NEWS AND NOTES

PARTY LIKE IT'S 1991: Worcester makes the first trip to Nashville in franchise history and this week's series is the Sounds first against a Boston Red Sox affiliate since the 1991 season. Triple-A Pawtucket last visited Nashville for a two-game series May 22-23, 1991, at Greer Stadium. Nashville and Pawtucket played 21 total games between 1988-1991 as interleague foes when the Sounds were in the American Association and Pawtucket was in the International League. Nashville was 11-10 overall against Pawtucket but just 3-6 in their nine meetings in Nashville. Five of Boston's top 30 prospects (MLB Pipeline) are listed on Worcester's roster to start the series, including their no. 1-rated prospect LHP Payton Tolle who is scheduled to start for the WooSox on Saturday night.

FRENEMIES: LHP Shane Drohan will get the start for Nashville Tuesday night. The Brewers no. 25-rated prospect was traded from Boston to Milwaukee this past February in a six-player trade that included former Sound Anthony Seigler, who is on Worcester's active roster to begin the week. Drohan appeared in 35 games for Worcester between 2023-2025 and made his Major League debut last week with Milwaukee at Fenway Park against the Red Sox.

TRIPLE DIPPER: Outfielder Luis Lara hit his first career Triple-A triple in the top of the first inning in Sunday's series finale against Gwinnett. The Brewers no. 12-rated prospect extended his hit streak to four games with his lone knock of the day. Lara has recorded 13 triples in his six-year professional career and the 21-year-old Brewers' prospect set his single-season career-high with four triples during the 2022 season for the Dominican Summer League Brewers. Through his first 13 career games with Nashville, Lara is hitting .367 (18-for-49) with four XBH, 6 RBI, and has more walks (8) than strikeouts (6). **He ranks sixth in the IL in AVG, tied for fifth in hits, tied for first with his 14 runs, and is T-4th with eight steals.**

ON-PACE STREAK: Outfielder Greg Jones continued his hot start to the season as he went 1-for-3, with a run and a walk, and has reached base in all 13 games this season with Nashville. The last time a Sounds hitter got on base in at least 13 consecutive games was by Raynel Delgado from May 29-June 18 last season, posting a .269 batting average (14-for-52), six runs, two doubles, and six RBI. Nick Martini continues to hold the franchise lead for on-base streak with 66 consecutive games during the 2018 season from April 14-September 1 as he posted a .326 batting average (79-for-242), 40 runs, 14 extra-base hits, six homers and 37 RBI.

STRIPED: The Sounds dropped their second series of the 2026 season to the Stripers, losing five-of-six games. It was just the second six-game series loss to Gwinnett since Nashville joined the International League, including a 5-1 series defeat June 11-15, 202, in Gwinnett. The last time Nashville dropped five or more in a six-game series was a series sweep at the hands of the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp August 5-10 last season.

EVERYBODY LOVES RAMÓN: Ramón Rodríguez collected his third straight multi-hit game after finishing Saturday night 3-for-4 out of the nine hole in Nashville's lineup. Rodríguez is hitting .458 (11-for-24) in seven games this season with four total multi-hit games and is 7-for-15 (.467) with two doubles, and a RBI in his four games against Gwinnett this week. Rodríguez was limited to just 21 games a season ago for Double-A Biloxi but hit .359 (23-for-64) with seven multi-hit games. Rodríguez is now tied with Greg Jones for the second-most multi-hit games for Nashville this season.
