as the Greater Rochester Area Honda Dealers Frozen Frontier presented by Labatt, a two-week outdoor hockey festival in December, 2013.

Frozen Frontier was highlighted by an AHL hockey game between the Rochester Americans and Lake Erie Monsters on December 13th that drew over 11,000 fans.

## Josh Whetzel

Josh enters his 18th season as the Voice of the Red Wings in 2021 and his 26th season broadcasting professional baseball. He was honored as Ballpark Digest's Broadcaster of the Year following the 2015 season. Prior to coming to Rochester, Whetzel spent three years as the play-by-play announcer for the Binghamton Mets, following stints with the Kinston Indians (1996-99) of the Carolina League and the Albany Polecats (1995) of the South AtlanticLeague.Duringhis career, hehas called the play-by-play for the 1995 South Atlantic League All Star Game, 1998 Carolina League All Star Game and the 2009 Triple-A All Star Game. He also called the Yankees-Twins game on September 19, 2011 in which Yankee pitcher Mariano Rivera set the Major League record for career saves. Whetzel is a native of Parsons, Kansas and a 1994 graduate of the University of Kansas.

## Brendan Harrington

Brendan Harrington will help fill in on Red Wings radio broadcasts this season. A native of nearby Naples, Harrington has worked with the Red Wings since 2012 as an official scorer and fill-in radio broadcaster. A 2001 graduate of Washington and Lee University (VA), he was the voice of UNC Asheville basketball for six seasons prior to moving back home to Western New York. Harrington has also worked as a play-by-play broadcaster in minor league baseball for the Lakewood (NJ) BlueClaws and Salem (VA) Avalanche. In addition to his work behind the microphone, Harrington has been a high school social studies teacher for the past 16 years. He currently resides in Brighton with his wife Amy and daughter Macy.

## MEDIA INFORMATION

CREDENTIALS - Daily credential requests can be emailed to Director of Communications, Morrie Silver, at MSilver@RedWingsBaseball.com, or mailed on company letterhead from the sports editor/director/producer to Communications Department, One Morrie Silver Way, Rochester, New York 14608. Applications should be received at least 24 hours in advance of game time.

Due to limited space, applications will be processed on a first-come, first-served basis. Upon approval of request, media may pick up their daily credentials on the day of the game when the press box opens to media.

Media members are asked to wear their credential at all times while at Frontier Field. Credentials are not to be transferred from person-to-person and under no circumstance should a credentialed member of the media seek autographs from uniformed personnel. Failure to abide by these rules will result in removal from Frontier Field and the credential being revoked.

PRESS BOX - The press box is located on the suite level directly behind home plate and is accessible only to working media members with a valid credential.

FIELD ACCESS - In accordance with the regulations designated by Major League Baseball, the media may not access the field through the tunnel behind home plate. Media members wishing to reach the field can do so through the gates at the far end of each dugout (between sections 104-105 and 127-128).

CLUBHOUSE ACCESS - In accordance with the regulations designated by Major
League Baseball, the Red Wings clubhouse will not be open for media access.
PHOTOGRAPHERS - Photographers must have credentials and must work out of stationary camera wells located adjacent to both dugouts. Television camera locations are available in the press box.

GAME INFORMATION - Game notes, statistics, rosters, etc. are available in the press box two hours prior to game time. To receive game notes in your inbox daily, please email MSilver@RedWingsBaseball.com.

MEDIA INTERVIEWS - Red Wings uniformed players and coaches can be made available for Zoom interviews and on-field for vaccinated media members.
