Today's Game: The Oklahoma City Comets look for a series win during today's series finale against the El Paso Chihuahuas at 6:05 p.m. at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark. The seven-game series is tied, 3-3, as the Comets have won three of the last four games...Today is a Family Sunday featuring pregame player autographs, postgame kids run the bases and a Comets poster giveaway presented by R.K. Black to the first 1,000 fans.

Last Game: Zach Ehrhard hit a go-ahead home run in the eighth inning as the Oklahoma City Comets edged El Paso, 3-2, Saturday night in another close game at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark. El Paso scored the opening run with a two-out single from Nick Pratto in the second inning. Oklahoma City jumped ahead in the seventh inning as two runs scored when Ryan Ward hit into a fielder's choice coupled with an El Paso throwing error. The Chihuahuas tied the game on a RBI single from Ethan Salas in the eighth inning. The Comets took the lead back one batter into the bottom of the eighth as Ehrhard belted a solo shot out to center field. El Paso got two runners in scoring position in the ninth inning before a pair of groundouts forced by Garrett McDaniels ended the game.

Today's Probable Pitcher: Charlie Barnes (3-2) is slated to make his first start since July 7 vs. El Paso...Barnes last pitched in relief Tuesday, tossing 2.0 scoreless and hitless innings with two walks and two strikeouts...In six appearances this month, Barnes hasn't allowed a run across 8.2 innings with four hits, four walks and 10 strikeouts...Barnes has also made four appearances with the Dodgers this season, allowing seven runs and 13 hits across 10.0 innings. The lefty joined the Dodgers after being claimed off waivers from Chicago (NL) May 9...Earlier this year, Barnes appeared in seven games (four starts) with Triple-A Iowa and made one appearance for the Cubs for his first MLB appearance since 2021 with Minnesota...Barnes split last season between the KBO's Lotte Giants and Triple-A Louisville (CIN) and played for Lotte from 2022-24...Barnes was originally drafted by Minnesota in the fourth round of the 2017 MLB Draft out of Clemson University.

Against the Chihuahuas: 2026: 7-4 2025: 10-8 All-time: 77-62 At OKC: 44-29

The Comets play their second of three series against the Chihuahuas, meeting for the final time at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark this season...Of the final 25 games of the season, 13 are against the Chihuahuas...OKC won four of five games July 7-12. Following a series opening loss, the Comets won each of the final four games, scoring 33 runs in the process...The Comets won last year's season series, 10-8, and OKC has only lost two season series since the Chihuahuas joined the PCL in 2014, last in 2022...With a win today, the Chihuahuas will win their first series at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark since 2018 (3-1) and first-ever series of at least six games since the format was instituted in 2021, as OKC has gone 6-0-4 in their last 10 home series against El Paso.

Close Calls: Last night, the Comets played their third straight one-run game, sixth one-run game in the last seven contests and ninth in the last 11 games. OKC is 3-4 in the last seven one-run games and 3-6 in the last nine one-run games...Each of the Comets' last six losses have all been by one run and the Comets are 19-22 in one-run games overall this season. OKC's 22 losses in one-run games so far in 2026 are the team's most in a single season since also losing 22 one-run games in 2021. OKC last had more than 22 one-run losses in a season in 2018 (25)...Saturday marked the Comets' 11th last at-bat win of the season and third in the last seven games, including Friday night's 5-4 walk-off win in 10 innings and last Sunday's 1-0 win in 10 innings at Sugar Land.

August Ascent: The Comets play their final game of the month of August tonight as they have won three of the last four games and are 5-3 in the last eight games...The Comets own the best record in August among all Triple-A teams at 17-9 and put together a 15-3 stretch July 29-Aug. 18...The Comets are 3-0-1 in their last four series and have not lost a series since July 21-26 in Sacramento. OKC has not lost a home series since June 2-7 vs. Round Rock...With 19 games remaining in the regular season, the Comets sit 3.0 games behind first-place Sugar Land in the PCL second half standings and are in a tie for second place with Round Rock. The winner of the second half advances to play Las Vegas in the PCL Championship Series...The Comets travel to Round Rock to begin a six-game series at Dell Diamond Tuesday night.

Hard-Line: Zach Ehrhard collected his second home run in three games Saturday night and is up to 19 homers this season. He's collected a hit in each of the last four games, going 4-for-14 with two homers and four RBI. Ehrhard also scored his 103rd run last night and is now tied for third on OKC's Bricktown-era single-season record list with Esteban German (2005)...Ehrhard leads the PCL in runs scored this season, while ranking third with 85 walks, fourth with 132 hits and 84 RBI and tied for fourth with 217 total bases...He is one home run shy of the third 20/20 campaign during the Bricktown era, joining Nelson Cruz (2008) and Ryan Noda (2022).

On the Mend: Los Angeles Dodgers catcher Will Smith continued his Major League Rehab Assignment Saturday and made his fourth appearance of the series with the Comets. He went 2-for-4 with two doubles while playing as the designated hitter. He was placed on the Dodgers' Injured List June 11 with neck inflammation and was transferred to the 60-day IL July 21...Justin Wroblewski began his Major League Rehab Assignment with Oklahoma City last night. He earned the win in relief as he tossed 1.1 innings with one run, three hits and two strikeouts. He threw 34 pitches (21 strikes). The 2026 National League All-Star is currently recovering from right elbow inflammation...The Comets currently have six players on ML Rehab Assignments and have had at least one player on their roster as part of a rehab assignment for 107 of the last 109 games starting April 21.

Pitching Prowess: The Comets limited the Chihuahuas to two runs last night and have now surrendered four or fewer runs in 15 of the last 17 games. Since Aug. 12, the Comets have allowed a total of 40 runs (31 ER) — the fewest runs allowed by a team in the full-season Minors — but have a 10-7 record during the stretch. OKC leads the Minors with a 1.85 ERA, tied for the lowest WHIP at 1.08 and has the second-lowest BAA (.195) during that span...OKC enters tonight with a 3.19 ERA this month, which would be the team's lowest in a month since April 2018 (2.48). The Comets have notched six shutouts this month, becoming the first PCL team to do so since Memphis in June 2015. It's the first time OKC has registered six shutouts in a month since August 2006.

Way of the K: The Comets struck out 13 batters for the second straight game last night as Oklahoma City reached double-figures for the third time this series. They have notched least 13 strikeouts in six of the last 13 games...The Comets lead all Triple-A teams with 281 strikeouts this month and they lead the PCL with 1,197 strikeouts this season...OKC has finished among the top three PCL teams in strikeouts every year since 2019 and led the league in strikeouts three times during the span (2019, 2023 and 2025).

Six-For-Six: Ryan Fitzgerald and Hyeseong Kim have both hit safely in each of the first six games of the current series against El Paso...Kim is 10-for-22 (.455) with a triple, two RBI and two stolen bases. This is his longest hitting streak of the season...Fitzgerald 10-for-21 (.476) with three extra-base hits and five RBI. He leads all Triple-A players with 149 hits and is one hit shy of becoming the eighth player in the OKC's Bricktown era (since 1998) to collect at least 150 hits in a single season.

Homeboys: A win tonight would give the Comets their 40th home win of the season as they lead the PCL with a 39-28 record at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark. OKC last recorded 40 or more home wins in 2023 when the team finished 42-31...The Comets are 17-7 in the last 24 home games.

Around the Horn: The Comets have won each of their last four series finales overall and have also won four consecutive home series finales. The team is 5-2 when aiming to win a series in the finale...The Comets' 36 stolen bases in August are second-most in the league behind El Paso's 43.

Last Game: Aug. 25 vs. ELP (ND); 2.0 IP, 0 H, 0 R, 0 ER, 2 BB, 2 K, 0 HR; 32 pitches/18 strikes

- Appeared in the current series opener Tuesday...entered the game in the seventh inning with El Paso leading, 4-2...retired six of eight total batters faced...allowed a walk each inning, but held the Chihuahuas 0-for-4 with runners on.

2026:

- Team record in starts: 3-4 (Streak: L1)...previous start was July 7 vs. El Paso.
- Over six games with the Comets in August has thrown 8.2 scoreless innings...allowed four hits, with four walks and 10 strikeouts...held opponents 4-for-30.
- Appeared in five games in the Majors this season between the Dodgers and Cubs (13.0 IP, 17 H, 11 R, 10 ER, 7 BB, 6 K)...has been optioned to Triple-A five times this season between the two organizations.
- Most recently called up by the Dodgers Aug. 10, but was only active for that night's game and did not pitch...optioned back to OKC the following day...subsequently outrighted to OKC Aug. 13.
- Designated for assignment by the Dodgers for the second time this season July 29; after clearing waivers, re-signed as a minor league free agent Aug. 2...previously outrighted July 13, elected free agency and re-signed as a minor league free agent July 17.
- Delivered five strong innings June 6 vs. Round Rock in a no decision (5.0 IP, 4 H, 1 R, 1 ER, 0 BB, 5 K)...after the first three batters reached, retired 10 in a row and 14 of his final 16 batters, allowing a pair of singles during that stretch.
- Earned his first win with OKC during the Comets' 9-1 victory May 30 at Sugar Land...retired 10 of his first 12 batters faced (1 H, 1 E)...only run scored in the fourth inning with two outs...held Sugar Land 1-for-7 with runners on (1-for-4 with RISP)...was second start of the season with 5.0 innings and no walks (April 8 with Iowa vs. Omaha).
- Recalled by LAD May 15 before making an appearance with OKC...tossed a scoreless inning both May 15 and 16 before getting optioned back to OKC May 17...marked the first time in his career to appear in back-to-back games.
- Claimed off waivers by the Dodgers from the Chicago Cubs May 9 and optioned to OKC...DFA by Chicago May 6.
- Began year with Triple-A Iowa; went 3-1 with a 3.04 ERA, 1.20 WHIP and .220 BAA in seven appearances (four starts)...had three stints with Iowa (start-April 12, April 14-26 & April 27-May 6)...tossed season-high 5.0 IP four times...in his final start with Iowa May 6 vs. Columbus, threw five scoreless innings; allowed four hits, with one walk and four strikeouts
- Had contract selected by Chicago (NL) April 12, marking first of two stints with the Cubs (April 12-14 and April 26-27)...made one relief appearance April 13 at Philadelphia (3.0 IP, 4 H, 4 R, 3 ER, 3 BB, 1 K)...marked first MLB outing since Oct. 3, 2021 with Minnesota at Kansas City.
- Signed with the Cubs as a minor league free agent Jan. 26.

2025:

- Began fourth straight season with the Lotte Giants (KBO)...went 3-4 with a 5.32 ERA in eight starts...struck out season-high 11 batters April 16 vs. Kiwoom...tossed a season-high 7.0 IP three times.
- Signed with Cincinnati as a minor league free agent Aug. 5 (marked first time playing in U.S. since 2021)...finished season with Triple-A Louisville; went 1-3 with a 7.13 ERA, 1.92 WHIP and .366 BAA in six starts...tossed a quality start on Sept. 4 vs. St. Paul (6.0 IP, 8 H, 2 ER, 1 BB, 5 K)...struck out seven batters twice.
- Played in the Dominican Winter League after the season for the first time with Aguilas Cibaenas and went 0-1 with a 2.84 ERA in five starts.

Career:

- Enters his 10th professional season...originally drafted by Minnesota in the fourth round of the 2017 MLB Draft out of Clemson University.
- In two MLB seasons (2021, 2026) with Minnesota, Chicago (NL) and LAD, is 0-3 with a 5.86 ERA, 1.65 WHIP and .297 BAA in 12 appearances (eight starts).
- Across four KBO seasons from 2022-25 with Lotte, went 35-32 with a 3.58 ERA in 94 starts.
- Made ML debut in Game 1 of a doubleheader with Minnesota at Detroit July 17, 2021 (4.2 IP, 4 H, 1 ER, 1 BB, 1 K).
- Won 2018 Florida State League championship with High-A Fort Myers (MIN)...tossed 6.2 scoreless innings in Game 1 of championship series.
- Third-Team All-ACC selection in 2017 with Clemson...won the Stowe Award, given to the team's most valuable pitcher.
- Brother, James, was a redshirt freshman quarterback on Clemson's 2016 national championship team...completed one pass for nine yards that season.
