### ABOUT LAST NIGHT...

In a tightly contested pitcher's duel delayed one hour and 20 minutes by rain, the Tampa Tarpons walked off the Dunedin Blue Jays 2-1 in the 9th inning on Tuesday night in their series opener. Jackson Lovich opened the game with a single and later scored on a Willy Montero RBI knock to give Tampa a 1-0 lead in the 1st, but Blue Jays starter Brayden Heidel settled in from there, retiring the final 11 batters he faced without allowing a hit. JoJo Parker tied the game in the 4th with a solo homer, his third professional long ball, and the contest remained deadlocked behind dominant bullpen work from both sides. Jack Nedrow impressed in his Blue Jays debut, firing four shutout innings in relief to keep the game even entering the 9th. With two outs in the bottom of the 9th and the winning run standing 90 feet away, Lovich delivered the decisive blow, scorching a 104 MPH line drive into left field for a walk-off single to seal Tampa's 2-1 victory.

### BLUE BIRD BLUES

The Blue Jays went 4-8 over their two week homestand, taking two of six in each of their sets against the Jupiter Hammerheads and Bradenton Marauders.

The Blue Jays are 3-8 over their last 11 games, and 4-14 over their last 18 games since April 22. Dunedin bats and are hitting just .173 with a .566 OPS over that span.

Dunedin has slipped from an 8-6 record on April 18, when they sat in second place and two games back, to last place in the FSL West. The stretch mirrors their toughest run of 2025, when they went 2-12 from May 20 to June 1, including a seven-game losing streak that dropped them from first to fourth place.

### COME BACK LIKE A BOOMERANG

Blue Jays No. 2 prospect JoJo Parker launched his third professional homer on Tuesday, a solo blast in the 4th at 109.2 MPH/406 ft. Parker went on a seven-game hit streak in mid-April, capping it off with his first professional home run on April 14. He then scuffled a bit from Mid-April until last week's series vs. Bradenton, when the 19-year-old went 6-for-17 (.353) with two doubles and three RBI.

### QUICK NOTES...

- The Blue Jays and Tarpons will play 24 meetings across four series' in 2026.
- Dunedin owned the 2025 season series over Tampa 14-10. In their first meeting of the season, Dunedin took 5-of-6 from Tampa in Tampa, and in their second go around, Tampa took 5-of-6 from Dunedin in Dunedin. 16 of their 24 meetings last year were decided by three runs or fewer.
- Tampa split a six-game set with Ft. Myers at Hammond Stadium last week.

### LICOURT IS IN SESSION

OF Yorman Licourt played hero in both of Dunedin's wins last week vs. Bradenton

In Sunday's series finale, Licourt gave the Blue Jays a 2-1 lead in the 2nd inning with a two-run blast for his team-leading sixth homer of the season. His two-run shot was his third homer in his last six games.

In Thursday's 9-6 Blue Jay win, Licourt went 3-for-4 with a season-high five RBI, falling a triple shy of the cycle. Licourt smacked an RBI single in the 1st, launched a three-run homer in the 3rd, and added an RBI double in the 7th. All three of his hits left the bat at 105+ MPH (109.1, 108.8, 105.9). His five RBI on Thursday are the most in a game by a Blue Jay this season, and most since JR Freethy's five RBI on 4/13/25 @JUP.

### BLAINE'S WORLD

It was a strong homestand for Blue Jays No. 15 prospect Blaine Bullard, highlighted by a walk-off RBI single in the 10th inning on May 2nd vs. JUP.

Bullard went 11-for-38 (.289) over the two-week homestand with 2 2B, 5 RBI and 8 SB. He also recorded a pair of outfield assists.

The Jays had just two prospects steal over 20 bases last year. Bullard had 16 over an 11 game stretch earlier this season, and leads the organization.

# 2026 DUNEDIN BLUE JAYS COACHING STAFF

## Ryan Casteel | Manager Year with Toronto: 1 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Chattanooga, TN

Casteel makes his managerial debut in 2026, joining the Blue Jays organization after a 14-year professional playing career. Casteel spent time in the Colorado Rockies, Seattle Mariners, and Atlanta Braves farm systems, while also playing winter ball in Australia and Puerto Rico. A four-time minor league All-Star, he was named Australian Baseball League MVP in 2013 after earning California League Catcher of the Year honors that summer with the Mariners' High-A Modesto Nuts. Casteel spent parts of six seasons at the Triple-A level, including the final four years of his career with the Gwinnett Strippers. After being placed on the Gwinnett Development List for much of the 2024 season, Casteel was activated for a July series against Jacksonville and delivered a ninth-inning, walk-off home run on July 12 in his first game in nearly two months, lifting the Strippers to a 7-6 win after entering as a late-game defensive replacement. Two days later, on July 14, he announced his retirement following a nearly 900-game minor league career. Casteel immediately transitioned into a coaching role with Gwinnett and served as a coach with the FCL Braves in 2025 before stepping into his first managerial role. Was Arizona Fall League teammates with Blue Jays Farm Director Joe Sclafani in 2014 for the Salt River Rafterers on a team that won the AFL Championship and also included Byron Buxton, Trevor Story, Taylor Rogers, Max Kepler, and Tyler Heineman.

## Brett Kennedy | Pitching Coach Year with Toronto: 2 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Galloway, NJ

Kennedy enters his first season as Dunedin's Pitching Coach and second with the Blue Jays organization after leading the Complex League Champion FCL Blue Jays pitching staff in 2025. Kennedy enjoyed a nine-year professional playing career, including MLB service time with the San Diego Padres in 2018 and the Cincinnati Reds in 2023. A Fordham University graduate, Kennedy takes over for fellow Ram Cory Riordan, who was named the Blue Jays' Pitching Coordinator after three seasons in Dunedin.

## Nash Knight | Hitting Coach Year with Toronto: 3 | Year with D-Jays: 3 | Born: Denton, TX

Knight returns for his third season as Dunedin's Hitting Coach. Under Knight's guidance in 2025, Dunedin ranked among the Florida State League's top offensive clubs, finishing fourth in batting average (.244) and home runs (85), second in slugging percentage (.371), and third in OPS (.716). Through the first 46 games of the 2025 season, the Blue Jays led the league in home runs (41), on-base percentage (.368), slugging percentage (.416), OPS (.784), and runs scored (292). Eight position players earned their first promotions to High-A in 2025 under Knight, including JR Freethy, who reached Double-A by season's end. The Denton, Texas native spent six seasons as a player in the Blue Jays organization from 2015–2021, reaching the Triple-A level. He also spent time with the Rangers and Twins in his final season on the diamond 2022. A Dallas Baptist University product, Knight hit .245/.350/.352 while playing in 556 career minor league games. Knight suited up for Dunedin in parts of two seasons, playing 105 career games at TD Ballpark in his career, notably playing all nine positions in a game on Sep. 2, 2018 for a team managed by Casey Candaele. Was a member of 2017 FSL Co-Champion Dunedin team which was managed by current Toronto skipper John Schneider and included future big leaguers including Vladimir Guererro Jr, Bo Bichette, Lourdes Gurriel Jr, Jordan Romano, and Ryan Borucki. Majored in kinesiology at DBU. Brother, Austin, has coached at DBU, Texas A&M, and most recently coached in the Mariners organization.

## Ashley Stephenson | Bench Coach Year with Toronto: 4 | Year with D-Jays: 2 | Born: Mississauga, ON.

Stephenson returns for her second season on Dunedin's coaching staff and fourth with the Blue Jays organization. Stephenson spent the 2025 season as a Position Coach for Dunedin, primarily working with the outfielders. She spent the prior two seasons in the same role with the High-A Vancouver Canadians, where she helped guide the club to a Northwest League championship in 2023. Inducted into the Canadian Baseball Hall of Fame in 2024, Stephenson has enjoyed a storied multi-sport career. She starred collegiately in hockey at Wilfrid Laurier University, winning four conference titles and a CIS National Championship before playing professionally in both the National Women's Hockey League and Canadian Women's Hockey League. On the diamond, Stephenson represented Canada's women's national baseball team from 2004–2018, earning two Team MVP honors, an All-Star selection at third base at the 2008 IBAF World Cup, and the 2011 Baseball Canada Jimmy Rattlesnake Award, which was later renamed in her honor. In 2022, she became the first woman to manage a Canadian national baseball team, leading her squad to two victories over Team USA in the Friendship Series, before joining the Blue Jays organization.

## Andy Fermin | Position Coach Year with Toronto: 9 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Cleveland, OH.

Fermin joins the Dunedin staff as a Position Coach in his first season with the club. A former infielder in the Blue Jays farm system from 2010–2016, Fermin has remained with the organization in a coaching capacity following his playing days. He served as a coach with the Double-A New Hampshire Fisher Cats from 2017–2019 and was part of the 2018 Eastern League championship staff under current Toronto Manager John Schneider. He served as Hitting Coach for the DSL Blue Jays in 2021 and managed the club from 2022–2023. He returned stateside as manager of the FCL Blue Jays in 2024 before serving as the club's Bench Coach in 2025. Fermin returns to Dunedin after spending parts of three seasons at TD Ballpark as a player in 2014–2016. His father, Felix, played mainly shortstop over 903 MLB games from 1987–1996 while with Pittsburgh, Cleveland, Seattle and Chicago (NL).

## Antonio Caceres | Ast. Pitching Coach Year with Toronto: 26 | Year with D-Jays: 2 | Born: Cotui, DR

Caceres spent the past three years as the Pitching Coach for the FCL Blue Jays. A lifelong member of the Blue Jays organization, Caceres was signed out of the Dominican Republic by Toronto when he was 17. He played in their minor league system from 1995–1998, before he transitioned to a pitching coach role in 2000. He's spent the past 24 years working as a pitching coach at the lower levels of the farm system, mentoring stars over the years including Aaron Sanchez, Noah Syndergaard, Joe Musgrove, Jordan Romano, Daniel Norris, and Roberto Osuna. Has served as Pitching Coach under Dennis Holmberg for 10 seasons, also working under current Blue Jays coaches Brent Lavallee, Jose Mayorga, Cesar Martin, Dallas McPherson, and current Miami Marlins Manager Clayton McCullough.

**2026:** Still only 22 years old, Barriera enters 2026 having thrown in only 13 games, only five of those being non-rehab appearances, totaling 27.1 innings due to various injuries including Tommy John, a fractured forearm, elbow sprain, bicep soreness, and shoulder injury.

**2025:** Upon returning from elbow surgery, Barriera pitched in five rehab games for the FCL Blue Jays before a fracture in his forearm once again placed him on the shelf.

JoJo hit leadoff and Jacob hit second on their high school team, and they were often walked back-to-back because nobody wanted to face them. Some teams, including the Blue Jays, White Sox, and Rangers even discussed drafting the pair together in 2025, although no teams were able

to meet Jacob's signing bonus demands. The twins played football through junior year of high school, with JoJo at QB and Jacob his top target at WR. Parker's father, Joesph (Jop), became paralyzed in nearly all of his body at 16 years old after going to make a tackle on the football field, breaking his neck and he has been confined to a wheelchair ever since. Despite being told he wouldn't even be able to graduate high school, Jop went on to become a lawyer and is currently a county court judge. Despite not being able to have a catch with them, Jop coached all of the twins little league teams growing up. Native of Purvis, MS, is a small, old railway town of approximately 1900 people per the 2020 census, which was a stop on the New Orleans to Northeast Rail Line. JoJo described it as a three stop light town with a couple of stop signs here and there. The Parker family grew up close friends with the family of MLB No. 1 prospect Konor Griffin. Griffin and Parker are best friends, and played on the same teams growing up before Griffin reclassified, and they train together in the offseason. Closest MLB team to his home in Mississippi was the Atlanta Braves, over six hours away, so never had a favorite team but grew up idolizing Derek Jeter. Hobbies include fishing, hunting, and play golf. In 2nd grade wrote on a piece of paper that his teacher gave him that he wanted to be an MLB baseball player.
