Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send LHP **Logan Allen** to the mound tonight, as they attempt to take a 3-2 series lead (have not lost a series since 4/7-4/12 at Worcester). Lehigh Valley will counter with RHP **Chuck King**. Columbus is 40-23 (.635) versus right handers this year. King has never pitched against the Clippers in his career (tonight is 13th career game in the IL).

vs. the IronPigs

Columbus has won 47 of the last 80G (.588), including playoffs. All-time in Allentown, the Clippers are 35-26 (.574), including playoffs (2-0 in '11 GC Finals). This year marks the second straight season the Clippers have travelled to Allentown and the third time since the expansion of the IL (Lehigh has been to Columbus once, 2024). **Dom Nunez** has 2HR and 7RBI in 8G against the Pigs in his career.

Outliers

The Clippers reached 50 wins last night, having done so with negative differentials in runs (-3; of eight teams with at least 47 wins, only team in the red, all others at least +28 and averaging +55), hits (-2; other seven teams average +42) and homers (-2; other seven at +21). Last night's victory saw Columbus allow 12 hits, marking the 16th win when the opponents reach double digits (16-16, .500, 1st in IL).

Ingle is Back

Cooper Ingle's two week stint in the Majors (.095/.208/.095 in 7G) dropped him below qualification for rate statistics in the IL this year (debuted as the leader on 6/7). Including a 4x4 (3HR) game on 6/18 vs. Scranton/WB, he has slumped to a line of .235/.316/.500 in his last 24G with Columbus. At catcher, Ingle has a 1.293OPS (11HR) in 31G (.586OPS and 2HR in 20G between DH and LF).

Angel Ascendant

Angel Genao has a 1.148OPS in the last 21G, batting .421 (32x76) while drawing 16BB in 95PA (17%) over that time (11BB in 139PA, 8%, in first 35G with Columbus). Genao has 20 runs in those 21G, collecting 13RBI and 10XBH (.632SLG). Among IL hitters with at least 35PA from the 7th inning on, Genao has the 2nd best OPS (1.204; 1st- **Travis Bazzana**, 11th- **Kody Huff**, 12th- **Cooper Ingle**).

Free for All

CJ Kayfus collected the first multi-steal game of his career on Wednesday, when the Clippers had 7SB as a team, and he added another last night to establish his career high (6). Columbus has 9SB in the last 3G, following 16SB in the 28G prior (had 87SB in first 59G before the slowdown). In his last 7G, Kayfus is 7x25 with 3XBH (.520SLG; was 10x56, .179, with 2HR and a .286SLG in 15G prior).

Roughing It

Since doubling twice on 6/25 at Omaha, **George Valera** is hitting .122 (5x41, all singles), while scoring twice and driving in a pair over his last 11G. He has drawn only 5BB during the slump (3BB on Sunday) against 10K in 46PA. Valera has not homered since 5/19 vs. Louisville (91AB since) and has just 2HR in his last 43G (153AB, .314SLG). Additionally, he has no multi-RBI games since 5/30 (22G).

Another Personal Best

Kody Huff tied his career high in steals (7) on 6/28, having already hit top marks in triples (4), homers (11), runs (51), RBI (50), hit streak (12G, 5/1-5/16) and on base streak (20G, 6/2-6/28). He enters tonight a pair of walks short of his personal best (44BB in 2024 with Akron). All of that damage has come in just 290PA (averaged 398PA from 2024-25, when he set all his prior career highs).

Rare Company

Dating to the nightcap vs. Scranton/WB on 6/19, **Milan Tolentino** is 19x56 (.339) in his last 17G, collecting 10XBH (.607SLG) and 12RBI (was 5x39, .128, in 13G prior). Over his last 10G, Tolentino has drawn 10BB to only 7K (43PA; had 8BB and 42K in previous 33G, 114PA). He played in his 200th game as a Clipper on Thursday and is one of five with at least 30HR and 30SB (only two are 40-40).

Frias Feeling It

Dayan Frias tripled and walked last night to extend his on base streak to 14G (.351OBP since 6/18). He is hitting .275 (14x51) during the streak, after having gone 2x27 (.074) in his previous 15G (.194OBP from 5/6-6/16). Additionally, he has a .431SLG in his last 14G (.220SLG prior). Frias has been sitting in the .290s with his season OBP for the last three weeks, having last been above .300 on 4/12.

This Date in Clipper History

7/11/2018

Huntington Park hosted the Triple-A All-Star Game, with the PCL coming out on top, 12-7. The game featured six Columbus players, as **Brandon Barnes**, **Yu Chang**, **Eric Haase**, **Francisco Mejia**, **Mitch Talbot** and **Adam Wilk** all made the squad, joining former Clipper **Chad Huffman** ('11-12; won HR Derby). In the game, Haase electrified the hometown crowd with a 2-run HR.

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,453 to 1,400).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 131-109 (.546) in pitch reviews, with batters going 67-71 (.486) and pitchers/catchers going 64-38 (.627). They have run out of challenges in 39G and have not challenged in 4G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .571), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 816, would rank as 4th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 112 through the first 90G (on pace for 185SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 30CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the 2nd most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (50; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 137 runs while crafting a .919OPS (nearly 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 72 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +65 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 208-135 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 79 grand slams and 1,960RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.21 through the first 90G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). However, the staff is pacing to give up only 180HR (average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 7th in the IL this year (.981), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 50G this season (30-20, .600), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the most last at bat wins this year (14, tied with Syracuse) while playing in the most games decided in the last at bat (25). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 98G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 48-50 (.490, 14th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 436-446 (.494), 406-400 with Columbus (.504).

Workhorse

Allen is the only Clipper averaging over 80 pitches a start this season, at 86.9 (along with **Ryan Webb**, only pitchers to throw more than 90 in a game multiple times). Averaging almost 93 pitches per outing in the Majors last season, Allen hit triple digits six times (Columbus has not had a pitcher reach 100 since **Peyton Battenfield** on 9/2/22, 554G ago).

On Guard(ians):

In two stints in the Majors this season (27th man in a DH on 4/5 and a two day excursion from 5/24-5/25), Allen has appeared once for Cleveland, closing out the game on 5/25 vs. Washington (4.0IP, 5H, 0R, 0ER, 1BB, 7K). The game was his second in relief at the Major League level (once last season) and he has just 4G out of the bullpen in the minors (all on starter's rest, three piggybacking rehabbing Major Leaguers).

Stellar Support:

Through 15GS, the bullpen has graced Allen with a 2.35ERA in relief (53.2IP, 14ER), stranding three of six runners inherited. The defense has committed only 11E in Allen's starts, while the offense has put forward 5.4 runs per game. That all adds up to a 13-2 record for Columbus when he takes the hill.

Tough Split:

In his first 5GS (103BF), Allen recorded 32K (31%) against only 10BB (10%), while painting the zone with strikes on 63% of his offerings. Once the calendar flipped to May, however, he made 4GS (87BF), watching his strikeout rate dip to 16% (14K) and his walk rate inflate to 14% (12BB; strikes on 57% of pitches). He found his groove in June, starting with a 10K outing (fifth of career) on 6/6 vs. Omaha (40K to 105BF last month, 38%; 5BB, 4%, 67% of pitches were strikes).

Cleaning Up:

Opposing cleanup hitters had just one hit off Allen in their first 30AB of the season, though the hit went over the wall (**Charles McAdoo**, 4/26 at Buffalo). Coming into today, they are 4x36 (2HR, 1BB, 10K) and, looking at the lineup as a whole, the top five in the order have slashed .198/.274/.352 with 6HR in 182AB against Allen, while batters 6-9 have hit .367/.437/.615 with 6HR in 109AB.
