



FOLLOW THE LEADER

Manager Chris Widger enters his first season at the helm of the Naturals, after previous stops in *Advanced Rookie* Burlington (2019) and *High-A* Quad Cities (2021) managing Royals affiliates.

- 18 of the Naturals' 28 active players played for Widger with the Quad Cities River Bandits last season.
- 9 of the Naturals' 28 active players played under Widger with the Burlington Royals, then in Quad Cities and now in Northwest Arkansas: **Dante Biasi, Jonah Dipoto, Maikel Garcia, Jake Means, Noah Murdock, Zack Phillips, Logan Porter, John Rave** and **Ángel Zerpa**.

EXTREME ENDS OF THE SPECTRUM

When looking at the Naturals' numbers one game to the next, it appears rather black and white with what leads to a win or loss.

- When scoring seven runs or more, the Naturals are 29-5, while when scoring six runs or less, just 7-38.
- The Naturals are 23-10 when recording 10 hits or more, but when they get nine hits or less, are just 13-33.
- The Naturals are 33-11 when out-hitting their opponent or hits are tied, but 3-32 when out-hit by their opponent.
- When the Naturals score first, they are 22-13, whereas 14-30 when the opponent scores first.

ONE RUN GOES A LONG WAY

The Naturals are 4-17 in one-run games this season, meaning 17 of their 43 losses (39.3%) this season have been decided by just one run.

- The Naturals have had the tying run at the plate or on base in 18 losses this season (including 13 of their one-run losses).
- In three games this season (4/26, 7/1 & 7/2), the Naturals have entered the last inning trailing Amarillo by five runs, proceeded to score four runs and put the tying run on and either bring the winning run to the plate or put it on base, but failed to tie the game or win.

Yo, YOU WANNA SEE SOME REAL SPEED?

Through 79 games, the Naturals have stolen *113 bases in 134 attempts* (average 1.43 steals/game, 84.3% success rate).

- 113 steals ranks second in the Texas League, fourth in Double-A and tied 20th in the Minors.
- Maikel Garcia's** 27 steals (in 30 attempts) ranks second in the Texas League and fourth among all Double-A hitters/basestealers.
- The Naturals have stolen at least one base in 54 of 79 games this season (68.3%), including 29 games with two or more steals ... the team stole a season-high six bases on July 6 vs. Tulsa with a pair of five-steal games as well this season.
- The Naturals have pulled off a double steal 15 times, meaning 30 of 113 steals this year (26.5%) have come on a double-steal.
- Naturals players have stolen multiple bases in a game 14 times, SIX of those occasions being Maikel Garcia ... Tucker Bradley had the first three-steal game of the season (and of his career) on July 9 vs. Tulsa.

PUSHIN P(ORTER)

Catcher **Logan Porter** has quietly flown under the radar as one of the top hitters in the Royals system so far in 2022.

- Among full-season Minor League hitters, Porter ranks *FIFTH in on-base percentage (.447)* and third among all Double-A hitters in OBP ... in the Texas League, he is third in OBP and seventh in OPS (.922).
- Among qualified Royals minor league hitters, Porter's .447 OBP is the highest on-base percentage in the system, while he ranks third in OPS, fourth batting average and seventh in slugging percentage (.475) ... his 47 walks are second in the system, behind Nick Pratto's 49.
- Porter has reached base in 53 of 59 games he's played this season (89.8%), with hits in 49 of 59 and 18 multi-hit games, nine of which came in May.
- Porter's 17-game on-base streak between May 31 and June 23 is tied with Robbie Glendinning for the longest on the team this season, a stretch where he hit .321 (17-for-53) with 15 walks and a .493 on-base percentage.

ROCKIN' ROBBIE

After slumping for much of June, first baseman Robbie Glendinning has begun to heat back up in the last two weeks.

- Friday the Western Australian's 11-game hitting streak came to an end, a stretch during which he collected 9 multi-hit games, including four straight to start the streak and five straight to start the month of July ... between June 24 and July 6, Robbie hit .468 (22-for-47) with five doubles, seven home runs and a 1.549 OPS, including homers in his last four games at Amarillo.
- His four-game homer streak, featuring five long balls, is just the fifth four-game homer streak in Naturals history and the second last week, after Nick Loftin opened the week with a four-game home run streak.
- In July, Glendinning is hitting .375 (12-for-32) with SEVEN extra-base hits and 10 runs batted in ... his 29 total bases are the most in the Texas League this month, while 12 hits and 10 RBI are tied for the second-most.
- He has reached base in 61 of 68 games he's played this season (89.7%), reaching multiple times in 34 games this season ... he has hits in 46 of 68 games, including 23 multi-hit games this season, which is tied with Maikel Garcia for the most among Naturals hitters ... 21 of his multi-hit games are two-hit games and a pair of three-hit games, both coming during his recent hitting streak.

GAR-SEE YA ON BASE

Shortstop **Maikel Garcia** has reached base in 62 of the 72 games he has played in this season (86.11%), reaching base multiple times on a team-best 41 occasions, including a team-best 23 multi-hit games.

- In 348 plate appearances, the Venezuelan has reached base 125 times (86 hits + 39 walks), for a .362 on-base percentage.
- Garcia has walked 39 times and struck out 60 times, a 0.65 K/BB rate that ranks third among Royals minor league hitters with at least 300 plate appearances.
- The shortstop is second in the Texas League in steals (27), tied for the second-most hits (87) and third in doubles (23), while tied fifth in runs scored (57) ... among all Double-A hitters, he ranks tied second in hits, fourth in steals, tied fifth in runs scored and seventh in doubles.
- Maikel's 23 doubles are tied for the most among all Royals Minor League hitters, while he ranks second in the organization with 86 hits, 27 steals and 57 runs scored ... he ranks tied fifth in the system in walks (39), tied sixth in extra-base hits (27) and total bases (120) and seventh in batting average (.283).
- His 14-game hitting streak between April 27 and May 12 is the longest on the Naturals this year, tied for the 15th-longest in club history and tied for the second-longest in the Texas League this season ... in those 14 games, he hit .397 (23-for-58) with six doubles and a .970 OPS.

TYLER, THE CREATOR (OF RUNS)

Naturals outfielder Tyler Gentry is as hot as they come, with a great series last week in Amarillo and a fantastic start to his Double-A career.

- Last night, Gentry snapped a 10-game hitting streak, where he hit .474 (18-for-38) between June 26 and July 8 with three doubles, four home runs and 13 runs batted in, and seven walks as well, for a 1.400 OPS.
- The 10-game hitting streak was the longest of his career, topping a pair of seven-game streaks he had this season in High-A with Quad Cities, his first seven games and last seven games with River Bandits.
- Over his first 20 games at the Double-A level since joining the Naturals June 14, Gentry is batting .342 (26-for-76) with five doubles, seven home runs and 21 runs batted, over one RBI per game and a 1.095 OPS.
- He has hits in 14 of his first 20 games with the Naturals and has reached base in 17 of 20 games.
- Gentry is the Royals' organization leader in batting average (.338), slugging percentage (.578) and OPS (1.004), while ranking second in on-base percentage (.426) behind Naturals teammate Logan Porter (.447) ... his 12 total home runs and 44 runs batted in between Quad Cities and Northwest Arkansas are both eighth.
- He ranks *THIRD among all qualified hitters in batting average*, while 14th in OPS.

Pitchers of the Month (1)

May: LHP Drew Parrish ... started five games and went 3-1 with a 0.59 ERA (2 ER in 30.2 IP) ... only allowed 15 hits and four walks, while striking out 29 opposing hitters ... among qualified Texas League pitchers, threw the most innings and had the lowest ERA and WHIP (0.62), while holding opponents to a .144 average.

Players of the Week (3)

- April 25 to May 1: 2B Michael Massey** ... hit .417 (10-for-28) across six games with a league-best 19 total bases and nine runs batted in, while tied for the Texas League lead with 10 hits. His 1.221 OPS ranked third among players with at least 20 at-bats, while his .417 average tied for second among that same group.
- May 23 to May 29: 2B Michael Massey** ... hit a league-best .481 (13-for-27) across six games in Midland, while tied for the league lead with 19 total bases. He drove in nine runs as well, doubling three times with one home run, a go-ahead grand slam on May 24 and collected multiple hits in each of the first five games of the series.
- June 27 to July 3: OF Tyler Gentry** ... hit .435 (10-for-23) with two doubles, four home runs and 11 runs batted in, which was tied for the most in the league. Recorded 24 total bases with a 1.043 slugging percentage 1.543 OPS.

Pitchers of the Week (3)

- May 2 to May 8: LHP Drew Parrish** ... threw 7.0 scoreless innings on May 7 @ Springfield ... held the Cardinals to just two hits and one walk while striking out four. He retired the first eight he faced and the final five, with five 1-2-3 frames.
- May 9 to May 15: LHP Drew Parrish** ... threw 7.0 scoreless innings on May 13 vs. Wichita ... held the Wind Surge to just three hits and no walks while striking out nine. Between the second and sixth innings, he retired 13 straight batters, retiring the side 1-2-3 in the first inning, as well as the third through sixth.
- June 6 to June 12: LHP Anthony Veneziano** ... threw 7.0 scoreless innings in a complete-game shutout on June 9 @ Tulsa ... held the Drillers to just three hits and one walk while striking out five, on 79 pitches. Retired the final eight hitters he faced and 11 of the last 12, only needing five pitches for a 1-2-3 seventh inning to end the night.

- Derrick Lewis is in his third season with the Royals' organization and second as pitching coach at Northwest Arkansas.
- He spent the previous 16 seasons in the Atlanta Braves' organization, the first 14 as a Minor League pitching coach and the last two as the Pitching Coordinator.

#6 ABRAHAM NÚÑEZ • HITTING COACH

- Abraham Núñez enters his fourth season as Northwest Arkansas' hitting coach after serving in the same capacity with High-A Wilmington (2015-2018), Class-A Lexington (2014), Rookie Advanced Burlington (2013) and the Dominican Royals (2012).
- Núñez played for parts of 12 seasons in the Majors with the Pirates (1997-2004), Cardinals (2005), Phillies (2006-2007) and Mets (2008). - Christian Colón returns to the organization as the Naturals Assistant Hitting Coach in 2022, following a 12-year professional career.
- He was the Royals first-round pick in the 2010 MLB Draft, scored the winning run in the 2014 AL Wild Card game and had the game-winning hit in the title-clinching Game 5 of the 2015 World Series.
- After being drafted in 2010, Colón ascended to Northwest Arkansas by 2011 and between 2011, 2012 and 2014, played 202 games for the Naturals ... in 2011, Colón led the Texas League in sacrifices (21), while leading the team in at-bats (491) and hits (126). His 21 sacrifices that season are the most a Naturals player has ever recorded in a single season, while 28 overall are tied for the club record.
- During his playing career, he made stops in Miami (2017) and Cincinnati (2019-20) ... spent 2021 with the Rich Baseball-owned Buffalo Bisons (Triple-A, Toronto) before announcing his retirement.
- He also played in parts of four seasons in the Puerto Rican Winter League.
- Christian lives in Cave Springs, Ark. (15 minutes North of Arvest Ballpark) with his wife, Kayla, and three daughters, Marley, Mia and Lucy.



#23 MIKE JIRSCHOLE • BENCH COACH

- Mike Jirschele enters his first season as the Bench Coach for Northwest Arkansas after spending last season in the same role for Manager Chris Widger in Quad Cities.
- He served as a Special Assistant to the General Manager in 2020 and was on the Royals coaching staff as the Third Base Coach from 2014-19 and won the World Series in 2015.
- Jirschele previously managed the Triple-A Omaha franchise for 11 seasons (2003-13), leading the team to four division titles, three-straight trips to the Pacific Coast League championship round (2011-13), two PCL titles (2011, 2013) and a Triple-A Championship in 2013.
- He earned the 2011 Mike Coolbaugh Award for outstanding baseball work ethic, knowledge of the game and skill in mentoring young players on the field.
- Prior to his 11-year stint with Omaha, he served as the Royals Minor League Infield Coordinator for four years (1998-2002), while he held managerial positions with Omaha (1995-97), Wilmington (1994), Rockford (1993) and the Gulf Coast Royals (1992).
- Jirschele was originally selected by the Texas Rangers in the fifth round of the 1977 MLB Draft and played in 999 minor league games over 13-plus seasons in the Rangers and Royals systems.

- Danny Accola is entering his seventh season with the Royals organization and first as the certified athletic trainer with the Naturals, after serving in the same role with the Quad Cities in 2021.
- He was slated to serve in that role with Wilmington in 2020 and previously filled those roles with Lexington in 2019, Burlington from 2017-18 and with Surprise in 2016.
- Accola graduated from the University of Central Missouri in 2014 and previously held an athletic training internship with the Denver Broncos in 2013.

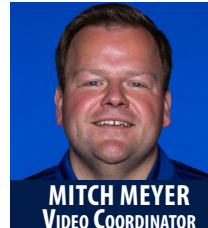
