Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Kevin Herget** to the mound tonight, looking to avoid the first eight game losing streak since 4/17-4/24/06 (New York Yankees affiliation). Indianapolis will counter with RHP **Max Kranick**. The Clippers are 7-12 (.368) against right handers this year. Kranick has never pitched against the Clippers in his career (Triple-A debut tonight).

vs. the Indians

Columbus was 15-9 against Indy in 2019, despite scoring just 10 more runs on the season, 132-122 (more wins, fewer runs than Indy in each of three seasons from 2016-18). Individually, **Connor Marabell** has hit .321 (9x28) against Indianapolis in eight career games and **Bobby Bradley** has hammered 5HR with 12RBI in 20 games (3HR and 6RBI in 13 games at Victory Field).

Get What You Pay For

The Clippers are the only team in the IL that has seen every game played to completion in nine innings, as they are one of two (Toledo) that has not experienced extra innings this year. Detracting from the drama is the fact that the Clippers have played in an IL-low four games decided by a single run (1-3). Tonight's opponent, Indianapolis, is tied for 3rd in the IL with nine 1-run games (4-5).

Quite a Slide

Since starting the season 5-1, the Clippers have been beaten down to the tune of a 3-14 record, getting outscored 123-72 in that time. The last time the Clippers had a 17 game stretch with only three wins was 5/24-6/9/13, going from 28-19 to 31-33 (outscored 128-88). The 2013 Clippers never recovered from that slide, going 40-40 to finish the season at 71-73 (last sub .500 team).

Double Time

Ernie Clement had a seven game hit streak (.478, 11x23), in which he had an XBH in every game, from 5/6-5/27 (missed 11 games with a leg injury). Of his 12 hits on the season, Clement has 8XBH, resulting in a .618SLG. However, not counted among those hits is a homer, as Clement is the only player in the IL (of 60) with at least 37PA and a .445+SLG that has yet to go deep.

Cursed at the Top

Daniel Johnson returned to the leadoff spot Friday and went 0x9 in 2G (.157, 11x70, 4HR, 32K over last 17G). Johnson had been sharing leadoff duties with **Oscar Mercado** over the last two weeks, but Mercado has also fallen on hard times, batting just .164/.258/.182 over 55AB since 5/15. Clipper leadoff hitters have the worst average in the IL (.204) and have scored the fewest runs (8).

Arias Also in a Funk

Gabriel Arias started the season by reaching base in each of his first 12G (.429OBP), while cranking the batting average up to .282, but has hit just .135 (5x37) with a .200OBP in 10G since. He has drawn only 3BB over his last 10G, compared to 8BB in his first 12G (walked in six straight from 5/5-5/12). Arias has no extra base hits since homering on 5/14 vs. Omaha (49AB).

The Rock

Bobby Bradley will man the cleanup spot for the 23rd time in 24G (through 19G, had been the only player in the IL to start every game at cleanup). After a solid Toledo series that saw his average climb to .200 (6x24, 2HR, 4RBI), he went 1x16 with a HR against Nashville, dropping back to .171. When playing first base this year, Bradley has 3HR in 71AB, compared to 4HR in 11AB as a DH.

Swinging Hard

Heading into today, the Clippers have three players among the top seven in the IL in strikeouts, as **Nolan Jones** leads the league (39K), **Daniel Johnson** ranks 4th (33K) and **Bobby Bradley** is 7th (30K). Jones has seen 43% of his plate appearances end with a strikeout. Remarkably, Columbus trails two other teams, including Indianapolis, in the IL in total strikeouts (237K in 23G).

But Still...

Despite the heavy strikeout numbers, **Nolan Jones** enters today with a 15G on base streak (.410OBP), 2G ahead of **Bradley Zimmer** (still active) and **Daniel Johnson** (5/8-5/23) for the team lead. Jones paces the Clippers with 16BB (tied for 3rd in the IL) and has a three true outcome rate of 61.5% (ranks 1st among 83 qualified IL hitters; Johnson ranks 7th at 54.0%, Zimmer is 11th at 49.3%).

This Date in Clipper History

6/1/2009

Columbus tied a franchise record with 11 runs in the bottom of the 3rd inning vs. Norfolk, en route to a 16-3 thumping. **Andy Marte** led the charge, going 2x2 with a double and 4 RBI in the inning. Marte was later promoted to Cleveland, on 7/28. At the time of his call up, he was the only player in the IL to rank in the top three of each Triple Crown category (3rd with .327 average, 2nd with 18HR and 66RBI).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 years since the move downtown, Huntington Park has ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game, totaling 2.25 per contest (1,763HR, 783 games). In 2019, HP averaged over three per game for the first time ever (seventh time averaging over a pair), as the Clippers surrendered a record 127HR and just missed out on triple digits themselves (97HR was second highest team total). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (946 to 904).

Record Destruction

The Clippers broke the established mark for homers in a season (182 in 1983) on 8/7/19 and finished with a total of 213 (most in the IL). From 5/14-6/2, they homered in 20 straight games (44HR total) and they had seven straight multi-HR games from 6/14-6/21 (22HR). On the mound, they broke the record for homers allowed (156 in 1998) on 7/31/19, giving up 198 for the year (2nd most in the IL).

Ain't Over 'Til It's Over

Since the start of the 2014 season, no team has had more come from behind victories than the 210 posted by Columbus (35 last season) and no team has produced a better winning percentage when trailing than the .353 of the Clippers (Scranton/WB ranks 2nd in win percentage at .338 and wins, 192).

Walk-Off Magic

Columbus was 5-2 in walk-off games last season, winning four thanks to the courtesy runner in extra innings (Columbus pitching did not allow a run through first 9.0IP in extras last year). On 6/29/19 at Louisville, they suffered their first walk-off loss of the year, snapping an 81 game streak without (previous loss was 5/31/18 at Buffalo). Additionally, the Clippers ranked 1st in the IL with a 16-8 (.667) record in games decided in the last at bat.

Trending Downward

While ranking in the top three of the IL with a 4.71ERA (3rd), the 2019 Clippers registered their worst mark since the 1998 season (4.85ERA). In 2018, they ranked dead last in the IL with a 4.34ERA, marking the third straight (now fourth) season that the team ERA had gotten worse. From 2011-16, the Clipper staff turned in a sub-4.00ERA five times in six seasons (zero such seasons from 1993-2010), including the best two ERAs of the past 30 years (3.33 in 2015 and 3.65 in 2016).

Doing Damage

In 2019, the Clippers ranked tied for 5th in the IL with 112RBI with the bases loaded, while carrying a .252 average (10th, 36x143, 4HR). In both 2017 and 2018, the Clippers led the IL in RBI with the bases loaded (243RBI total) and paced the circuit in grand slams (16 total, no other team had more than eight).

Free Swingers

After two straight seasons leading the IL in strikeouts, the Clipper lineup was atop the IL again in 2019 (1,392K, 60 more than 2nd place). They obliterated the franchise record (1,297, set in 2017; 2018's total of 1,290 was 2nd worst in franchise history), passing it on 8/22/19 (reduced strikeout rate to 8.3 per game after setting record, 10.1 prior). On the season a Clipper was punched out at least four times in a game on 15 occasions (**Eric Haase** led the team with three golden sombreros).

That's More Like It

In 2019, the Clippers were 50-30 (.625) when playing errorless baseball, while turning in a 31-29 (.517) mark with at least one error. Contrary to logic, in 2018 they actually had a worse winning percentage when playing mistake free (.514), than when committing at least one error (.530). The Clipper defense finished 1st in 2019 (.983) after falling to 6th in the IL in 2018, ending a run of three consecutive seasons ranked among the top three (2015-17 resulted in the three best seasons in franchise history).

One On, No Out Success

When the leadoff batter of an inning reached base in 2019, the Clippers plated him nearly 60% of the time (over 51% only once in the last six seasons, 55% in 2016). Getting more than one base was a specialty of Clipper hitters, as they led the IL with 136XBH to lead off the inning, including 54HR (led the IL, had 28 leadoff homers in 2018). From 4/13-4/20/19, the Clippers hit 16 leadoff doubles over 72 innings, including four straight innings in a win at Louisville on 4/15/19.

Good Baseball

Ernie Clement advanced a runner with a sac bunt on 5/8 at Louisville and the runner came around to score in the win. During 2019, the Clippers struggled in the bunt department (12 successes), but when the advanced runners did score, they were 7-1. During 2018, Columbus was 23-2 in games in which a run was scored after a good bunt attempt (54 successes; won 17 in a row from 4/12-7/31/18).

International Accolades

Bobby Bradley was named International League Player of the Month for May 2019, reaching base in 24 of 25 games during the month while hitting .302/.374/.740 with 12HR (led IL) and 28RBI. **Brandon Barnes**, **Eric Haase**, **Josh Smith** and **Asher Wojciechowski** were named to the 2019 IL All-Star Team and Bradley, Barnes and Haase were selected to the postseason squad.

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy makes his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's second year as a manager (first with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 38-61 (.384), 8-15 with Columbus (.348).

Returning Champion:

Though 5/26 marked Herget's International League debut, he had pitched in Huntington Park once before, as a member of the Memphis Redbirds against the Durham Bulls in the 2018 Triple-A National Championship (W, 14-5). Herget started and picked up the win for Memphis (5.1IP, 5H, 2R, 2ER, 0BB, 4K), outdueling future Clipper **Chih-Wei Hu** (2019).

That Was Fast:

Starting the season with Fargo-Moorhead in the American Association, Herget made only one start, on 5/19 vs. Cleburne (W, 7.0IP, 3H, 1R, 1ER, 1BB, 10K), before Cleveland signed him to a minor league deal on 5/25. While Herget became the first RedHawk to play for Columbus, six former Clippers have suited up for Fargo-Moorhead: **Jalal Leach**, **Mike Figga**, **Randall Simon**, **Donzell McDonald**, **Yurendell de Caster** and **Yhoxian Medina**.
