HARD TO BEET: Entering today, Clayton Beeter leads the Eastern League with a 2.34 ERA, while his 63 K and .206 BAA tie him for 4th. After going the first 54 appearances of his career without a win, Beeter enters today on his second two-game win streak of the season.

GIVING THEM FITTS: With his 8.0 IP last night, Richard Fitts matched his career-high mark (8/27/22 vs. HIC in High-A) and matched the most IP by any Patriots starter in a game since Somerset became affiliated with the Yankees in 2021. Fitts' 59.1 IP this year are the most of any Eastern League pitcher. Fitts' 10 strikeouts matched the career-high mark he set in his second Double-A start on 4/12/23 @BNG. Fitts joins Clayton Beeter (11) and Blane Abeyta (11) as the third Patriots starter this week to set or match his career-high in strikeouts.

KINGS OF K: Somerset has struck out double digit batters in all five games this series. In total, Somerset's staff has struck out 59 batters in five games. All five Patriots starters this week have either set or matched their season-highs in strikeouts.

SILENTLY SKILLED: In 10 games since being promoted to Somerset, Aaron Palensky is 3-for-25 (.120 AVG), but he has a .410 OBP (9 BB, 4 HBP). All three of Palensky's hits have been XBH.

SUMMER OF SWEENEY: Entering today, Trey Sweeney is on a season-long 8-game hit streak, one shy of the longest by any Patriot this season. During the streak, Sweeney is 10-for-36 (.278 BA), 3 RBI, 3 R, HR, 2 2B, 3 BB, 1 HBP, and 1 SB.

THREE IS COMPANY: On Friday night, the Patriots homered 3+ times in a game for the 12th time this season (10-2 in such games). The performance snapped a season-long streak of 17 straight games without 3+ homers. Jasson Dominguez has partaken in half (6) of the Patriots' 3+ home run games.

TONIGHT'S PATRIOTS STARTER



RHP #29 CLAYTON BEETER

CAREER: (3-11, 3.74 ERA, 173.1 IP, 259 K, 93 BB)

HT-WT: 6'2" | 230

2023: In Beeter's second start of the season (55th career game) on 4/14 @BNG, he earned his first professional win with a career-high 6.2 IP, breaking his previous career mark of 5 IP, set in his final two starts of 2022. In the performance, Beeter started the Patriots' second shutout win of the season.

2022: Spent the beginning of his second season with the Dodgers in Double-A Tulsa making 18 appearances (16 GS), continuing to serve primarily as an opener, working no more than 4 IP in any of his starts, posting an 0-3 record with a 5.75 ERA and 15.33 K/9 IP. Beeter was acquired by the Yankees from the Dodgers hours before the 2022 MLB trade deadline on August 2 as the lone piece received in exchange for outfielder Joey Gallo. At the time of the trade, Beeter was ranked the Dodgers' No. 21 prospect by Baseball America, which credited him with having the Best Curveball in the Dodgers MiLB system. Beeter made his Yankees organizational debut with Double-A Somerset on 8/10/22, pitching three scoreless innings in which he posted six strikeouts and allowed only one baserunner (BB). In seven starts to end the season with Somerset, he posted a 2.13 ERA over 25.1 IP with 41 K and 11 BB (14.57 K/9 IP). Across his 7 GS with Somerset to end 2022, Beeter set and matched a new career-high 9 K on 8/27/22 vs. NH and 9/3/22 @BNG. Over this stretch, he also set a new career high in IP three different times, including in his lone postseason start on 9/22/22 vs. POR. He allowed 2 R (1 ER) with 6 K over 5 IP, getting credit for a no-decision in Somerset's first home playoff win as the Yankees' Double-A affiliate.

2021: Made his pro debut in 2021 and posted a 3.44 ERA between High-A Great Lakes and Double-A Tulsa, working mostly as an opener, going no more than 3.1 IP in any outing.

College: Beeter was drafted out of Texas Tech University, where he redshirted his freshman year. In his redshirt freshman year as the Red Raiders' closer in 2019, Beeter led Texas Tech to the 2019 College World Series semifinals behind 21 appearances with an 0-3 record, 3.48 ERA, 8 SV and 40 K, compared to 20 BB in 20.2 IP. During the Covid-shortened 2020 season, his redshirt sophomore year, Beeter became Texas Tech's Friday night starter. In 4 GS, he went 2-1 with a 2.14 ERA and 33 K, compared to 4 BB in 21.0 IP, before the remainder of the season was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Personal Notes: Attended Birdville High School in Colleyville, TX. Beeter had Tommy John surgery in high school during December of 2017, as well as a follow-up arthroscopic elbow procedure seven months later. As a senior in high school, he earned first-team All-District honors with a 0.81 ERA and 106 K over 55 IP. At the plate, he had a .417 AVG with 2 HR. A two-sport athlete, Beeter also lettered in football three years during high school.

Career Notes: Initially drafted by the Los Angeles Dodgers in Competitive Balance Round-B of the 2020 MLB Draft (pick 66 overall), Beeter signed for an over-slot amount of \$1,196,500. Born and raised in Fort Worth, TX, Beeter was a Texas Rangers fan, who grew up watching Joey Gallo: the player he was eventually traded for on 8/2/22 from the Dodgers to the New York Yankees.

RAUL DOMINGUEZ: Manager (1st year)

Dominguez begins his 1st season as manager for the Somerset Patriots, 9th overall as a manager and 17th overall coaching in the Yankees organization. He spent the past two seasons (2021-2022) as a defensive coach for Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre and was assigned to the same post for 2020, before the minor league season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. From 2012-2015, his teams finished at least 10 games over .500, including reaching the DSL semifinals in 2012 and 2015. An outfielder during his playing days, Dominguez signed with the Yankees as an undrafted free agent in 2001 and spread four minor league seasons for New York between the DSL and the GCL. 2023: Started this season on the injured list, after a fracture of his 12th rib upon reporting to Tampa for Spring Training. Wells was reinstated to the Patriots on 5/2/23 following a five-game rehab assignment in Single-A Tampa. Entering the 2023 season, Wells has been recognized by Baseball America for being the "Best Power Hitter" in the Yankees minor league system.

2022: Began 2022 by playing 28 games for High-A Hudson Valley, where he slashed .323/.429/.576 (1.005 OPS) with 6 HR, 16 RBI and 21 R. After a groin injury that landed him on the IL in May, Wells returned to playing with Single-A Tampa from 6/25-7/4, spending eight games with the Tarpons and hitting .231 with a .950 OPS and 2 HR. Wells was promoted to Somerset on 7/5/22, ending the season with 55 games for the Patriots, plus the postseason. From the point Wells joined Somerset on 7/5/22 through the end of the season (playoffs included), he led all Eastern League batters with 51 RBIs. In total, Wells led the Patriots in the following offensive categories from the time he joined the team through the end of the regular season: AVG (.261), HR (12), RBI (43), SLG (.479), OPS (.839), H (55) and TB (101). Overall, Wells ranked among the Yankees' minor league leaders in HR (20, 4th) and RBI (65, 3rd). During his time playing for the Patriots in 2022, Wells lived at teammate Anthony Volpe's house in Watchung, alongside teammates Max Burt and Blake Perkins. Along Somerset's 2022 Eastern League Championship run, during the postseason Wells ranked 2nd on the Patriots in RBI (8), XBH (3), TB (12) and H (7), trailing only Jasson Dominguez in each category.

2021: In Wells' pro debut season during 2021, he combined to hit .264/.390/.476 in 103 games with an OPS of .886, 16 HR, 76 RBI and 82 R between Single-A Tampa (65 games) and High-A Hudson Valley (38 games). Wells ranked among the Yankees' minor leaguers in BB (2nd), R (2nd), RBI (3rd), OPS (4th), 3B (T-4th) and XBH (5th). Following the 2021 MiLB season, Wells played for the Surprise Saguaros of the Arizona Fall League. Across in 18 games during the fall, Wells ranked 6th in the AFL with a 1.034 OPS, adding 2 HR and 14 R. His 18 RBI were tied for the most of any catcher in the AFL. For his efforts, he was named an AFL Rising Star. He was recognized by Baseball America for having the "Best Strike-Zone Discipline" of any Yankees minor leaguer in 2021.

College: Wells spent two seasons with the University of Arizona Wildcats, playing in 71 games and hitting .357 with a 1.036 OPS with 7 HR, 74 RBI and 85 R. Among his honors while at Arizona, Wells was first named Pac-12 Freshman of the Year in 2019, when he was also a Freshman All-American honoree per Collegiate Baseball, Baseball America, NCBWA and Rawlings. In 2020, Wells was a Collegiate Baseball Second-team All-American and was named to the Buster Posey National Collegiate Catcher of the Year Award watch list (top NCAA catcher). During the summer of 2019, Wells played in the Cape Cod League with the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox. In 42 regular season games, where he was named a Cap Cod League All-Star starter, after hitting .308 with 7 HR, 26 RBI and 23 R. Wells was named a 2019 Cape Cod League Outstanding Pro Prospect.

Personal Notes

Wells spent his preps career at powerhouse Bishop Gorman High School in his hometown of Las Vegas, combining to hit .428 with 87 RBI and 85 during his preps career. He was named team captain and Most Valuable Player as a junior and senior. As a junior, Wells was the 2017 Nevada Gatorade Player of the Year. Upon graduating high school, Wells was originally selected by the Yankees in the 35th round of the 2018 MLB Draft. After electing to play college ball at Arizona, the Yankees selected him again in the first round of the draft two years later, 28th overall. For the second consecutive season, Wells is living with close friend and former teammate Anthony Volpe's family in Watchung, New Jersey.

Career Notes

Selected by the Yankees in the 1st round of the 2020 MLB Draft, making him the fourth Yankees catcher chosen first round of the MLB First-Year Player Draft since its inception in 1965, joining Anthony Seigler (2018), David Parrish (2000) and Thurman Munson (1968).
