Syracuse Mets RHP Jonah Tong vs. Worcester Red Sox LHP Jake Bennett

March Madness - The sixth edition of the Worcester Red Sox take the field at Polar Park this afternoon for Opening Day against the Syracuse Mets at 4:05 pm as the WooSox celebrate their 5th Anniversary season in 2026. (Polar Park opened on May 11, 2021). The game is live on NESN (beginning with a one hour pre-game show at 3:00 pm) and can be heard on NASH 98.9 FM and the rest of the WooSox Radio Network. March 27 marks the earliest date a Red Sox Triple-A franchise has ever started a season. It is one day earlier than last year at this time when the WooSox lost their 2025 season-opener on March 28 (also vs. Syracuse) here at Polar Park, 4-3. For those inquiring minds, the proposed 2027 International League schedule has the WooSox (God-willing) beginning the season even a day earlier than today on Friday, March 26, 2027 at a site and time to be determined. Today's opener comes exactly 186 days since the WooSox concluded their 2025 season with a 9-8 win over Rochester last September 21 here at Polar Park.

Next Year is Here – But before we look ahead to 2027, let's enjoy the 178 days and 150 regular-season games that make up the WooSox '26 schedule. Worcester's home (and regular-season) finale will come before we know it...exactly 25 weeks from this Sunday on Sunday afternoon, September 20 vs. Durham at 1:05 pm. This season, for the fourth year in a row and the fourth time ever, the IL will again invoke a split season with the first half starting today and ending on June 21 (first 75 games) while the second half will run from June 23 – September 20 (the final 75 games). The first half winner in the overall league standings will host the winner of the second half in a best 2 out of 3 series from September 22-24 for the IL Championship. The winner will play the Pacific Coast League champ in the Triple-A National Championship Game in Las Vegas on September 26 in a winner-take-all showdown.

A Winning Tradition – The 2025 Worcester Red Sox went 76-73 to post a winning season for the fifth time in as many years of existence (and for the fourth year in a row under returning WooSox manager Chad Tracy). Worcester finished 41-33 during the first half last year and then 35-40 in the second half. Overall the 2025 WooSox went 40-34 at home compared to 36-39 on the road. The Pawtucket Red Sox posted five straight winning seasons just once in their 47 years as Boston's Triple-A affiliate – that coming from 1996-2000.

How the WooSox Have Won - The 2021 WooSox had a 74-54 record during their abbreviated inaugural season, the 2022 WooSox finished 75-73, the 2023 club posted a 79-68 mark, the 2024 team matched that win total going 79-71, and as mentioned the 2025 squad went 76-73. Add it all up and the WooSox are 383-339 all-time for a .530 winning pct. including a 195-168 record at home compared to a 188-171 mark on the road.

Fun Fact – Of the 260 players who have played for the Worcester Red Sox in their 5-year history (through the 2025 season), 190 of them have played in the Major Leagues (73%) including 136 with the Boston Red Sox (52%).

Opening Weekend – The WooSox and Mets play today and tomorrow both at 4:05 pm and Sunday at 1:05 pm in the series (and homestand) finale. This is one of only two 3-game sets the WooSox will play all season - the other comes right after the All-Star break when the Sox travel to Scranton/Wilkes-Barre for a 3-game series from July 17-19. Besides those two 3-game series, Worcester's other 24 series this season will all be 6-game sets. Each of those 6-game series will start on a Tuesday evening and will end on a Sunday afternoon.

We Met Again – Worcester and Syracuse (or at least a facsimile of these two teams) met on Opening Day of 2025 here at Polar Park on March 28 with Syracuse winning, 4-3. Including today, the Mets have provided the opposition for four of the six WooSox home openers in their history (2021, 2023, 2025, and now 2026) with the WooSox winning two of the first three.

Pitching In – Today’s season opener features an intriguing pitching matchup as 25-year-old lefty **Jake Bennett** makes his Red Sox organizational debut against one of the Mets top pitching prospects in 22-year-old righty **Jonah Tong**. Bennett was acquired by the Red Sox last December 15th in a trade with Washington that sent one of Boston’s top pitching prospects (Luis Peralta) to the Nationals.

Bennett posted a 2.27 ERA (19 ER in 75.1 IP) with 64 strikeouts and just 19 walks in 19 games (18 starts) across three levels in the Nationals system in 2025. The 6’6”, 234 lbs. southpaw returned from Tommy John surgery in September of 2023 to make 2 rehab starts for Fredericksburg (A) last May, then 7 starts for Wilmington (A+) going 1-2, 1.90, and 10 more games (9 starts) for Harrisburg (AA) where he went 1-2 with a 2.56 ERA. After the season he appeared in 5 games for the Scottsdale Scorpions in the Arizona Fall League.

Selected by the Washington Nationals in the second round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Oklahoma, the Oklahoma native enters 2026 ranked as the Red Sox No. 6 prospect by *Baseball America*.

Tong, who was named Minor League Pitching Prospect of the Year by MLB Pipeline last season, pitched at three levels in the Mets system last year going from Double-A Binghamton (8-5, 1.59 in 20 starts) to Triple-A Syracuse (2-0, 0.00 in 2 starts) to the New York Mets where he did struggle a bit going 2-3 with a 7.71 ERA in 5 starts. The Canadian native was born in Markham, Ontario and has a full name of Jonah Reid Tin Chee Matthew Tong.

Rocket Roger – Roger Clemens will make his official Polar Park debut today (although rumor has it Roger attended a game in 2024 to watch his son Kody play for Lehigh Valley) as the Boston Red Sox Hall of Famer - and should be Baseball Hall of Famer in the opinion of many - will take part in special Opening Day pre-game ceremonies today and then meet fans in the Sherwood’s Diner from approximately the 3rd – 6th innings.

Roger Clemens had a stellar 24-year Major League career that saw him become one of the most dominant pitchers in Major League Baseball history. Clemens won a record seven Cy Young Awards, one American League MVP Award, was an 11-time All-Star, and a two-time World Series champion. He pitched for Boston (1984-1996), Toronto (1997-98), the Yankees (1999-2003 & 2007), and Houston (2004-06) amassing 354 wins (ninth-most in MLB history) with a 3.12 ERA and 4,672 strikeouts (third-most all-time) in 709 games. He is the only pitcher in MLB history to record over 350 wins and strike out over 4,500 batters.

Nicknamed “Rocket”, he burst on the Boston scene in 1986 when he went 24-4 with a 2.48 ERA to lead MLB in wins (something he would do four times during his career) and ERA (which he would do seven times). He began that 1986 season with 14 consecutive victories (the most wins to start a season in Red Sox history). And on April 29, 1986, he became the first pitcher in history to strike out 20 batters in a nine-inning game when he beat Seattle at Fenway Park. His catcher that night was fellow Red Sox Hall of Famer and current WooSox hitting coach, Rich Gedman. Roger would duplicate that feat in 1996 when he struck out 20 batters in a game at Detroit (with Bill Haselman as his catcher)

Clemens’ historic 1986 season earned him a host of honors including the All-Star Game MVP, the American League MVP, and the first of his seven Cy Young Awards while leading the Red Sox to a berth in the World Series where they would lose to the New York Mets in seven games.

Clemens ended his Red Sox career tied with the immortal Cy Young for both most victories in franchise-history (192) and most shutouts in Red Sox history (38). Clemens is still Boston’s all-time strikeout leader with 2,590. He was inducted in the Boston Red Sox Hall of Fame in 2014.

After the 1996 season, he would sign with Toronto and in 1997 and 1998 he would win the pitching triple crown and the Cy Young in both of his seasons with the Blue Jays. Clemens was traded to the New York Yankees before the 1999 season and he won World Series titles with the Yankees in both 1999 and 2000. In 2001, he became the first pitcher in MLB history to start a season 20-1. He would finish 20-3 for the Yankees and earn his sixth Cy Young.

Clemens, now 63-years-old, announced his retirement early in the 2003 season, however, he came out of “retirement” in January of 2004 when he signed with his adopted hometown Houston Astros. Amazingly, at the age of 42, he became the oldest pitcher to ever win the Cy Young going 18-4 with a 2.98 for the 2004 Astros. Nearing the end of his incredible career he posted the lowest ERA of his then-22-years in the big leagues when he finished with a 1.87 in 32 starts for Houston in 2005.

Roger unexpectedly returned from his second “retirement” (following the 2006 season with Houston) when he rejoined the Yankees in June of 2007. On July 2, 2007 he notched his 350th win to become one of only three pitchers to pitch his entire career in the live-ball era and reach 350 wins.

Roger and his wife Debbie have four sons...Koby, a former coach in the Houston Astros system, Kory, Kacy, and Kody, who played for the Minnesota Twins in 2025.

The “Real” Rocket Man - Robert Goddard, the "father of modern rocketry," was born at Maple Hill in Worcester on October 5, 1882. He earned his undergraduate degree in physics from Worcester Polytechnic Institute and his doctorate at Clark University where he also later taught. Modern rocketry began 100 years ago last week (March 16, 1926), in a snowy field just south of Worcester in Auburn, MA when Clark University professor Robert Goddard fired up a rocket nicknamed “Nell,” powered by a blend of gasoline and liquid oxygen. It went 41 feet into the air and 184 feet sideways, and it changed the world. Goddard had built the first liquid-fueled rocket.

“Goddard had developed pretty much all the basic ingredients that modern rockets have,” Nikolaos Gatsonis, professor of aerospace engineering at WPI, told The Boston Globe “from the metered and controlled combustion, but also gyroscopes and controllability of the rockets, also turbo pumps for managing propellants.”

Opening the Door to Home – The WooSox are 3-2 all-time in their first five home openers at Polar Park. The WooSox defeated Syracuse, 8-5 in the first-ever game at Polar Park on May 11, 2021 behind two HR from Jarren Duran and the first-ever Sox HR at Polar Park by Marcus Wilson. Worcester routed Lehigh Valley on April 12, 2022 Opening Day at Polar Park, 8-3 thanks to a 477-foot HR by Triston Casas. The WooSox rolled over Syracuse, 11-2 on March 31, 2023 getting homeruns from David Hamilton, Greg Allen, and Daniel Palka and a strong rehab start from Garrett Whitlock. The Sox suffered their first defeat during a home opener on April 2, 2024, a day that began with the passing of legendary WooSox owner and Red Sox Hall of Famer, Larry Lucchino, and ended with a 2-0 loss to Buffalo in 10-innings. Last season, on March 28, Syracuse edged the WooSox, 4-3 in a game played in 56 degree temperatures at the start.

Opening Acts – The WooSox are 2-3 on Opening Day in their brief history. Worcester opened on the road each of their first two years of existence. The WooSox lost their first game in franchise-history on May 4, 2021 against Buffalo in Trenton, NJ, 6-1. Worcester won in Jacksonville, 6-5 on April 5, 2022 to begin the '22 campaign. On March 31, 2023 the WooSox opened at home for the first time and they routed Syracuse, 11-2. On March 29, 2024 at Lehigh Valley, the WooSox gave up 7 runs in the bottom of the 9th-inning - including what was originally a walk-off grand slam but became a walk-off 3-run HR after a baserunning miscue - to suffer a stunning, 7-4 defeat. And last year on March 28, the Sox were edged by the Mets, 4-3 here at Polar Park. For what it's worth, the Pawtucket Red Sox won 12 of their last 14 Opening Days in their history from 2006-2019.

The Road Ahead – The WooSox will fly to the Midwest during this coming Monday's off-day when they make their second-ever trip to the State of Minnesota. Worcester will face the St. Paul Saints (AAA-Minnesota Twins) for 6-games beginning Tuesday through Friday nights all at 7:37 pm and then next weekend on Saturday and Easter Sunday at 3:07 pm. (All game times in St. Paul are Eastern Daylight Time). The club will fly back to Boston on Monday morning, April 6 as part of their usual Monday off-day, and then start their first extended series at home on Tuesday, April 7 at 6:05 pm with the opener of 6-game set against the Columbus Clippers (AAA-Cleveland) that will last from April 7-12.

Broadcast News - The WooSox will have all of their 150 games this season broadcast on the WooSox Radio Network, led by flagship Nash Icon 98.9 FM along with several other stations along the Network. Jim Cain and Alex Jensen call all the action on radio for all road games and many home games. Cooper Boardman, Mike Antonellis, and Jay Burnham also handle radio duties during home games. The full WooSox Radio Network: 98.9 FM **NASH ICON** in Worcester, 100.1 FM **THE PIKE** in Worcester, 105.3 FM/1280 AM **WPKZ** in Fitchburg, 101.3 FM/1490 AM **WMRC** in Milford, and 1380 AM **WNRI** in Woonsocket, RI.

Lights, Camera, Action - All 75 home games at Polar Park will once again be televised on **NESN** or **NESN+**. NESN will be live from Polar Park this afternoon at 3:00 pm with a one hour pre-game show prior to first pitch at 4:05 pm. Cain and Jensen will be the lead team on NESN while former Major League General Manager and WooSox Hall of Famer JP Riccardi will return as the main color analyst. Boardman, Antonellis, and Burnham will also appear on NESN telecasts. Natalie Noury will handle the majority of pre-game, in-game, and post-game field reporting duties once again this year while Nicole Menner will fill-in on occasion.

A Trace of History - The second manager in Worcester Red Sox history, Chad Tracy has led the WooSox to winning seasons in each of his first four years at the helm of the WooSox to become the first Red Sox Triple-A manager to accomplish that feat dating back to at least the 1930's. Known affectionately as "Trace", he returns for his fifth season as WooSox manager in 2026. Tracy earned the 300th victory of his Worcester managerial career on August 31, 2025 in Durham. He has a 309-285 record since taking over as WooSox manager for the 2022 season. Chad became the sixth manager in modern Red Sox organizational history to reach the 300-win plateau with a Red Sox Triple-A affiliate. Joe Morgan is the all-time leader with 601 wins in his nine years as Pawtucket Red Sox manager (1974-82). "Trace" also had 176 wins in three years as a Minor League manager in the Los Angeles Angels' system from 2015-17 giving him a total of 485 career managerial wins entering the 2026 season. Tracy, 40, has sent a number of Worcester players to Boston during his tenure including, most recently, OF Roman Anthony, INF Marcelo Mayer, and LHPs Connelly Early & Payton Tolle who all earned their first-ever promotions to Boston during the 2025 season. Other past or current Red Sox who have played for Tracy in Worcester include: OF Wilyer Abreu, RHP Brayan Bello, INF/OF Kristian Campbell, 1B Triston Casas, RHP Kutter Crawford, OF Jarren Duran, INF Romy Gonzalez, RHP Tanner Houck, OF Ceddanne Rafaela, INF Nick Sogard, and catcher Connor Wong among several others.

Roster Roulette – Of the 28 active players on the Worcester Opening Day Roster, 13 appeared for the WooSox last season (7 pitchers and 6 position players). Four players on this year's Opening Day Roster were also on last season's Opening Day Roster...reliever Jacob Webb, infielders Nathan Hickey & Nick Sogard, and outfielder Nate Eaton. Furthermore, two members of this year's Opening Day Roster were on both the 2024 & 2025 WooSox Opening Day Rosters...Sogard and Hickey. Sogard (at 3B), Hickey (as DH), and Eaton (as CF) were in the WooSox Opening Day starting lineup last March 28th. In addition, only eight members of Worcester's 2025 closing day roster last September 21 are on their Opening Day roster today...pitchers Jack Anderson, Wyatt Olds, Noah Song, Tyler Uberstine, and Jacob Webb along with infielders Nathan Hickey and Mikey Romero, and outfielder Kristian Campbell.

More Roster Notes - 6 of the 15 pitchers and 8 of the 13 position players on the current roster have appeared in the Major Leagues including 6 with the Boston Red Sox. The list...pitchers Tayron Guerrero, Kyle Keller, Zach Kelly (Red Sox), Seth Martinez, Devin Sweet, and Payton Tolle (Red Sox), catchers Jason Delay, Mickey Gasper (Red Sox), and Matt Thaiss, infielders Vinny Capra, Tsung-Che Cheng, and Nick Sogard (Red Sox), and outfielders Kristian Campbell (Red Sox) and Nate Eaton (Red Sox).

Proud Alumni – Of the 26 active players on the 2026 undefeated Boston Red Sox Opening Day Roster, a total of 13 have played for Worcester. Wilyer Abreu, Roman Anthony, Brayan Bello, Jarren Duran, Connelly Early, Marcelo Mayer, Ceddanne Rafaela, Justin Slaten, Trevor Story, Greg Weissert, Garrett Whitlock, Connor Wong, and Masataka Yoshida are all former WooSox.

Last Season vs. Syracuse – The WooSox lost the 2025 season-series to Syracuse by an 11-10 margin going 6-6 vs. the Mets here at Polar Park and finishing 4-5 in Syracuse.

All-Time vs. Syracuse - Pawtucket/Worcester leads the all-time series over Syracuse by a 491-475 count.
