**Last Night:** Captains 8, Lugnuts 0 (6 innings). In a game shortened due to inclement weather, the Captains received five scoreless innings from **Alex Royalty**, a leadoff home run from **Will Brennan**, a two-run homer from **Bryan Lavastida** and a 4-for-4 game from **Brayan Rocchio** in a series-opening win. **Shane Selmán** went 2-for-2 with two doubles in the loss.

**On Deck:** Tomorrow is a Labatt Blue Thirsty Thursday, with \$2 domestic drafts and \$4 craft drafts. The Nuts and Caps play one another through Sunday, including a full Wizarding Weekend!

**What's New in 2021:** Entering this season, the Lugnuts' stadium name changed from Cooley Law School Stadium to Jackson® Field™, Lansing moved up to the High-A Central and the ballclub accepted an invitation to affiliate with the A's, the Nuts' fourth MLB partner, following the Royals (1996-98), Cubs (1999-2004) and Blue Jays (2005-2020).

### LUG-NOTES: HEADLINES AND POINTS OF INTEREST

**Transaction:** A day after the Lugnuts saw shortstop **Max Schuemann** promoted to Double-A Midland and received infielder **Marcos Brito** in his stead from Low-A Stockton, the Nuts today received outfielder **Austin Beck** from Triple-A Las Vegas. Beck batted 3-for-20 with the Aviators with home runs in three straight games, from July 4-6.

**Streaking:** The Lugnuts' hottest hitter is outfielder **Shane Selmán**, who has reached base in his last 15 games dating back to June 25. Over that span, Selmán is slashing .327/.475/.609 with seven extra-base hits and 11 walks, raising his OPS from .727 (.228/.317/.409) to its current .817 (.256/.362/.455). He leads the Lugnuts in home runs (8).

**Star of Stars:** The 2021 MLB All-Star Game MVP Award, the Ted Williams Award, was presented to 2017 Lugnut **Vladimir Guerrero, Jr.**, who went 1-for-3 with two RBIs, including a 468-foot home run, in the American League's 5-2 victory last night. He is the youngest All-Star Game MVP in the game's history. Fellow 2017 Lugnut **Bo Bichette** entered in reserve at shortstop and went 0-for-1 with a strikeout. Back to Vladly Jr.: He leads the Majors in batting average (.332), RBIs (73), on-base percentage (.430) and OPS (1.089) and is tied for second in home runs (28).

**Alumni Report:** 2019 Lugs outfielder **Griffin Conine**, playing for the Beloit (MIA), leads the minors with 21 homers, while 2017 outfielder **Edward Olivares**, playing for Omaha (KC), leads the Triple-A East with a .363 batting average and 2015 first baseman **Ryan McBroom** (Omaha) is tied for the Triple-A East lead with 17 homers and leads the Triple-A East with 45 RBIs.

**Bruised:** Lansing leads the High-A Central with 56 HBPs, no thanks to the Nuts' games against Great Lakes (53 HBPs). Loons pitchers hit two more Lugnuts on Sunday and have plunked 18 Lugnuts batters this season.

**Call to Arms:** The Lugnuts' pitching staff ranks second in the High-A Central with a 3.70 earned run average as well as second with a 1.28 WHIP, pitching the second most innings in the league (532 1/3), issuing the second fewest walks (198) and recording the fifth most strikeouts (600).

**Complete Effort:** Right-hander **Jack Cushing's** seven-inning complete game in Game 2 of last Friday night's doubleheader at Great Lakes was the fourth complete game by a High-A Central pitcher this year. Cushing tossed one complete game while at Georgetown University, a nine-inning CG on April 13, 2019, at Villanova. The right-hander is slated to pitch again tomorrow night vs. Lake County.

**Heavy Workload:** Lugs lefty **Dalton Sawyer**, who missed the 2018-2019 seasons due to Tommy John and so did not pitch in a game between the 2017-2018 offseason this year, is making up for lost time. Saturday marked his 23rd relief appearance of the season, ranking second-most in the circuit, one behind West Michigan's **Jared Tobey**.

### History vs. Lake County

The Lugnuts are 3-4 in 2021 and 86-88 vs. the Captains all-time, with a record of 51-44 vs. the Caps at home, compared to 35-44 in Eastlake. In 2019, the Nuts won the series, 10-9.

## TODAY IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

**2012:** Noah Syndergaard tossed three hitless innings, striking out four, before the first of two rain delays forced him out. In the ninth, at 12:15 a.m., with Lansing one out away from victory, the **Kernels'** Matt Scioscia knocked an RBI double to left-center... and the skies opened up in a torrent of rain, causing a third rain delay. The Lugs never did get that last out -- the game was eventually called -- but they did pick up a 9-4 win over Cedar Rapids near 1 a.m. The game lasted 2:38, while the delays totaled 3 hours, 2 minutes.

**2016:** The Lugnuts were swept in a doubleheader, 3-2 and 1-0, at Peoria. Game 2 saw the Lugnuts' Jordan Romano and Josh DeGraaf pitch a six-inning no-hitter, the second no-hitter in franchise history, but a leadoff walk to Craig Aikin, a sacrifice bunt/DeGraaf fielding error, a fielder's choice and an Eli Alvarez sacrifice fly in the bottom of the sixth gave the Chiefs the game's only run.

**Root, Root, Root for the Home Team:** July 4th's Lugnuts/Dragons series finale drew a season-high attendance of 10,109. That's a larger crowd than any of the Blue Jays' home games this season in Dunedin or Buffalo and it's higher than the average attendance in MLB for the Detroit Tigers (9,717), Baltimore Orioles (8,654), Pittsburgh Pirates (8,237), Tampa Bay Rays (6,783), Oakland Athletics (6,403), Miami Marlins (5,983) and Toronto/Buffalo/Dunedin Blue Jays (3,877). Only eight of the 119 other Minor League teams have drawn a larger crowd to a game this season: Albuquerque, Nashville, Charlotte, Fresno, Indianapolis, Round Rock, Durham and Las Vegas.

**Major League Lugnuts:** Three former Nuts have made their Major League debuts this season, bringing the total to 157 all-time - pitcher **Ty Tice** '18, outfielder **Josh Palacios** '16-'17, and pitcher **Taylor Saucedo** '16-'17. Tice and Palacios made their first MLB appearance in the same game for the Toronto Blue Jays on April 9th. It was the seventh time in team history that two Lugnuts made their MLB debut in the same game, with the first occurring on September 14, 1998: **Carlos Fables** and **Carlos Beltrán** for the Kansas City Royals. Saucedo most recently debuted, tossing a scoreless inning for the Blue Jays on June 17.

**Record-Setting, For Better:** On June 15, **Max Schuemann** broke **Samad Taylor**'s franchise single-game record of four steals in a game (set July 1, 2018) with five stolen bases against the Great Lakes Loons.

**Record-Setting, For Worse:** On June 20, **Stevie Emanuels** broke the franchise single game record, tied many times before, of three homers served up in a game, giving up four HRs to the Loons - two apiece by Deacon Liput and Andy Pages.

**So Many Starters:** The Lugnuts have used 14 different starting pitchers this season, namely **Brady Basso**, **Reid Birlingmair**, **Jeff Criswell**, **Jack Cushing**, **David Leal**, **Stevie Emanuels**, **Richard Guasch**, **Rafael Kelly**, **Bryce Nightengale**, **Colin Peluse**, **Leudeny Pineda**, **Seth Shuman**, **Shohei Tomioka** and **Brock Whittlesey**.

**Roster Index:** When he appears in his first Lugnuts game, **Marcos Brito** will become the 844th Lugnut all-time and the 40th player used this year. The 2021 Lugnuts have already surpassed the total number of players used in the 1999 and 2008 seasons (38 apiece). The franchise record for most players used in a single year is 54, set in 2017. Currently, about 18.6% of all Lugnuts are reaching the Major Leagues (157 of 844). If that percentage continues to hold true, at least seven of the 40 players to see time this year with the Nuts will reach MLB.

**A Pleasant Peninsula Surrounds You:** **Max Schuemann** (Portage Northern H.S.) is the first Lugnut to hail from Eastern Michigan University in Ypsilanti. Earlier this season, the Nuts featured two Michigan Wolverines in **Jeff Criswell** (injured) and **Jack Weisenburger** (promoted).

**Finally:** Pitchers **Jeff Criswell**, **Stevie Emanuels** and **Shohei Tomioka**, catchers **Jared McDonald**, **Drew Millas** and **William Simoneit**, first baseman **Patrick McColl**, and outfielder **Michael Guldberg** have all made their pro debut this season with the Lugnuts.

**Front Office Connections:** Lugnuts pitching coach **Don Schulze** was drafted 11th overall by the Chicago Cubs in 1980, 12 picks before Oakland Executive Vice President of Baseball Operations **Billy Beane** was drafted by the New York Mets. Lugnuts first baseman **Patrick McColl** set a new Harvard baseball single season record with 70 hits in 2019, breaking the previous record held by Athletics General Manager David Forst.

**Clubhouse of Higher Learning:** The Ivy League is well represented on the Lansing roster. First baseman **Patrick McColl** played for Harvard University, reliever **Michael Danielak** was drafted from Dartmouth College and catcher **William Simoneit** spent four years at Cornell University before grad-transferring to Wake Forest. Speaking of outstanding academic institutions, starter **Jack Cushing** spent four years at Georgetown University.

**Power Five Baseball:** The Lugnuts also represent the ACC (**Michael Guldberg**, Georgia Tech); Big 12 (**Brady Basso**, Oklahoma State); Big Ten (**Dalton Sawyer**, Minnesota); the SEC (**Cobie Vance**, Alabama); and the Pac-12 (**Stevie Emanuels**, Washington).

**International Appeal:** In addition to 17 different states (Arizona, California, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Louisiana, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Nevada (Connor Hughes), North Carolina, Ohio (Scott Steinmann), Texas, Virginia, Washington) represented by Lugnuts players and coaching staff, seven nations are represented: USA, Colombia, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Japan, South Africa (Anthony Phillips) and Venezuela (Javier Godard).

**Representing His Country:** 1B/3B **Jordan Diaz** played for Colombia in Olympic Baseball Qualifying play, blasting a game-tying home run in the 9th against Venezuela, but Colombia lost all three games in opening pool play and was eliminated. Team USA won the tournament, punching a ticket to Japan.

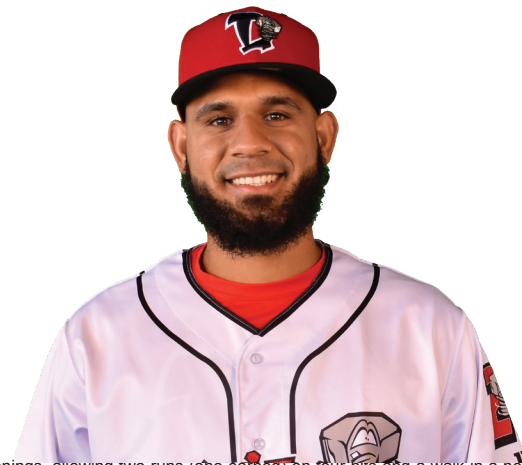

**Personal:** The first letter of Richard's last name is pronounced with an "h" sound, as in "hwahsh"... rated Baseball America's No. 35 Oakland prospect, with his slider rated as the best in the organization.

**Last Outing:** Started Game 1 of a doubleheader at Great Lakes, July 9: 4 IP, 2 hits, 1 run, 4 walks, 4 K's, 1 HBP, allowing a solo home run to Leonel Valera... battled command: of 85 pitches, only threw 45 for strikes... Shohei Tomioka followed with three perfect innings of relief in a Lugnuts 2-1 victory.

**2021 in the High-A Central: 22.0 IP, .173 OBA, 1.64 ERA at home, 22.0 IP, .250 OBA, 4.09 ERA on road.**

- Opened the season as the No. 3 starter in the Lugnuts' rotation, working 2 1/3 scoreless innings on May 6th vs. Lake County... struggled with command, working around a one-out walk in the 1st inning with a strikeout of top prospect George Valera... hit a batter and walked a batter in the 2nd inning but stranded runners at the corners... gave up a double and a walk in the 3rd inning, but responded by striking out Valera and cleanup hitter Jonathan Engelmann before he was relieved in favor of Bryce Nightengale, who escaped the jam... departed with the Lugnuts leading, 3-0, only to see bullpen relinquish the lead in a 7-6 loss.

- Relieved Shohei Tomioka in a piggyback assignment on Thursday, May 13th, at Dayton... struck out six Dragons in four innings, allowing two runs (one earned) on four hits and a walk in a no-decision... relieved Tomioka starting the 3rd inning, allowing a home run to Jose Tello, the second batter faced; Victor Ruiz followed with a single, but was erased on a strike 'im out, throw 'im out double play... pitched around singles by James Free and Jonathan Willems in a scoreless 4th... whiffed Quincy McAfee and Ruiz in a perfect 5th... in frustrating 6th, walked Quin Cotton on a 3-2 pitch, Cotton stole 2nd and then stole 3rd on a strikeout of James Free, coming home on a throwing error by catcher Jared McDonald, giving Dayton an enormous insurance run, on their way to a 4-2 win over the Lugnuts.

- Pitched brilliantly in a start Thursday, May 20, at Fort Wayne, tossing five scoreless innings while allowing two hits, two walks, and striking out seven... pitched around an Agustin Ruiz single in the 1st inning... allowed a leadoff double to Justin Lopez in the 2nd inning and wild-pitched him to third, then struck out the side to strand him... walked Adam Kerner and Reinaldo Illaraza to open the 3rd and wild-pitched them to scoring position, but stranded them there... struck out two in a perfect 4th... struck out his seventh batter in a perfect 5th... Lugnuts went on to win, 12-1.

- Disaster on May 27: Richard relieved Seth Shuman with two outs in the 3rd inning, held the Great Lakes Loons scoreless in the 4th and 5th innings, and then was charged with eight unearned runs in the 6th on three walks, three errors behind him, an HBP, a fielder's choice, a dropped sacrifice fly, and zero hits... Charles Hall relieved him and gave up a pair of two-run singles in a nine-run inning, and the Loons went on to win, 10-1.

- Dominance on June 3: Richard mesmerized the South Bend Cubs, posting six scoreless three-hit innings, walking one and striking out eight... departed with the Lugnuts leading 4-0, only to see the Cubs rally for three runs in the 7th and two in the 9th for a 5-4 comeback win... eight strikeouts tied career high for most in an appearance.

- After allowing 1 ER in his first 20 1/3 innings, Richard gave up four runs on nine hits in four innings at West Michigan on June 10, jumping his ERA from 0.44 to 1.85... removed after facing three batters in the 5th and not recording an out; lefty Dalton Sawyer allowed a run on a sacrifice fly but stranded the other two runners... Guasch was charged with the loss as the Lugnuts fell, 10-0.

- Started June 17 vs. Great Lakes, receiving no-decision... whiffed eight batters in five innings, allowing two runs on four hits, three walks and three HBPs... Lugnuts won, 4-3, scoring four unearned runs thanks to four Loons errors... stranded bases loaded in the 1st, stranded two in the 2nd... stranded one in the 3rd... stranded two in the 4th... finished with a perfect 5th.
