**YESTERDAY:** The Flying Squirrels beat the RubberDucks, 5-4. Down, 4-2, entering the ninth, **Jonah Cox** tied the score with a two-run homer. Later in the inning, **Drew Cavanaugh** won the game with a walk-off double. **Trystan Vrieling** worked five scoreless innings. Wilfredo Antunez broke a scoreless tie in the sixth with an RBI single. In the seventh, Cox tied the score with a sacrifice fly. Akron scored two runs in the top of the eighth to take a 3-2 lead. **Maui Ahuna** brought in a run with a groundout in the bottom of the eighth to close the score to 3-2. Jake Fox plated a run for Akron in the top of the ninth to open a 4-2 lead.

**TODAY'S GAME:** The Flying Squirrels play the third of a six-game series against the Akron RubberDucks, Double-A affiliate of the Cleveland Guardians. It is the first series between the two teams this season. Richmond is 13-1 at CarMax Park this year.

**STRONG START:** The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 22-6 start is the best in team history through 28 games, passing the 17-11 starts in 2010 and 2022. Richmond has won four series and split one so far this year. Five-of-six Richmond losses have been by one run.

**RELENTLESS:** In their 22 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 13 of them. In nine of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. On April 4, they scored two in the ninth for an 11-9 win at Erie. In the April 7 home opener, they never trailed but jumped ahead in the bottom of the eighth for a 3-2 win over the Curve. On April 9, they scored two in the eighth for another 3-2 win against Altoona. On April 11, the Curve scored two in the top of the 10th before the Flying Squirrels walked off with three in the bottom of the 10th. On April 15 in Hartford, the Flying Squirrels scored five runs with two outs in the ninth to win 13-11. On April 24, **Drew Cavanaugh** hit a walk-off, two-run homer in the ninth for a 7-6 win over the Patriots. On April 26, Richmond tied the score with two outs in the ninth before **Parks Harber** hit a walk-off single in the 10th. On April 30, the Flying Squirrels rallied from a two-run deficit in the eighth to take the lead in the ninth and 10th but were answered by Altoona before a 12-run top of the 11th. On Wednesday, **Jonah Cox** hit a two-run homer to tie the score in the ninth before Cavanaugh won the game, 5-4, with a walk-off double.

**THE FLYING SQUIRRELS** are tied for the best record of all 150 teams across Major League Baseball and Minor League Baseball, even with a 22-6 record for High-A Eugene (Giants). The Richmond offense leads all 120 full-season MiLB teams in batting average (.296) and doubles (71) and ranks second in SLG (.489) and OPS (.872). Richmond leads all 30 Double-A teams in batting average, runs (206), hits (287), doubles, RBIs (188) and OBP (.383). In 14 road games this year, the Flying Squirrels are batting .313 (164-for-524) and have scored 122 runs (8.7 runs per game). In 14 home games at CarMax Park, the Flying Squirrels are hitting .276 (123-for-446) and have scored 84 runs (6.0 runs per game). Starting pitchers **Joe Whitman** and **Trystan Vrieling** have combined for 11 scoreless innings in this series.

**THE RUBBERDUCKS** are 16-13 this season, third in the Eastern League Southwest Division. Last week, they split a six-game series with Harrisburg in a battle for second place in the division. Akron's pitching staff leads the Eastern League in ERA (4.13), which is third-best in Double-A. Akron's roster features five players included in Baseball America's top-30 Guardians prospects list, including 1B Ralphy Velazquez (No. 3), RHP Khal Stephen (No. 8), OF Jaison Chourio (No. 9), OF Alfonsin Rosario (No. 24) and LHP Josh Hartle (No. 25). There are six Akron players on MLB.com's top-30 Guardians prospects list, including Velazquez (No. 4), Stephen (No. 6), Chourio (No. 11), Rosario (No. 15), C Jacob Cozart (No. 19) and Hartle (No. 26).

**FOR RICHMOND:** Right-hander **Darien Smith** makes his fourth Double-A start and his sixth appearance of the year. He picked up a win in his last start last Friday at Altoona, throwing five scoreless innings. On Tuesday, he was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Month for April after going 3-0 with a 1.35 ERA in five outings, tying the league lead (min. 20 IP) in ERA and ranking first in WHIP (0.75). Among MiLB pitchers this year, he ranks sixth in ERA (1.08). He leads the Eastern League in ERA and ranks tied for second in wins (4), third in WHIP (0.92) and fourth in BAA (.165). Smith pitched collegiately at Jacksonville University (2019), JUCO Eastern Florida State College (2020-21), Florida Gulf Coast (2022) and NAIA Southeastern (2023-24). At Southeastern in 2024, he was named the ABCA/Rawlings NAIA Pitcher of the Year, going 12-0 with a 1.87 ERA in 17 games (16 starts). Smith signed with the Giants as a non-drafted free agent that summer. In his first professional season in 2025, Smith went 8-0 with a 1.91 ERA in 20 outings (three starts). **For more on Smith, see page two.**

**FOR AKRON:** Left-hander Matt Wilkinson makes his sixth Double-A start and his first against Richmond. In his last outing on Friday against the Senators, he threw his second five-inning, scoreless start of the season and struck out six while allowing three hits. In his last three starts since April 19, he is 1-0 with a 0.59 ERA (1 ER/15.1 IP/19 SO/4 BB). For the year, he leads the Eastern League in WHIP (0.80), ranks second in ERA (1.14) and second in BAA (.148). Wilkinson is eighth in MiLB in WHIP, tied for eighth in ERA and tied for ninth in BAA. Last year, he made 25 starts for High-A Lake County and went 4-9 with a 4.24 ERA. Wilkinson was selected by the Guardians in the 10th round of the 2023 MLB Draft out of Central Arizona College. This spring, he made two scoreless appearances for Canada in the World Baseball Classic, striking out four over 2.2 innings.

**COX ROCKS:** **Jonah Cox** reached base in the first 23 games he played this season to begin his Double-A career before an 0-for-3 outing on Tuesday night. The streak was the second-longest in the Eastern League this year. He opened the season on a 12-game hit streak and has at least one hit in 23-of-25 games he has played, adding a 10-game hit streak that was also snapped on Tuesday. He went 3-for-3 on Wednesday with a game-tying, two-run homer in the ninth. For the year, he leads MiLB in batting average (.429) and ranks second in OPS (1.216), third in SLG (.726) and sixth in OBP (.490). His 17 steals are second in the Eastern League after swiping 58 bases each of the last two seasons. On May 1 (G1), he became the fifth player in Flying Squirrels history to hit three triples in a single game.

**GREAT SCOTT:** **Scott Bandura** is tied for fourth in the Eastern League in RBIs (23) this season. He drove in six runs in last week's series at Altoona. On April 14 at Hartford, Bandura went 3-for-4 with two doubles and drove in five runs, the most by a Richmond batter this season. The next day, he hit a solo homer before clubbing a go-ahead, three-run double in the ninth. On Tuesday, he reached base three times with a double and two walks.

**JUST HOW WE DREW IT UP:** **Drew Cavanaugh** has reached base multiple times in 12-of-his-17 games started this season and ranks third in the Eastern League in on-base percentage (.469). He has at least one hit and one walk in 12 starts. On April 24, he entered as a pinch-hitter in the ninth and hit the first walk-off home run in CarMax Park history, a two-out, two-run shot for a 7-6 win. On Wednesday, he broke a 4-4 tie with a walk-off double to beat Akron.

**SABIN SOARING:** **Sabin Ceballos** hit his sixth homer of the season on Tuesday, tying his total from 2025. Of his six homers, three have been on Tuesdays and three have been on Wednesdays. Over his last 18 games since April 14, he is batting .319 (22-for-69) with four doubles, six homers and 12 RBIs with 12 walks. He homered twice in the April 15 win at Hartford and finished the night 3-for-4 with four RBIs and four runs scored. Prior to this stretch, he opened the season batting .160 (4-for-25) in his first seven games from April 3-12. Last season, Ceballos hit .311 (46-for-148) with five homers, 11 doubles and 27 RBIs over final 43 games from July 3-September 6. His 11-game hit streak was snapped in the second game on Friday night.

**SMITH HONORED:** **Darien Smith** was named the Eastern League Pitcher of the Month on Tuesday after going 3-0 with a 1.35 ERA (3 ER/20 IP) for the month. Among EL pitchers who worked at least 20 innings, Smith led the league in WHIP (0.75), was tied for first in ERA and ranked second in BAA (.145). He was also tied for third in the league in wins (3). Smith is the third player in Flying Squirrels franchise history to be named an Eastern League Pitcher of the Month, joining **Matt Frisbee** (May 2021) and **Mason Black** (June 2023).

**TOP SKIPPER:** Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 282 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

**PACKING THE HOUSE:** In 2025, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in total (446,679) and average (6,768) attendance for the fourth consecutive season. The average attendance was the highest in the franchise's history. April 7's inaugural game at CarMax Park had been sold out for more than a month, marking the 16th consecutive home-opener to sell out for the Flying Squirrels. This season, the Flying Squirrels rank second among the 120 MiLB teams in average attendance (7,227).

**IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS:** In the Eastern League, **Jonah Cox** is first in batting average (.429), first in OBP (.490), first in SLG (.726), first in OPS (1.216), tied for first in triples (3), second in steals (17), tied for second in RBIs (24), tied for second in hits (36) and tied for fourth in total bases (61). **Scott Bandura** is tied for fourth in RBIs (23), tied for fourth in hits (34), fifth in runs (25), tied for fifth in doubles (9), 10th in batting average (.315) and 10th in OBP (.423). **Drew Cavanaugh** is third in OBP (.469) and seventh in OPS (1.026). **Darien Smith** is first in ERA (1.08), tied for second in wins (4), third in WHIP (0.92) and fourth in BAA (.165). **Jack Choate** is first in wins (5). **Joe Whitman** is tied for third in strikeouts (35), sixth in innings pitched (28.1) and 10th in WHIP (1.16). **Tyler Vogel** is first in saves (5).

**PROSPECT WATCH:** Richmond's roster features three players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 3), **Parks Harber** (No. 16), **Diego Velazquez** (No. 24) and **Joe Whitman** (No. 25). **Adrian Sugastey** is rated by Baseball America as the top defensive catcher in the Giants organization and **Jonah Cox** is rated as the top defensive outfielder. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 7), Harber (No. 14), **Maui Ahuna** (No. 20) and Whitman (No. 26).

### THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

**1987:** A baseball game at The Diamond opened the Legends Fest of Sports. The Legends won, 7-0. Pitchers Bob Gibson, Warren Spahn, Gaylord Perry and Wade Blasingame struck out eight in the six-inning game. Lou Brock, Curt Flood and Ernie Banks combined for seven hits and drove in three runs. The Legends lineup also included Ron Santo, Hank Aaron, Joe Torre, Bill Skowron and Brooks Robinson. Willie Mays, Dick Allen, Jerry Koonsman and others were also at the event. Earl Weaver managed the team. **1988:** The Richmond Braves beat the Pawtucket Red Sox, 5-4, at The Diamond. David Justice had four hits in the game. John Smoltz started and entered the ninth with a 5-1 lead and struck out the first two batters before allowing three runs. Jose Alvarez entered and recorded a three-pitch strikeout to end the game. **2011:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Altoona Curve, 5-0. Eric Surkamp recorded double-figure strikeouts for the third straight start, a franchise record that still stands today.
