Today's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Austin Peterson** to the mound today, in the final tuneup before the games count for real on Tuesday. Scranton/WB will counter with RHP **Brendan Beck**. Columbus is 35-18 (.660) versus right handers this year. Beck has pitched against the Clippers once in his career, dominating with a quality start on Tuesday (W, 6.0IP, 3H, 1R, 1ER, 0BB, 9K).

vs. the RailRiders

Since a 14 game win streak over the RailRiders from 4/24/13-8/9/14, the Clippers have gone 20-25 against Scranton/WB (4-2 in last series played, 2023 in Huntington Park). Prior to Tuesday, no active Clippers had ever played against the RailRiders (**George Valera** played in the 2023 series, but is currently on waivers; **Kolby Allard** had pitched 3G, but was released on Monday).

Funday

From 9/1/24-4/12/26, Columbus was 8-24 on Sundays, posting the worst winning percentage in MiLB (.250). However, the Clippers are 9-1 in the last 10G on Sunday (won eight straight). On the season, Columbus is a combined 19-6 on Saturday and Sunday, having won on both days six times (each of last three weekends). If this trend continues, a win today puts Columbus at 4-0-6 in the last 10 series.

After You

Last night's win boosted the Clipper record to 21-19 when allowing the opponents to score first (.525, best in the IL), while also serving as the 27th comeback win of the year (most in the IL, +5 on 2nd). Last season, Columbus was 20-54 when the bad guys plated the first run (.270, 18th), while collecting a measly 28 comeback wins (2nd fewest). At home, the Clippers are 14-8 when giving up the first run.

Close-ing the Gap

Columbus has won six straight 1-run games and eight of the last nine, improving to 10-7 (.588, 4th in the IL). In addition, the Clippers have gone 15-5 in the last 20G with a margin of three or fewer (29-19, .604, 3rd best). Over the last 30G, in which the Clippers are 20-10, they have a +7 run margin (160-153). On the year, Columbus is at -8 (14th; all other IL teams with at least 40 wins average +58).

Getting There

Cooper Ingle reached the qualification level for rate statistics in the IL on 6/7 and his current .432OBP ranks 2nd in the IL. Ingle has slumped to a .312OBP over the last 20G (19x80, .234, 10BB, 22K), but since his Triple-A debut on 8/13/25, he has the best OBP in the IL (.415, +7 points on 2nd place). As a catcher, Ingle has a 1.293OPS (11HR) in 31G (.474OPS and 1HR in 16G between DH and LF).

Struggling Slugging

CJ Kayfus snapped a 119AB homerless streak with Columbus on Friday, doing so out of the third spot in the order. The #3 hitter for Columbus has 8HR this year, with only the cleanup man and ninth batter hitting fewer (7; **Ralph Velazquez** has batted cleanup in all 24G he has played, 1HR in 93AB). The most powerful spots for the Clippers have been leadoff (16) and second (12).

Run Production

Kody Huff tied a career high with his 47th RBI last night (59G, had 47RBI in 101G last season), while embiggening his career high for homers (10). He scored his 43rd and 44th runs (one off career best, 45 in 98G with Akron in 2024) thanks to the bomb and 3BB (37BB in 242PA this year, 15%; 37BB in 407PA last year, 9%). Since 5/3, Huff has 25BB to only 17K in 32G (12BB and 24K in first 27G).

Four for Frias

Dayan Frias has a hit in each of his last 4G (4x13), while scoring in each (also had 5RBI over first 3G of streak). The hit streak is the longest since a 5G run from 4/28-5/3 (7x18). Frias has been a relatively hot hitter in Huntington Park, posting a .630OPS in 24G (.439OPS in 24G on the road). His start on the infield today will be his first since 5/17 (played once as a defensive replacement, 6/6).

Out(field) of Position

Columbus will be starting a pair of first basemen in the outfield today (**Ralph Velazquez** making 26th career appearance in left, **CJ Kayfus** playing his 84th game in the grass). **Dom Nunez** is set to play his 27th career game at first (all with Columbus, 12th this year), freeing up **Kody Huff** to play behind the dish (second game at catcher in last 20; 98% of games at catcher from 2022-25).

This Date in Clipper History

6/21/1983

Homers by **Barry Evans, Steve Balboni, Rowland Office** and **Matt Winters** lifted the Clippers to a 13-5 win over Charleston. The 1983 Clippers were the highest scoring team in franchise history (898 runs), knocking a then-record 182 balls out of the park (surpassed in 2019, now 4th). They failed to reach the playoffs, however, as the pitching staff set a club record for worst ERA (5.08; surpassed in 2021, now 3rd).

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers are 41-32 and will finish with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,446 to 1,395).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 105-91 (.536) in pitch reviews, with batters going 54-62 (.466) and pitchers/catchers going 51-29 (.638). They have run out of challenges in 35G and have not challenged in 3G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 4-3 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 54-36 when playing past regulation (.600, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 90G to require extra play, 71 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to easily top 800 again, with an outside chance to establish a new team high (on pace for 839, would rank as 4th most all-time; 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 94 through the first 73G (on pace for 192SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 24CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the 3rd most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (49; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 115 runs while crafting a .942OPS (over 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 49 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +66 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 185-120 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 78 grand slams and 1,945RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.36 through the first 73G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). However, the staff is pacing to give up only 173HR (average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 10th in the IL this year (.979), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 38G this season (25-13, .658), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

Milan Tolentino bunted the winning run into scoring position in an extra-inning win at Indianapolis on 6/14. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 88-23 (.793) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 5-2 mark this season (.714, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 2nd most last at bat wins this year (12, Syracuse at 13) while playing in the 2nd most games decided in the last at bat (20; Scranton/WB has played 21). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 94G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 46-48 (.489, 15th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 427-438 (.494), 397-392 with Columbus (.503).
