Tonight: The Lansing Lugnuts play the fourth of a six-game series at the Dayton Dragons. The Nuts are 14-7 vs. Dayton this year, including 6-3 at Day Air Ballpark, stopping Dayton's franchise record 15-game winning streak with a victory yesterday.

Last Night: Lugnuts 5, Dragons 4. With the Dragons one out away from a 3-0 win, the Nuts rallied for five runs on a Cameron Leary two-run single, Dylan Simmons wild pitch and Pedro Pineda two-run single, and Mark Adamiak stranded the game-tying run in the bottom of the ninth for Lansing's first win of the series.

On Deck: The Nuts and Dragons reconvene at 7:05 p.m. tomorrow night, and then close out the season with a Sunday matinee. The next Lugnuts home game is 211 days away, opening the club's 30th season in the Midwest League on April 2 at Jackson Field against these same Dayton Dragons.

#### Lug•Notes

Irony: The Dragons, who blew a 3-0 lead last night en route to defeat to the Lansing Lugnuts, lost for the first time since... a 3-0 defeat to the Lansing Lugnuts on August 16.

Mark it Down: After securing last night's victory, Mark Adamiak stands alone atop Minor League Baseball with 21 saves, one more than Chattanooga's Trevor Kuncl. Adamiak also leads the Midwest League with 43 appearances.

Garland vs. Dayton: Though Jake Garland made 18 appearances for the Nuts in 2023, he only faced Dayton once, on August 25 in the Gem City (6 IP, 5 H, 2 R, 0 BB, 4 K)... last year, Garland went three rounds with the Dragons: on April 27 (5 IP, 3 H, 2 R, 1 HR, 0 BB, 4 K); on June 7 (blown save, loss in relief, 2 IP, 4 H, 4 R, 2 ER, 1 BB, 0 K); and July 31 (4 IP in relief, 7 H, 7 R, 2 HR, 1 BB, 3 K)... this season, Garland was excellent on both June 5 (5 IP, 4 H, 0 R, 1 BB, 2 K) and June 28 (6 2/3 IP, 7 H, 2 R, 1 HR, 1 BB, 7 K)... in total: 6 G, 4 GS, 4.71 ERA, 28 2/3 IP, 30 H, 17 R, 15 ER, 4 BB, 20 K.

Harmon vs. Lansing: Dragons starter Johnathan Harmon first arrived in the Midwest League at the end of the 2023 season, but his first encounter with the Lugnuts came on April 24, 2024: a loss (4 IP, 6 H, 3 R, 0 BB, 5 K)... he followed up with a serious gem in Dayton on June 6 (7 IP, 5 H, 0 R, 0 BB, 6 K), before going down with an injury two batters into his next outing, June 12, and requiring Tommy John surgery... a year later, he was back and effective on August 13 at Jackson Field (5 IP, 3 H, 1 UER, 0 BB, 3 K)... in total: 3 GS, 1.69 ERA, 16 IP, 14 H, 4 R, 3 ER, 0 BB, 14 K.

Walking with Dragons: Davis Diaz drew two more walks yesterday, giving him six walks in three games and 14 walks drawn in 17 games vs. Dayton, and is batting .316 with a .444 OBP overall vs. Dragons pitching.

3... 2... 1... Contact: Lansing is the hardest team to strike out in Minor League Baseball, averaging a scant 7.16 strikeouts per game (923 in 129 games). The offense is on track for its first sub-1,000 strikeout season since 2006.

At the Plate: The Nuts' offense ranks 3rd in at-bats (4,211), 3rd in base hits (1,037), tied for 3rd in sacrifice flies (49), 3rd in HBPs (106) and 4th in batting average (.246).

Roll Call: The 2025 Lugnuts have had 51 different players, 27 position players and 24 pitchers (plus one position player pitching). 24 players have stolen a base. 19 players have homered. 12 pitchers have started a game and seven pitchers have recorded a save.

Prospecting: The Lugnuts' roster has four of MLB Pipeline's Top 30 Athletics prospects: No. 14 Steven Echavarria, No. 18 Ryan Lasko, No. 22 Carlos Pacheco and No. 24 Kenya Huggins. Additionally, No. 1 Leo De Vries, No. 3 Gage Jump, No. 8 Tommy White. No. 11 Joshua Kuroda-Grauer, No. 20 Nate Nankil and No. 21 Wei-En Lin played for the Lugnuts earlier this season and are now with Double-A Midland, with Jump scheduled to start tonight.

200 to The Show: Seven former Lugnuts players have made it to the Majors this season, most recently 2023-24 Lugnuts right-hander Luis Morales on August 1st for the A's, bringing the total to 200 Lugnuts all-time who've reach the Majors. Morales joined Max Muncy, Gunnar Hoglund, Jack Winkler, Denzel Clarke, Jack Perkins and Colby Thomas to debut in MLB this season.

### SEPTEMBER 5TH IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

- · 2010: In Game 1 of a doubleheader, Lake County's Casey Frawley became the first player to homer off the Classic Park lighthouse in center field the prize: \$1,000 split between Frawley and a random Captains fan - and the Caps beat the Lugnuts, 8-6. In Game 2, the Lugnuts' Daniel Webb came one out from throwing a seven-inning no-hitter before Chase Burnette broke it up with a single to center field. Casey Beck finished off a 3-1 Lugnuts win.
- · 2011: Billy Hamilton stole three bases, finishing the regular season with 103 steals, and Dayton edged the Lugnuts, 3-2, at Fifth Third Field. Jonathan Jones went 4-for-4 with a walk and three stolen bases in the loss. Jake Marisnick went 0-for-2 before exiting, ending his MWL-best 30-game road on-base streak. The Nuts closed the regular season with a 77-60 record, while the Dragons finished at 83-57.
- · 2018: Taylor Walls scored from second base on a Ronaldo Hernandez infield single in the top of the 10th, and the Bowling Green Hot Rods won Game 1 of the playoffs, 4-3 over the Lugnuts at Cooley Law School Stadium. The game featured two different rain delays totaling 51 minutes, and the game was played in a tense three hours and nine minutes. The Lugnuts had rallied from 1-0 and 3-1 deficits, tying the score in the fifth on an Andres Sotillo oppo home run to right-center and again in the eighth on a two-out Norberto Obeso two-run triple to right. 19-year-old Maximo Castillo allowed only two hits and one run (a Jim Haley solo homer) in 5 2/3 innings in a no-decision.

No-Hit History: On June 13, 2024, tossed five hitless innings, walking two and striking out six, before handing the baton to Grant Judkins (2 2/3) and then Colton Johnson (1 1/3) as part of the Lugnuts' 8-0 no-hitter of the Cedar Rapids Kernels, the 4th no-hitter in franchise history and the first home no-hitter since April 2003.

Jupiter? How did Jake's hometown receive its name? The Hobe tribe lived in the area; a Spanish mapmaker miswrote their name as Jobe, which was then miswritten again as Jove, which was then mistranslated to Jupiter. Jupiter is located on the eastern coast of Florida in Palm Beach County on the Atlantic Ocean. Burt Reynolds was born in Lansing and died in Jupiter.

Hometown Hero: Started four years for Jupiter High School ("Warriors," wearing green and gold)... totaled 229 strikeouts, 1.49 ERA and 1.13 WHIP... two-time FHSAA All-State... honored twice as the 9A Player of the Year... also from Jupiter H.S.: Miles Mikolas and Dante Bichette (but not son Bo, who was homeschooled and played for Lakewood High School in St. Petersburg)... the Garland family was originally from New England before moving to Florida shortly before Jake was born.

College Days: Attended the University of Miami (Coral Gables), a baseball program founded in 1940 with four NCAA championships and 25 CWS appearances... played for head coach Gino DiMare... true freshman year was the pandemic-shortened 2020 season, making six relief appearances before the year was shut down... returned in 2021 as a member of the rotation: 16 games, 13 starts, totaling a teamhigh 68 innings (5.69 ERA, 38 K, 14 BB, .286 avg.)... improved in 2022 to a 3.99 ERA in 65 1/3 innings (54 K, 11 BB, lowering home runs from 10 to four)... fifth of six Hurricanes drafted in 2022... the last Miami product drafted by the A's: Jemile Weeks (1st round, 12th overall, 2008)... two other Hurricanes previously played for the Lugnuts: 3B Mark Sobolewski and OF Adam Finnieston.

### Additional Lug•Notes

**DK** at the Helm: The 19th manager in Lugnuts history is **Darryl Kennedy**, entering his second year in the A's organization. Kennedy distinguished himself as a catcher at Manatee Community College before starring at the University of North Florida and was named an NCAA All-American in 1991 en route to North Florida's Hall of Fame, inducted in 2017. Kennedy played in the Minor Leagues for seven seasons, including parts of four seasons in Triple-A. Following his 1997 retirement, he immediately began managing, leading the Gulf Coast League Rangers to the 1998 GCL Championship. Kennedy won a second title with the GCL Rangers in 2000, moving on to stops in the Florida State League, Northwest League and Texas League through 2006. Upon joining the Royals' organization, Kennedy managed in the Appalachian League, Carolina League, Pioneer League, Arizona League and Texas League through 2020. He served as bench coach for the KBO's Hanwha Eagles from 2021 through 2023 before joining the A's as Double-A Midland's assistant hitting coach in 2024.

Filling Out the Staff: Dave Burba, the Lugnuts' pitching coach, walked on at Ohio State, pitched in the Big Ten Championship game as a freshman, was drafted by the Mariners one round after Ken Griffey, Jr. in 1987, and won 115 games in 15 MLB seasons before spending 13 seasons as a pitching coach in the Colorado Rockies' organization. Rubén Escalera is in his second year as hitting coach and his 30th season in the A's organization; he simultaneously serves as a scout for the A's in Puerto Rico. And the pride of Yuba City, Calif., Cooper Goldby comes to the Lugnuts after two seasons serving as the Dominican Summer League A's manager. The catcher/utilityman was drafted out of Lewis-Clark State in the 35th round in 2017.

**Get to Know These Names:** If the past is any indication, the Athletics' 2025 draft picks will be making a Midwest League impact sooner rather than later. This year, the A's selected Florida State southpaw **Jamie Arnold** with the 11th overall pick, following up with a pair of impact slugging outfielders: Indiana Hoosier **Devin Taylor** (the No. 30 prospect) at pick 48 and Oregon State Beaver **Gavin Turley** (the No. 78 prospect) at pick 110. Both outfielders are playing for Single-A Stockton.

The Mutant Cycle: The best individual performance of the season was achieved against the Lugnuts by now former Nut Leo De Vries, who went 5-for-5 on April 22nd for Fort Wayne, with a single, a double, two home runs, a sacrifice fly, and - in the top of the ninth inning – a go-ahead two-run triple to both give the TinCaps the win and culminate the third cycle in Fort Wayne franchise history. De Vries finished the game with eight RBIs, tying the Fort Wayne single game franchise record. De Vries also is the only player in Fort Wayne history to have two four-walk games.

Walk-Off Wonders: The Nuts walked off with a win on four different occasions this year:

- Jared Dickey's two-run single in the 12th inning to beat Great Lakes, 12-11, April 13th
- Sahid Valenzuela's RBI single in the 10th inning to beat Lake County, 1-0, May 4th

- Jared Dickey's RBI fielder's choice in the bottom of the 9th to beat West Michigan, 4-3, June 11th

All-Star Representation, Futures Edition: A pair of Lugnuts now in Double-A, Tommy White and 2025 Opening Day starter Gage Jump, represented the Athletics' organization at the 2025 All-Star Futures Game on July 12th at Truist Park. White went 0-for-1 with a strikeout while Jump needed only four pitches to strike out Padres No. 1 prospect Leo De Vries and induce a groundout from Cubs No. 1 prospect Owen Caissie – coincidentally to White at third. White, the A's No. 6 prospect, joined Luis Morales (2024), Denzel Clarke (2022), Vladimir Guerrero Jr. and Bo Bichette (2017) and Angel Perdomo (2016) as active Lugnuts to play in the Futures Game.

All-Star Representation, Present Tense: Four Lugnuts were named Major League All-Stars – American League starting shortstop Jacob Wilson (2023), A.L. starting first baseman Vladimir Guerrero, Jr. (2017), A.L. reserve catcher Alejandro Kirk (2019), and N.L. starting pitcher Matthew Boyd (2013). It was Vladdy's fifth All-Star appearance, Kirk's second, and the first apiece for Wilson and Boyd. Wilson was the first A's starting shortstop in an All-Star Game since Bert Campaneris (1974) and the first rookie starting shortstop in an All-Star Game since Ron Hansen in 1960.

Still Shoving: 45-year-old Rich Hill pitched for the Lugnuts in 2003 (0-1, 2.76, 15 G, 4 GS, 29 1/3 innings, 14 H, 36 walks, 50 strikeouts, 9 wild pitches). On July 13, Hill struck out 10 Toledo Mud Hens in five innings, becoming the first 45-year-old to strike out at least 10 batters in a game since the Texas Rangers' Nolan Ryan whiffed double-digit Athletics on August 6, 1992. Hill is in his 20th professional season and with his 14th different MLB organization.

The Butler Did What: 2021-2022 Lugnut Lawrence Butler led off July 8th's game for the A's vs. Atlanta with an inside-the-park home run, the Athletics' first inside-the-park homer since Mark Kotsay achieved the feat on October 4, 2006; the first leadoff inside-the-park home run for the A's since Elmer Valo in 1943; and the first A's player to have both an inside-the-park home run and an over-the-fence home run in the same game since Billy Williams on August 23, 1975. When the Giants' Patrick Bailey delivered a walk-off inside-the-park home run to end the night in baseball, it was the first time in Major League Baseball history that a leadoff inside-the-parker and a walk-off inside-the-parker were hit on the same day.

**Dubious History:** 2018 Lugnut **Vinny Capra** was former Great Lakes Loon Clayton Kershaw's 3,000th strikeout victim on July 2. Capra, a 20th-rounder from Richmond in 2018, had been claimed off waivers by the White Sox from the Milwaukee Brewers on May 15.

Simply Electric: 2022 Lugnut Denzel Clarke won the MLB Chevrolet Electric Play of the Week each of his first four weeks in the Majors.

**Happy Trails:** 2012 Nut **Kevin Pillar** announced his retirement on July 2 following a 13-year playing career with 10 different teams. A 32nd-round selection in 2011, Pillar went 6-for-6 with a grand slam in a 6-RBI night at the Dayton Dragons on May 13, 2012, and found a fire extinguisher in his locker after the game. He went on to be the 2012 Midwest League Most Valuable Player.

If Lansing's July 4 crowd is excluded, the May 28 attendance would rank larger than any crowd in the Midwest League this season except for a West Michigan Whitecaps gate of 9,049 on June 7.
