RHP ETHAN PECKO (2-3, 4.55) vs. RHP GABRIEL HUGHES (1-1, 7.20)

TODAY'S GAME: The Space Cowboys evened the series at a game apiece last night with a 21-8 win ... Albuquerque is expected to start Gabriel Hughes, while Ethan Pecko is slated to toe the slab for Sugar Land.

THE HIT STREAK: Ryan Ritter went 3-for-6 yesterday with a double, extending his Triple-A hit streak to 29 games—setting an Isotopes franchise record (previous: Mike Tacuhman, 28, August 12, 2016-April 9, 2017) ... Also the longest active streak in MiLB.

-During the stretch (started May 14, 2025), slashing .411/.469/.806 with 12 doubles, three triples, 11 homers and 41 RBI ... Last night was his seventh three-hit game during the streak and 17th multi-hit contest.

-Of the 12 one-hit games, has recorded a hit in his last at-bat just once (April 11, 2026) ... Has recorded a hit in his first at-bat 12 times.

-There have only been three longer hit streaks in the PCL since 2005 (Ildemaro Vargas, 35, Reno, 2018; Jake Elmore, 31, Reno, 2012; Anderson Hernandez, 30, Oklahoma City, 2011).

-Also has a 36-game on-base streak dating back to May 2, 2025.

CHAD: Chad Stevens has a 51-game Triple-A on-base streak dating back to September 11, 2025, with Salt Lake, tied for the second-longest active in all of pro ball ... Slashing .340/.426/.476 with 15 doubles, one triple, three homers, 35 RBI and 27 walks.

-Is just the 11th on-base streak of 51+ in the PCL since 2005.

-During the 51-game streak, has reached base once in 20 games ... Of those contests, reached base in last PA seven times (all in 2026: March 29, April 2, April 25 GM1, May 3, May 14-16).

-Has a 41-game Triple-A on-base streak in 2026 (every game with Albuquerque in 2026 with PA), the longest in Isotopes history (previous: 38, Joe Dillon, June 26-Aug. 8, 2005).

GEORGIA BOY: Charlie Condon went 1-for-4 with a triple and two RBI Wednesday ... Over his last nine games is slashing .343/.425/.971 with two triples, six homers, four walks and 16 RBI.

-Twenty of his 30 extra-base hits in 2026 have come in his last 25 contests ... Recorded two of his three triples in back-to-back games (first time in career with a triple in back-to-back games).

-Has 78 hard hit balls in 2026—5th-most in PCL—with an average EV of 90.4 MPH, T-8th-highest in PCL (min. 175 at bats).

VEEN, VEEN: Zac Veen went 1-for-4 last night with a walk and single to push his hit streak to 19 contests (career high), the fourth-longest active streak in MiLB.

-During the streak, he is slashing .430/.446/.848 with 11 doubles, two triples, six homers and 15 RBI, raising average from .268 to .323 ... Wednesday was his tenth game during the stretch with one hit (nine multi-hit contests).

-Second-longest hit streak by an Isotope in 2026: 22, Cole Carrigg, April 18-May 15.

-Also has a 23-game on-base streak, setting a season high (previous: 22, April 17-May 14).

-Has 77 hard hit balls—6th-most in the PCL—with an average exit velocity of 90.4 MPH, T-8th-highest in PCL (min. 175 at-bats).

EL MACHIN: Vimalael Machin went 1-for-4 yesterday with two RBI, extending his on-base streak to 17 games. During streak is slashing .313/.368/.433 with two doubles, two home runs, 15 RBI and five walks. ... Has 75 hard hit balls on the year, 7th-most in the PCL.

TRIPLE-A LEADERS: The Isotopes lead all Triple-A clubs in runs (485), RBI (453), OBP (.384), 2nd in 2B (144) & OPS (.851), 3rd in AVG (.285), hits (700) & TB (1,130) & T-4th in SB (112).

PCL LEADERS: Vimalael Machin: T-8th, hits (72) & RBI (45); 9th, OBP (.409); 10th, AVG (.320); 12th, OPS (.920); 13th, TB (115); T-14th, XBH (24); 15th, SLG (.512).

-Charlie Condon is T-3rd, HR (14) & runs (55); 5th, BB (43); T-5th, XBH (30); 8th, TB (123); 12th, SLG (.523); 11th, RBI (44) ... **Andrew Knizner** is T-12th, HR (10) ... **Drew Avans** is T-8th, SB (13) & T-13th, BB (36).

-Zac Veen is T-2nd, 2B (18); 4th, XBH (31); 5th, OPS (.971) & TB (129); 6th, SLG (.556); 6th, OBP (.415); T-6th, hits (75); 7th, AVG (.323); T-8th, RBI (45); T-8th, SB (13), T-12th, HR (10).

UP AND DOWN: Albuquerque's pitching staff has limited their opponent to two runs or fewer 14 times this season (20 times in 2026), while also allowing nine or more runs on 27 occasions.

RUNS ALLOWED: The Isotopes allowed 21 runs on the night, the most permitted since August 4, 2024, at Las Vegas (also 21).

-It was the 15th time in club history surrendering 20+ runs and the sixth time doing so twice in a season (last 2024).

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 22nd year as a minor league manager and fourth guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history and is in his sixth year overall with the club, becoming the longest-tenured coaching staff member in franchise history. Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, when the Isotopes defeated the Bees 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

CRAIG BJORNSON: Begins his first season as Isotopes pitching coach, and 27th year in the professional coaching ranks ... Was previously in the Rockies organization from 2009-11 as the pitching coach for the Casper Ghosts of the Rookie Level Pioneer League ... Most recently spent three seasons in the Braves organization as a pitching coach (Triple-A Gwinnett, 2023), roving pitching instructor (2024) and bullpen coach (Gwinnett, 2025). Was in the Major Leagues as a bullpen coach for the Houston Astros (2012, 14-17) and Boston Red Sox (2018-20) ... Won back-to-back World Series championships with the Astros in 2017 and Red Sox in 2018 ... Spent a total of 13 seasons as a Minor League pitching coach from 1999-2011 in the Montreal/Washington, Kansas City, Los Angeles (NL), and Colorado organizations. Signed as a free agent by the Astros in 1991 and pitched for parts of three seasons in their Minor League system. Attended Arizona Western Junior College where he was teammates with Pedro Lopez, and also played collegiately at Nicholls State University.

LUIS LOPEZ: Joins Albuquerque as bench coach after spending the past four seasons in the same role with the Double-A Hartford Yard Goats ... Began his coaching career as a Minor League hitting coach in the Red Sox organization from 2008-11. Was the Braves' Minor League infield coordinator from 2012-17, then managed the Gulf Coast League Tigers in 2018 and 2019. Appeared in parts of 11 MLB season from 1993-2005 with San Diego, New York (NL), Milwaukee, Baltimore and Cincinnati.

MATT SNYDER: Enters his first season in the Colorado Rockies organization as the Isotopes hitting coach ... Previously had stints in the Marlins system as hitting coach with High-A Beloit (2021-22) and Double-A Pensacola (2023) before serving as Minor League hitting coordinator in 2024. Last season, he was the hitting coach for the High-A Jersey Shore Blue Claws in the Phillies organization ... Was a 10th round pick by the Yankees in 2012 and played eight Minor League seasons with New York-AL (2012-18) and Miami (2019). Reached Triple-A with New Orleans in 2019.

CHECK-SWING CHALLENGE: Starting May 5, the Check-Swing Challenge will be used in the PCL. In addition to being able to challenge ball/strike calls, players will also be able to challenge the umpire's call of swing or no-swing. A batter will be judged to have offered at a pitch when the bat head gets ahead of the knob and creates an angle greater than 45 degrees. The 45-degree threshold allows umpires to use the baselines as a visible point of reference.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the fourth-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 21) will host the second half winner (beginning June 23) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 26. The Isotopes have not reached the playoffs since 2012, tied with Charlotte for the second-longest drought among all 30 Triple-A teams. Only Louisville has gone longer without reaching the postseason, as they last qualified in 2010.

- Selected in the first round (10th overall pick) by Colorado in the 2022 MLB Draft

- Participated in the MLB Draft Combine at Petco Park in the summer of 2022
- Played collegiately at the University of Gonzaga (2020-22), compiling a 3.05 ERA on the mound across parts of three seasons (30 appearances, 26 starts)
- Ranked ninth in the country with 138 strikeouts during the 2022 season with Gonzaga
- Selected to play for the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team in 2022
- Garnered Collegiate Baseball Freshman All-American and WCC All-Conference Freshman honors in 2021, awarded West Coast Conference Player of the Week on two occasions
- Was a two-way player at Gonzaga in 2020 and 2021, starting 31 games at first base as a redshirt freshman
- Broke a knuckle after being hit by a pitch in 2021, ending his season ... dropped hitting and playing the field heading into the 2022 campaign

- Made fifth start for Albuquerque (seventh appearance) on June 12 at Tacoma and earned first win of the year (first Triple-A start since April 29) ... Spun 5.0 shutout frames and allowed just one hit and one walk with four punchouts ... Retired first eight batters faced ... Lone hit was a groundball single to shortstop ... Had 1-2-3 fourth and fifth innings ... Did not allow a ball out of the infield ... Induced 10 groundouts (doubleplay) with an overall average exit velocity of 77.2 MPH
