Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send LHP **Logan Allen** to the mound tonight, making his first start since a one-day stint with Cleveland (DH vs. Pittsburgh on 7/18). The Saints will counter with RHP **Ryan Gallagher**. Columbus is 40-29 (.580) versus right handers this year. Gallagher has pitched against the Clippers once in his career, taking the loss on 5/16 in St. Paul (4.0IP, 7H, 7R, 7ER, 2BB, 7K).

vs. the Saints

Columbus went 4-2 against the Saints in Minnesota last year, on the way to a 9-7 series record, and has won 49 of the last 80 overall opposing the Saints (435-347 run differential; 14 of 31 losses by a single run, only 11 losses by more than two runs). Individually, **Angel Genao** has hit .314 (11x35) with 3HR and 10RBI in 9G against St. Paul in his career (**Kahlil Watson** has 4HR and 14RBI in 12G).

Outliers

The Clippers reached 50 wins on 7/10, having done so with negative differentials in runs (-28; of nine teams with at least 50 wins, only team in the red, all others at least +23 and averaging +48), homers (-9, all others average +17) and hits (-26, others average +42; St. Paul brings up the rear, -46). In the second half, Columbus is being outscored 133-111 and outthomered 38-24.

Ingle is Back

In 9G since his option, **Cooper Ingle** is 15x37 (.405), drawing 6BB (.488OBP) with 6XBH (1HR, .622SLG). Last night's 4x5 performance pushed his season average over .300, while also qualifying him for rate statistics, as he is one of two players in the IL, along with Iowa's **BJ Murray**, hitting .300/.400/.500. At catcher, Ingle has a 1.301OPS (11HR) in 33G (.627OPS and 2HR in 26G between DH and LF).

Angel Ascendant

Over his last 27G, since 6/18, **Angel Genao** leads the IL in hitting (.392, 38x97), OBP (.500) and walks (22), while ranking 2nd with a 1.088OPS. He owns an 18% walk rate in that time (122PA; 8% in first 35G with Columbus) and his 7K yield a 6% rate (21% in first 35G). Wednesday's strikeout snapped a 40PA streak without (50PA with 0K from 6/23-7/3) and he has not had a multi-K game since 5/31.

Watson Walks Waning

Kahlil Watson is returned to Columbus for his 100th career game as a Clipper last night, following a month-long stay in the Majors (hit safely in last 6G with Cleveland, 7x20). Watson started the season with 30BB in his first 31G (2nd in the IL through 5/9), but he has just 7BB in his last 26G with Columbus (15G without, 5/10-5/29). While in Cleveland, Watson had only 3BB in 27G, but also had 9SB.

Brito Piling Up Numbers

Tonight will mark **Juan Brito**'s 250th career game in a Columbus uniform (55th to reach 250, **George Valera** became the 54th earlier this year). Last night saw his 65th double (tied with **Yandy Diaz** for 20th most) and he is just 3RBI from 150 (37 Clippers have reached 150, with Valera sitting at 149). Brito's 158BB are 20th most (Valera is 18th at 160), but he has only 5BB in his last 56PA (9%).

Swing It

Since Independence Day, **Bo Naylor** is hitting .296 (14x47) with a beefy .532SLG (7XBH, including a 1st-inning grand slam on 7/9 at Lehigh Valley; was 1x19 with a triple in 6G prior). Nearly half of his hits this season have gone for extra bases (16 of 33) and, while his .355OBP is 2nd among Clippers since his arrival on 5/27, he has drawn just 1BB in the last 11G (45PA; had 24BB in first 28G, 121PA).

Serious Growth

Kody Huff clubbed his 13th homer of the season on Tuesday, equaling his total from the last two seasons combined. Having already also established career bests in runs, triples, RBI and walks, Huff is a steal away from breaking a tie for his personal best there and he is 11 hits away from a career high (82 with Akron in 2024). His .894OPS stands as 11th best in the IL (.682OPS in MiLB career prior).

Rare Company

Dating to the nightcap vs. Scranton/WB on 6/19, **Milan Tolentino** is 24x80 (.300) in his last 25G, collecting 12XBH (.563SLG) and 15RBI (was 5x39, .128, in 13G prior). Over his last 18G, Tolentino has drawn 16BB to 14K (67PA; 8BB and 42K in previous 33G, 114PA). He is one of 10 in the IL with at least a dozen HR and SB, along with **Kahlil Watson** (Columbus and Omaha are only teams with two).

This Date in Clipper History

7/24/2005

Anthony Slosser, then the Clippers Media Intern, made the trip to Indianapolis with the team and was selected to compete in the Red Gold Target Throw contest after the 7th inning, in which he took home \$100 for his accurate throw. That sparked a 6-run rally for Columbus in the top of the 8th, as the Clippers would prevail, 7-1. Mike Vento had a 2-run double in the 8th and Melky Cabrera chipped in a 2-run single.

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,458 to 1,401).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 142-116 (.550) in pitch reviews, with batters going 74-74 (.500) and pitchers/catchers going 68-42 (.618). They have run out of challenges in 41G and have not challenged in 4G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .571), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 800, would rank as 6th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 115 through 98G (on pace for 175SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 31CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the 4th most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (47; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 150 runs while crafting a .909OPS (nearly 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 78 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +72 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 232-143 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 79 grand slams and 1,961RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.40 through the first 98G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up only 189HR (average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 6th in the IL this year (.981), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 54G this season (31-23, .574), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 3rd most last at bat wins this year (14, one off the lead) while playing in the 2nd most games decided in the last at bat (26, Memphis has 28). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 100G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 48-52 (.480, 16th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 437-453 (.491), 407-407 with Columbus (.500).
