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Spring Training **TICKET HOLDER GUIDE**

Dear Valued Ticket Holder,

Thank you for your continued support of the Mets as we embark on this unique Spring Training season. As you visit Clover Park during the month of March, you will notice several changes to both the ballpark and the games themselves that have been designed to promote the health and safety of all fans, players and staff. The following is a brief summary of these changes.

HEALTH & SAFETY PROTOCOLS

Clover Park will be operating in accordance with all MLB, local health department and CDC guidelines to ensure that all fans, players and staff are safe.

- Fans will be required to wear masks that cover their nose and mouth at all times on ballpark property other than when actively eating or drinking at their ticketed seat. Stadium ushers and staff will monitor the crowd and ask all fans to comply with the safety protocols.
- Hand sanitizer stations and social distancing markers have been installed throughout Clover Park and staff will continually disinfect and sanitize restrooms and common areas.
- Concession stands will be open with health and safety protocols strictly enforced. Every location will have a touchless payment option and the Mets encourage fans to use credit or debit cards at all locations.

GAME LENGTH

- Games that occur from the start of Spring Training through and including March 13th will be scheduled as 7-inning games, and may be shortened to 5-inning games (or lengthened to 9-inning games) upon mutual agreement of both managers. Managers will make that decision before 5 p.m. on the day before the game.
- Games that occur on or after March 14th shall be 9-inning games (and, upon mutual agreement of both managers, can be shortened to 7-inning games). Once again, managers will make that decision before 5 p.m. on the day before the game.

GAME LENGTH

- For all Spring Training games through and including March 13th, the “Retiring the Side” rule shall be relaxed, such that defensive managers may end an inning prior to three outs following any completed plate appearance, provided the pitcher has thrown at least 20 pitches.
- Starting with all Spring Training games beginning on March 14th the “Three Batter Minimum” rule will be enforced.
- Throughout all Spring Training games, pitchers who are removed during any game may re-enter at a later point during that same game. This exception applies to pitchers only.
- All Spring Training games, regardless of scheduled length (5 innings, 7 innings, or 9 innings), may end in a tie after the scheduled length of the game has been played.

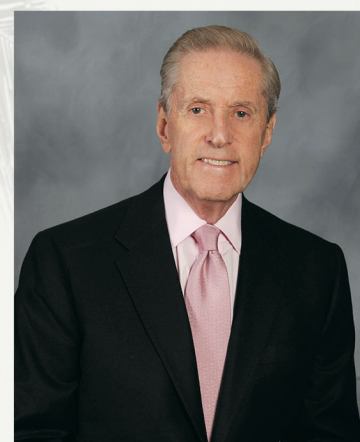

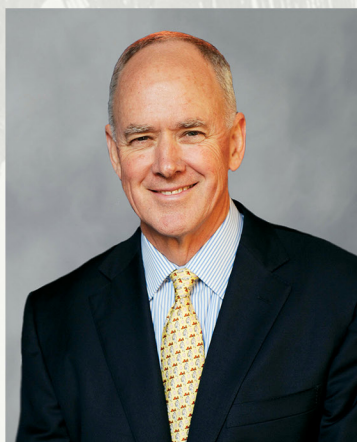

A - Z GUIDE

ALCOHOL SALES

Beer may be purchased at all concessions stands, the Jim Beam Bourbon Bar and at portable locations along the ballpark's main concourse. Liquor drinks may also be purchased at the Jim Beam Bourbon Bar and the Mulligan's Bullpen Bar. The Clover Park suites offer a full range of beer, wine and spirits for suite patrons only. All alcohol sales conclude at the end of the seventh inning or at any time prior to the end of the seventh inning deemed appropriate by the St. Lucie Mets. Alcohol may only be purchased and consumed by adults 21 and older and proper ID is required. The Mets reserve the right to refuse alcohol sales to any guest for any reason.

ANIMALS

The only animals allowed in the ballpark are certified service animals. Owners must have appropriate certification in their possession.

ATM

There will be no ATM access at Clover Park in 2021.

BANNED ITEMS

The following items are not allowed inside the stadium: bags, full-sized baseball bats, glass bottled, metal cans, alcohol, illegal substances, outside food or beverage, brooms, poles, selfie sticks, video cameras, professional cameras for commercial use, tripods, offensive signage, signage displayed for commercial use, weapons (regardless of permit), pets (except service animals), noise making devices, (air horns, cowbells, instruments), personalized recreational vehicles (skateboards, roller blades, wheeled footwear, bicycles, hover boards, razor boards, segways), drones, folding chairs and stools.

BANNERS/SIGNS

Fans may display signs that are in good taste and that do not pose an inconvenience to other fans. No signs or banners may be hung on/in the field of play or contain advertising without the express written consent of the St. Lucie Mets.

BOX OFFICE

Tickets for all spring training games are SOLD OUT. The Box Office will be open Monday - Friday, 10 a.m. - 4 p.m.

CAMERAS

Cameras are allowed in the ballpark during all regular season games as long as they are not professional cameras and not for commercial use. Video cameras are not allowed.

CANCELLED GAMES/RAIN DELAYS

In the event of a cancelled game, guests in attendance should be given the following information:

- Paid Tickets
- Bring ticket stubs to Box Office and exchange for future game based upon availability or receive a refund for the printed value of the ticket by filling out the Spring Training cancelled game form ([click here to download](#))
- Complimentary Tickets
- No refunds, no exchanges

CARRY-IN ITEMS

Bags will NOT be allowed into Clover Park in 2021 (this includes purses). The only exceptions are diaper bags are for guests accompanied by their babies, medical supply bags or a small clutch.

CONCESSIONS

Clover Park concessions are run by Aramark, which offers a variety of unique concession items and traditional ballpark fare. There are four full-service food and beverage stands with a full menu of food items, including (but not limited to) hot dogs, nachos, pizza, chicken strips, fries, snacks, and beverages. These food stands are located behind home plate, down the first base line, next to the Left Field Party Terrace, and on the hill. Vendor food such as funnel cakes, cotton candy, and Italian ice are located through the concourse.

DIRECTIONS

From Interstate 95, take Exit 121 St. Lucie West. Travel East on St. Lucie West Blvd. Make your first left onto Peacock Blvd. Clover Park will be on your right.

DISABLED GUESTS

Guests with disabilities are recommended to contact the St. Lucie Mets at (772) 871-2115 prior to attending games to learn more about the services and seating options offered to guests at Clover Park.

FAMILY RESTROOMS

Family restroom facilities are located on the first base and third base lines of the concourse.

FIRST AID

The Mets First Aid Station is located along the 3rd base concourse. For all injuries and accidents, please report to the First Aid Station, or ask an usher or stadium staff member to call for First Aid. In case of an emergency, please seek assistance prior to calling 911.

FOLDING LAWN CHAIRS/STOOLS

Folding chairs or stools of any kind are not permitted inside the stadium.

FOUL BALLS

Fans may keep foul balls. However, fans must not enter the playing field to retrieve balls or interfere with balls in play. Because of the close proximity of the field, all fans are cautioned to stay alert for thrown bats and thrown or batted balls, which may land in seating areas. Major League Baseball, the City of Port St. Lucie, the participating clubs, their agents, players, and other individuals are not liable for injuries resulting from such causes. Please be alert at all times.

GAME LENGTH

Games that occur from the start of Spring Training through and including March 13th will be scheduled as 7-inning games, and may be shortened to 5-inning games (or lengthened to 9-inning games) upon mutual agreement of both managers. Managers will make that decision before 5 p.m. on the day before the game. Games that occur on or after March 14th shall be 9-inning games (and, upon mutual agreement of both managers, can be shortened to 7-inning games). Once again, managers will make that decision before 5 p.m. on the day before the game.

GAME TIMES & GATE OPENINGS

Most spring training home games start at 1:10 p.m. Gates open at 11:30 a.m. for all 1:10 p.m. games. The game on March 26 begins at 6:10 p.m. with gates opening at 4:30 p.m.

GUEST INTERFERENCE

Guests are not to access the field at any time or interfere with players, equipment, or balls in play. Any guest entering the field of play without permission will be subject to immediate ejection and criminal prosecution.

LOST & FOUND

Lost items may be claimed at the Box Office during games or during regular business hours.

MERCHANDISE/SOUVENIRS

Merchandise can be purchased during games from the Mets Fan Shop located behind home plate and the main Mets Fan Shop located next to the ticket office. The Fan Shop is open Monday-Friday from 10 a.m. - 4 p.m. It is also open at 10 a.m. on home game days.

OUTSIDE FOOD & BEVERAGE

There is no outside food or beverage of any kind permitted with the exception of one sealed bottled water. The Mets do not allow glass bottled or thermoses of any size to be brought into the ballpark. Fans bringing in baby food or medically-related food or beverages should contact the Mets prior to attending.

PARKING

Parking during Spring Training is \$10 for cars and \$20 for large RV's and buses.

RESTROOMS

Both men's and women's restroom facilities are located on the first base and third base lines of the concourse. There are also restrooms on the Seacoast Sun Deck of the Hill.

RULE MODIFICATIONS

- For all Spring Training games through and including March 13th, the "Retiring the Side" rule shall be relaxed, such that defensive managers may end an inning prior to three outs following any completed plate appearance, provided the pitcher has thrown at least 20 pitches.
- Starting with all Spring Training games beginning on March 14th the "Three Batter Minimum" rule will be enforced.
- Throughout all Spring Training games, pitchers who are removed during any game may re-enter at a later point during that same game. This exception applies to pitchers only.
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SECURITY

Security team members, St. Lucie County Sheriff's Office and City of Port St. Lucie Police are present at all spring training home games. Any emergencies should be reported immediately to an usher, staff member or security personnel.

SMOKING

There is no smoking allowed inside the complex. This includes electronic cigarettes and vape pens.

STROLLERS

Umbrella strollers are allowed in the stadium but must be collapsible and fit under a seat. Umbrella strollers may not be left unattended on the concourse areas. Umbrella strollers are the responsibility of their owner and are not the responsibility of the Mets.

UMBRELLAS

Guests may bring small tote umbrellas into the stadium as long as they do not interfere with other fans. Golf umbrellas are not permitted.

WILL CALL

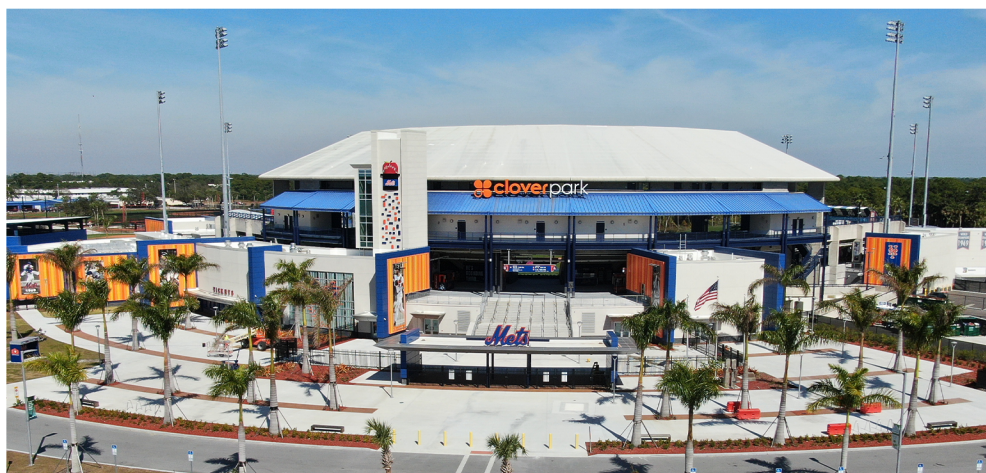
Tickets purchased in advance may be picked up at the Will Call window located at the Box Office in front of the stadium. Guests may also leave tickets for other parties at Will Call.

2021 SEASON PREVIEW

A POSITIONAL OUTLOOK FOR THE METS

Change has come to the New York Mets in major ways this year. The organization has a new owner in Steve Cohen. Sandy Alderson has returned to the organization as team President. Zack Scott is the new acting General Manager. And then there are the players. Nearly half of the 40-man roster has churned over from 2020.

In the first year of the new leadership regime, the Mets have upped spending and made significant trades to improve the club. All the offseason moves add up to an intriguing and different looking team in 2021.

Expectations are high and rightly so. Several baseball experts predict a playoff berth. Baseball Prospectus' PECOTA rankings project the Mets to win 96 games. Projections and expectations are fun for fans, but in the end it is up to the players on the field to turn those into a reality. Here is a positional outlook for the Mets in 2021.



CATCHER

The Mets made upgrading catcher a top priority in the offseason and they addressed the decision quickly with the December signing of free agent James McCann. The 30-year-old backstop came up with Detroit before becoming an All Star for the White Sox in 2019. McCann is lauded for his defense, something the Mets have lacked from their primary catcher the last few years. McCann is also well regarded for his leadership and ability to connect with his pitching staff. McCann's offense has improved the last two seasons. In a shortened 31-game season last year, he hit seven home runs, drove in 31 runs and had an OPS of .896. McCann hit .273 in his 2019 All Star season.

Tomas Nido is slated to be the No. 2 catcher, a role he has held the last couple of seasons. Nido is known for his defensive prowess and has an excellent report with his pitchers.

FIRST BASE

The Mets are in great shape at this position. Pete Alonso, the 2019 NL Rookie of the Year and home run leader, figures to get the bulk of the work at first. Alonso did not meet his own expectations in the 2020 season, but he was still able to bash 16 home runs in only 57 games in his second year. Alonso has a total of 69 homers in just 806 career at-bats. Expect him to revert back to his 2019 form in a more normal season.

Dominic Smith continues to see an upward trajectory in his Mets career. With the benefit of the DH in the National League last year, Smith had a career season. He hit .316, bopped 10 home runs and drove in 42 runs in just 50 games. Smith received MVP votes. Even if there is no DH in 2021, Smith's bat and solid glove make him a candidate to get work at first base.

Veteran infielder Jose Martinez was signed as a free agent. The former Cardinal and Ray has a .289 lifetime average and 43 homers in five seasons.

SECOND BASE

The door has been open for Jeff McNeil to anchor the second base position, which has proven over time to be his best position. McNeil has been deployed all over the diamond since arriving in the big leagues in 2018, but 103 games at second base are the most he's played at a single position. His fielding percentage as a second baseman is .989 (four errors in 358 chances). McNeil followed up his 2019 All Star campaign with a solid season in 2020. After a slow start he came alive late in the year and finished with a slash line of .311/.383/.454.

Slick field Luis Guillorme could receive a boost in playing time at second base and elsewhere in the infield after the Mets traded Amed Rosario and Andres Gimenez to Cleveland in the Francisco Lindor and Carlos Carrasco deal.

Veteran Jonathan Villar was signed to a one-year deal earlier this year and will provide depth at second as well as other infield positions.



THIRD BASE

Third base has seen a rotating cast of players since the end of David Wright's days as an everyday player. Perhaps 2021 will bring stability to the position. Similar to Jeff McNeil at second base, J.D. Davis might find himself getting the bulk of the playing time at third base due to circumstance. Davis got most of his reps in 2020 at the hot corner (34 games) and no one else on the team played as many games at third. As the season wore on, Davis played better and better as he got more comfortable. The Mets hope that trend continues. Davis will hope to rebound his bat to his 2019 version.

Guillorme, Villar and McNeil are other candidates who could receive playing time at the hot corner



SHORTSTOP

The Mets made improving their team up the middle a high priority this offseason. They pulled it off in a big way with the acquisition of superstar Francisco Lindor. The four-time All Star with the Indians is entering his seventh season and at 27-years-old entering the prime of his career.

Lindor is a two-time Gold Glove winner and he has stolen 99 base. His speed, athleticism, quickness and defense will be a welcome addition. Lindor has tremendous pop for a shortstop, already accumulating 138 career home runs and an .833 OPS.

The Mets two previous shortstops – Gimenez and Rosario – are gone to Cleveland. That leaves Guillorme and Villar as depth options to spell Lindor.

CENTER FIELD

Brandon Nimmo was a breakout star for the Mets in 2018, suffered through an injury-plagued 2019, then returned to good health and production in 2020. The Mets improved up the middle with McCann and Lindor. Now they need Nimmo to take his game to the next level to match that strength up the middle. Nimmo has the combination of power, on-base ability and speed that can make him a dynamic player.

The Mets have quality depth and experience behind Nimmo in new acquisitions Kevin Pillar and Albert Almora, Jr. Pillar, an eight-year veteran, has played 759 games in center field for Toronto, Boston and Colorado. Almora spent his first five seasons with the Cubs, where he logged 427 games in center.



LEFT FIELD

With the additions of Pillar and Almora, the Mets have enough outfield depth that they can piece together different combinations several times per week. But if Nimmo is playing center field regularly and the NL does not use the DH then there's a good chance Dominic Smith could get a sizeable workload in left field.

Smith's bat is too much of a weapon to have him as a bench player so the Mets will deploy him in left field on most nights when Alonso is at first. Smith started 27 games in left field in 2019 and 21 games in left last year.



RIGHT FIELD

Michael Conforto is fast becoming one of the best players in all of baseball and is the Mets surefire everyday right fielder. His career continues to ascend after an All Star appearance in 2017, a career year in 2019 and an impressive shortened 2020 season in which he had a slash line of .322/.412/.515 over 54 games. Conforto is entering an important season. He has a leadership role on the team and is headed towards free agency at the end of the year. Expect a monster performance in 2021.

Nimmo, Pillar, Almora and Jose Martinez can also play right field on days Conforto is out.

STARTING ROTATION

Throughout the offseason Sandy Alderson, Zack Scott and the Mets baseball operations department improved the quality and depth of the Mets rotation through free agency and trades. The revamped rotation is considered one of the best in baseball.

The leader of the group is Jacob deGrom, who is widely viewed as the best pitcher in baseball and the undisputed ace of the Mets. After winning back-to-back Cy Young awards in 2018 and 2019, deGrom finished in third last year.

The No. 2 spot in the rotation could be filled by either Marcus Stroman or Carlos Carrasco. After opting out of the 2020 season, Stroman accepted the Mets qualifying offer and is pitching on a one-year deal. The Mets traded for the former Blue Jays All Star at the 2019 trade deadline. In limited time with the Mets, Stroman owns a 3.77 ERA and 60 strikeouts in 11 starts.

Carrasco joins the Mets from Cleveland. He was acquired in the same trade that brought over Lindor. Carrasco was named the 2019 AL Comeback Player of the Year after overcoming his battle with Leukemia. Carrasco was excellent in limited time last year, posting a 2.91 ERA in 12 starts. He struck out 82 batters in 68 innings.

Taijuan Walker signed a three-year deal with the Mets just days into camp. Walker spent his first eight years in the big leagues with Seattle, Arizona and Toronto. Like Carrasco, he too had an impressive shortened 2020. Between the Mariners and Blue Jays he went 4-3 with a 2.70 ERA in 11 starts.

With deGrom, Stroman, Carrasco and Walker taking the top four spots, there is expected to be heavy competition for the fifth and final rotation spot between David Peterson, Joey Lucchesi and Jordan Yamamoto. All three have major league experience but none have an extensive track record. Peterson might be seen as the

leader for the fifth spot, as he was impressive as a rookie for the Mets in 2020 with a 3.44 ERA in 10 games (nine starts). Lucchesi, who was acquired from San Diego in a three-team trade, has 58 career starts. He only pitched in three games last year. Yamamoto made 18 starts for the Marlins the last two years and has a career 6.20 ERA.

The two pitchers who don't make the cut will provide rotation depth at Triple-A Syracuse along with Sean Reid-Foley, Jerad Eickhoff, Franklyn Kilome, Corey Oswalt and Thomas Szapucki.



BULLPEN

Just like with the rotation, the Mets baseball operations department set out to improve the quality of depth in the bullpen this offseason. It started almost immediately with the signing of righty Trevor May, who was the first big acquisition of the Steve Cohen era. May was excellent with his original team, the Twins. Over the last two seasons with Minnesota, May appeared in 89 games, pitched 87.2 innings, struck out 117 and had a 3.18 ERA. He is likely to be used in a prime setup role.

The Mets have not officially announced Edwin Díaz as the team's closer, but Díaz is treating his spring training like it's his job to lose. Díaz has had his ups and down in two seasons in Queens but has some of the best pure stuff among all relief pitchers.

The Mets were dealt a blow when Seth Lugo underwent an elbow procedure before camp that will keep him out of the early portion of the season. However, the Mets still have experienced veterans to shoulder the load in Dellin Betances and Jeurys Familia.

A key lefty signing in the offseason was Aaron Loup, formerly of Tampa Bay. Loup was instrumental in the Rays 2020 postseason success. He did not allow a run in four appearances in the ALCS against the Astros.

Robert Gsellman and Miguel Castro also figure to be impact relievers.

Other candidates to make the bullpen are Jacob Barnes, Sam McWilliams, Drew Smith and Stephen Tarpley.

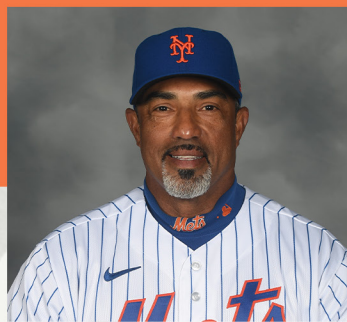

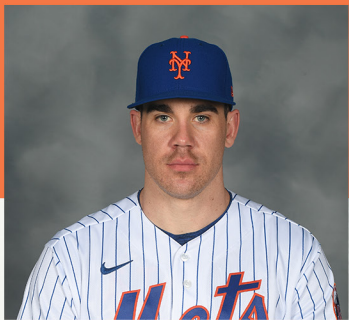
