MAGIC NUMBER 2: With two games remaining in the 2024 Eastern League regular season, the Somerset Patriots lead the Portland Sea Dogs by 0.5 game and enter today with a magic number of two to clinch a second half playoff spot. As recently as August 18th, Somerset was 6.0 games back of Portland for first place. Over their last 28 games dating back to August 13, the Patriots are 20-8, outscoring opponents 134-78 (+56). Dating back to that day (series opener in Hartford), Somerset has won four straight series for the only time this season. **EARLY BIRD GETS THE WIN:** In each game this week, the team to score first has won the game. Overall this season, Somerset is 56-19 when scoring before the opposition this season.

MESSAGE ŘECEIVED: Friday night's 3-0 result marked the Patriots' 10th shutout win of the season and the second started by Zach Messinger. Over Messinger's final nine starts of the season since the All-Star break (7/19), he posted a 5-1 record with a 1.50 ERA, 1.02 WHIP and .182 BAA over 54.0 IP. He ends the regular season ranking second in the Eastern League with a 3.06 ERA, while leading the league with 150.0 IP, 1.11 WHIP and .207 BAA.

DUNHAM'S DELIVERED: Elijah Dunham opened the scoring in Friday night's win with the first of three straight run-scoring plays for Somerset. Dunham has now hit safely in all three games he's played this series, combining to go 4-for-11 with 7 RBI, 4 R, 2 HR and 1 BB.

MULTI-HIT RICH: On Thursday night, Grant Richardson collected his 32nd multi-hit game of the season, which ranks second on the team. Richardson has more multi-hit games (32) than single hit games (26) this season. Richardson has four multi-hit games over his last 10. Over his last 11 games, he is 12-for-39 (.308 BA) with 4 RBI and 6 R.

SEIGING THE BALL WELL: Over his last 21 games dating back to 8/22, Anthony Seigler is batting .318 with 7 XBH, 9 RBI, 12 R and an .880 OPS. Seigler has set career-highs this season with 12 HR, 48 RBI, 24 doubles and 28 SB, which lead the Patriots.

COACH LOCKED IN: On Friday night, Brandon Lockridge became the 43rd Somerset Patriot in franchise history to debut in the big leagues (SDP) and the 22nd to have played for the 2022 Eastern League Champion Patriots team. Lockridge was the 17th Patriot this year to make his MLB debut for 12 different teams.

GAME OF INCHES: Since the All-Star break, the Somerset Patriots are 28-18. Of their 18 losses, 16 have been decided by three runs or less. In Somserset's 46 games post-All-Star break, 33/46 have been decided by three runs or less (rercord: 18-16). Six of the Patriots' last seven losses have come by two runs or less.

BEST OF THE BABY BOMBERS: Spencer Jones and Rafael Flores enter today tied for the Yankees' minor league organizational lead with 51 XBH. Jones also leads the Yankees farm system with 77 RBI and ranks 2nd with 123 H and 212 TB, T-2nd with 6 3B, T-3rd with 29 2B, T-4th with 70 R and 5th with a .445 SLG. Flores is 1st with 213 TB and an .881 OPS, T-1st with 30 2B, 2nd with a .499 SLG, 3rd with a .281 BA, .382 OBP and 118 H, while coming in at 5th with 68 RBI and 65 BB.

Raul Dominguez enters his second consecutive season as manager for the Somerset Patriots, 10th overall as a manager and 18th coaching in the Yankees organization. He led the 2023 Patriots to a Double-A best record of 84-53 and a +211 run differential, which ranked first among all MiLB teams. Under his leadership, the Patriots finished with the Eastern League's top record in both halves of the season and clinched their second straight playoff berth. In 2023, Dominguez became the third manager in Somerset Patriots Double-A franchise history and in 2024 he will become the first to serve as manager for more than one season. Before joining Somerset, Dominguez spent the prior two seasons (2021-2022) as a defensive coach for Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre. He previously served as defensive coach for Trenton (2018-2019) and Tampa (2017). The Panama City, Panama native gained prior managerial experience with the GCL Yankees East (2016), DSL Yankees 1 (2011-15) and DSL Yankees 2 (2009-10). From 2012-2015, his teams finished at least 10 games over .500, including reaching the DSL semifinals in 2012 and 2015.

KEVIN MARTIR: Hitting Coach (1st year)

Hitting coach Kevin Martir begins his first season in Somerset and fourth in the Yankees organization, after serving in the same position for High-A Hudson Valley in 2023 and Single-A Tampa for two seasons in 2021-22. He joined the Yankees organization in 2020 and had been scheduled to serve as hitting coach for former Rookie-Advanced level Pulaski, prior to the cancellation of the minor league season. Martir began his coaching career in 2019 as a development coach for the GCL Phillies East. Martir starred at catcher during his playing career at the University of Maryland (2013-15), where he was a semi-finalist for the Johnny Bench Award in 2015. Martir was drafted by the Houston Astros in the 18th round of the 2015 MLB Draft. He played two professional seasons for the Astros with Rookie-Advanced Greeneville in 2015 and Short-Season Class-A Tri-City in 2016. A native of Brooklyn, New York, Martir graduated from the Grand Street Campus in 2012, after transferring from Xaverian High School in Brooklyn prior to his senior year.

BRETT DeGAGNE: Pitching Coach (1st year)

Pitching coach Brett DeGagne begins his first season with Somerset and fourth year in the Yankees organization. After making his organizational coaching debut as the Single-A Tampa Tarpons' pitch-ing coach in 2021, DeGagne most recently served as the FCL Yankees pitching coach in 2022 and 2023. In 2023, his staff led the Florida Complex League in strikeouts (587) and finished fourth in ERA (4.47). DeGagne was initially tabbed to be the DSL Yankees pitching coach in 2020, before the cancellation of the minor league season. DeGagne played college ball at the University of North Dakota from 2012-2016. He moved on to grad school at St. Cloud State University, where DeGagne also begal his baseful coaching career. He served as the Huskie's pitching coach during the 2017-2018 seasons. He gained additional coaching experience in 2018 as the pitching coach for the Bismarck Larks of the Northwoods League. One year prior to joining the Yankees, in 2019 DeGagne took over as pitching coach for North Iowa Area Community College.

AARON BOSSI: Defensive Coach (3rd year)

Aaron Bossi returns for his third consecutive season as the Patriots' defensive coach. Under Bossi's leadership in each of the past two seasons, infielders Jesus Bastidas (2B, 2022) and T.J. Rumfield (1B, 2023) were each awarded Rawlings Minor League Gold Gloves for their work in the field. Bossi has also overseen Somerset's baserunning program each of the last two seasons, leading the team to an Eastern League-best 205 stolen bases in 2022 and a Double-A-best 256 stolen bases in 2023. Bossi made his coaching debut as Hudson Valley's defensive coach in 2021. Prior to his coaching experience with the Yankees, he spent 2017-2019 assisting rehabbing players at the organization's minor league complex in Tampa. The St. Louis, Missouri native was signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Yankees on June 24, 2016 as a catcher/infielder. He played in 22 games for the GCL Yankees East in 2016.

2024: Broke camp with High-A Hudson Valley, where he went 6-4 with a 2.60 ERA in 17 starts, striking out 108 over 86.2 IP. Started the season by allowing 1 ER in 15 IP over his first three starts with 19 K. Pitched to a 1.77 ERA over his first eight starts, where he went 3-1 with 50 K in 40.2 IP and a 0.91 WHIP. Made a spot start for Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on 6/23 vs. BUF, where he allowed 4 ER in 1.2 IP with 3 K, 4 BB, and 3 HBP. Upon returning to High-A, pitched six more games for the Renegades before being promoted to Double-A Somerset on 8/6. At the time of his promotion to Double-A, Schlittler led the South Atlantic League with a 2.60 ERA and .191 AVG, and ranked among league leaders with a 1.13 WHIP (2nd), 82.6 IP (6th), 108 (T-2nd).

2023: Began season in extended spring training. Finished the year by splitting time between three levels, totaling a 4.11 ERA in 13 starts (14 games) with 50 K in 46 IP. After pitching in seven games for the FCL Yankees, he had a 5.68 ERA in five starts at Single-A Tampa and then a 4.76 ERA in two starts at High-A Hudson Valley.

College: Spent three seasons at Northeastern University, where he pitched to a 14-9 record and career 2.62 ERA in 182 IP with 180 K. As a redshirt freshman in 2021, Schlittler led the Huskies on the mound with an 8-1 record in 13 starts, 1.88 ERA, and 85 K's in 76.2 innings pitched, earning CAA Co-Rookie of the Year and Rookie All-American Honors. As a redshirt sophomore in 2022, he posted a 3.53 ERA in 15 starts, placing third in the CAA in strikeouts with 85. In 2019 as a freshman, got the start vs. the Boston Red Sox in the annual Huskies vs. Red Sox exhibition game at Jet Blue Park in Ft. Myers, FL to open Spring Training where he threw a shutout inning, retiring Jarren Duran, Marco Hernandez, and Rusney Castillo.

Career Notes: Selected by the Yankees in the 7th round of the 2022 MLB Draft, signing for slightly below slot value at \$205,000. Did not pitch upon signing in 2022.

Personal Notes: Played varsity basketball at Walpole HS, where he was a 3x baseball state champ. Schlittler is one of four former Northeastern Huskies in the Yankees farm system, joining INF Max Burt, RHP Thomas Balboni, RHP Sebastian Keene. The Huskies are coach by former MLB infielder Mike Glavine, brother of Hall of Fame LHP Tom Glavine. Mike played for the Mets in 2003 on top of nine minor league seasons, including a two-year stint with the Somerset Patriots in the independent Atlantic League in 2001-02. Cam's father, John, is the Police Chief in Needham, MA and played both baseball and football at D1 Stonehill College in Easton, MA.
