May 21: Senators 2, RubberDucks 1: Joe Lampe launched a home run, but Harrisburg would keep the Akron offense quiet the rest of the way to take the opener.

Top arms by the numbers: The RubberDucks pitching staff is among the best in baseball. Akron's pitching staff has a 2.54 ERA, 378 strikeouts over 346.2 innings pitched in its first 39 games of the season. The Ducks rank first in the Eastern League in ERA, wins, innings pitched, shutouts (8) and average against (.206). Akron ranks second in the Eastern League in strikeouts and WHIP (1.17).

Must be the flow: Aaron Davenport has been incredible to start his Double-A career. The right-hander is 3-0 with a 1.66 ERA and 39 strikeouts over 43.1 innings. Davenport ranks among the best in the Eastern League in ERA (first), starts (tied first-8), winning percentage (first-1.000), WHIP (fifth-1.02) and average against (eight-.196).

Grand Slam Frias: Two of **Dayan Frias'** three home runs this season have been grand slams. The Ducks infielder launched his first on April 10 in Richmond and second one on May 17 at Canal Park. Frias is the first Duck to hit multiple slams in a season since Bo Naylor in 2021.

Dominating Doug: Doug Nihzazy has been lights out in 2024. Through his first two starts of the season, the left-hander allowed just one hit over 10 innings while striking out 13. He earned Eastern League Pitcher of the Week honors for striking out eight over five one-hit innings against Richmond on April 11. After a stint on the injured list kept him off the mound until May 5, Nihzazy has continued to pitch well. Over three starts back off the injured list (first one was rain shortened), Nihzazy has tossed eight innings allowing just four hits while striking out 12.

Magical Mace: Tommy Mace's first full season in Akron is off to a great start. The right-hander leads the team in wins (5) and innings pitched (46.1). Across all of Double-A, Mace ranks among the leaders in wins (second), innings pitched (first), ERA (seventh-1.94), WHIP (seventh-0.93) and winning percentage (sixth-.883). To add to his impressive season, Mace tossed 7.2 innings against Altoona on May 17, which marked the longest start by a RubberDuck since Sean Brady in 2018.

Tolentino's Top Play: Milan Tolentino won MiLB Premier Plays Play of the Week after his impressive sliding catch against Altoona on Tuesday, April 23. Tolentino picked up the win in the fan vote with 73% of the vote. Tolentino's play then moved on to the [Play of the Month](#) voting where the Ducks infielder won with 80% of the vote.

RubberDucks travel to Senators: Akron and Harrisburg will face off for the first of three series this season, and the first at FNB Field. The two clubs split the 2023 season series 9-9. Top prospects in this series include:

Throwing up zeros: The Akron pitching staff leads all of baseball in shutouts this season with eight. The RubberDucks have tossed a shutout in at least one game in six of the seven series they've played this season. The four road shutouts by the RubberDucks staff is tied for second in all baseball behind their parent club the Cleveland Guardians (five road shutouts).

Terrific Torres: Lenny Torres Jr. has been untouchable to start the 2024 season. The RubberDucks reliever has not allowed a run in his 11 games (13 innings). In that span, Torres Jr. has saved four games (third most in Eastern League) and stuck out 18.

Halpin Hitting Streak: Petey Halpin went on an 11-game hitting streak from April 30-May 14. During the streak, Halpin hit .271 (13-for-48) with two home runs, two doubles and eight RBI. This was the longest hitting streak by a RubberDucks hitter this season and the second hitting streak of 2024 for Halpin of more than five game after he opened the season picking up a hit in each of his first eight games.

RubberDucks streak by the numbers: The RubberDucks won 10 games in a row from April 21-May 2. The streak was tied for third longest streak in franchise history and included the club's first six game series sweep of an opponent (Altoona 4/23-28). During the 10-game winning streak, the RubberDucks held opponents to a .191 batting average and just 24 runs while striking out 89 over 90 innings. Akron hitters during the streak picked up 79 hits including nine home runs and 16 doubles. The RubberDucks scored 49 runs during the streak.

Former RubberDucks make MLB debuts: Rouglas Odor (Akron manager 2019-2023) and **Brad Goldberg** (Akron pitching coach 2023) each made their MLB coaching debuts on Opening Day 2024. **Cade Smith** (2022-23) made his MLB debut in 2024 for the Guardians striking out five over two scoreless innings against the A's. **Chris Roller** (2021-22) made his MLB debut for the Milwaukee Brewers on May 15. **Johnathan Rodriguez** (2022-23) made his MLB debut for the Guardians on May 21 against the Mets.

On Injured list from 4/17-5/5 with left oblique strain.

2023

- Led team in strikeouts with 128.
- Best month was July where he went 1-1 in four starts with a 1.89 ERA and 21 K over 19 innings pitched.
- Entered the 2023 season as Cleveland's No. 30 prospect by MLB Pipeline.

2022

- Ranked as Cleveland's No. 28 prospect by MLB Pipeline.
- Came within a strike of a seven-inning no-hitter in Game 1 of a July 9 doubleheader in Fort Wayne, but he got a no-decision in a 3-2, eight-inning loss.
- Through his final High-A start, his 118 strikeouts ranked ninth in the Midwest League, and his 21 starts ranked tied for sixth.
- Promoted to Akron Aug. 29 and made three Double-A starts.
- Pitched 4.2 scoreless innings at Harrisburg on Sept. 9, allowing just one hit with nine strikeouts, as part of a combined 5-0, one-hit shutout.

College:

- Posted a 12-2 record with a 2.45 ERA in 16 games/15 starts at Ole Miss in 2021 (92.0IP, 62H, 25ER, 31BB, 142SO).
- Earned First Team All-American honors from ABCA/Rawlings, Baseball America, Collegiate Baseball, NCBWA and D1Baseball.
- Set an Ole Miss record for single-season wins (12) and finished second in program history for single-season strikeouts (142, fifth in NCAA), behind Lance Lynn's 146 in 2007.
- In 2021, he was a finalist for the C Spire Ferriss Trophy (awarded to the top collegiate baseball player in the state of Mississippi) and a semifinalist for the Golden Spikes Award.
- Was the second Ole Miss pitcher drafted in 2021, as RHP Gunnar Hoglund was drafted in the first round (No. 19 overall) by Toronto, which traded Hoglund to Oakland in the Matt Chapman deal in March 2022.
- Concluded his three-year college career with a 24-6 mark and a 2.81 ERA in 40 games/33 starts (204.2IP, 149H, 64ER, 73BB, 259SO).
- Recorded a one-hit shutout vs. Mississippi State and set an Ole Miss single-game record with 16 SO vs. Florida State at the Oxford Regional.
- Was a member of the Team USA Baseball Collegiate National Team in 2019
- Set an Ole Miss freshman record with 86 SO (previously 81 by Jeff Calhoun in 1977 and Drew Pomeranz in 2008) in 89.2 innings, earning Freshman All-American honors in 2019.
- Major in political science.

Amateur:

- Lettered all four years, playing right field and pitching, at West Orange High in Windermere, FL, under head coach Jessie Marlo.
- Was a two-time district champion in 2016 and 2017 that included a trip to the state final four in 2017.
- Was a member of the USA Baseball team in 2015.
- Was the student body president at West Orange High, a national debater, and a coordinator of West Orange dance marathon that raised \$80,000 for a children's miracle network.

2024 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

#26 Manager Greg DiCenzo enters his fourth season with the Guardians organization. The 2024 season will be DiCenzo's first as RubberDucks manager, and third as a manager in the Guardians organization. He becomes the 19th manager in Akron franchise history (since 1989).

Prior to becoming Triple-A Columbus' bench coach in 2023, DiCenzo spent the 2021 and 2022 seasons as the manager in High-A Lake County. He guided the Captains to a 141-108 record in his two seasons including a Midwest League finals appearance in 2022.

A native of Duxbury, MA, DiCenzo was the head baseball coach at Holy Cross for 12 seasons prior to joining the Cleveland organization. The Crusaders went 137-109 in Patriot League play during his tenure, including a 2017 Patriot League Championship, and posted 20-win seasons in 10 of those 12 years.

#38 Hitting Coach Jordan Becker enters his fifth season with the Guardians and first with the RubberDucks. In 2023, Becker served as the hitting coach for Lake County.

Becker joined the Cleveland organization in 2019 after a collegiate coaching career that saw stops at Riverside Community College and New Mexico State University.

#50 Assistant Hitting Coach Amanda Kamekona enters her second year with the Guardians organization and first season with [Akron](#). Kamekona spent 2023 as the hitting development coach on the Arizona Complex Academy staff.

Kamekona is the first female on-the-field coach in RubberDucks history. She played professional softball on the PFX Tour from 2010-2011 and the NPF tour from 2011-2019 where she was a three-time National Champion. Kamekona started her coaching career as an assistant softball coach at Limestone College before becoming the head softball coach at Brevard College. She also has head coaching stops at Bishop Amat High School and CA Bombers Fastpitch.

#49 Pitching Coach Cody Buckel enters his sixth season in the Guardians organization and first season with the RubberDucks. Prior to coming to Akron, Buckel was the pitching strategist for the Columbus Clippers for the 2022 and 2023 seasons.

After starting his coaching career as a pitching coach in the Seattle Mariners organization, Buckel has spent time in the both the dugout and front office for Cleveland serving as the pitching resource coordinator and assistant director of pitching development before joining the Clippers field staff in 2022.

#32 Assistant Pitching Coach Michael Poole enters his second season in the Guardians organization and first season with the RubberDucks. Prior to joining the RubberDucks, Poole was the pitching development coach on the Arizona Complex Academy staff.

A native of Akron, Poole played at Cuyahoga Community College and Lake Erie College before starting his coaching career at Inspiration Academy (FL) in 2019. Poole was an assistant coach at LSU-Eunice for the Bengals D2 JUCO World Series Championship season in 2021.

#28 Bench Coach Kyle Lindquist enters his fifth season in the Guardians organization and first season in Akron. Prior to coming to Akron, Lindquist spent 2023 as the bench coach for Lake County.

A native of Columbus, Lindquist played at Marietta College (Ohio) and was a three-time All-OAC selection, 2012 All-American and member of the back-to-back National Championship teams in 2011 and 2012. After starting his coaching career at Marietta, Lindquist spent five seasons as an assistant coach at Denison University and one season at Davidson before joining the Cleveland organization.

#45 Bullpen Coach Seth Caddell enters his first season as a coach in the Guardians organization after spending the last three seasons as a catcher in the Cleveland organization. Signed out of East Carolina, Caddell last played for the RubberDucks in 2023.

Athletic Trainer Derrik Diaz enters his seventh season in the Guardians organization and first season with the RubberDucks. Prior to coming to Akron, Diaz served as the head athletic trainer for the Dominican Republic Complex in 2023. Named the 2021 PBATS Athletic Trainer of the Year for the Dominican Summer League. Also serves as the Assistant DR Medical Coordinator.

Assistant Athletic Trainer Karina Gonzalez enters her second season in the Guardians organization and first season in [Akron](#). Prior to joining the RubberDucks, Gonzalez served as an athletic trainer at the Arizona Complex. Gonzalez graduated from Sonoma State University (CA) in 2012 with a degree in kinesiology and earned a Master's degree in athletic training from Thomas Jefferson University (PA) in 2020. She earned a doctorate in athletic training from Indiana State University in 2022.

Strength and Conditioning Coach Mo Cuevas enters his ninth season with the Guardians organization and second season in Akron. Prior to joining the RubberDucks, Cuevas served as the rehab strength and conditioning coach in 2022. Earned a Bachelors and Master's degree in Exercise Science at East Stroudsburg University.

Tech Assistant Henry Haracz enters his first season in Akron after spending last season in Lake County.

We Are the RubberDucks

On October 29, 2013, team owner **Ken Babby** stood before a capacity audience at the Akron Civic Theater and announced that the team would be known henceforth as the **Akron RubberDucks**. In addition to being symbolic of the fun, family-friendly brand of entertainment offered by minor league baseball, the name also honors Akron's long history as the "**Rubber Capital of the World.**" Brandiose Marketing of San Diego, California designed the team logo, colors, and various marks and insignias. Please note that for print coverage, *RubberDucks* is spelled as one word with a capital "D." In broadcast coverage, referring to the team as "*the 'Ducks*" is an acceptable variation of the team's nickname.
