### "FUN IS GOOD" FACTOIDS

**I TOTALLY REMEMBER LAST YEAR, BUT REMIND ME AGAIN?:** Following their best season as a Twins affiliate, the Saints finished last year 70-79, a 14-win dropoff from the season prior and their lowest win total in four years in Triple-A. In a season of peaks and valleys, the Saints opened up the year 28-35 before they ripped off an 11-game winning streak, the longest in the International League all year. St. Paul peaked at four games over .500 after winning back-to-back games in Iowa to open the second-half before being bogged down by a pair of extended losing skids, including a string of 10 consecutive losses from Aug. 9-Aug. 20, tied for the longest in the league that season.

**SAINTLY STANDOUTS AT THE DISH:** Last year's Saints offense was led by the consistent presence of DaShawn Keirsej, Jr, who hit .300 (.844 OPS) with 14 HR, 81 RBI, and 36 SB before a September call-up. He was the fifth-ever St. Paul hitter w/ 10+ homers and 20+ steals. Dominican slugger Junior Severino shook off a sluggish start to the year to belt a Saints-high 21 homers, while finishing top-10 in the league in RBI (79) and total bases (211); both Keirsej and Severino eclipsed the previous Saints franchise record for RBI in a season with 81 & 79, respectively. Following a late-April demotion from MIN, Forest Lake native Matt Wallner clobbered 19 homers in 67 games with St. Paul, including 12 in the month of June, before returning to the Bigs. After starting the season on the IL, Brooks Lee got off to a tepid 3-for-14 start in early-June before roping 7 homers in the next 16 games, including his first 2-HR game as a pro on June 20, to earn his first MLB call-up. This year's Saints' Opening Day squad features just three hitters that saw more than 300 PA with St. Paul last season: Severino, Anthony Prato, & Jair Camargo.

**ARMS RACE:** Last season's staff was led by workhorses Caleb Boushley and Randy Dobnak, who each made at least 24 starts and logged over 130 IP each, both ranking top-10 in the IL. Twins No. 4 prospect David Festa spent the first three months of the season with STP and was dominant; his 89 strikeouts were the third-most in the IL from Opening Day to the time of his call-up and he fanned 138 of 638 batters faced (34.9%), the highest strikeout rate of any Triple-A pitcher (min 60 IP). Twins prospects Simeon Woods-Richardson and Zebby Matthews each established big-league roles after making just seven combined starts with St. Paul. Saints pitching ranked bottom-6 in the IL in ERA (5.08), but had a 4.96 ERA among starting pitchers that ranked 8th/20. St. Paul's Opening Day bullpen returns two of their top-4 relievers from last season by total appearances (Ryan Jensen-44, 1st & Scott Blewett-38, 4th) while the seven starters on the Opening Day roster combined for just 31 starts with the Saints last season (15 by David Festa).

**THE STARS OF TOMORROW, TODAY:** The Saints Opening Day roster features nine of Minnesota's Top-30 prospects according to MLB.com and ten according to Baseball America: OF Emmanuel Rodriguez (No 2. MLB.com, No. 2 BA), INF Luke Keaschall (3/3), RHP Zebby Matthews (-/4), RHP Marco Raya (6/8), RHP Andrew Morris (9/10), RHP Cory Lewis (11/20), INF Payton Eeles (23/17), RHP Travis Adams (22/22), C Diego Cartaya (24/21), & C Jair Camargo (-/23). Both Rodriguez (19/37) and Keaschall (45/60) rank among the top-100 overall lists of both publications.

**CONCERNING OPENERS:** The Saints are 2-2 in Opening Day games since 2021 after winning 8-1 last season against Columbus, the first time the Saints opened up a Triple-A campaign at home. The Saints have homered at least once in all four previous Opening Day games. A Saints hitter has never reached base in the first plate appearance of the season and a Saints pitcher has never struck out the first batter faced of the season (Saints opponents are 2-4 vs Saints pitchers in the first-at bat, including Myles Straw singling on David Festa's first pitch last season) Here are the previous Opening Day results and notable Saints performances in openers:

**LET ME PACK MY SNOW SHOVEL:** For the second straight season, the Saints will open up the season at home in the month of March. This year's March 28 start is the earliest in franchise history, including their days as an Independent club. Last season, the originally scheduled home opener on March 29 was cancelled due to wet grounds. In 2023, following their three-game road trip in Toledo, their first two home games on April 4 & 5 were postponed. Their April 4 game was postponed due to six inches of snow that had fallen on March 31 and their April 5 game was postponed due to inclement weather. Including a 31-minute delay for weather in 2022, the Saints have not started their home opener as scheduled since 2019.

**HOME SWEET HOME:** During the past four years, the Saints are tied for fifth in all of Minor League baseball with 163 home wins. Their .570 Win% at home is fourth-best in Triple-A and third in the IL in that span. Last year's 35-38 record was the 1st season the Saints played below .500 at home in 4 years as a Triple-A club.

**FRESH FACES, NEW ENEMIES:** The Saints will play three International League teams for the first time in franchise history in 2025: Norfolk (BAL) for a home series late-May, Worcester (BOS) at home in late-July, and Memphis (STL) in a September road series. Also new to Triple-A this year, the Saints will take part in an International League vs Pacific Coast League crossover series as Round Rock (TEX) visits CHS Field for the first-time in August. In addition to the four new teams they'll face, the Saints will also visit Coolray Field for their first road games ever vs Gwinnett (ATL).

**LATE-BLOOMER:** A late-adopter to pitching, Festa did not start toeing the slab until his senior year of high school at Seton Hall Prep. He was initially committed as a shortstop to a Division 3 school entering his final prep season, but when his high school ran out of pitchers during a tournament, Festa was handed the ball for the first time and never looked back. He continued to play shortstop for the rest of the year, but also went 4-0 with a 1.50 ERA while striking out 44 over 30 innings on the mound. He chose to walk-on to nearby Seton Hall University as a pitcher instead, getting a good recommendation from his high school head coach Mike Sheppard Jr, who's brother was the head coach of the nearby Big East program. Festa was mostly a fastball-changeup pitcher in college, mixing in an occasional slurve, and credits the Twins development program for helping him develop a slider, which as become his bread-and-butter out pitch, accounting for 65 of his 166 (39%) strikeouts between the Majors and Triple-A last year.

**A PERFORMANCE FOR THE AGES:** In just his ninth professional pitching appearance, Festa was a major part of a no-hitter. On May 10, 2022 with Fort Myers, he threw 6.0 no-hit innings, striking out a career-high 11 batters in a combined no-hitter for the Mighty Mussels. Jaylen Nowlin followed with 2.0 perfect innings and struck out three. Hunter McMahon tossed 1.0 hitless inning to finish it off, a 3-0 win.

**ONE, TWO, THREE, YOU'RE OUT!** On July 24, 2022 with Single-A Cedar Rapids, Festa allowed three consecutive singles between the third and fourth innings. The final two batters of the third inning reached, as did the first of the fourth. Festa got three outs, but did not retire a batter because promptly picked off each of the three batters, one after the other.

**THE SLIM REAPER IDOLIZING THE deGROMINATOR:** While he's worn the No. 58 jersey for both the Twins and Saints so far in his career, Festa came up through baseball wearing number 48, a tribute to his favorite player growing up, Jacob DeGrom. The two-time Cy Young award winner had his most dominant seasons in 2018-19 , the summers before Festa's first two years of college ball at Seton Hall University, about 35 miles West of Citi Field in Flushing.

**你好:** While attending Seton Hall Prep in New Jersey, Festa was a member of the National Chinese Honor Society.. The National Chinese Honor Society (NCHS) was established in 1993 to recognize those accomplished high school students who study Chinese as a world language. The National Chinese Honor Society is a scholastic organization that promotes and recognizes students who demonstrate citizenship, leadership, and community service. A member must be a full time high school student (grades 9 – 12) who has studied Chinese for four semesters in high school with an average of B or higher.

**BIGGER, FASTER, STRONGER:** Festa's goal in the offseason leading up to 2024 was to add some muscle, so he can be prepared to go an entire season. He said it's sort of tough for him to do certain exercises given his height and narrowness. Last season he was listed at 185 pounds and came into Spring Training in 2024 10 pounds heavier at 195.
