SCOUTING REPORT

NEW YORK YANKEES DOUBLE-A AFFILIATE 2024 SCHEDULE \$5 **(**C) 27

AGUST IN APRIL: On Friday night, Agustin Ramirez went deep for the fifth time this season out of six games played. Ramirez's five homers lead the Eastern League and tie him for fifth in MiLB, despite the Triple-A season having started two weeks earlier than the Double-A season. Ramirez also leads all Double-A batters with 12 RBIs this season and has collected at least one RBI in all six games played. His 22 total bases are the most in the Eastern League and tied for the most in Double-A. He has now homered in five out of six games for the second time in his career and the first time since July of 2023 with High-A Hudson Valley.

OUTRAGEOUS OUTFIELDERS: All three Patriots outfielders hit home runs on Friday night, signaling the first of the season for Elijah Dunham Grant Richardson and Jared Wegner. Wegner's homer tracked an exit velocity of 116 mph and traveled 404 feet. With their first four-homer effort of the season, the Patriots now lead the Eastern League with nine home runs, three more than any other team.

HOOSIER HOMERS: Former college teammates Elijah Dunham and Grant Richardson (Indiana, 2019) both went deep with their first homers of the season on Friday night. It marked the fourth time in their college and pro careers that both Dunham and Richardson both homered in the same game. The last time it occurred was also at Delta Dental Stadium on 9/16/23 (when Richardson also homered off Michael Dominguez). Prior to that, the two homered in the same game twice in the same week during the lone season they shared at Indiana: first on 3/19/19 at Indiana State and then again on 3/24/19 vs. Iowa (Fisher Cats SP Trenton Wallace started in left field for the Hawkeyes that game and doubled in their only run).

NEW BEN IN TOWN: Patriots infielder Ben Cowles has hit safely in each of his first six Double-A games to start the season and he leads the team with nine overall hits (9-for-22, .409 AVG). On Sunday, Cowles tied career-highs with three hits and three runs batted in an 8-0 victory over Richmond. On Thursday, he became the first Patriot this season to swipe two stolen bases in a game.

TALL-KING SPRING: After earning a non-roster invite to MLB Spring Training, Yankees 2022 first round pick Spencer Jones was named the Yankees' 2024 James P. Dawson Award winner, given to the team's most outstanding rookie during the spring. In his first Spring Training game, Jones went 3-for-3 with a 470-foot home run and went on to hit safely in each of his first five Spring ABs, overall slashing .444/.565/.722 with 4 RBI, 7 R and a 1.287 OPS in 12 games. He started in center field for the Yankees in their inaugural Spring Breakout game vs. TOR and went 3-for-4 with 2 HR and 4 KBI en route to being named to MLB Pipeline's All-Spring Breakout First Team.

KNOWING NEW HAMPSHIRE

New Hampshire's 2024 roster includes 16 returning Fisher Cats and 12 newcomers from Vancouver or Dunedin. The Blue Jays' High-A affiliate Vancouver won the 2023 Northwest League Championship. Outfielder Garrett Spain led Vancouver in extra-base hits (39) and was tabbed by Baseball America as the Best Outfield Arm of all Blue Jays prospects entering the 2024 season. Blue Jays No. 7 prospect Alan Roden, along with fellow returning outfielder Devonte Brown both hit the second-most HRs for Vancouver last season (14) before being promoted to New Hampshire.

2024 SOMERSET PATRIOTS COACHING STAFF

RAUL DOMINGUEZ: Manager (2nd year)

Raul Dominguez enters his second consecutive season as manager for the Somerset Patriots, 10th overall as a manager and 18th coaching in the Yankees organization. He led the 2023 Patriots to a Double-A best record of 84-53 and a +211 run differential, which ranked first among all MiLB teams. Under his leadership, the Patriots finished with the Eastern League's top record in both halves of the season and clinched their second straight playoff berth. In 2023, Dominguez became the third manager in Somerset Patriots Double-A franchise history and in 2024 he will become the first to serve as manager for more than one season. Before joining Somerset, Dominguez spent the prior two seasons (2021-2022) as a defensive coach for Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre. He previously served as defensive coach for Trenton (2018-2019) and Tampa (2017). The Panama City, Panama native gained prior managerial experience with the GCL Yankees East (2016), DSL Yankees 1 (2011-15) and DSL Yankees 2 (2009-10). From 2012-2015, his teams finished at least 10 games over .500, including reaching the DSL semifinals in 2012 and 2015.

KEVIN MARTIR: Hitting Coach (1st year)

Hitting coach Kevin Martir begins his first season in Somerset and fourth in the Yankees organization, after serving in the same position for High-A Hudson Valley in 2023 and Single-A Tampa for two seasons in 2021-22. He joined the Yankees organization in 2020 and had been scheduled to serve as hitting coach for former Rookie-Advanced level Pulaski, prior to the cancellation of the minor league season. Martir began his coaching career in 2019 as a development coach for the GCL Phillies East. Martir starred at catcher during his playing career at the University of Maryland (2013-15), where he was a semi-finalist for the Johnny Bench Award in 2015. Martir was drafted by the Houston Astros in the 18th round of the 2015 MLB Draft. He played two professional seasons for the Astros with Rookie-Advanced Greeneville in 2015 and Short-Season Class-A Tri-City in 2016. A native of Brooklyn, New York, Martir graduated from the Grand Street Campus in 2012, after transferring from Xaverian High School in Brooklyn prior to his senior year.

BRETT DeGAGNE: Pitching Coach (1st year)

Pitching coach Brett DeGagne begins his first season with Somerset and fourth year in the Yankees organization. After making his organizational coaching debut as the Single-A Tampa Tarpons' pitching coach in 2021, DeGagne most recently served as the FCL Yankees pitching coach in 2022 and 2023. In 2023, his staff led the Florida Complex League in strikeouts (587) and finished fourth in ERA (4.47). DeGagne was initially tabbed to be the DSL Yankees pitching coach in 2020, before the cancellation of the minor league season. DeGagne played college ball at the University of North Dakota from 2012-2016. He moved on to grad school at St. Cloud State University, where DeGagne also began his baseball coaching career. He served as the Huskies' pitching coach during the 2017-2018 seasons. He gained additional coaching experience in 2018 as the pitching coach for the Bismarck Larks of the Northwoods League. One year prior to joining the Yankees, in 2019 DeGagne took over as pitching coach for North lowa Area Community College.

AARON BOSSI: Defensive Coach (3rd year)

Aaron Bossi returns for his third consecutive season as the Patriots' defensive coach. Under Bossi's leadership in each of the past two seasons, infielders Jesus Bastidas (2B, 2022) and T.J. Rumfield (1B, 2023) were each awarded Rawlings Minor League Gold Gloves for their work in the field. Bossi has also overseen Somerset's baserunning program each of the last two seasons, leading the team to an Eastern League-best 205 stolen bases in 2022 and a Double-A-best 256 stolen bases in 2023. Bossi made his coaching debut as Hudson Valley's defensive coach in 2021. Prior to his coaching experience with the Yankees, he spent 2017-2019 assisting rehabbing players at the organization's minor league complex in Tampa. The St. Louis, Missouri native was signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Yankees on June 24, 2016 as a catcher/infielder. He played in 22 games for the GCL Yankees East in 2016.

2023: Began the season with High-A Hudson Valley, making 26 appearances and posting a 1.74 ERA with a 59/15 K/BB ratio. He was promoted to Double-A Somerset on 7/25 and finished the season over 16 games for the Patriots in which he posted a 4.29 ERA in 21.0 IP.

2022: Spent the bulk of his second pro season with Single-A Tampa, going 4-3 over 31 games, while posting a 3.31 ERA, 24 BB, 62 K and a 1.14 WHIP. In September, he was promoted to Hudson Valley for his final three appearances of the season, allowing 4 R (2 ER) over 5.2 IP with 2 BB and 8 K.

2021: Pitched three games in his pro debut season for the FCL Yankees, including his only career start prior to this season, combining to allow 5 R (2 ER) over 2.1 IP with 1 BB and 5 K.

College: Played four seasons at Penn State University, appearing in 43 career games (33 starts) and going 8-9 with a 4.52 ERA with 64 BB and 176 K. He earned Academic All-Big Ten honors his sophomore, junior and senior seasons (2019-21).

Personal Notes: Attended Hough High School (NC) as a junior and senior, after transferring from Independence High School (NC) as a freshman and sophomore. As a freshman in 2014, he helped lead Inde- pendence to a conference championship, while guiding Hough to back-to-back conference championships in 2017 and 2018. Trained at Tread Athletics in Charlotte, NC ahead of 2021 college season.

Career Notes: Selected by the Yankees in the 18th round of the 2021 MLB Draft, signed for \$50,000.

2022-23: Vrieling did not pitch following the 2022 MLB Draft and he spent the entire 2023 season on the 60-day Injured List with a stress fracture in his pitching elbow. However, following the 2023 season, Vrieling was sent to the Arizona Fall League to pitch for the Mesa Solar Sox. In his first affiliated pitching experience, Vrieling started five games for Mesa, combining for 10.2 IP with 15 K, 6 BB and a 5.06 ERA.

College: Appeared in 42 games over three seasons at Gonzaga from 2020-2022, going 5-7 with a 4.31 ERA and 178 strikeouts in 137.2 innings. In 2022, he transitioned to the starting rotation, when he went 4-4 in 15 starts.

Personal Notes: Attended Kamiakin High School (WA), where as a senior he posted a 0.56 ERA with 63 strikeouts in 55 innings and was named MCC Pitcher of the Year and First Team pitcher. Two-sport athlete also played basketball in high school.

Career Notes: Selected by the Yankees in the third round of the 2022 MLB Draft, signing on July 25, 2022 for a slot value bonus of \$611,400. Had been ranked by MLB.com as the No. 71 Draft prospect in 2022.
