ALTOONA CURVE: A BRIEF HISTORY

Success of Franchise Began Early and Continues Strong

The dream of one native son that began decades ago has not only become a reality, but is about to enter its 12th season in 2010. The story of the Altoona Curve begins in 1979. Area native Bob Lozinak, a successful McDonald's franchisee, knew his hometown was a baseball haven and always dreamed of what it would be like to have a professional sports team in his hometown. He had a chance to make a dream of many come to fruition, so as the 1970s were about to come to a close, a series of meetings and preliminary discussions took place to put the plan into motion. However, there was enough opposition that thwarted the idea as an initial fear from natives was that a professional team would hurt the successful youth teams in the region. Professional baseball, for the time being, was put on the back burner.

In the meantime, that same year, Bob and his family went across the country and bought what became one of the most successful franchises in the entire country - the Albuquerque Dukes, the long time Triple-A affiliate of the Los Angeles Dodgers.

Fast forward 16 years.

Like many other decisions in baseball, the latest round of major league expansion had a domino effect on the minor leagues. 'In 1995, Arizona and Tampa Bay were awarded major league franchises to play their inaugural season in 1998.

To keep pace, baseball's rookie level added two teams in 1996. The following year, Class 'A' and Class 'AAA' each increased by two teams.

That left only Class 'AA' in need of expansion to match the number of teams in the big leagues. In 1997, the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues, as it was then called, decided the Eastern League would receive the two new franchises to start play in 1999. Erie was an easy first choice of the NAPBL's expansion committee. After all, the SeaWolves had established short-season attendance records in the new Uht Park as part of the New York-Penn League from 1995-98.

The awarding of the second franchise wasn't easy. For months, it seemed Springfield, Massachusetts would land the team. However, an inability to

finalize land and stadium finance deals left the NAPBL looking for another option. Enter Altoona. City native Bob Lozinak and a group of Pennsylvania lawmakers put together an 11th hour stadium financing package and site plan. The proposal

was presented to the expansion committee at an October 5, 1997 meeting in Las Vegas. It received unanimous approval and Double-A baseball was on its way to Altoona.

Ballpark ground breaking ceremonies took place on March 7, 1998 and the franchise was officially awarded the following month. In June of that year, the team selected "Curve" as its nickname. The combination railroad/baseball moniker beat out several choices like "Lake Monsters," "Ridge Runners" and, believe it or not, "Fish!"

The next step for the Curve was affiliating with a major league team. Erie seemed to have an inside track on becoming the Pirates' new Double-A club, as the SeaWolves had served as Pittsburgh's short-season club from 1995-98. However, after a series of meetings with potential major league parent clubs, the Curve landed the coveted affiliation with the Pirates. The September 1998 announcement took the franchise to another level as the U.S. Route 22 pairing seemed an ideal fit. Central Pennsylvania fans, with their strong Pirates' roots, could now cheer for the Bucs' top prospects on their way to Pittsburgh.

The long-awaited first game in Curve history took place on April 9, 1999 in Reading, Pa. The game against the Phillies' affiliate was suspended by rain and completed the next day as part of a doubleheader. For the record, the Curve lost its first contest, 6-2, but recorded its first win hours later with a 6-4 decision in game two of the twinbill.

Finally, the Curve christened BCB on April 15 with a triumph over the Bowie Baysox. A huge crowd of 6,171 attended the historymaking contest despite cold, rainy weather and nearly a one-hour delay.

After three remarkable seasons, the Lozinak family sold the franchise to a group headed by Pittsburgh attorney **Chuck**

Greenberg on April 2, 2002. Among the limited partners in Greenberg's collective: Pittsburgh Penguins' owner, star center and NHL Hall of Famer Mario Lemieux; Pittsburgh Steelers' all-pro running back Jerome Bettis; Altoona-based businessmen Steve Sheetz and Don Devorris. Todd Parnell would be tabbed as the team's new General Manager

On August 5, 2002 the Curve announced a new four-year affiliation agreement with Pittsburgh, securing one of baseball's strongest affiliations through 2006. Despite the ownership change, the Curve franchise enjoyed its most successful season to that point, drawing 363,871 fans to Blair County Ballpark

Between the 2002 and '03 seasons, Blair County Ballpark underwent its first major capital expansion project, as a new third-base Picnic Area, left-field Party Deck and outfield reserved seating section were constructed. The additions of the new areas brought the seating capacity of the ballpark to

just over 7,200 and created enough room to hold nearly 10,000 fans on any night.

During the 2003 season, the Curve, led by third-year manager **Dale Sveum** took the franchise to new heights on the field, posting a 78-63 regular season record and securing the club's first-ever Eastern League postseason berth. The Curve would lose to the eventual E.L. champion Akron Aeros three-games-to-one in the first round of the playoffs. The playoff run helped fuel yet another franchise attendance record as 365,376 fans came through the gates at Blair County Ballpark.

In 2004, the Curve, now managed by **Tony Beasley**, finished with a league-best 85-56 record and not only returned to the playoffs, but took the next step and advanced to the Eastern League Championship Series for the first time in club history before losing to the New Hampshire Fisher Cats. The '04 season also turned out to be a banner year at the gates as the Curve added a fifth consecutive franchise attendance record after drawing 394,062 fans

to Blair County Ballpark. Among those fans who attended Curve home games in 2004 was Vice President **Dick Cheney**, who attended the club's Fourth of July game against Harrisburg. Following the season, Curve General Manager **Todd Parnell** was honored as the Eastern

League Executive of the Year, while the franchise was presented the prestigious Larry MacPhail Trophy symbolizing the top promotional effort, both on and off the field, in all of baseball.

The 2005 edition of the Curve reached postseason play in dramatic fashion, sweeping a four-game road series from Bowie during the final weekend of the season to reach the playoffs for a third consecutive season. Despite losing in the first round of the playoffs, the Curve won big earlier in the season when the franchise was named the host of the 2006 E.L. All-Star Game.

Altoona would have a banner year in 2006. The highlight of the season, and arguably the top moment in the first eight seasons of Curve baseball, came on July 12th when Altoona played host to the 2006 Eastern League All-Star Game. A Blair County Ballpark-record crowd of 9,308 were on hand to witness Curve All-Star **Brett Roneberg** take home MVP honors in a 5-3 win for the Southern Division All-Stars.

In the fall of 2006, the franchise won two prestigious awards, most notably, the John H. Johnson President's Trophy, which is given annually to Minor League Baseball's top club on the basis of longtime franchise stability, contributions to and promotion of the baseball industry and the financial success of the team. Also, the Curve were honored by Baseball America as the 2006 winner of the Double-A Bob Freitas Award.

The 2007 season proved to be a year in which the Curve continued their winning ways, as the club marched on to its sixth consecutive winning season. However, it wasn't enough to qualify for postseason play, as the club finished with an overall mark of 73-68. That season, plenty of the Pirates' top prospects passed through Blair County Ballpark. In addition to third-baseman Neil Walker and outfielder Andrew McCutchen, first basemen Steve Pearce enjoyed one of the finest seasons in club history en route to being named the 2007 Topps/Minor League Player of the Year.

In 2008, the Curve celebrated its storybook 10th anniversary season welcoming back plenty of former stars, including **Adam Hyzdu** and **Josh Bonifay** among many others. The Curve also unveiled their 10th Anniversary All-Time team.

On June 17, Jimmy Carter, the 39th President of the United States attended the Curve versus Reading game while on a fishing trip in nearby Huntingdon.

As for the team, though, the Curve underachieved as they suffered their first losing season since 2001, finishing with a mark of 65-77 and a fifth place finish in the Eastern League's Southern Division.

However, 2008 will be remembered not for what happened during the season, but rather what happened following the season. On Dec. 1, 2008, President and Managing Partner, Chuck Greenberg announced that his group was selling the Curve back to original owner and visionary, **Bob Lozinak**. Greenberg announced that he was forming a sports consultation service and that many members of the Curve upper management would join his endeavor, including General Manager Todd Parnell.

Shortly after the announcement of the sale, it was made public that **David Lozinak** would be appointed as the team's Chief Operating

Officer, overseeing the day-to-day functions of the ball club.

The final block to the organization's new foundation was laid on December 5, 2008 when the Lozinak Family announced that they would bring back an old friend to steer the Curve into the future -- Rob Egan. Egan was the original play-by-play broadcaster for the team from 1999-2004. He left baseball for four years, but returned to the minors to become just the fourth General Manager in the club's 11-year history.

On December 30, 2008 Minor League Baseball approved the sale of the Curve from Greenberg's group back to Lozinak and the second chapter of the Lozinak era officially began.

The new 2009 season saw the Altoona Curve stumble under first-year manager Matt Walbeck as the team got off to a franchise worst 0-8 start and was never able to recover, finishing the year 62-80. However, the team did see one of the most prospect-laden lineups ever assembled in team history. As Pirates General Manager Neal Huntingdon traded away many valuable players at the major league level, an influx of talent came back in return. However, no one expected the fan fare that Pirates' 2008 top draft pick and top-rated prospect Pedro Alvarez would get when it was learned the New York native was being promoted from Lynchburg (A) on June 23. A throng of media attention ensued and Alvarez lived up to all his hype. The third baseman hit .333 with 13 home runs and 40 RBIs in just 60 games with the Curve. He was named the 2009 Curve M.V.P. not only for those staggering numbers, but primarily for the impact he had in the team's overall success. In games in which Alvarez played, the

Curve were 34-26 (.567) while going just 26-51 (.338) in games where Alvarez did not play.

An outstanding partnership with the Pittsburgh Pirates became even stronger during the 2009 season when, on May 23, the Curve and Pirates signed a four-year extension to their Player Development Agreement, which will extend through the 2014 season.

Oct. 17, 2001	Curve majority owner Bob Lozinak announces that the franchise will be sold to a new group headed by Pittsburgh sports attorney Chuck Greenberg. Later, Greenberg would welcome Pittsburgh sports stars Jerome Bettis and Mario Lemieux into the new ownership group.				
April 3, 2002	Less than 48 hours before the start of the 2002 season, the ownership transfer officially takes place. Todd Parnell is officially named the club's new General Manager.				
Aug. 8, 2002	The Curve franchise is featured in a full-page feature story in the sports section of USA Today. The article titled "Curve Shape a Region's Heart" documents the game-day happenings at Blair County Ballpark.				
Jan. 2003	Construction begins on a nearly \$1 million privately financed addition to BCB. The project yielded a left-field Picnic Pavilion, Party Deck and outfield bleacher seating section in time for the '03 season.				
July 4, 2004	The Curve welcomes U.S. Vice President Dick Cheney for the Fourth of July game against Harrisburg. Cheney tossed out the first pitch and watched the first half of the game with his wife and granddaughter from the skybox of Pennsylvania State Senator Robert Jubelirer.				
Dec. 2004	After setting a fifth-straight attendance record and continuing to create more fun in-game and nightly promotions, the Curve are awarded the Larry MacPhail Trophy for promotional excellence in Minor League Baseball.				
July 12, 2006	The Curve hosts the 2006 E.L. All-Star Game in front of a record 9,308 fans.				
Dec. 2006	The Curve are awarded Minor League Baseball's highest honor, the John H. Johnson President's Trophy signifying the top franchise among all clubs across the U.S. and Canada. The club is also presented with the Baseball America Bob Freitas Award as the top Double-A franchise in the minors.				
June 17, 2008	Jimmy Carter, the 39th President of the United States, attends a Curve game while on a fishing trip to Spruce Creek in nearby Huntingdon. Altoona beat Reading, 4-3.				
Dec. 1, 2008	Chuck Greenberg announces his group is selling the Curve back to Bob Lozinak, the original owner of the team. Greenberg also announced he was forming a sports consulting firm and that many of the team's upper management would leave with him in this endeavor, including GM Todd Parnell.				
Dec. 5, 2008	The original Voice of the Altoona Curve from 1999-2004, Rob Egan, is named the fourth General Manager in Curve History.				
Dec. 30, 2008	Minor League Baseball approves the sale of the Altoona Curve. Bob Lozinak and his family once again own their hometown team.				
May 23, 2009	The Altoona Curve extend its current Player Development Contract with the Pittsburgh Pirates for an additional four years. The pact not only ensures that the Curve and Pirates will be affiliated with one another through the 2014 season, but the term means the Pirates and Curve will be affiliated for 16 seasons, making the affiliation the longest the Pirates have ever had in their history with a minor league club.

John H. Johnson Trophy twice. The Johnson Trophy is awarded annually to the top franchise in Minor League Baseball in the U.S. and Canada. The Dukes were presented the honor in both 1984 and 1991. Additionally, Albuquerque also captured the Larry McPhail Trophy for the country's top promotional effort in 1987.

Lozinak sold the Dukes in 2000 so he could focus his efforts on his new franchise, the Altoona Curve.

After selling the Curve in 2002, the family purchased the West Tenn Diamond Jaxx, and would enjoy Double-A affiliations in the Southern League with both the Chicago Cubs and the Seattle Mariners before the team was sold in the early months of the 2008 season.

Bob was born in Altoona on June 4, 1937. His college education was interrupted by five years of service in the Army during the 1960s. Lozinak completed Officer Candidate's School in Lawton, Oklahoma and was honorably discharged as a 1st Lieutenant. Upon his discharge from the Army, Lozinak returned to finish his education at St. Francis College in Loretto, Pa. and graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in History.

Bob & Joan Lozinak, Managing Members

Bob and Joan Lozinak, both Altoona natives who always had dreams of bringing professional baseball to their hometown, were finally able to realize that dream in 1999. The original owners of the franchise from 1999-2001, Bob and Joan along with their three sons, Mike, David and Steve, reacquired their hometown team on December 29, 2008.

The Lozinaks had visions of bringing professional baseball to Altoona in the late 1970s, but public opposition thwarted the idea. They then proceeded to buy the Triple-A Albuquerque Dukes from former Los Angeles Dodgers owner Peter O'Malley and over the next 20 years (1979-2000), the Dukes captured six Pacific Coast League titles and numerous awards for club operations. Lozinak is among only a handful of minor league baseball owners to have been awarded the prestigious

After college, Bob and Joan became McDonald's franchisees in 1969 and their role as an owner-operator continues with stores in Hartford County, Maryland.

Since the purchase of their first McDonald's franchise, Joan has been actively involved in many phases of the operation of the restaurant, whether it means balancing the restaurant budget or appearing at numerous functions within the community.

Joan, a graduate of Altoona Catholic High School, currently serves on the Board of Trustees for Bishop Guilfoyle Catholic High School in Altoona. She is actively involved in long-term planning, policy development, financing, capital improvements, public relations and marketing, development and alumni relations and budgetary management.

Joan has always been actively involved in the Catholic church serving as either a Eucharistic Minister or singing in the choir.

The couple can often be found somewhere inside Blair County Ballpark on game days enjoying Curve baseball with fellow fans and enjoying the fun, affordable family atmosphere they always dreamed of providing through the game of baseball in their hometown.

The original play-by-play voice of the Altoona Curve from 1999-2004, Rob Egan returned to professional baseball after a four year hiatus when he was named the fourth General Manager in franchise history on December 5, 2008.

He returned to the Curve after spending nearly four years as the Secretary for Communications for the Catholic Diocese of Altoona-Johnstown (2005-08). Egan also hosted the daily sports talk show "Front & Center" on the ESPN Radio affiliates in Altoona and State College.

Egan brings 10 years of experience in professional baseball and has spent his entire career in the fields

of communications and public relations. In addition to his broadcasting responsibilities, Egan was extensively involved in the marketing, promotions and sponsorship sales of all the teams for which he previously worked.

Before getting into baseball, Egan was the afternoon news and sports director for WGHN-FM and AM Radio in Grand Haven, MI from 1992-1995. A 1991 graduate of Central Michigan University, he has performed various play-by-play duties for three Division I schools: Central Michigan, College of Charleston, and St. Francis University. A native of Grand Blanc, MI, Egan resides in Altoona with his wife, CK, and three children: Drew, Gabriel, and Caroline.

The 2010 season will be the second year for 10-year Major League veteran Matt Walbeck as manager of the Altoona Curve.

"Wally" became the fifth manager in the 12-year history of the Altoona Curve in the winter of 2008, succeeding Marty Brown ('99-'00), Dale Sveum ('01-'03), Tony Beasley ('04-'05) and Tim Leiper ('06-'08). The former major league catcher spent the 2008 season as the third base coach for the Texas Rangers, his first stint as a major league coach.

From 2004-07, Walbeck managed in the Detroit Tigers minor league system, compiling a combined 312-224 (.561) record. He skippered Low-A West Michigan of the Midwest League for three seasons ('04-'06). For his efforts, he was named Midwest League Manager of the Year in 2006 after leading the Whitecaps to their second championship in three years.

The Tigers brass promoted Walbeck the following year. During the 2007 season he managed the Erie SeaWolves of the Eastern League to an 81-59 record. The 'Wolves won the E.L. South title outright and Walbeck captured E.L. Manager of the Year honors. Walbeck also captured the same honors from Baseball America as the best skipper in all of minor league baseball.

The 2008 season found Matt in the big leagues for the first time as a coach when he joined Ron Washington's staff in Texas as the Rangers third base coach.

A six-year run for Walbeck as a manager and coach was preceded by a successful career as a major league catcher from 1993-2003 with Chicago (NL), Minnesota, Anaheim, Detroit and Philadelphia.

Matt, 40, was born in Sacramento, Calif. and currently resides in Fair Oaks, Calif. with his wife Stephenie and their children Luke, Olivia and Tatum.

The only triple play turned in franchise history came on May 3, 2001 against the Harrisburg Senators at Blair County Ballpark. The play was scored 2-6-4. With Senators' pitcher **Mark Mangum** batting, he popped up a bunt that was caught by Altoona catcher **J.R. House**, who threw the ball to shortstop **Shaun Skrehot**, who then threw on to second baseman **Chris Peterson**, who was covering the first base bag to complete the rare triple play.

Fast forward eight years to a game at Blair County Ballpark on July 15, 2009 and the Senators returned the favor. In the bottom of the first inning, Altoona's **Jim Negrych** walked and **Gorkys Hernandez** singled to begin the bottom of the first inning, placing runners at first and second. **Jose Tabata** followed by lining a 2-1 pitch toward Harrisburg second baseman **Ofilio Castro**. Castro caught the low liner, tossed to shortstop **Freddie Bynum** at second base to double off Negrych. Bynum then threw to 1B **Dimitri Young** to triple Hernandez off first.

Curve was selected for two reasons: one for the baseball connotation, but also as a tribute to the historic Horseshoe Curve, located just outside the city of Altoona. The landmark Horseshoe Curve was built in the 1850s as a means to make it easier for incoming trains to navigate through the Allegheny Mountains. The first train went around "the Curve" in 1854.

It didn't take long for the city of Altoona to show the critics who said the area was too small to support a professional baseball team that it has as knowledgeable and caring fans as anywhere minor league baseball is played. It didn't take Adam Hyzdu long to discover that fact either.

When the minor league veteran signed as a minor league free agent with the Pirates shortly after being released by the Boston Red Sox organization early in the 1999 season, Curve fans were just getting used to their new team and its beautiful new ballpark. Few probably even knew the names of the players they were cheering for. But soon, everyone knew about Hyzdu.

He was the club's Most Valuable Player during the inaugural 1999 season, batting .316 with 24 home runs and 78 RBI in just 91 games, before earning a late-season promotion to Triple-A. Most people thought they had seen the last of Hyzdu in a Curve uniform.

However, after a less than intent look from the Pirates in major league spring training, and much to the surprise of the fans of Altoona, Hyzdu returned to the Curve for the 2000 season. Although perhaps initially upset about returning to the Double-A level for the fifth time in his career, Hyzdu tore up Eastern League pitching and in return won the hearts of Curve fans. In 142 games for the 2000 Curve, he batted .290 with team records for home runs (31) and RBI (106) and earned the Eastern League's Most Valuable Player Award. By the middle of the season, the entire city of Altoona was campaigning for Hyzdu's promotion to the major leagues.

And just when it appeared as though Adam Hyzdu's 11th season as a professional baseball player would end without a major league at-bat, he had the week of his life. On September 4th, following a season-ending loss to Akron, his number 16 jersey was retired by the Curve--an honor not normally bestowed upon a minor league baseball player. Then, just four day's later, Hyzdu received the call he had been waiting for--he was heading to the major leagues with the Pittsburgh Pirates! He singled in his first major league at-bat on September 8th and 12 days later hit his first major league home run against the Philadelphia Phillies at Veteran's Stadium.

After returning to the minor leagues to open 2001, he was recalled by the Pirates in May and spent the majority of the season with the major league club. On July 4th that season, in his hometown of Cincinnati, Hyzdu hit two homers against the Reds, bringing his baseball playing career full circle from the days when he was belting home runs at Moeller High School.

After spending parts of the 2002 and 2003 seasons with Pittsburgh, Hyzdu left the Pirates' organization to join the Boston Red Sox system in 2004. After hitting .301 with 29 homers and 79 RBI for Triple-A Pawtucket, Adam was rewarded with a September call-up to the playoff-bound Boston Red Sox and had a chance to remain with the club as the Sox did the unthinkable and won the franchise's first World Series title since 1918.

In 2005, despite spending most of the season in the minor leagues with both the Padres and Red Sox' organizations, Hyzdu appeared in 29 big league games between San Diego and Boston, marking the sixth season in which he has seen action in the major leagues. 2005 also brought a milestone in Adam's career as he appeared in a major league postseason aame for the first time.

The 2006 season saw Hyzdu appear for his fourth major league team as he played in two games for the Texas Rangers after signing with the club as a minor league free agent in November 2005. Hyzdú spent the 2007 season in Japan before announcing his retirement at the end of the year, capping off an 18-year playing career. Currently, Adam lives in Arizona and works for the Children's Miracle Network.

NOTE: The Pittsburgh Pirates have retired 10 uniform numbers at the major league level. It is Pirates' policy that those numbers are not to be worn by any of their players in the minors throughout the farm system. Those numbers are:

JOSH BONIFAY

In his first year with the Curve, Josh Bonifay slugged 11 home runs with 56 RBI in 114 games while batting .285. It would be the first of three years in a Curve uniform for Bonifay, who went on to hit 19 home runs in 2004 and 25 home runs in 2005. The 25 homers in '05 is the second most in a single season for a Curve player behind Adam Hyzdu's 31 in 2000. Bonifay finished his playing career in 2006, playing 113 games with the Corpus Christi Hooks (Double-A Affiliate of the Houston Astros) before calling it a career. Bonifay is now a coach with the Pirates affiliate in West Virginia (Low-A, South Atlantic League).

THE NEED FOR SPEED

The 2005 Altoona Curve stole 155 bases as a team in 2005 and 90 of those came from just two players: Rajai Davis and Rich Thompson. Davis and Thompson each swiped 45 bags in '05 and were two of only three players on the team to register double-digit stolen bases. Their 45 steals each still stand as team records for stolen bases in a single season while the 155 is still a team season-high. The only other player who took more than 10 bases that season was Craig Stansberry (14).

For the second straight year, ESPN Radio, 1430-WVAM will serve as the team's flagship station, airing all 142 regular season games live during 2010

"We're thrilled to be back on WVAM," said General Manager Rob Egan, who from 2006-2008 served as drive time host of "Front and Center" on the station before assuming GM duties with the Curve in 2009. "Sports fans in Altoona know that WVAM is the place to go on the radio dial for terrific sports coverage on a local, regional and national basis and it was simply an easy decision to continue what has been a fantastic partnership with Forever Broadcasting."

Most Curve games will be preceded by "Sports Central" a weekday drive time show from 4:00 – 6:00 p.m. that is simulcast on WQWK-AM, 1450 in State College and hosted by longtime Altoona Curve beat writer, Cory Giger. Each weekday during the baseball season, Giger will preview the night's Curve games and on many occasions will provide extended pre-game show coverage leading up to Curve broadcasts. Sports Central will also be the outlet in which fans can tune in to hear extended, live in-depth interviews from Curve players, coaches and broadcasters.

In 2010, Curve fans will also hear a new voice contributing to the broadcasts. Mike Passanisi will join the Curve's broadcast team as a play-by-play announcer/studio host. Passanisi will call the middle three innings of each home game and serve as a studio host for all 71 road games this season. Passanisi comes to Altoona after a three-year stint at Savannah (A — New York Mets) where he called games for the Sand Gnats. He joins lead play-by-play announcer Dan Zangrilli, who enters his third season in the Altoona booth.

In addition to airing games on WVAM, the Curve and Forever Broadcasting will continue their partnership with several crosspromotional events and marketing efforts. The Curve will have season-long presence on Forever's six stations in the Altoona area: Froggy 98, Rocky 104.9, WALY 103.9, Hot 100, The Big 1290 WFBG, and ESPN Radio 1430 WVAM. Curve staff will regularly join several of the stations' personalities to promote upcoming games and events in "Curve, PA". Forever Broadcasting will also gain exposure to Curve fans throughout the region with promotional events at Blair County Ballpark that will showcase their stations' popular on-air personalities.

"It's been an absolute pleasure to work with Carol Logan, Dave Davies, and the entire Forever team in continuing and strengthening our relationship," said Egan. "We're looking forward to a terrific season and our partnership with Forever will play a big role in getting the word out about the fun we're having in 'Curve, PA'."

Prior to his time in Savannah, Passanisi worked with the San Diego Surf Dawgs of the Golden Baseball League and had the privilege of providing color analysis for Jose Canseco's last comeback hurrah in 2006.

A graduate of San Diego State University with a degree in Journalism and a minor in history, Passanisi has been a warmweather man his entire life and is spending his first extended period of time in the northeast. During his time at San Diego State he helped out in the San Diego State Media Relations Department and has worked at the NCAA Tournament, McDonald's High School All-American Game and the AFLAC All-American Game. He also served as the public address announcer for the softball team and as a fill-in PA announcer for the women's basketball team during his time with the Aztecs.

Passanisi is a native of Penngrove, California, which is located about an hour north of San Francisco, but has lived in San Diego, California and Savannah, Georgia. In all his cross-country travels, he has visited nearly every state except for the ones in the extreme north.

DIRECTIONS TO BLAIR COUNTY BALLPARK

From PITTSBURGH and Points West: Take I-76/I-376 East to U.S. 22 East. Drive on 22 East for approximately 80 miles. Merge onto I-99/US-220 North approximately six miles from Altoona. Stay on I-99 North and take the Frankstown Road exit (Exit #32). Go straight at the light at the top of the ramp (crossing over Frankstown Road). The ballpark is on the right.

From STATE COLLEGE and Points North: Take U.S. 322 West to I-99/U.S. 220 South. Take Frankstown Road exit (Exit #32). At the top of the ramp, turn right at the light onto Frankstown Road. Take a right at the next light onto Park Avenue. Ballpark is on the right.

From BEDFORD, PA/CUMBERLAND, MD and Points South: Take 1-99/U.S. 220 North toward Altoona. Take the Frankstown Road exit (Exit #32). Go straight at the light at the top of the ramp (crossing over Frankstown Road). The ballpark is on the right.

From HARRISBURG/PHILADELPHIA and Points East: Take Pennsylvania Turnpike West to Bedford exit. Following the toll booths, take a left at the light. Follow signs and get on 1-99/U.S. 220 North. Take Frankstown Road exit (Exit #32). Go straight at the light at the top of the ramp (crossing over Frankstown Road). The ballpark is on the right.

From I-80 Traveling East: Take the Philipsburg/Woodland Exit to U.S. 322 East. After about 25 miles, take U.S. 220 South 220 South merges with I-99 South. Drive on I-99 South for approximately 20 miles. Take the Frankstown Road exit (Exit #32). Turn right at the exit, the ballpark will be to your right.

From I-80 Traveling West: Take the Altoona/Milesburg exit and bear onto U.S. 220 South. After approximately 30 miles merge onto I-99 South. Drive on I-99 South for approximately 20 miles. Take the Frankstown Road exit (Exit #32). Turn right at the exit, the ballpark will be to your right.

The Curve will contact media outlets on an individual basis regarding season-long credentials. Other media organizations that would like to request a season credential can do so by sending that request on company letterhead via fax (814-283-3119) or as an e-mail attachment to dzangrilli@altoonacurve.com.

DAILY CREDENTIALS: Daily credentials will be issued to those individuals or organizations who do not qualify for season credentials, including freelance writers and weekly and monthly publications. Daily credentials will also be issued to radio and TV stations when the need arises for extra pre/ post-game personnel and to newspaper reporters providing extra coverage. The Curve Media Relations Department should be notified at least 24 hours in advance of the game in which daily credentials are being requested. Requests should be faxed or e-mailed. Once approved, the credentials can be picked up at the Media/Handicap Gate (see below).

CREDENTIAL PICKUPS: Season Credentials can be picked at the Curve's annual Media Day activities. Media can make other arrangements with the Curve Media Relations Department to pick up credentials after that date. Daily credentials will only be available for pickup on the day they are issued at the Media/Handicap gate.

MEDIA ENTRANCE TO BLAIR COUNTY BALLPARK: All credentialed media should enter the ballpark through the Media/Handicap gate located at the top of the stairs halfway between the Front Office and the Upper Ticket

Plaza on the third base side of the ballpark. No credentialed media are permitted to enter the ballpark through either the Curve Front Office or one of the ticket gates.

OTHER ACCEPTABLE CREDENTIALS: The Curve will also honor credentials from the Pittsburgh Pirates, National and American Leagues, the Baseball Writers Association of America and Minor League Baseball.

PRESS BOX SPACE: Though Blair County Ballpark's Press Box is spacious, the Curve still gives preferred seating to those media outlets that cover the club most frequently. If your media organization needs special space requirements please contact the Curve Media Relations Department at least 24 hours prior those dates.

PHOTO WELLS: Photo wells are located at the end of both dugouts. Photographers are welcome to use this space throughout the course of the game. Photographers are not permitted in the actual dugout area or on the field once the game begins. Please wait until the end of the inning to move to or from these areas.

PARKING: Media members holding season credentials are permitted to park their vehicles in the VIP parking lot by presenting their credentials to the attendant. Please be aware that parking is available on a first-come basis. Those holding daily credentials that need to be picked up at the Media/Handicap gate will have their name placed on a VIP parking list, as long as they give at least 24 hours notice.

INTERVIEW POLICY: The Curve Media Relations Department will be glad to assist members of the media in procuring interviews with Curve players and coaching staff members. Media members wishing to do an off-site interview or a feature story should contact the Curve no later than 48 hours prior to the scheduled interview time. The media is asked to be respectful of the players' pre-game schedule when requesting an interview with a player. Please consult the Curve Pregame Schedule listed on page 102 of this publication. No one will be permitted to interview starting pitchers on the day of their start.

<u>CLUBHOUSE POLICIES</u>: In accordance with the regulations designated by the Pittsburgh Pirates and Major League Baseball, both clubhouses will open to credentialed media from 3 1/2 hours prior to game time until 45 minutes before game time. Following the game, the clubhouses will be closed for a period of five minutes to allow the team ample time to return to the clubhouse. The clubhouse areas are also closed when the teams are on the field, unless previously approved by the Curve Media Relations department. **Clubhouses are also closed between games of a doubleheader.**

FIELD ACCESS: Credentialed media are permitted access to the field and dugout areas, but are not permitted to cross the foul lines, particularly when the team is taking batting practice. Media must leave the field and dugout areas no later than 45 minutes prior to game time.
