## TODAY'S HEADLINES

**LAST TIME OUT:** The Saints gave up a franchise-record 20 runs as their 11-game win streak came to a close in a 20-9 loss to Toledo on Sunday. The Mud Hens hit seven long balls, the most the Saints have given up as the Twins' Triple-A affiliate. The Mud Hens scored three in the first inning on Louie Varland, who allowed a career-high 12 runs, a franchise record for a Saints starter. The Saints briefly took a 5-3 lead in the first inning, collecting five hits, three of which were doubles. However the Mud Hens poured in on from there, plating five more in the second, four in the third and seven in the fourth, taking a 19-5 lead. The Saints answered with three in the fourth inning on a Matt Wallner RBI single and Jair Camargo triple. The Saints got one more run in the sixth on a fielder's choice but could not dig themselves out of the hole in the loss.

**SAY HELLO TO THE SECOND HALF:** Today marks the official beginning of the second half of the Triple-A season. The Saints finished the first half 38-36, tied for second place in the IL-West. The Saints went 41-33 in the second half in 2023, 6.5 games behind Durham. Today also marks a new era of rules in the International League, where the Challenge System will be used for every game and the number of incorrect challenges drops from three down to two.

**SAINTS AND I-CUBS:** This week marks the seventh six-game series that the Saints and Iowa Cubs have played in Principal Park, the most the Saints have played at any road venue since 2021. The Saints are 19-17 all-time in Des Moines, their second-best record of any road venue they have played at least two series (Louisville Slugger Field: 23-13).

**WRAPPING UP SUNDAY:** The Saints set franchise records on Sunday, allowing a record 20 runs, seven long balls, allowing 20 hits for the third time in franchise history. Louie Varland was tagged for 12 runs, the most allowed by a Saints starter since 2021, also giving up five homers, the most by a Saints starter.

**WALLNER WARMING UP:** In his 19 June games, Matt Wallner has hit .333/.400/.790 sporting a 1.190 OPS. He's hit a league-high 11 home runs in his this month, averaging a 94.3 mph exit velocity and owns a .457 ISO in that span. He's also the league leader in June in RBI (25), total bases (64) and extra-base hits (15).

Wallner's 11 home runs in June are the most for any Triple-A player in any month this season and tied for the most of any minor league player in any month in 2024. Wallner is the 18<sup>th</sup> IL batter since 2021 to hit 10 home runs in a month and just the second Saint to accomplish the feat, joining Chris Williams, who hit 10 home runs in June of 2023.

**LEE'S LOCKED IN:** Brooks Lee has made his presence known in a hurry since returning to the Saints lineup. Over his last 10 games, Lee is hitting .391 (18-for-46), collecting hits in nine of those 10 games, hitting four doubles, four home runs, owning a 1.168 OPS. **LOVING THE LONG BALL:** The Saints have found their knack for hitting home runs over the last three weeks, hitting 42 of their 97 (43%) of their home runs since May 29, a span of 22 games. In that stretch, 65 of the 129 (50%) runs the clubs has scored have come as a result of a home run. The 42 home runs the Saints have hit in that time are the second-most in Triple-A, trailing Lehigh Valley's 45.

**GO, DIEGO, GO!** Diego A. Castillo has surged again over his last 19 games, hitting .371 (23-62) with six doubles and three home runs with a 1.100 OPS. Over that 19-game span, Castillo has walked 14 times and struck out only eight times.

**SUMMERTIME SEVERINO:** In Yunior Severino's 26 games since May 21, he has hit .396 (36-for-91), with eight home runs, drawing 23 walks to 26 strikeouts, owning a 1.203 OPS. His average exit velocity over that stretch is 93.1 mph, up from his season average of 89.7 mph. In June, Severino leads the IL in batting average (.446), on-base percentage, sporting a .587 clip and second in OPS, at 1.337. His 18 June walks are tied for the third-most in the league.

**TWINS UPDATE:** The Twins were off yesterday as they traveled to Arizona to take on the Diamondbacks tonight at 8:40 CT. Joe Ryan (5-5, 3.13) will square off against Brandon Pfaadt (3-6, 4.37) in the first of a three-game series against the defending National League champs.

**LAST APPEARANCE:** 6/18 v TOL...made fifth start of the season in a rain-shortened game...allowing four runs on seven hits, allowing one home run, walking two and striking two out...surrendered leadoff single in the first inning that came around to score on a Jace Jung double...five of seven hits allowed came in the first two innings...allowed two run double to Parker Meadows in the second inning...retired nine of 10 batters before allowing a solo home run to Eddy Leonard in the sixth inning before the rain came...game was called with one out in the top of the sixth inning with a 1-1 count on Justice Bigbie...became the first Saints pitcher to throw a complete game...received second win in 5-4 Saints victory.

**APPEARANCE PRIOR:** 6/12 @ LOU...made fourth start of the season, throwing a season-high 5.2 innings, allowing one run on five hits, walking none and striking out five...retired the side in the first inning before allowing a leadoff double in the second, then retiring the next five batters...worked around a pair of two-out singles in the third inning...retired seven of final eight batters...did not record an out on the ground after the second out of the second inning...received first Triple-A win since May 29, 2019 at Norfolk while pitching for Columbus in 7-2 Saints victory.

**FROM THE TWINS TO THE TWINS:** The last 2 seasons for Plutko have been spent in the KBO, where he has dominated for the LG Twins, going 26-8 between the 2022 and 2023 seasons. After signing for \$500,000 in 2022, he went 15-5 in his first season, re-signing for \$1.4 million in 2023. He followed that campaign with a season that saw him go 11-3, but did not make it to the championship series due to a hip injury.

**REMEMBER THE PAC 12:** Plutko finished his career as one of the best pitchers in program history at UCLA, where he finished his three-year stint there with second-most wins (29), starts (52) and IP (351.1) in school history. His career ERA of 2.25 and 272 career strikeouts both rank 7th on UCLA's all-time lists. His sister, Sara, was a three-year soccer letterwinner at University of Oregon and his wife, Allison, was a four-year gymnast at UCLA and was on same team as gold medalist Carly Patterson.

**LEAVE A MESSAGE AFTER THE TONE:** When he was promoted to Triple-A Columbus (Cleveland organization) in September, 2021 he missed the phone call from Cleveland's Director of Player Personnel Carter Hawkins because he was at a friend's wedding. They had just got done saying, "I Do" and got done taking the bridal party photos. Got a call from Cleveland and he put it straight to voice mail. When the call came again his wife Allison prodded him to answer because it could be important, so he did.

**NOT PERFECT, BUT STILL PRETTY GOOD:** On June 2, 2018, Plutko was spinning a gem with Columbus, not allowing a baserunner until the ninth inning at Syracuse when he issued a one-out walk. He followed that with a fly out and a strikeout to finish off the no-hitter. It was just the ninth complete-game no-hitter in the IL since 2005. It continued a stellar stretch for Plutko, who took a no-hitter into the sixth just two starts prior with Cleveland against the Chicago Cubs
