NEWS AND NOTES

FIRST HALF RECAP: The Sounds ended the first half 4-3-32 and in third place in the International League behind Memphis (47-28) and Rochester (45-28). Since moving to the split season format in 2023, the Sounds remain one of just two teams in Triple-A to post a winning record in all seven halves along with Oklahoma City who finished 41-33 and in third place in the Pacific Coast League. The Brewers farm system posted the fourth-most wins of any organization through June 21 with 187 wins. The Sounds ended with the fourth-best ERA in Triple-A (4.23) and the fewest amount of runs allowed (328). The 54 home runs allowed by Nashville pitchers were the second fewest in Triple-A behind Sacramento (48). Offensively, Nashville had the third fewest strikeouts (584) at the plate in Triple-A behind Sacramento (494) and Las Vegas (562). The Sounds ranked sixth in triples (20), stolen bases (118), and walks (37), and led all Triple-A in hit by pitches (58).

NUKE ADAMS: Luke Adams became the eighth Nashville player to record a 3-HR game in franchise history in Sunday's series finale against Memphis. The Brewers no. 11-rated prospect is the first to do it since Matt Chapman did it September 3, 2016 at New Orleans. He joined Dan Pasqua as the other Sounds player to record a 3-HR game against Memphis; Pasqua recorded his on September 3, 1984. Sunday was not only the first 3-HR game of Adams' career, but it was also the first multi-HR game as a professional (324 games). He

is the 10th Triple-A player to record a 3+ homer game this season, joining Memphis' Joshua Baez (4 HR, 6/16 vs. NAS) and Columbus' Cooper Ingle (3 HR, 6/18 vs. SWB) to accomplish the feat last week. Adams also set a career-high with 5-RBI with his performance Sunday, recording all five RBI via home runs and tied his career-high with three hits. It was his first 3-hit game since May 10, 2025 with Double-A Biloxi. His seven home runs in June are tied for the most in the Brewers' farm system and he ranks second in OPS (1.230), SLG (.760), XBH (9), total bases (38), and runs (15) this month.

BID-YOU-BADDOO: Akil Baddoo recorded a new single-game career-high with seven RBI on Saturday night against the Redbirds. His old career-high lasted just one game after knocking in six on Wednesday night. His seven RBI performance on Saturday included his second grand slam of the series after not recording a grand slam in his first 503 career minor league games. He is one of just 11 Sounds in franchise history to record 7+ RBI in a game and the first since Mario Feliciano had seven on September 4, 2022 vs. Memphis. Drew Denson is the only player in franchise history to have multiple 7+ RBI games when he did so May 13, 1993 at Buffalo and again on August 28, 1993 vs. Omaha. Baddoo is one of nine Triple-A players to record 7+ RBI game this season and one of 27 in the minors overall. His 25 RBI in the month of June are tied for the fourth-most in the minors and sits one shy from tying for the 10th-most

RBI in any single month for a Nashville player since 1998. Chad Hermansen recorded 33 RBI in July 1999, to set the record in a single month dating back to when the Sounds joined the Pacific Coast League in 1998. Baddoo has recorded five of his six total multi-RBI games this season over his last eight games. Since appearing in his first game with Nashville on May 15, Baddoo leads the team in RBI (28), SLG (.600), OPS (.992), XBH (11), total bases (48), and is tied for the team lead in HR (7). He ranks second in AVG (.275), OBP (.392), and ranks third in walks (16).

BLACK-JACK: Tyler Black recorded his sixth career leadoff home run on Saturday night and first since April 28, 2024, on the road in Louisville. Three of his six career leadoff home runs have come with Nashville. It was the fourth leadoff home run of the season for Nashville. It was his second home run of the season with Nashville and first since March 31 vs. Charlotte and ended a 40-game homerless drought. Black went 3-for-5 on the night, adding a triple to give him his first 3-hit game since recording his first career MLB 3-hit game with Milwaukee on April 28 vs. Arizona and first multi-hit game overall since June 4 on the road in Jacksonville. Since making his professional debut in 2021, he ranks first triples (25) and walks (282) in the Brewers farm system and is second in runs (284). He also ranks third in XBH (143) and stolen bases (123), and is fourth in RBI (234) and total bases (660), and ranks fifth in hits (405).
