STEADY STREAM OF SINGLES NETS RIDERS OPENING DAY WIN:

Behind 10 hits in the first five innings, all singles, the Frisco RoughRiders won 5-1 on Thursday night's Opening Day over the Corpus Christi Hooks at Whataburger Field. Designated hitter **Keith Jones II** kicked off the scoring for Frisco (1-0) in the second inning when he slashed a two-RBI single through the left side of the infield. Third baseman **Frainer Chavez** followed Jones up with a two-run knock of his own in the fourth for a 4-0 RoughRiders lead. Frisco's Opening Day starter, **Leandro Lopez**, starred across 4.2 scoreless, no-hit innings before being lifted for **Zach Bryant** ahead of the final out of the fifth. Corpus Christi (0-1) scored its lone run with a two-out rally against Bryant, punctuated by a bases-loaded hit by pitch of outfielder Lucas Spence. The Riders added another run in the seventh on an RBI groundout from **John Taylor** that boosted the lead to 5-1. **Ryan Lobus** (1-0) took the win with two scoreless innings in relief, handing the Hooks' starter James Hicks (0-1) the loss.

YOU WANT THE HITS, WE GOT UM:

The RoughRiders' 14 hits on Thursday were the most among teams starting their seasons (Double-A, High-A and Low-A). If you include Triple-A games, individual teams have had more than 14 hits in only six games so far this season. Their 13 singles are tied for the most in a single game this year. The 14 hits were the most on an Opening Day in recorded franchise history (since 2005), breaking the record of 13 on April 3rd, 2008 and the most singles in an initial game since they ripped 10 singles on April 9th, 2009 against Springfield. **Tucker Mitchell** tied the franchise record for most hits on Opening Day with three, becoming the sixth player to do so (**Josh Hatcher**, 2025; **Preston Beck**, 2019; **Gulider Rodriguez**, 2013; **Chris Davis**, 2008; **Joaquin Arias**, 2005). Mitchell was also one of four Double-A players with three hits on Thursday.

QUITE THE START:

Frisco starter **Leandro Lopez** poured in 4.2 no-hit innings on Thursday night, tying the longest no-hit outing of the season so far (**Noah Davis**, Triple-A Indianapolis, also on Thursday). Since 2005, it was just the fourth Texas League Opening Day start to go at least 4.2 innings without allowing a hit and the first since April 5th, 2024 when **Tink Henc** (Springfield) went 5.0 no-hit innings. **Emmet Sheehan** (Tulsa) threw 5.0 no-hit innings on 2023's Opening Day and **Jose Urquidy** (Corpus Christi) tossed 5.0 no-hit innings as well in 2019.

SOUTHERN SUCCESS:

Since 2021, the Riders have been very good against their South Division opponents, going 251-185 (.576) against their division teams. The only problem is that they have gone just 55-53 against Midland while they went a combined 196-132 (.598) against Corpus Christi, Amarillo and San Antonio.

CLASS OF THE LEAGUE:

Since 2021, the RoughRiders have been the best team in the Texas League. Over the last five seasons, Frisco has a 360-308 (.539) record. Their .539 winning percentage is the top mark in the Texas League and the sixth-best in Double-A during that span. Somerset (Yankees affiliate) has the best record in Double-A, going 387-280 (.580) in that stretch. On the opposite end, Corpus Christi has had the worst winning percentage in the Texas League over the last five years, going 287-381 (.430), the third-worst in Double-A. (See below for more info)

VERSUS THE CORPUS CHRISTI HOOKS:

The Riders went 12-11 against the Hooks in 2025 and have gone 30-18 (.625) against the Astros affiliate since the start of 2024. Statistically, the two teams recorded very similar numbers in 2025. Frisco hit .251 head-to-head while Corpus batted .248, but had the slight edge in OPS (.739 to .725) and runs scored (125 to 120). On the mound, the Riders had a 4.74 ERA while Corpus owned a 4.76 ERA. While he is currently on the Injured List, **Sebastian Walcott** paced the offense against the Hooks, slashing .323/.398/.552/.950 with six home runs, 16 RBIs and 11 steals in 23 games. Since 2021, the Riders are 58-43 (.574) against Corpus Christi despite their losing record against the Hooks in their franchise history (282-289). In both 2024 and 2025 combined, the Hooks' .366 winning percentage is worst in all of Minor League Baseball.

WE'RE GOING PROSPECTING:

The RoughRiders have four players in MLB Pipeline's Rangers Top 30 Prospects rankings to start 2026. On the mound, **David Davalillo** (No. 7), **Leandro Lopez** (No. 14) and **Josh Trentadue** (No. 23) all slot into the starting rotation and are all returners to Frisco. The lone prospect on the offense side is **Dylan Dreiling** (No. 10), who makes his Double-A debut in 2026.

FAMILIAR AND NEW FACES IN FRISCO:

The RoughRiders welcome 16 returning players in 2026, but will have just three players on the roster (infielder **John Taylor**, outfielder **Dylan Dreiling** and RHP **Dylan MacLean**) who have yet to make their Double-A debut. Of the 28, 10 players will be making their Rangers organization debut with the RoughRiders.

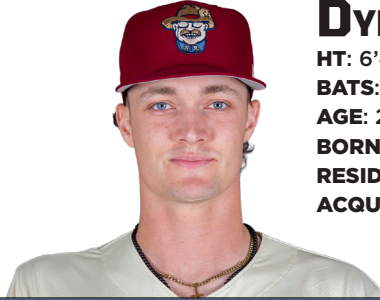

ABOUT DYLAN

- Drafted in 2020 out of Central Catholic High School in Portland, Oregon.
- Named 2019 Oregon Gatorade Player of the Year in junior year, leading all Oregon pitchers in wins (10), ERA (0.51), strikeouts (128) and WHIP (0.71). Led Rams to 6-A State Championship game against Jesuit (nicknamed the "Holy War") and faced now-Phillies pitcher Mick Abel. Jesuit won 2-1 in 13 innings.
- Was named as the No. 2 pitcher in Oregon's 2020 class behind Abel.
- At 13 years old, he pitched for Oregon in the opening round of the 2015 Little League World Series. In 1-0 loss to Texas, he threw 5.2 innings, striking out 12 batters.
- Before signing with the Rangers, MacLean was committed to the University of Washington.

2026 SEASON

- Opening the season as the Saturday starter for the RoughRiders

2025 SEASON

- Returned from injury to High-A Hub City, dominating at home (2.45 ERA as opposed to a 4.08 ERA on the road)
- After allowing five runs in his second appearance, he dominated in his last 19G (10GS), to the tune of a 3-1 record and 2.70 ERA.
- Started two games in the playoffs, allowing three runs in 8.0 innings, striking out 7 to 1 walk

2024 SEASON

- Missed the entire season with "Tommy John" surgery.

2023 SEASON

- Lead the team with 7 wins on the season
- As a starter, went 1-1 with a 2.89 ERA over 7 games. As a reliever, went 6-4 with a 3.38 ERA.

CHAD COMER

Years with Rangers: 10

Years with RoughRiders: 2 (1st as manager)

Comer returns to Double-A Frisco in 2026 after managing at the High-A level over the last three seasons. The native of Mansfield, Texas will enter his 10th season with the Rangers and his second in Frisco.

In 2022, Comer helped pilot the Riders to their second Texas League Championship in franchise history, serving as a development coach. Over the last three seasons, Comer managed High-A Hickory (2023-2024) and High-A Hub City (2025), going 197-191 (.508).

Prior to Frisco, Comer was the hitting coach for the High-A Hickory Crawdads in 2021, after serving as a coach at various levels of the Rangers system from 2016-2019.

The former University of Texas at Arlington catcher played two seasons in the Atlanta Braves organization, reaching High-A Lynchburg in 2012. He was drafted by Atlanta in the 29th round of the 2011 draft after four seasons at UTA.

PITCHING COACH



THOMAS ST. CLAIR

Years with Rangers: 5

Years with RoughRiders: 1

St. Clair joins the Riders as the pitching coach after leading a Hub City staff that finished third in the SAL with a 3.50 ERA in 2025. St. Clair also will serve as the assistant pitching coordinator in the Rangers farm system in 2026.

Initially, St. Clair came to the Rangers as a coach in the Dominican Summer League in 2022 before serving as a pitching coach for the ACL Rangers from 2022-23. Before professional baseball, he spent two and a half years as pitching coach and recruiting coordinator at North Carolina Wesleyan College.

The right-hander pitched three professional seasons in the St. Louis Cardinals system from 2017-19 after he was picked in the 24th round of the 2017 June draft, making 88 outings for the organization's Rookie and Single-A affiliates.

The Winston-Salem, North Carolina native played four years (2014-17) at Division II Lenior-Rhyne University in Hickory, N.C.

HITTING COACH



JASON HART

Years with Rangers: 13

Years with RoughRiders: 9

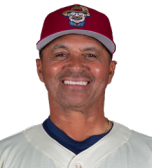
Hart returns as the hitting coach in Frisco for the first time since he served as the RoughRiders hitting coach from 2012-2019. Before that, most recently, he was the Major League hitting assistant for the Miami Marlins under current Rangers manager Skip Schumaker.

In 2015, Hart was named the Mike Coolbaugh Texas League Coach of the Year for his work with the Riders hitters. Prior to joining Frisco, Hart spent two seasons as the hitting coach with Low-A Hickory. His tenure with the Rangers began after he assisted the Single-A Clinton staff with coaching responsibilities for a portion of the 2008 season and continued when he accepted the role of hitting coach for the Arizona Rangers before the 2009 campaign.

Hart played professionally for parts of eight seasons from 1998-2006, with stints in the Oakland, Texas and Minnesota organizations. He made his Major League debut with the Rangers in 2002, when he batted .267 (4-for-15) with three doubles over a span of 10 games. He missed the 2004 campaign following the removal of a benign brain tumor, but returned to the field in 2005 and hit 21 home runs in 128 games with Frisco.

Originally drafted by Oakland in the fifth round of the 1998 draft, Hart was acquired by Texas in a January 2002 trade with the Athletics. He attended Southwest Missouri State University, where he paced the conference in homers in 1997 and was named a Missouri Valley Conference All-Star in 1998.

BENCH COACH



JORGE HERNANDEZ

Pronounced "George"

Hernandez joins the RoughRiders for his first season with the Rangers organization.

During 2020, Hernandez managed the Texas Collegiate League Frisco RoughRiders after the MiLB season had been canceled. In 2025, he served as a bench coach for Triple-A Jacksonville and spent 19 seasons with the Marlins as a coach and coordinator. As part of that stint, he served eight seasons as a manager, most recently in 2022 with High-A Beloit.

Hernandez started his coaching career at the University of Mobile in 1993 as a hitting coach and stayed there through 2001. From 2005-2006, Hernandez served as the hitting coach for the Independent Pensacola Pelicans.

DEVELOPMENT COACH



JAY SULLENGER

Sullenger joins the Riders in 2026 as the Development Coach. He made his professional managerial debut in 2021, leading the ACL Rangers.

Before joining the professional ranks, Sullenger led the baseball program as head coach at Biola University in La Mirada, California, from 2013-2018.

Additionally, he worked one season in stadium operations for the Tampa Bay Rays. Sullenger attended Spotswood (Va.) High School and went on to play baseball at Florida Southern College (one season) and Liberty University (three seasons).

He holds a bachelor's degree from Liberty and earned a master's degree in Kinesiology with a focus in Athletic Administration/Coaching from James Madison in 2003.

ATHLETIC TRAINER



KILEY BROWN

Brown makes his Double-A debut in 2026. Before being the athletic trainer for High-A Hub City in 2025, Brown was the ACL Rangers athletic trainer in 2024.

Brown was also a student athletic trainer at Slinger (Wisc.) High School (2022) and Carroll University in Waukesha, Wisc. (2021).

The Louisville, Ky. native holds an associate's degree in Biology (McHenry County College), a Bachelor's degree in Exercise Science (Upper Iowa University), and a Master's in Athletic Training (Carroll University).

STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING COACH



BRETT PLATTS

Platts is back with the RoughRiders for his third season and his fourth in the Rangers organization in 2026.

In his first year, he was the strength and conditioning coach for the Low-A Down East Wood Ducks before spending a season with the Cubs, working in the Dominican Summer League. The Canadian completed his strength and conditioning internship with the University of Iowa athletic department in 2022 and spent four years with the Okotoks Dawgs Baseball Academy from 2019 through 2022.
