MOST VALUABLE PLAYER

SHANE VICTORINO – 2005



Shane Victorino became the first Scranton/Wilkes-Barre player to win the International League's Most Valuable Player Award in 2005. At mid-season he was not even named to the All-Star team. However, a strong second half propelled him to the league's highest honor and a place on the post-season All-Star team. Overall he finished 6th in batting (.310), 2nd in runs (93), 1st in triples (16), 2nd in total bases (264), 5th in extra-base hits (59), 5th in slugging (.534) and 8th in OBP (.377). In addition he slugged 18 HR and drove in 70.

SHELLEY DUNCAN – 2009



Shelley Duncan was the second Scranton/Wilkes-Barre player and first Yankee to win the award for his outstanding 2009 season. Duncan established a new franchise record by clubbing 30 home runs. He led the International League in home runs, RBI (99), extra-base hits (61), runs scored (85) and total bases (247). All this despite missing 20 games due to multiple big league callups. This combined with mid-season and post-season all-star selections made Duncan's 2009 season one of the best in franchise history.

BEN GAMEL – 2016



Ben Gamel became the third Scranton/Wilkes-Barre player and first RailRider to win the award after an All-Star-caliber performance in 2016. The Neptune Beach, Fla. native owned the circuit's sixth-best batting average (.308) and finished fourth in the IL with 149 hits. He led the league with 80 runs scored to go with 26 doubles, five triples, six home runs, 51 RBI and led the team with 19 stolen bases. Gamel was the International League Rookie of the Year in 2015.

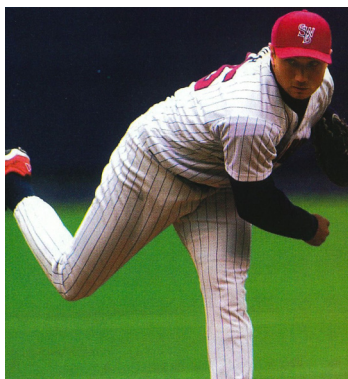
PITCHER OF THE YEAR



BRANDON DUCKWORTH – 2001

Brandon Duckworth became the first Scranton/Wilkes-Barre player to earn either of the International League's top honors. He signed with Philadelphia as a non-drafted free agent in 1997 and made his Triple-A debut four years later.

Over 22 games in 2001, including 20 starts, Duckworth went 13-2 with a 2.63 ERA. 13 wins tied him for the league lead and his 150 strikeouts were the second-most in a single Red Barons at the time, just two shy of the franchise record.



JOE ROA – 2002

Joe Roa followed Brandon Duckworth's remarkable campaign with a stellar season of his own in 2002. The right-hander was traded to Philadelphia at the end of Spring Training in 2002, ultimately appearing in 14 games for the Phillies.

His time with Scranton/Wilkes-Barre leading to the big league call was nothing short of spectacular, posting a 14-0 record over 17 starts with a 1.95 ERA. Roa struck out 74 and walked 16 over 111 innings en route to being tabbed as the league's top arm, despite going to the Majors in July and staying there the remainder of the year.



GREG WEISSERT – 2022

Greg Weissert became the third Scranton/Wilkes-Barre player and first RailRider to win the International League's top pitching honor. He was named as both the league's Pitcher of the Year as well as the top relief pitcher.

Weissert appeared in 42 games for the RailRiders in 2022, going 2-1 with 18 saves and a 1.69 ERA while striking out 70 over 48 innings pitched. The Yankees signed the right-hander to a Major League deal on August 25 and he made his big league debut that night.

In game two of a doubleheader, singles by Wes Chamberlain and Phil Geisler put runners on first and second. Chris Saunders then hit a soft liner to shortstop Desi Relaford who stepped on second doubling up Chamberlain then threw to first to complete the triple play.

SWITCH-HIT HOME RUNS

On April 23, 1998 at Rochester, Darren Burton became the first Scranton/Wilkes-Barre player to switch-hit home runs (homer from both sides of the plate) in the same game. In the third inning, he hit a solo shot off righty Joel Bennett, then in the ninth inning, he connected for a three-run blast off lefty Vince Horsman.

Andrew Velazquez homered from both sides of the plate in July 23, 2021, at PNC Field against the Rochester Red Wings. The infielder hit a right-handed home run in the fourth inning off of Red Wings left-hander Matt Tomshaw. In the sixth, Velazquez added a solo shot off righty Ronald Pena.

RETURN OF THE KING

On January 20, the New York Yankees announced that Shelley Duncan would manage the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders during the 2023 season.

Duncan played portions of three seasons with SWB from 2007 to 2009, helping the club win an International League title in 2008 before winning the league's Most Valuable Player honor in 2009.

In 2007, Duncan set a new franchise record with 25 home runs.

Two years later during his MVP campaign, Duncan set a new franchise mark with 30 home runs. His 67 career home runs with Scranton/Wilkes-Barre remain second-most in the 34-year history of the team.
